Regulations on Fast and Abstinence ...

The Law of Abstinence (from eating meat) binds those who have completed their fourteenth year of age.

The Law of Fasting (one full meatless meal is allowed, two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together should not equal another full meal) binds all those who have attained their majority (18 years of age) until the beginning of their sixtieth year.

Abstinence (from meat) is to be observed on all Fridays within the season of Lent and Passiontide and on Ash Wednesday.

Fast and abstinence are observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Theological Questions

Answer to last week's question: How many Catholic priests have been awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor?

The Medal of Honor is the highest award for valor in action against an enemy force which can be bestowed upon an individual serving in the Armed Services of the United States. It is generally presented to its recipient by the President of the United States of America in the name of Congress.

Since the Civil War, there have been five Catholic priests who have received this award.

Fr. Joseph O'Callahan, S.J. (Lt. Commander, USN) bravely tended to the suffering souls aboard the fiercely attacked USS Franklin on March 19, 1945, near Kobe, Japan, in World War II.

Fr. Emil Kapaun (Captain, USA) heroically tended to and rescued wounded soldiers during combat at Unsan, Korea, on November 1-2, 1950. He remained with the wounded despite risk of certain capture. During captivity, he prevented the execution of an American prisoner, as well as tending to the needs of other prisoners, and inspiring them under adverse conditions. He died as a prisoner of war on May 23, 1951.

Fr. Angelo "Charlie" Liteky (Major, USA) was awarded the Medal of Honor for his actions during Vietnam, braving intense fire to carry 20 wounded soldiers to safety during a battle on December 6, 1967. He later left the active priesthood and the Church, and he renounced his Medal by mailing it to President Reagan with his explanation.

Fr. Charles J. Watters (Major, USA) Jersey City native and U.S. Army Airborne paratrooper chaplain earned his Medal of Honor on November 19, 1967, during the Battle of Dak-To. He bravely administered spiritual and medical aid to soldiers on the battlefield. When the Americans pulled back, he went forward to rescue two wounded soldiers. Several times he exposed himself to intense friendly fire as well as enemy fire to attend to the dying. He was mortally wounded while ministering to the wounded.

Fr. Vincent Capodanno (Lieutenant, USN) He was admired as the "Grunt Padre" by the Marines he served in Vietnam. On September 4, 1967, he brought the sacraments as well as medical aid to many dying Marines on the battlefield, despite heavy enemy fire, even after sustaining a serious wound from mortar fire. He was attempting to reach a wounded Marine when he was killed by a burst of machine gun fire.

The Church has opened the causes for canonization for both Fr. Emil Kapaun and Fr. Vincent Capodanno, They now are officially called "Servants of God" as the Church considers their causes.
