Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Monday, March 16, Bishop Burbidge held a videoconference with all the pastors of the Diocese of Arlington (and me, a parochial administrator!) to discuss his decision to suspend public Masses beginning March 17. As you may be aware, Bishop Burbidge permitted Masses last weekend while the Archdioceses of Baltimore and Washington suspended public Masses, and he assured us that this was his intention going forward. However, the recent restrictions of group sizes put forth by the Centers for Disease Control and the White House no longer made that possible. His letter to the Diocese assures us that it is "with great sadness" that Bishop Burbidge suspends public Mass throughout the Diocese. Let us pray for his continued leadership and discernment in the difficult times ahead.

Unfortunately, because the official press release came on the evening before the suspension of public Masses, it was difficult to get the word out. We did our best by placing an update online and on the church door, but I know that some still showed up for 6:30 am and 8:45 am Mass on March 17 disappointed to see that there would be no public Mass. I apologize for the inconvenience and that you had to find out in this way. I make the distinction of a "public Mass" because we are not canceling Masses at St. Andrew's. Fr. Bresnahan and I will still offer Masses each day for the intentions of the day. We're working to record one of our Masses with a homily each day in order to share them with our parishioners. We need to get up to speed on some technology, but hopefully, we will get there very soon. In the meantime, we thank you for your patience.

To review the current status of some details at St. Andrew's:

- For the time being, public Masses and public Stations of the Cross have been suspended.
- The church is open and following the ordinary parish schedule, which is Monday through Friday from 5:30 am to 9:00 pm, Saturday from 7:45 am to 9:00 pm, and Sunday from 6:30 am to 9:00 pm.
- We are holding Confessions in our Confessionals. After each Confession, we will wipe down the door handle and the confessional before the next penitent enters.\*
- All are encouraged to pray during this time of uncertainty and suffering. During this Season of Lent, I encourage everyone to pray the Holy Rosary and the Stations of the Cross, as well as reflecting on the readings of the Mass.\*
- We will have Adoration in the church on Thursday from 6 pm to 9 pm and on Friday from 9:30 am to 7:00 pm.\*
- In order to sanitize the pews as often as possible, we have reserved the middle sections of the pews for prayer. This allows us to focus on those sections and conserve our cleaning supplies for the time being. It is a large enough space that we can spread out in the pews.\*

\* We are required to have no more than ten people in the church at once, each staying a minimum of 6 feet from each other, so please be aware when you are coming to pray or to go to Confession.

Many people have asked how they can contribute to the Church during this time as there will no longer be Sunday collections. Allow me to thank those who are contributing during this time and to make a plea for continued regular contributions to St. Andrew's in this period of drastically reduced income. There are several ways to donate, including (1) dropping off your contribution at the parish office during regular office hours, (2) mailing in your contribution, or (3) signing up for electronic contribution with Faith Direct ([www.faithdirect.net](http://www.faithdirect.net)) where our parish code is VA310. This is going to be a difficult time to pay our bills, and I pray for your generosity to sustain us.

Finally, please let me end with some good news: the first phase of the project to clean and repair the bell tower is near completion. I thank the contractors who worked so hard to get this finished and the family whose generous donation made this long-overdue improvement possible. The main entrance to the church looks amazing. Let us pray for each other in these trying times, knowing that the Lord who fills us with his divine love unites us in that same love as a parish community of faith.

### Adult Confirmation Classes

If you are a baptized Catholic who has received First Communion but have not had the chance to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Church welcomes you to partake in this grace-filled Sacrament. Wagner and Fr. Bresnahan will be teaching the classes. Bishop Burbidge will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation on May 31 at 2:30 p.m. at the Cathedral of St. Thomas More. The **Catholic Bishop Abuse Reporting Service** has been established to receive reports of sexual abuse and related misconduct by bishops, and to relay those reports to proper Church authorities for investigation. Where a report includes a crime, such as the sexual abuse of a minor, it will also be reported to civil authorities. Otherwise, reports will be kept confidential.

If you have any other kind of complaint about a bishop—such as parish assignments, church closings, or homily contents—please address those directly to your diocesan or eparchial bishop instead. Sexual abuse by a priest, deacon or a staff member or volunteer of the Church should be reported to the office of Victim Assistance in your local diocese/eparchy. So, to be sure you get the help you need, phone numbers and addresses may be found on the diocesan/eparchial website.

### 40 Cans for Lent


