Theological Questions

Last week's question:

Why was keeping the Sabbath day holy so important for the Jews, after escaping from Egypt?

The Third Commandment, "Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day," was not only a solemn obligation, but also a source of joy for the Israelites. It was a reminder that they were **no longer slaves**. "You shall remember that you were a servant in the land of Egypt, and the Lord your God brought you out thence with mighty hand and outstretched arm; therefore the Lord your God commanded you to keep the Sabbath day" (Deut 5:15). See the Catechism, #2168-2188.

They had been slaves in Egypt, and they were not able to worship the Lord God as they wanted to. Not only the burden of heavy labor, but also the lack of freedom and the lack of suitable leisure and rest made life so difficult and oppressive. The inability to observe a weekly day of rest and worship is a defining quality of slavery, and the leisure to worship God is a mark of liberation and freedom. The Sabbath was a continual reminder of their status of freedom from slavery, and of their status as children of God. The word **Sabbath** in Hebrew means "rest" as well as "seven". In the book of Genesis, God rested on the seventh day of creation.

Since Jesus rose from the dead on the first day of the week, Christians observe Sunday, rather than Saturday, as the Lord's day, but the principle remains the same: the Lord's day is consecrated to God in a special way. One of the Precepts of the Church is to attend Mass on all Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. But we are also enjoined "to refrain from engaging in work or activities that hinder the worship owed to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, the performance of the works of mercy and the appropriate relaxation of mind and body". (Catechism, 2185)




