Theological Questions

Last week's question:

The notations for "**dynamics**" (or **volume**) are not usually indicated in hymnals, but would be used in the more detailed musical scores for musicians or choirs. It may be indicated by letters below the musical staff:

pp stands for **pianissimo** (very soft),

p for **piano** (soft),

mp for **mezzo piano** (medium soft),

mf for **mezzo forte** (medium loud),

f for **forte** (strong or loud),

ff for **fortissimo** (very loud).

The musical instrument we call a "piano" was invented by Bartolomeo Cristofori (1635-1731). It was originally called a "pianoforte", was because it is capable of being played either loudly or softly, unlike earlier keyboard instruments like harpsichords or clavichords.

An **accent mark** (>) above a note indicates that it is to be played or sung more loudly or forcefully.

A **crescendo** is a gradual increase in volume from soft to loud. (e.g., "... o'er the land of the FREE, and the HOME OF THE BRAVE".)

A **decrescendo** also called **diminuendo**, is a gradual decrease in volume from loud to soft. (e.g., "... sleep in heavenly peace.")



There is a crescendo in "O Come All Ye Faithful". The words "O come, let us adore him," are sung three times, gradually increasing the volume with each repetition from very soft to very loud.

The same increase in volume is used in "Joy to the World", when repeating the words "Let heaven and nature sing".

New Question: In musical terminology, what are sharps and flats? See next week's bulletin for the answer.
