Theological Questions

Last week's question:

In musical notation, what is a "staff"?

The staff is the set of five horizontal lines and four spaces in which notes are written.

In ancient times, there was no written musical notation. Melodies or "modes" of intonation would have to be learned by ear, and remembered. Beginning in the 9th century, Christian liturgical manuscripts began to include primitive notations, like accents or inflection marks, above the text, to indicate a change in pitch. Other markings, dots and wavy lines, were sometimes used to indicate how the text was to be intoned. The square dots, called neumes, were arranged above the text to indicate higher and lower notes, but without a staff, or arranged above and below a single horizontal line.

A Benedictine monk named **Guido of Arezzo** (991- c.1033) introduced the **four-line staff** and the "Do-Re-Mi-Fa-Sol" scale that has served as the basis for writing the music for Gregorian chant ever since.



As music became more complex, especially with the introduction of polyphony, the modern **five-line staff** became widely used in the 16th century. In order to accommodate a full range of voices, modern notation uses two staves: the treble clef (G-clef) for the higher notes, and the bass clef (F-clef) for the lower notes.
