About the Victory

- The Aggies completed their first-ever perfect 7-0 home worksheet. It was the first undefeated home worksheet since the pandemic-altered 2020 schedule when the Aggies were 4-0 at Kyle Field. It was Texas A&M's first undefeated home slate in a **full** season since **R.C. Slocum's** Aggies posted three-straight 6-0 home schedules from 1997-99.
- It was the first shutout of the **Mike Elko** era at Texas A&M and the first by the Aggies since a 31-0 victory over Sam Houston in the 2022 season-opener.
- The victory pushed Texas A&M's win streak to 11 games, which matches the most recent 11-game streak that stretched over the 2020-21 seasons. It's the longest in-season win string since Slocum's Aggies won the first 12 games of the 1992 season.
- The Aggies improved to 11-0 for the first time since 1992.
- Today's attendance of 104,877 marked the Aggies' 10th straight home crowd of 100,000-plus. Additionally, Texas A&M shattered season records for average and cumulative home attendance with an average of 106,159 and 743,113 total in seven home contests. It was the sixth time Texas A&M has drawn more than 700,000 fans through the gates at Kyle Field.

Offense

- Texas A&M rolled to 475 total yards, marking the team's 10th straight game with 400-plus yards. It is the team's longest streak of 400-plus games in a season since Heisman Trophy winner **Johnny Manziel** directed the Maroon & White offense to 13 straight in 2012.
- The Aggies rushed and passed for 200-plus yards for the sixth time in 2025, rushing for 247 yards and gaining 228 through the air.
- Redshirt sophomore QB **Marcel Reed** completed 10-of-15 passes for 120 yards and three touchdowns, including a 58-yard strike to freshman WR **Ashton Bethel-Roman**. It marked Reed's fifth game this season with at least three scoring strikes.
- Reed moved to No. 5 on the Aggie single season passing touchdown list with 25, while ranking seventh on the Texas A&M career passing touchdown list with 41 in just 25 career games.
- Bethel-Roman led the Aggies with 61 yards receiving on two catches, while registering his first career multi-score game. The Missouri City, Texas, native became the third Aggie receiver to catch multiple touchdowns in a game this season.
- WR **KC Concepcion** caught a team-high five passes for 42 yards and touchdown, marking his ninth touchdown catch of the season, which is tied for eighth-most in school history.
- Redshirt senior RB **Amari Daniels** posted the first 100-yard rushing game of his career in his final regular season home game. Daniels rushed for 106 yards and a touchdown on nine carries against the Bulldogs.

- Also logging his career rushing high was true freshman RB **Jamarion Morrow**, who gained 52 yards on nine carries.
- Redshirt freshman WR **Izaiah Williams** had a career-high four catches for 14 yards.
- Among the offensive career firsts were: Freshman RB **Tiger Riden Jr.** scored his first touchdown on a 1-yard plunge. He also received his first carries and finished with 45 yards on 11 totes ... Freshman QB **Brady Hart** completed his first passes and finished the day 5-of-9 for 62 yards ... Senior RB **Preston Landis** scored his first-career rushing touchdown on Senior Day. ... Other Aggies gaining first-career carries were redshirt freshman RB **Ramarian Tillman** and junior RB **Ronnie Crosby III.** ... Logging their first career catches were Landis, freshman WR **Blake Buntyn** and freshman WR **TK Norman**.

Defense

- The defense limited Samford to 77 total yards, the lowest offensive output by an opponent since 1996 when the “Wrecking Crew” allowed just 70 yards in a 55-0 win over North Texas. The Bulldogs were held to 31 rushing yards and 46 passing yards.
- Texas A&M matched its season high with 11.0 tackles for loss, which marked the Aggies’ third game with double-digit TFLs. Redshirt freshman DE **Solomon Williams** led the team with 2.0 tackles for loss and the Aggies received 0.5-plus TFLs from 10 different players.
- Freshman DE **Marco Jones** led the Aggies in tackles for the first time with a career-high seven stops against the Bulldogs, while fellow true freshman LB **Noah Mikhail** also chipped in a career high with six stops.

Special Teams

- Redshirt sophomore P **Tyler White** averaged 44.7 yards on three punts and all three were downed inside the Samford 20-yard line.
- Freshman DT **Landon Rink** produced his first career block when he batted down a third-quarter Samford field goal attempt. It was the first block by an Aggie since **Shemar Turner** in 2023. Junior CB **Jayvon Thomas** returned the block 41 yards.
- Graduate student PK **Jared Zirkel** booted a career-high two field goals in his final regular season home game with FGs of 25 yards and 39 yards. He also connected on 6-of-6 extra points for a 12-point effort on Senior Day.
