Theological Questions

Last week's question: Who was Pope Paul VI?

He was the pope from June 21, 1963, until August 6, 1978. Born on September 26, 1897, his name was Giovanni Battista Montini. He became a priest in Brescia, Italy, and he worked in the Vatican Secretariat of State for many years, becoming a top advisor to Popes Pius XI and Pius XII. He was known to be very wise and prudent in canon law, diplomatic affairs, and administration. He became the Archbishop of Milan in 1954. He was named a cardinal in 1958.

When Pope John XXIII died, shortly after convoking the **Second Vatican Council**, Cardinal Montini was elected as the next pope, taking the name of Paul VI. He continued the Council, which produced four Constitutions, nine Decrees, and three Declarations. He declared Mary the "Mother of the Church." He continued to guide the Church for thirteen years after the Council, implementing many changes in liturgy and discipline. For example, he allowed the use of vernacular languages at Mass, and issued the revised rites for Mass and for the other sacraments. When many things were changing, however, he maintained the moral and doctrinal teachings of the Church. For example, he issued the encyclical, **Humanae Vitae** on July 25, 1968, reaffirming the Church's constant teaching against the use of contraception, which is sinful and contrary to God's law. He was beatified on October 19, 2014, and he will be canonized, declared a saint, on October 14, 2018.

A Catholic high school was named after him in Fairfax in 1983. Paul VI High School will be moving to a new campus in Loudoun County in 2020.
