Theological Questions

Last week's question: What musical instruments are mentioned in the Bible?

Above all, the human voice itself is frequently mentioned throughout the Old Testament and the New Testament as the means of singing God's praises. Moses sang a hymn of praise after crossing the Red Sea (Exodus 15), and Jesus and his disciples sang a hymn after the Last Supper (Mark 14:26). Saint Paul and Silas sang hymns in the jail at Philippi (Acts 16:25).

The Old Testament frequently mentions several different stringed instruments (lyre, harp, psalter) wind instruments (ram's horn, trumpet, flute, bagpipe), and percussion instruments (cymbals, tambourines, sistrums, bells).

Lyre (kinnor): Awake, lyre and harp. I will awake the dawn. Ps 57:8.

Harp (nevel): I will play for you on a ten-stringed harp, Ps 144:9.

Psaltery or stringed instrument (psalterion in Greek): Daniel 3:4.

Ram's horn or trumpet (shofar): Give praise with blasts upon the horn, Ps 150:3

Trumpet of silver or metal (yobel): Make two trumpets of silver, Numbers 10:1.

Flute or pipe (chalel): my heart wails like a flute, Jer 48:36. Flutes were played by mourners at the funeral of the daughter of Jairus, Matthew 9:23; also, "We played the flute for you and you did not dance," Matthew 11:17.

Bagpipe (symphonia, in Greek): used by the Babylonians, Daniel 3:4.

Tambourine or drum (tof): Miriam, Aaron's sister, took a tambourine in her hand, Exodus 15:20

Sistrum or rattle (manaanem): **Cymbals** (zezelim): David and all the house of Israel danced before the Lord with all their might, with singing, and with lyres, harps, tambourines, sistrums, and cymbals, 2 Samuel 6:5

Bells (paamon): worn on the vestments of the priests, Exodus 28:33; rung as a warning by lepers, Leviticus 13:45

New Question: What did Vatican II say about music in the liturgy?
