Quick Hits

- The Aggies continue a three-game homestand against Sam Houston State Wednesday with a 7 p.m. contest at Reed Arena.
- The Bearcats are the ninth-most common opponent in Texas A&M men's basketball history with 84 meetings on the hardwood... A&M leads the series 67-17 and has won 18 straight meetings between the schools.
- One of the most consistent performers this season, junior **Jalen Jones** is averaging 12.8 points per game and has reached double-digit scoring during four of five games this season ... The Dallas native also leads the team in rebounding at 7.2 boards per game.
- Since joining the active roster, junior **Danuel House** has given the Aggies a significant offensive boost, scoring 32 points in two games (16.0 points per game).
- Rookie **Alex Robinson** dished out a season-high nine assists in the win over New Orleans ... his performance marked the first time someone other than Alex Caruso has led the Aggies in assists since Feb. 20 of last season.
- As a team, the Aggies are shooting 34.1 percent from beyond the 3-point arc ... **Peyton Allen** and **Danuel House** lead the way with identical 41.7 shooting percentages from long-range ... Allen made 6-of-7 field goal attempts including 4-of-5 from 3-point range to pour in a game-high 16 points during the win over UNO.

Texas A&M Bahamas-Bound to Battle 4 Atlantis in 2015

ESPN announced on Nov. 28 evening that the Texas A&M men's basketball team will join an impressive field at next year's Battle 4 Atlantis, which will take place at Atlantis Paradise Island, Bahamas, Nov. 25-27, 2015.

Joining the Aggies for Thanksgiving in the Bahamas next season will be Charlotte, Connecticut, Gonzaga, Michigan, Syracuse, Texas and Washington.



House Makes Splash in Debut

After receiving good news that the NCAA had granted him a waiver to play the 2014-15 season after transferring from the University of Houston, junior guard Danuel House hit the court for the first time as an Aggie on Nov. 23 against New Mexico.

Initially not with the team in San Juan for the Puerto Rico Tip-Off, House flew to the island to join his teammates. The Fresno, Texas, native made an immediate impact for the team as he made 7-of-11 field goal attempts to produce a game-high 18 points. In addition to making highlights with a pair of spectacular dunks, House added six rebounds, two assists, a block and a steal.

Aggies at Full Strength on the Court

After heading into the season with several questions regarding the availability of some members, the Aggie basketball team now has its full complement of players. Here's a look at each situation player by player:

Jalen Jones • Junior • Guard/Forward • 6-7 • 223

ISSUE: After transferring from SMU in December of 2013, Jones was initially not eligible for the fall semester.

RESOLUTION: Jones was granted a waiver on Oct. 7 allowing him to play this season ... Will be forced to sit out the first four games of the 2015-16 season after taking part in a two closed scrimmages for SMU prior to transferring to Texas A&M.

Dylan Johns • Sophomore • Center • 6-11 • 231

ISSUE: Suspended by the NCAA for the first three basketball contests of the season of this season based on a violation of NCAA rules that occurred prior to his enrollment at Texas A&M.

RESOLUTION: Served his suspension and returned to the active line-up on Nov. 23 against New Mexico.

Danuel House • Junior • Guard • 6-7 • 207

ISSUE: After transferring from Houston over the summer, House was initially not eligible for the entire 2014-15 campaign.

RESOLUTION: House was granted a waiver on Nov. 21 allowing him to play this season ... made his Aggie debut Nov. 23 against New Mexico.

Tonny Trocha-Morelos • Freshman • Center • 6-10 • 224

ISSUE: Unable to play at the outset of the season due to his final NCAA amateurism certification not being complete.

RESOLUTION: NCAA and Texas A&M reached final eligibility certification on Nov 22 ... made his debut Nov. 23 against New Mexico.

Aggies Win Two Games at Puerto Rico Tip-Off



A trip to the island proved to be a fruitful one for the Aggies as they captured a pair of wins at the 2014 Puerto Rico Tip-Off in San Juan Nov. 20-23.

The weekend started off with a hard-fought 55-53 loss to Dayton that featured the eighth career double-double by senior Kourtney Roberson. The Arcadia, La., set a career high with 15 boards in the contest to go along with 12 points.

Texas A&M bounced back with 59-50 victory over College of Charleston during which junior Jalen Jones posted the first double-double of his A&M career, finishing with 12 points and 11 boards. After trailing midway through the second period, the Aggies closed strong as senior Jordan Green scored nine of the Aggies' last 15 points in the game to finishing with 11 points on the day.

During the tournament's final day, Texas A&M was reinforced by the additions of Danuel House, Dylan Johns and Tonny Trocha-Morelos before going on the defeat New Mexico 64-51. House was the star of the day as he notched a game-high 18 points during his first action wearing the Maroon & White.

Aggies Hit the Century Mark for the First Time Since '08

The 109-point outburst during the season opener against Northwestern State not only turned heads but it also gave the Texas A&M men's basketball program its first 100-point game since the 2007-08 campaign.

It was the first time the Aggies have hit the century mark since scoring 110 points in a five-overtime loss to Baylor on Jan. 2, 2008, as well as the first time the Aggies hit triple digits on the scoreboard in a non-overtime game since Dec. 8, 2007, against Texas State.

Overall, it marked the 53rd time the Aggies have scored 100 points or more in program history and the ninth time they have done it at Reed Arena.



Series History: Sam Houston St.

Texas A&M leads 67-17

A&M streak: Won 18

- Texas A&M leads the all-time series, 67-17, which dates back to 1945 ... the Aggies have won 18 in a row, but the teams have played just twice since 1998.
- SHSU has been defeated in its only three trips to Reed Arena, including the most recent meeting which occurred on Nov. 24 of last season.
- During the 79-62 A&M win, Antwan Space approached a double-double with a game-high 12 points and nine rebounds.
- The Bearkats' last win over the Aggies came on Dec. 5, 1956 in Huntsville (59-58).
- A&M head coach Billy Kennedy is no stranger to the Bearkats and is 10-5 all-time as a head coach against Sam Houston State ... Kennedy faced SHSU 13 times while serving as the head coach at Southeastern Louisiana from 1999-05.
- Kennedy's counterpart, SHSU's Jason Hooton, is 0-2 all-time against the Aggies.
- Just 77 miles separate the two schools' home courts.

Head Coach Billy Kennedy

• Billy Kennedy was named the 21st coach in Texas A&M men's basketball history on May 16, 2011 ... he is a native of New Orleans and is in his 17th season as a head coach, with a record of 265-229.

• Over his last 10 years as a head coach, Kennedy's teams have averaged 20 wins a season, earned four conference titles and made four trips to the postseason—two to the NCAA Tournament, one to the NIT and one to the CBI ... in addition, the Murray State squad which he built before heading to College Station finished the 2012 season 31-2, won the Ohio Valley title at 15-1 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

New Look Coaching Staff

The Texas A&M coaching staff has a very different look from Billy Kennedy's first three seasons at the helm in Aggieland with the additions of Amir Abdur-Rahim and former Mississippi State head coach Rick Stansbury as assistants.

Overall, the complete men's basketball staff boasts a combined resume of 121 years of coaching experience (*assistant or head coach at the collegiate level*) included 38 seasons as a head coach.

Here's a look at the new additions to the A&M staff this season:

Rick Stansbury • Assistant Coach

Caruso Named to Cousy Award Watch List

Junior Alex Caruso has been recognized nationally as he was named to the watch list for the 2015 Bob Cousy Award, which is presented annually to the top point guard in college basketball.

The initial watch list of candidates for the Cousy Award will be narrowed down from 35 to 20 in early February, before thinning to a final five in early March. The winner will be announced on Championship Monday in Indianapolis at the Hall of Fame's Class of 2015 announcement and press conference.

Texas A&M is no stranger to the Cousy Award as Aggie standout Acie Law IV garnered the accolade in 2007. Joining Law on the list of previous winners are Jameer Nelson (St. Joseph's), Raymond Felton (North Carolina), Dee Brown (Illinois), DJ Augustin (Texas), Ty Lawson (North Carolina), Greivis Vasquez (Maryland), Kemba Walker (Connecticut), Kendall Marshall (North Carolina), Trey Burke (Michigan) and last year's winner Shabazz Napier (Connecticut).

In addition to Caruso, the SEC placed four other players on the watch list - Kasey Hill (Florida), Andrew Harrison (Kentucky), Tyler Ulis (Kentucky) and Jarvis Summers (Ole Miss).

Caruso Honored as Second Team Preseason All-SEC

The Southeastern Conference unveiled its 11th annual men's basketball coaches' preseason All-SEC selections Thursday with Texas A&M junior guard Alex Caruso being named to the second team.

Emerging as one of the SEC's top playmakers a year ago, Caruso led the league in total assists (170), assists per game (5.0) and total steals (6.9) while also seeing his scoring average jump from 5.5 points per game as a freshman in 2012-13 to 9.0 last season.

The coaches' preseason All-SEC first and second teams consist of a minimum of eight players on each squad, voted on by the SEC head men's basketball coaches. No ties were broken and no predicted order of finish was made.

Aggie Haul in Top-Five Recruiting Class

During the early signing period Billy Kennedy and staff inked a consensus top-five signing class, one which is ranked No. 3 by 247 Sports, ESPN, Rival and Scout (as of 11/14) as well as being widely regarded as the best class in the history of the program.

Kennedy Receives Two-Year Contract Extension

The Texas A&M University System Board of Regents authorized Texas A&M University Interim President Mark A. Hussey on Sept. 3 to negotiate and execute a two-year extension to the contract of men's basketball head coach Billy Kennedy, as proposed by Director of Athletics Eric Hyman.

"Coach Kennedy understands our commitment to building champions both in the classroom and in competition," Hyman said. "Our basketball program has made tremendous strides academically under Billy's leadership, while he has also raised the overall on-court talent level of our student-athletes. Our ultimate goal is to build the Texas A&M basketball program the right way, with a foundation for sustained postseason success."

The agreement extends Kennedy's current contract to run through the 2018 season. Financial terms of the contract will remain unchanged.

Kentucky Tops Preseason SEC Media Poll; Aggies Ninth

Kentucky was predicted to win the 2015 Southeastern Conference men's basketball championship in voting by a select panel of both SEC and national media members.

The Wildcats, who are the overall preseason favorite for the 10th time since the 1998-99 season, tallied all 20 first-place votes.

Kentucky sophomore Aaron Harrison was the choice of the media for SEC Men's Basketball Player of the Year. Aaron Harrison was one of five Wildcats that received votes in the preseason Player of the Year voting, joining Willie Cauley-Stein, Andrew Harrison, Alex Poythress and Karl-Anthony Towns. Georgia's Charles Mann, LSU's Jarell Martin and Jordan Mickey along with Ole Miss' Jarvis Summers also received votes in the Player of the Year voting.

Aaron Harrison, Mickey and Summers were each All-SEC First Team selections along with Arkansas' Bobby Portis and Florida's Michael Frazier II.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas (AP) – Texas A&M relied on a season-best nine 3-pointers to run away from New Orleans 87-65 on Friday.

The Aggies made 9-of-21 3-pointers in breaking open a game that had stayed close for much of the first half.

Peyton Allen led the Aggies with 16 points, making 4 of 5 3-pointers. SMU transfer Jalen Jones added 15 points. The Aggies (4-1) led 29-25 before closing out the first half on an 11-3 run to lead 40-28 at the break. A&M didn't ease up in the second half, holding a double-digit lead over the last 18 minutes.

Christavious Gill led the Privateers (1-2) with 16 points.

TEAM NOTES

- After trailing by two points with just over 10 minutes to play in the opening half, the Aggies went on a 26-12 run during the period's final 9:50 to take a 40-28 lead into the intermission.
- For the game, the Aggies shot 52.4 percent (33-for-63), marking the second time they've been better than 50 percent from the field in a game this season (56.8 percent vs. Northwestern State on Nov. 14)
- The contest saw Texas A&M set a season-high in blocked shots (7) and committed a season-low 10 turnovers.
- Displaying great ball movement, Texas A&M was credited with 22 assists on 33 made field goals.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Freshman sharpshooter Peyton Allen enjoyed an outstanding afternoon, scoring a season-best 16 points ... the Springfield, Ill., native made 6-of-7 field goal attempts with a 4-of-5 mark from 3-point range.
- Rookie point guard Alex Robinson distributed a personal-best nine assists in the contest.
- Junior guard Danuel House scored 14 points on the day to give him 32 points in two games this season (16.0 points per game).
- Junior guard Alex Caruso dished out six assists in the contest to produce his eighth consecutive game of five or more assists in a streak that dates back to last season.

- **Reveille**, the first lady of Aggieland, is a purebred collie and the official mascot of Texas A&M. As a five-star general, she is the highest ranking member of the Corps of Cadets. The most current Reveille is Reveille VIII, and she was officially introduced on August 30, 2008.
- **Yell Leaders** are a team of upperclassmen, three seniors and two juniors, elected each year by the student body. Aggie Yell Leaders still wear white during games and attend all home and away football games and many home events of other sports.
- The distinctive **Aggie Ring** serves as the symbolic link to the Aggie network of former students. The ring is not given, it must be earned academically. It was E.C. Jonas, class of 1894, who designed the ring Aggies wear today. Nothing on the ring has changed, except when the university's name changed to Texas A&M University in 1963.
- At a yell practice before the 1930 TCU game, a dedicated fan and member of the Texas A&M Board of Regents named Pinky Downs '06 shouted, 'What are we going to do to those Horned Frogs?' Improvising, he borrowed the name of a sharp-pronged frog hunting tool, called a gig. **'Gig 'em, Aggies!'** he said as he made a fist with his thumb extended straight up. With that, the first hand sign in the old Southwest Conference was born.
- In true Aggie Spirit, **'Howdy'** is the official greeting of Texas A&M. The university is known for its welcoming attitude and for making sure no one who visits the campus feels like a stranger.
- Every April 21, **Muste**r brings Aggies together worldwide. The stirring remembrance ceremony is dedicated to Aggies who have gone before us but are forever united in spirit.

Aggie Basketball 101

- The Aggies are in the midst of the 103rd season of basketball at Texas A&M University ... the first team was fielded for the 1912-13 campaign.
- The inaugural team was coached by F.D. Steger and won its first ever game (date unknown) over Marlin (Texas) High School, 78-8 ... the first "collegiate" opponent for the program was later that season with a pair of games against Sam Houston Normal Institute (now Sam Houston State University).

The Homes of Aggie Hoops

- **DEWARE FIELD HOUSE (1924-1954)**: Originally named Memorial Gymnasium, DeWare Field House sat on the northwest corner of Kyle Field and loomed over the football stadium until the construction of the second decks in the 1950s ... once basketball moved to G. Rollie White, the facility was still used for recreational sports before it was demolished in 1997 to make room for the Kyle Field north end zone expansion ... it was built for a cost of \$140,000.
- **G. ROLLIE WHITE COLISEUM (1954-1998)**: Known as "The Holler House on the Brazos", Aggie basketball called this building home for 44 years ... it had a seating capacity of 7,800 ... it is located on the northeast corner of Kyle Field (football) and, while still standing, is no longer used for sporting events—the arena floor is the temporary home of the campus bookstore while renovations to the student union (known as the Memorial Student Center) are going on across the street ... it was built for a cost of \$670,000 and was air-conditioned in 1967.
- **REED ARENA (1998-)**: 12,989-seat Reed Arena was built for \$33.4 million, opened in the spring of 1998 and became the new home of Aggie basketball that fall ... the building has seen several recent renovations, including the addition of a large four-sided, center-hung videoboard and ribbon boards that encircle the arena bowl and the \$23 million Cox-McFerrin Center for Aggie Basketball.
