## Theological Questions

**Last week's question: What is polyphony?**

"Polyphony" literally means "many voices". Polyphony involves two or more voices singing either in harmony, or with independent melodies.

Ancient liturgical music, in both the East and the West, was always "monophonic", with everyone singing the melody with the same "voice", without harmony. In the 11<sup>th</sup> century, "organum", a simple form of two-part harmony was introduced into liturgical singing.

During the Renaissance, from about 1400 until 1600, more elaborate forms of harmony and counterpoint were introduced into Western liturgical music, using more complex modern musical notation. At first, the Church regarded polyphony with great caution, because the meaning of the text could be obscured by the complexity of different voices not singing in unison. However, it achieved greater acceptance, and it has become part of the Church's liturgical repertory. In the East, Byzantine liturgical music has been more resistant to polyphony up until modern times.

The great flowering of polyphony in the sixteenth century included many great composers, such as Josquin des Prez, William Byrd, Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina, Orlando di Lasso, and Tomas Victoria.

**Clarification of Envelope Policy**

For parishioners who do not participate in Faith Direct, in order for your donations to be recorded on your Annual Contribution Statement, they **MUST** be in an envelope (either the ones that are mailed to you monthly; or one of the supplementary envelopes which are available at the Church entrances), include your name and address, or placed in a plain envelope that is labeled with your name and address. **Loose checks placed in the collection basket will not be recorded under your registration record.** Please do not use tape or staples.

Your offertory contributions are recorded when they are received. Therefore, multiple checks in multiple weekly envelopes are entered for that week into our contribution system. For example, if you are away for the month of August and turn in your August weekly envelopes with your September 2 weekly envelope, all of those contributions would be posted to the September 2 collection. Special collection envelopes are handled and recorded separately.

For those who use Faith Direct, contributions are periodically recorded based on printouts the office receives from Faith Direct. If you have any questions, please call the Parish Office.
