Theological Questions

Last week's question: What is moral theology?

Theology is the study of God and the things that pertain to God. It is also defined as "faith seeking understanding." It starts from the standpoint of faith, and seeks to deepen the understanding of what we believe. When our faith requires us to do good and to avoid evil, there are moral obligations to conform our behavior to right reason and God's law.

Moral theology considers rightness or wrongness of human acts in the light of faith. A "human act" is an act involving the intellect and the free will. The word "moral" comes from the Latin word mos (plural, mores), and it refers to human actions, customs, or behavior. Moral theology considers virtue and vice, good and evil, sin and repentance, obedience and disobedience of God's laws. The Catechism presents the moral teachings of the Church by explaining the Ten Commandments in depth. Moral theology differs from the philosophical study of **ethics** (from the Greek, ethos, custom), which does not presuppose a supernatural faith revealed by God. Priests must study moral theology in order to administer the sacrament of Penance.

New Question: What is dogmatic theology?


Sponsor Class:
