Theological Questions

Last week's question:

What does the Church teach about the obligation to attend Mass when the weather is very bad (for example, when it snows)?

There is a precept of the Church: On Sundays and other Holy Days of Obligation, the faithful are bound to participate in the Mass.

"The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. **For this reason the faithful are bound to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason** (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a serious sin (Catechism, 2181)."

The Diocese of Arlington has issued the statement: All baptized Catholics are obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. However, there are particular circumstances or conditions that may excuse a Catholic from this obligation. **If you are ill, homebound, or if there are severe weather conditions that make attending Mass dangerous to your safety or that of others, you are excused from the obligation.** In such cases, if you are unable to attend Mass, the Church recommends making a spiritual communion and spending some time in prayer.

Common sense and prudence are necessary here. If one is unable to drive to work or to the shopping center, it would, likewise, not be a sin to miss Mass under similar circumstances.

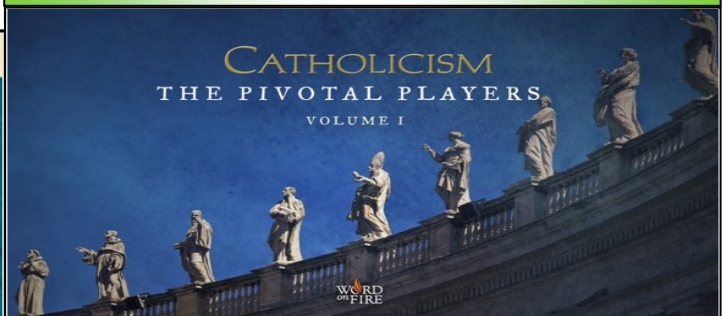
