Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Andrew the Apostle,

As we proceed through this difficult time, separated from each other for our safety and separated from receiving the Eucharist because of the suspension of public Masses, let me offer some updates for the parish.

I invite everyone to visit our new YouTube channel (<https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCUc7bg8DdOScYQk19YJYkWA>) to see the daily Masses from our chapel in the rectory celebrated by Fr. Bresnahan and me. We are still working on our technological skills. You do not have to have a YouTube account to see the videos, but if you have one, I ask you to subscribe to remain updated about new content. Each day, we will livestream Mass at 9:30am. We may add a second Sunday Mass so that both priests can have a Mass online. That way each of our mothers will have the opportunity to see their sons celebrating Mass! Fr. Bresnahan and I have been talking about adding additional spiritual content in the form of videos and live events, so we'll alert everyone through this newsletter and the parish website (<http://www.st-andrew.org/>) when we schedule those.

The videos of the Masses will also be available through the parish website. We are in the process of making improvements to our website, and I thank Trish Burkat for her help in getting us up to date. The website is an important means of communication this time of isolation, so I ask that you check it regularly for updates and spiritual nourishment as we add content to aid in your advancement in sanctity during this time.

Our director of youth ministry, Bethany Rogers, has started an Instagram account (@beforetheflamestudio) to remain in touch with our youth. She and her husband Derek, the director of youth ministry for Our Lady of Good Counsel, have transformed their garage into a studio where they can host special video events and keep in touch and spiritually guide our youth during this extended time of isolation.

Those who have stopped by the church during the day this week have seen - and heard - that construction on the balcony has begun. We are grateful to be that much closer to the installation of our new organ. Please see the parish website for updates, including pictures of the organ being assembled at the Peragallo factory in New Jersey. Because of the noise in the church during their construction, the Diocese has given us permission to set up a temporary chapel in Hannan Hall. Beginning Wednesday, March 25, we will have the Eucharist in Hannan Hall from 7:30am until 5:00pm from Monday through Friday while the construction continues. On Fridays Eucharistic Adoration will be in Hannan Hall from 9:30am until 4:30pm, at which point adoration will return to the church from 4:30pm until 7:00pm. There will only be ten chairs set up in Hannan Hall because of restrictions on gathering in groups. Please remain at least six feet from each other while in prayer.

Thank you to everyone who has continued to contribute to St. Andrew's during this difficult time. Many have dropped off their envelopes at the parish office or mailed them, and I appreciate those who have set up accounts through Faith Direct in order to give electronically during this time. Our financial situation at this time will be strained because of our loss of income, but we pray that through your generosity and God's grace, we will continue to provide for our church and school staff, pay our bills and provide the resources we can during this time of trial. Thank you again for all who have stepped up to help. Please see the parish website about how to give electronically through Faith Direct, where our parish code is VA310.

Finally, we are continuing Confessions and Adoration according to our Lenten schedule. On Thursday, Friday and Saturday, Fr. Bresnahan will hear Confessions in his Confessional, and I will be at the far end of Hannan Hall on the edge of the school hallway. This will allow people to separate from each other in line and keep to less than ten people in both the church and Hannan Hall. For all other times, Confession will be in the church with Fr. Bresnahan or me in our confessionals. We will be wiping down the confessionals after each confession, so please be patient.

Again, let us unite in prayer with each other during this tumultuous time that we may walk by faith. Our Lord has taken much control out of our hands. While it is uncomfortable for us, we know that we must place our full trust in him to advance in holiness. In this sacred season of Lent, may we walk boldly in faith, trusting in his Divine Will.

### **Adult Confirmation Classes**

If you are a baptized Catholic who has received First Communion but have not had the chance to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Church welcomes you to partake in this grace-filled Sacrament. Classes will begin in April (*subject to postponement due to coronavirus updates*) for anyone 18 years or older interested in receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. You must provide a baptismal certificate and if you are married, you must also provide proof of a valid Catholic marriage issued by a Catholic church. **A series of three classes will take place on Monday evenings, on April 20, April 27 & May 4 at 7:30 p.m. in the Padre Pio Room.** Fr. Wagner and Fr. Bresnahan will be teaching the classes. Bishop Burbidge will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation on May 31 at 2:30 p.m. at the Cathedral of St. Thomas More. The **Catholic Bishop Abuse Reporting Service** has been established to receive reports of sexual abuse and related misconduct by bishops, and to relay those reports to proper Church authorities for investigation. Where a report includes a crime, such as the sexual abuse of a minor, it will also be reported to civil authorities. Otherwise, reports will be kept confidential.

If you have any other kind of complaint about a bishop—such as parish assignments, church closings, or homily contents—please address those directly to your diocesan or eparchial bishop instead. Sexual abuse by a priest, deacon or a staff member or volunteer of the Church should be reported to the office of Victim Assistance in your local diocese/eparchy. So, to be sure you get the help you need, phone numbers and addresses may be found on the diocesan/eparchial website.

If you are the victim of sexual abuse (or any other crime), please contact local law enforcement.

### **40 Cans for Lent**


