Theological Questions

Last week's question: When were pipe organs invented?

The concept of moving air through a set of pipes to produce music is a very ancient one. Primitive bagpipes were used in the Middle-East by 1000 B.C. Bagpipes (symphonia) are mentioned in Daniel 3:5. Bagpipes use a bladder or pouch to maintain a reservoir of air that can be directed through one or more reeds or pipes. Pan-pipes, or mouth organs, were known in ancient Greece and other cultures.

The invention of the pipe organ is usually credited to a Greek man in the third century B.C., named **Ctesibus of Alexandria**. He made a primitive kind of pipe organ called a **hydraulis** that used hand-pumps to create water pressure to move air through a set of pipes. A set of keys or levers controlled how the air moved through each pipe. The hydraulis was used throughout the Roman Empire in outdoor arenas. By the second century A.D., the Romans were using bellows rather than water pressure to sustain the flow of air.

The ancient hydraulis was recognizable as a "pipe organ", but the instrument continued to develop over the centuries with every increase in technology. In the year 812, Charlemagne had a pipe organ placed in his chapel at Aachen, and over the next few centuries, pipe organs became more commonly used in churches. There was a gradual development of complexity, size, and precision throughout the late Medieval period, the Renaissance, and the Baroque period. In the 14th century, Guillaume de Machaut nicknamed the organ the "king of instruments".

New Question: On an organ, what is a "manual"?

This study will help us see how much happier marriages and families would be if they simply trusted the words of Christ and his bride, the Church. 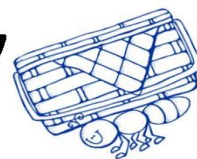
