Theological Questions

Last week's question: Why is the Third Sunday of Advent called "Gaudete Sunday"?

"Gaudete" is Latin for "rejoice." The title for the Third Sunday of Advent comes from the Entrance Antiphon (Introit), which is a quotation from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians:

"Rejoice in the Lord always; I say it again, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near."

"Gaudete in Domino semper: iterum dico, gaudete: Dominus prope est." (Philippians 4:4-5)

This passage of Philippians also serves as the Second Reading on the same day.

The season of Advent, like Lent, is a penitential season. Yet, devout Christians rejoice in the Lord, even in a time of repentance and self-denial. Advent is past the halfway point, and the anticipation of celebrating the birth of Jesus already causes the Christian to rejoice.

St. Paul repeats his admonition: "I say it again, rejoice", reminding each Christian that the Lord is near.

New Question: Is there more than one "King Herod" in the Bible?
