## Theological Questions

**Last week's question: What is the difference between a sin and a vice?**

A sin is an individual act or omission which is contrary to God's will, a turning away from God toward some creature, a moral failing or transgression against God's law.

**A vice is a habit of sin**, rather than one individual act.

Habits, both good and bad, are acquired by repetition or practice. Usually, habits become stronger with frequent repetition, and the acts become easier and more spontaneous, and, consequently, it becomes harder to break the habit.

It is possible to commit an individual act of sin without immediately developing a habit of sin. However, a habit is strengthened by every act that corresponds to the habit. Thus, if we frequently refrain from complaining, we begin to develop the virtue of patience. If we frequently lie we will develop the vice, or habit, of dishonesty.

Once a habit is formed, it is not easily changed.

An old joke says, "It is easy for me to stop smoking; I've stopped hundreds of times!"

A good habit is called a virtue.

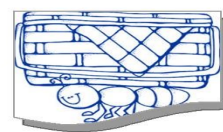
