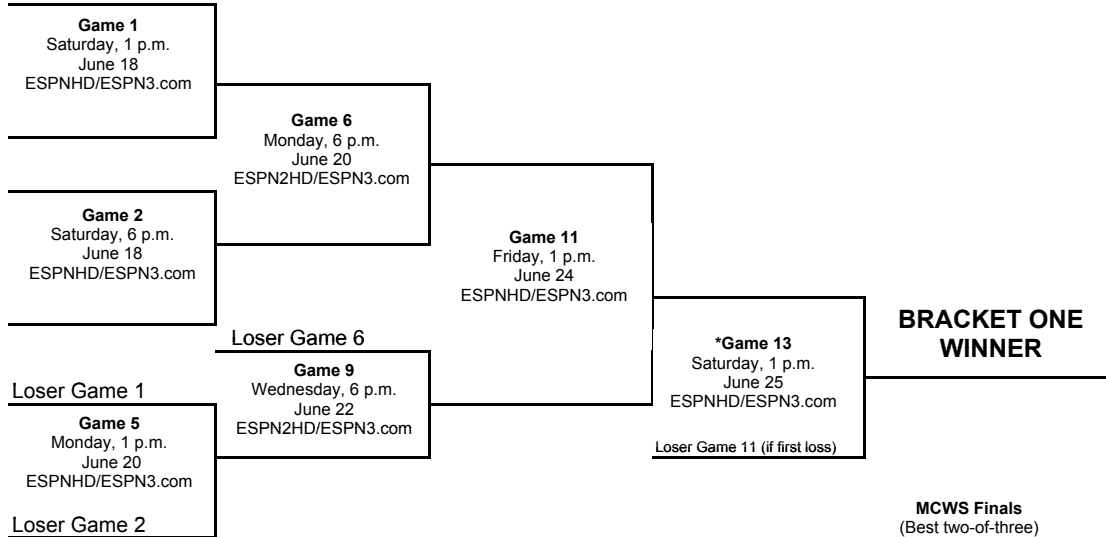




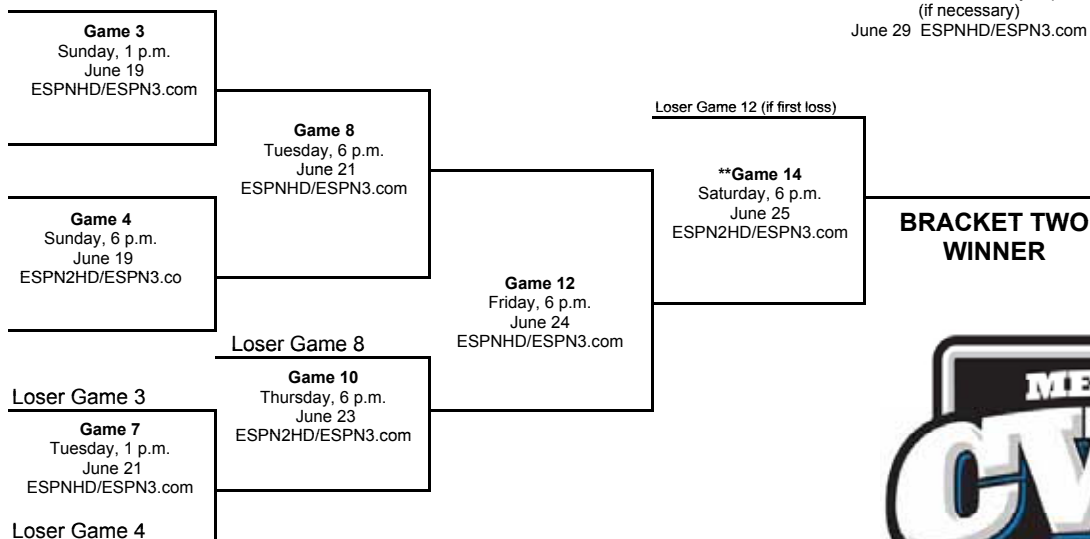

LEADING OFF

Texas A&M makes the trip to the College World Series this week for the fifth time in program history ... the Aggies will open play on Sunday at 6 p.m. (CDT) against defending national champion South Carolina, will then face either Virginia or California on Tuesday ... this year marks the debut of the brand-new TD Ameritrade Park in downtown Omaha as the host of the event ... 2011 marks the 65th anniversary of the College World Series.

A&M's ROAD TO OMAHA

- Texas A&M was awarded one of 16 regional sites and opened play with an 11-0 blanking of Wright State ... the Aggies then defeated Seton Hall, 6-3, and would face Arizona in the regional final ... the Wildcats forced a second championship game with a 7-4 win over A&M but, after a postponement due to rain, the Aggies shut out Arizona 3-0 to advance to the Super Regional round.
- The Aggies were paired with No. 5 national seed Florida State in the best-of-three Super Regional series in Tallahassee ... A&M knocked off FSU, 6-2, in the opener ... the Seminoles then powered their way to a 23-9 win to even the series ... the Aggies, however, answered with a decisive 11-2 victory in the winner-take-all third game to punch their ticket to Omaha.
- Texas A&M was the only road team to win a super regional this season.

TEXAS A&M AT THE COLLEGE WORLD SERIES

• Texas A&M is making its fifth all-time appearance in the College World Series, and its first since the 1999 season ... the Aggies also made it to Omaha in 1951, 1964 and 1993.
• The Aggies sport an all-time CWS record of 2-8, with victories coming in 1991 (over Ohio State) and 1993 (over Kansas).
• A&M is 1-3 all-time in CWS openers.

TEXAS A&M VERSUS THE CWS FIELD

Texas A&M has faced four of the other seven teams in this year's College World Series field ... a closer look at the history between the Aggies and the rest of the 2011 CWS schools:

- **SOUTH CAROLINA (never faced):** Texas A&M and South Carolina have never met in baseball.
- **CALIFORNIA (series tied, 2-2):** Texas A&M and Cal have split four all-time meetings on the baseball diamond ... the last meeting came in the 1992 NCAA Regional in Gainesville, Fla. ... A&M opened the regional with a 15-6 win over Cal, but three days later the Bears eliminated A&M, 11-4, to advance to Omaha ... the other two meetings came in a two-game set at Olsen Field in College Station back in 1984, with each winning once.
- **VIRGINIA (never faced):** Texas A&M and Virginia have never met in baseball.
- **VANDERBILT (never faced):** Texas A&M and Vanderbilt have never met in baseball.
- **FLORIDA (A&M leads, 6-1):** Texas A&M leads the all-time series with Florida, 6-1 ... all but one meeting have come in the tenure of Aggie coach Rob Childress (since 2006) ... A&M took two of three in Gainesville from the then fifth-ranked Gators in Childress' first season, 2006 ... A&M then swept three games from Florida in the return trip at Olsen Field in 2007 ... the teams' only postseason meeting, and first-ever meeting, came in the 1992 NCAA Regional in Gainesville, a 6-5 Texas A&M victory.
- **TEXAS (UT leads, 234-121-5):** Texas leads the all-time series with Texas A&M, 234-121-5, and has won 19 of the last 23 meetings ... the Texas A&M/Texas rivalry is the longest-running and most often played series in Aggie baseball history, dating back 107 years ... the Horns took two of a tight three-game series from the Aggies in mid-May, with every game being decided by three runs or less ... the teams met on the baseball diamond for the 97th straight season last month ... the last time A&M and UT did not play baseball was in 1914 ... Texas is by far A&M's most common opponent of all time.

AGGIE TIES TO OMAHA AND THE COLLEGE WORLD SERIES

- Head coach **ROB CHILDRESS** was the pitching coach at the University of Nebraska for eight seasons (1998-2005) ... Childress was a part of three CWS teams at Nebraska (2001, 2002, 2005).
- Associate head coach **ANDY SAWYERS** was an assistant at Nebraska on the 2005 World Series team.
- Assistant coach **JUSTIN SEELY** was a starter on Nebraska's first two College World Series squads (2001 and 2002) ... Seely hit a grand slam in the decisive third game of the Huskers' super regional win over Richmond in '02.
- Junior 1B **JACOB HOUSE** played on the 2009 CWS team at the University of Arkansas, advancing to the semifinals ... he went 4-for-6 with a run scored, playing in two games and starting one (UA's final game, against LSU) ... House is the only Aggie on the roster with CWS experience.
- Baseball trainer **JOSH COHEN** was on the Nebraska staff during their 2005 CWS run.

HEAD COACH ROB CHILDRESS

- Aggie skipper **ROB CHILDRESS** (Northwood '90) is in his sixth season as the head coach of the Texas A&M baseball program, with an overall record of 246-133-2.
- Childress has led the Aggies to four 40-win seasons, five Big 12 titles (regular season 2008 and 2011, tournament in 2007, 2010 and 2011), five NCAA Tournaments and three Super Regionals.
- **Childress is the only coach in school history to lead A&M to five straight NCAA Tournaments.**
- Only Beau Bell, who made it to Omaha in his first season as skipper in 1951, has taken an Aggie baseball team to the College World Series faster than Childress (sixth season).
- Childress is the third-winningest coach in school history (246 wins), trailing only legendary A&M managers Mark Johnson (876 from 1985-2005) and Tom Chandler (660 from 1959-84).

BANNER YEAR FOR AGGIE ATHLETICS

- Texas A&M has experienced arguably the greatest athletic year in school history ... the Aggies set a school record with nine Big 12 titles this season, a league high.
- A&M competes in 20 intercollegiate sports (11 female, 9 male) ... with baseball reaching the College World Series, 11 are in the Top 10 and 16 of the 20 finished in the Top 25.
- Texas A&M is the only school in the country to have a football team compete in a post-season bowl game; both men's and women's basketball reach the NCAA Championships; both the men's and women's outdoor track & field teams finish in the Top 10 and the baseball team reach the College World Series.
- **A&M'S 2010-11 BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIPS (9):** Women's Soccer, Football (Big 12 South), Men's Indoor Track & Field, Equestrian, Men's Tennis (tournament), Men's Outdoor Track & Field, Women's Outdoor Track & Field, Baseball (regular season), Baseball (tournament)
- **2010-11 BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIPS (by school):** Texas A&M 9, Oklahoma State 5, Texas 5, Baylor 5, Nebraska 4, Kansas 2, Missouri 2, Oklahoma 2, Texas Tech 1.
- Along with 9 Big 12 titles, Aggie teams finished second 7 times (men's golf, women's golf, women's basketball, women's indoor track & field, men's tennis, men's swimming & diving, women's swimming & diving) and third twice (men's basketball and softball).

NEAR PICTURE-PERFECT POSTSEASON

- Teams have to play well to reach the College World Series, and for the Aggies the numbers back that up ... A&M swept through the Big 12 Championship before capturing the College Station Regional and Tallahassee Super Regional titles.
- The Aggies are 9-2 in all postseason games, including a 6-1 record away from home.
- A&M is hitting .326 in the postseason and averaging 7.5 runs per game ... the Aggies entered postseason play hitting .286 and averaging 5.6 runs.
- Sophomore P **MICHAEL WACHA** is 3-0 in the postseason with a 0.95 ERA ... in 28.1 innings of work, Wacha is holding opponents to a sparse .184 batting average.
- Junior 1B **JACOB HOUSE** is hitting a team-best .442 with 13 RBI in the postseason.
- Three other Aggies are hitting over .350 in the postseason, including junior 3B **ADAM SMITH** (.387), sophomore RF **TYLER NAQUIN** (.383, 13 runs) and junior DH **MATT JUENGEL** (.364, 3 HR, 11 RBI, 8 extra-base hits).

TURNING THE TIDE

- A&M had lost 4 of its last 5 following an extra-inning defeat at UTSA on May 3 ... Coach Childress and the staff then tweaked the lineup and have started eight of the now-familiar nine (minus Adam Smith) in each of the following 22 ballgames.
- Over that span Texas A&M is 17-5, including a 7-2 mark away from home ... the Aggies are hitting .322 and averaging 7.0 runs per game.
- Some of the players having monster finishes to the regular season (stats over last 22 games):
ANDREW COLLAZO - .294, 18 runs, 9-9 SB, 2 E in 97 chances ... has raised average 29 points (.241 to .270)
JACOB HOUSE - .369, team-high 20 RBI, .996 fielding percentage (1 E in 245 chances)
MATT JUENGEL - .360, 3 HR, 17 RBI, 13 extra-base hits, .605 slugging percentage
KENNY JACKSON - .321, 10 RBI, .975 fielding percentage at SS (3 E in 122 chances)

THE FINAL PIECE

- The last piece to the lineup puzzle fell into place on May 20 ... Adam Smith was inserted in the 5-hole following a series-opening loss to Texas the night before, and has been the sparkplug to the Aggies' strong finish.
- A&M has used the exact same lineup in the last 13 games, posting a 10-3 record (7-2 away from home).
- Smith has hit .368 over that span with a team-high 3 HR, 9 extra-base hits, 9 RBIs and a .789 slugging percentage.
- Smith has raised his average a whopping 39 points over the last 13 games (from .205 to .244).
- The move has benefited several others in the lineup ... Smith hits behind Jacob House, who over the last 13 games has hit .400 with a team-high 13 RBIs ... House has raised his average 22 points over the last 13 games (.285 to .307).
- Kevin Gonzalez, who bats behind Smith, has also finished strong, hitting almost 30 points higher than his season average (.245) ... Gonzalez has a home run and 11 RBIs in the last 13 games, hitting at a .271 clip.

POWERFUL 1-2 PUNCH

- When staff ace **JOHN STILSON** missed his scheduled start against Dallas Baptist in early May, it put the spotlight on the rest of the Aggie weekend rotation—**MICHAEL WACHA** and **ROSS STRIPLING** ... the duo had already had a tremendous 2011, but since that time have been absolutely brilliant.
- Since Stilson missed his turn in the rotation, the Aggies are 14-4 ... Wacha and Stripling have combined for a perfect 8-0 record and a 2.13 ERA ... the duo have posted a .202 opponent average and a 4.4 strikeout-to-walk ratio, and have walked 15 in their last 80 2/3 innings.

HEAD COACH ROB CHILDRRESS

One of the top pitching coaches and recruiters in the country, Rob Childress is in his sixth season as the coach of the Texas A&M baseball program.



The Gilmer, Texas, native's expertise as a pitching coach is evident and has made an immediate impact, as A&M's pitching staff has ranked second in the rugged Big 12 in earned run average in each of his five seasons. His 2006 squad finished 25th in the country with a 3.56 team ERA, the Aggies' lowest since 1993 (3.40), while the 2010 staff ranked 13th nationally at 3.70--the highest finish by an A&M staff in 16 years.

A year ago, Childress and the Aggies accomplished something done only twice before in the program's 108-year history by earning a fourth consecutive trip to the NCAA tournament. The 2010 campaign also saw Texas A&M claim 43 victories to surpass the 40-win plateau for the third time in four seasons. Additionally, the Aggies once again ascended to the top of the Big 12 as they claimed their third league crown under Childress' direction when A&M won the league's postseason tournament. Along the way the Aggie pitching staff, led by All-Americans Barret Loux and John Stilson, ranked as one of the country's best, finishing atop the Big 12 and second nationally in strikeouts per nine innings (9.3). The Aggies' 612 strikeouts set a school record, topping the previous year's total of 568.

In 2009, Childress guided the Aggies to 37 wins and the school's third consecutive NCAA tournament berth, just the sixth time in the program's 107-year history that an A&M squad has advanced to the postseason three straight years. The pitching staff set a school record with 568 strikeouts, leading the Big 12 and finishing seventh nationally with an average of 9.5 per nine innings.

Named the Big 12's Coach of the Year by his peers in 2008, Childress guided the Aggies to 46 wins, their first regular-season championship in nine years and the first back-to-back NCAA regional championships in school history. Along the way A&M set a new school and Big 12 record by winning 16 straight conference games.

After just one season at the helm, Childress orchestrated the biggest turnaround in NCAA Division I baseball. His 2007 team finished 48-19, winning 23 more games than in 2006, in addition to claiming the NCAA College Station Regional championship, a berth in the Super Regionals and the school's first Big 12 title since 1999.

Childress was named the 19th head baseball coach in school history on June 21, 2005.

BRATSEN NAMED A LOUISVILLE SLUGGER FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICAN

Texas A&M outfielder Krey Bratsen was honored on June 8 as one of the top rookies in the nation when he was named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American by *Collegiate Baseball* magazine.

Additionally, Bratsen garnered second team Freshman All-American honors from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Associations on June 13.

NAQUIN, STRIPLING AND WACHA HONORED AS ALL-AMERICANS

Following a standout season during which they each helped lead the Texas A&M baseball team to another Big 12 Championship, sophomore outfielder Tyler Naquin, junior pitcher Ross Stripling and sophomore pitcher Michael Wacha have all been honored as All-Americans.

Collegiate Baseball selected Naquin as a second team performer and placed Stripling on the third team, while Wacha garnered third team accolades from *Baseball America*.

Naquin, the Big 12 Player of the Year, represented the Aggies on the second team while Stripling earned third team accolades.

Among Stripling's most memorable performances of the 2011 regular season was a four-hit complete game shutout on No. 4 Texas on the final day of the regular season which clinched Texas A&M's share of the Big 12 regular season title.

In addition to enjoying a incredible season all year long, Wacha has been dominant and is 4-0 with a 1.76 ERA since mid-May.

WACHA & NAQUIN SELECTED TO USA BASEBALL COLLEGIATE NATIONAL TEAM

Sophomore outfielder Tyler Naquin and sophomore pitcher Michael Wacha have been honored with selections to the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team.

The two Aggies will don the Red, White and Blue when the team begins play in late June as the Collegiate National Team is scheduled to face the Japanese National Team in a series of games between July 3-9.

The 2011 Collegiate National Team will have a Big 12 feel as it is slated to be led by Missouri head coach Tim Jamieson, who will serve as the squad's manager.

Naquin and Wacha become the 13th and 14th Aggies to represent the United States on the Collegiate National Team and the first since Daylan Holt in 1999. This season rather than have team trials to develop a roster, the squad will be selected by spring performances, which is the selection method for the professional national team.

NON-CONFERENCE SERIES WINNING STREAK AT OLSEN ROLLS ON

There were some tense moments in March 13th's contest against FIU but a late inning rally gave the Aggies' an 8-5 victory and prolonged an impressive streak against non-conference competition at Olsen Field. Texas A&M baseball has not lost a three-game series at its home park to a non-Big 12 opponent since dropping two of three games to Cal State Northridge in March 1995.

This spring the Aggies have earned series wins over Le Moyne, Gonzaga, FIU and Dallas Baptist in College Station this season to keep the streak alive.

REVISITING NAQUIN'S INCREDIBLE STREAK

Sophomore outfielder Tyler Naquin has been the Aggies' most consistent hitter all season long, but his career-best hitting streak of 27 games turned heads around the country. The run was the second longest ever by an Aggie and the longest by a Big 12 player this season.

COLLEGE STATION (6/3)—A six-run second inning jump started the Aggie offense Friday night as the No. 6 Texas A&M baseball team defeated Wright State 11-0 at Olsen Field during the opening day of the NCAA College Station Regional.

The second-seeded Aggies (43-18) continue their run at the NCAA College Station Regional on Saturday when they face No. 3 seed Seton Hall at 6:35 p.m. The Pirates shutdown second-seeded Arizona 4-0 in the early game on Friday, forcing the Wildcats to square off against Wright State in an elimination game at 12:35 p.m. Saturday.

On Friday, Texas A&M pounded out 16 hits while three Aggie pitchers combined in the shutout effort, which was the team's seventh of the season.

Sophomore Michael Wacha (8-3) led the way on the mound, tossing six scoreless innings while yielding just five WSU hits. Senior Steve Martin held the Raiders offense at bay with two solid frames before junior Estevan Uriegas tossed a perfect ninth inning.

After neither team was able to push across a run in the first inning, the Aggies went to work during their turn at bat in the second inning. Leading off the inning, third baseman Adam Smith singled sharply past the WSU shortstop. The ball, however, was misplayed in the outfield allowing Smith to come all the way around to score on the three-base error.

The big-inning continued as Texas A&M scored runs on an RBI single by Andrew Collazo and a Tyler Naquin run-scoring double before junior designated hitter Matt Juengel clubbed a three-run home run to put the Aggies up 6-0.

Juengel's shot, which cleared the wall inside the left field foul pole, was the Houston native's team-leading sixth long ball of the year. For the game, Juengel went 2-for-4 to join a list of six Aggies (Tyler Naquin, Krey Bratsen, Adam Smith, Kevin Gonzalez and Andrew Collazo) who enjoyed multi-hit games.

Collazo tacked on another run with his second RBI of the night during the bottom of the fourth as he notched a run-scoring double.

Texas A&M again used the long ball to make an impression on the scoreboard in the bottom of the fifth as senior catcher Kevin Gonzalez connected on his fifth homer of the season, a three-run shot to left center that made it 10-0 Aggies. The big fly was the 22nd of Gonzalez's career and his fifth of the season.

A bases-loaded walk issued to first baseman Jacob House in the Aggies' half of the eighth inning put the final run on the scoreboard.

The 2011 College Station Regional champion will be decided Monday night under the lights of Olsen Field when the two teams square off at 6:35 p.m. Texas A&M's Brandon Parrent (2-4, 3.65 ERA) and Arizona lefty Vincent Littleman (2-3, 8.10 ERA) are listed as the probable starters for the contest.

The loss snapped a seven-game winning streak for the Aggies, who fell to 44-19 on the year. Arizona, meanwhile, improved to 39-20 with the victory, which was their second of the day after defeating Seton Hall Sunday afternoon.

Early on it was Texas A&M who applied the pressure as All-American Tyler Naquin continued his hot hitting at the regional by leading off the contest with a double down the left field line. The Aggie sophomore came around to score the contest's first run later in the frame on a Wildcat throwing error to put Texas A&M ahead, 1-0.

Naquin finished 2-for-3 with three runs in the contest to notch his team-best 29th multi-hit game of the season. Both of the Spring, Texas, native's hits were two-baggers to bring his season total to 21.

Arizona designated hitter Josh Garcia used the long ball to tie the game at 1-1 in the bottom of the second as he went deep over the wall in left center for his team-leading eighth home run of the season.

Texas A&M battled back and retook the lead at 2-1 in the top of the third as the Aggies scored on a double play during the frame.

An unfortunate incident in the top of the third gave the game a wildly different look as Arizona starter Tyler Hale was struck hard in the arm by a sharp line drive off the bat of Krey Bratsen and forced to leave the game.

The Wildcats made a move to the pen and replaced the injured starter with sophomore Nick Cunningham (1-0), who was impressive on the mound. The Indianapolis product kept the Aggies off the scoreboard for 5.1 innings, limiting them to only two hits during his outing to pick up his first win of the season.

Freshman Derrick Hadley drew the start for Texas A&M and tossed five solid innings before being lifted following a leadoff double in the bottom of the sixth.

After the departure of Hadley, Arizona took control of the game with a three-run sixth that featured RBIs from Jett Brandy, Alex Mejia and Seth Mejias-Brean to give the Wildcats a 4-2 advantage.

Three more runs came across to score in the bottom of the sixth as Arizona opened up a 7-2 lead with the last five runs charged to A&M reliever Kyle Martin (2-2), who took the loss.

The Aggies attempted to rally in the top of the ninth and were able to push across a pair of runs on balks, but could not complete the comeback attempt.

Texas A&M dodged a bullet in the top of the fifth as the Wildcats collected three hits in the inning, the last of which appeared poised to plate the game's first run. However, when the final hit, a bloop single, landed in center field it was quickly scooped up by Bratsen, who gunned down UA catcher Jett Bandy at the plate with the help of a great tag from senior catcher Kevin Gonzalez.

Wacha was impressive during his second start at the tournament, tossing seven scoreless innings while limiting the Wildcats to just five hits and logging four strikeouts.

Senior Nick Fleece (7-1) tossed a scoreless top of the eighth to send the game to the bottom of the inning still tied at 0-0.

Arizona starter Kurt Heyer (8-5), who was also making his second start of the regional, was also effective on the mound as he kept the Aggies scoreless while working into the eighth inning.

However, Texas A&M was finally able to get to Heyer in the bottom of the eighth as a two-out double by Naquin kick started the Aggie offense. With the go-ahead run in scoring position at second, it was Bratsen who etched his name in Aggie baseball history with a sharp single up the middle to break the ice on the scoreboard.

Following an intentional walk to designated hitter Matt Juengel, House cashed in with the two-run double off UA reliever Bryce Bandilla.

Junior Ross Stripling, who tossed a complete game in a win over Seton Hall on Saturday, worked a perfect ninth inning for his fourth save of the season.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (6/12)—A four-run top of the seventh proved to be the deciding margin Saturday afternoon at Dick Howser Stadium as the No. 6 Texas A&M baseball team defeated Florida State 6-2 during the opening game of the Tallahassee Super Regional.

Texas A&M starter Ross Stripling (14-2) turned in an impressive effort as he scattered just two runs and seven hits during seven innings of work. The Southlake, Texas, native has been a workhorse for the maroon and white this season and Saturday was his 10th start of seven or more innings and his eighth in his last nine starts.

Junior designated hitter Matt Juengel gave the visiting Aggies an early lead in the top of the first as he went deep off FSU starter Sean Gilmartin, driving an off-speed pitch high off the scoreboard in left field for his team-leading seventh home run of the season.

Florida State (45-18) responded during its first turn at bat in the bottom of the first as the Seminoles tied the game at 1-1 after a lead-off double by second baseman Devon Travis turned into FSU's first run on a sac fly later in the inning.

After the excitement of the first inning, the game took on the feel of a pitcher's duel between Stripling and Gilmartin as the two began trading zeros on the scoreboard.

With the score still tied at 1-1 in the bottom of the sixth, Seminole first baseman Jayce Boyd broke the string of scoreless innings as he connected on a solo home run leading off the inning.

The long ball was the seventh of the season for Boyd and gave the 'Noles a 2-1 advantage but it would also be the last tally that FSU could muster against Stripling and the Aggie bullpen.

Texas A&M, however, found its offensive groove during the top of the seventh as junior first baseman Jacob House singled through the right side to begin the frame and was quickly joined on base by Adam Smith, who drew a five-pitch walk. Following a sacrifice bunt by Kevin Gonzalez that moved both runners into scoring position, sophomore left fielder Brandon Wood stepped to the plate and came up big for A&M. The sophomore from Sugar Land, Texas, found a hole on the left side of the 'Noles infield to drive in both runners and give the Aggies their first lead since the opening inning.

The two-out rally continued in the next as bat when senior shortstop Kenny Jackson added an RBI double to right center and later in the frame as sophomore right fielder Tyler Naquin capped the inning off with a bloop RBI single into left center, leaving A&M up 5-2.

House added an insurance run in the top of the eighth as he plated a tally with a sacrifice fly to deep right field.

Sophomore Kyle Martin tossed a scoreless eighth inning before senior Nick Fleece got the final three outs of the contest to give A&M its first win in a Super Regional since 1999.

Gilmartin (12-2) took the loss for FSU, only his second of the season, allowing five earned runs in seven innings on the mound.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (6/13)—Florida State pounded out 23 runs on 16 hits Sunday evening at Dick Howser Stadium to defeat the No. 6 Texas A&M baseball team 23-9 and even the Tallahassee Super Regional at one game apiece.

FSU (46-18) wasted no time getting its offense in gear Sunday as the Seminoles erupted in the top of the first by batting around to plate five runs against Texas A&M starter Derrick Hadley (0-1). The Aggie freshman lasted just one inning and was tagged with six runs before leaving after a leadoff double in the top of the second inning.

An RBI single by Seminole right fielder James Ramsey in the top of the second extended the FSU lead to 6-0.

FSU left fielder Stuart Tapley, who homered twice in the contest, extended the FSU lead to 8-0 during the top of the third as he connected on a two-run shot off A&M reliever Brandon Parrent.

Texas A&M hit the comeback trail in the home half of the third as the Aggies plated six runs to pull within 8-6. A bases-loaded walk drawn by Krey Bratsen kicked off the scoring for the Aggies before sac flies from Matt Juengel and Kevin Gonzalez along with an RBI single from Jacob House scored runs for A&M. Sophomore left fielder Brandon Wood capped off the inning by driving in two more runs with a double to right center.

Tapley again put a run on the scoreboard for FSU in the top of the fourth as he notched an RBI double and the Seminoles were able to score a second run on the play following an A&M throwing error, making the score 10-6.

Florida State used the long ball to build upon its lead from that point on as shortstop Justin Gonzalez connected on a three-run long ball in the top of the sixth and was followed in the next at bat by Tapley's second homer of the game.

Seminole first baseman Jayce Boyd, who went 4-for-4 at the plate Sunday, joined the home run parade in the top of the seventh as he connect on a two-run shot to make the score 16-6. The homer was his second against Aggie pitching in as many days.

Senior Gregg Alcazar came off the bench to contribute a two-run single for Texas A&M during the bottom of the seventh, which also featured an RBI single from senior shortstop Kenny Jackson.

The FSU offensive fireworks reached a crescendo during the top of the eighth when seven more Seminole runs crossed the plate to give the game its final score.

Reliever Scott Stitz (4-2) picked up the win for the 'Noles by pitching four innings against the Aggies, who used five pitchers in the contest.

The start of the game was delayed 1:06 due to a rain storm moving through the area around Dick Howser Stadium.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (6/14)—For the first time since 1999, the Texas A&M baseball team is headed to Omaha and the College World Series as Monday the Aggies punched their ticket with an 11-2 victory over Florida State during the deciding game of the NCAA Tallahassee Super Regional.

Unlike the previous day when the Seminoles put up a crooked number on the scoreboard in the first inning, on Monday it was the Aggies who exploded offensively during their first turn at bat. Aided by three walks in the inning, Texas A&M put six runs on the board to take a commanding 6-0 lead.

After the first three Aggies of the inning reached base, junior first baseman Jacob House drew a base-loaded walk to push across the first run of the contest. The at bat also signaled the end of the evening for FSU starter Hunter Scantling (3-3), who surrendered four runs while not recording an out in the contest.

A second bases-loaded walk during the next at bat with Adam Smith at the plate made it 2-0 Aggies and senior catcher Kevin Gonzalez followed with a two-run double. Left fielder Brandon Wood and shortstop Kenny Jackson put the finishing touches on the inning as they each drove in a run during the frame allowing the Aggies to bat around and take control of the game.

The early offense would be all that Texas A&M starter Michael Wacha (9-3) would need as the right-hander neutralized the hot-hitting Seminoles during 7.1 innings of work. The Texarkana, Texas, native limited FSU to only a pair of runs on three hits while logging eight strikeouts in the contest.

Smith continued A&M's surging start during the bottom of the second when he connected on his sixth home run of the year, a two-run shot of FSU reliever Brian Busch that made it 8-0 A&M.

The Seminoles got on the scoreboard during the top of the third as left fielder Stuart Tapley hit a solo home run off Wacha. Later in the bottom of the fifth, an RBI double by FSU catcher Rapael Lopez helped the 'Noles climb to within seven runs at 9-2.

Again taking advantage of walks by the FSU pitching staff, the Aggies increased their lead to 11-2 during the bottom of the seventh with a bases-loaded walk issued to Matt Juengel and a RBI single from House.

Relievers Kyle Martin and Nick Fleece closed the door on the Seminoles by getting the finale five outs of the game to clinch the win.

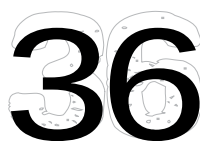
