The No. 6 Texas A&M Aggies embark on their 23rd consecutive NCAA Championship as they host the Lamar Cardinals in a match Friday evening at Ellis Field.

The Aggies earned an automatic bid with their 2-1 victory over the Arkansas Razorbacks in the SEC Tournament championship match. The Maroon & White enter play with a 17-2-1 overall record and a school-record 13-match win streak. Texas A&M finished in second place in the SEC regular-season, one point behind South Carolina.

Both squads enter the match on lengthy win streaks. Along with the Aggies' aforementioned 13-match streak, Lamar is winner of a school-record 12 straight matches. The Cardinals are 18-3-1 overall and earned the Southland Conference double, finishing 10-1-0 in league play and winning all three matches at the conference tournament.

Texas A&M owns a 10-game NCAA Championship win streak at Ellis Field with the last postseason home loss coming in 2007. The last Ellis Field tournament win came in 2015 when the Aggies bested Washington, 2-1, in a first round game en route to their sixth Elite Eight.

### WIN STREAK

A win Friday would give the Aggies a 14-game win streak, the longest win streak in school history. The overall school record is 13 consecutive wins encompassing the last 10 games of the 1994 season and the first three games of the 1995 campaign. Texas A&M won 11 consecutive games in 2001 and strung together 10-game win streaks in 1995, 2006 and '07.

### ADVANCING TO GOOD COMPANY

Texas A&M has advanced to the second round of the NCAA Championship in each of their last 19 appearances. It marks the third-longest active streak behind only North Carolina (35) and Virginia (23). The Maroon and White have gone 17-0-2 during the span, advancing on PKs in 2003 (vs. SMU) and 2010 (vs. North Dakota State).

## NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

The Aggies are playing in their 23rd consecutive NCAA Championship, one of five teams to play in each tournament since 1995. The other schools to make it to every tournament since 1995 are North Carolina (1982-2016), Notre Dame (1993-2016), Virginia (1994-2016) and Penn State (1995-2016). A&M is 34-21-6 (.607) all-time in the NCAA Championship. The Aggies have appeared in the Sweet Sixteen 14 times. The Maroon and White have advanced to the Elite Eight six times, including two of the last two three seasons. The Aggies made their first College Cup appearance in 2014.

Since 1999, Texas A&M has made 13 Sweet Sixteen appearances which is tied with Stanford for fifth in the nation for highest total during that span. The Aggies trail only North Carolina (17), UCLA (17), Virginia (17), and Florida State (15) over that stretch.

G Guerrieri and North Carolina's Anson Dorrance are the only two coaches to appear in every NCAA Championship since 1995.

## WINNING

With their win at Georgia, Texas A&M was ensured their 25th consecutive winning season, every season the program has existed. The closest the Aggies have finished to the .500 mark is the 12-8-2 (.591) record they posted last season. Only three teams in the nation boast longer active strings of winning campaigns - North Carolina (36), Stanford (30) and Notre Dame (30).

## WATT TIES SCHOOL RECORD

With her four goals against Missouri in the SEC Tournament quarterfinal round, **ALLY WATT** tied the Texas A&M single-game mark accomplished twice by Ashlee Pistorius. Pistorius scored four times against Baylor in 2005 and equaled her own mark against Baylor in 2007. The performance marked the first career hat trick for Watt.

# 2017 TEXAS A&M SOCCER GAME NOTES

## ON THE 7-1 WIN

The seven goals smashed A&M's mark for an SEC Tournament match. The old Aggie mark was three against Georgia in the 2013 quarterfinal round. The most goals the Aggies scored in an entire SEC Tournament was five in both 2013 and 2014, two years in which A&M captured the tournament title. The tally marked a new league tournament record for the Maroon & White, besting the six goals they scored against Iowa State in a Big 12 Championship quarterfinal game in 1998.

Texas A&M came up one goal shy of the SEC Tournament single-game mark set by Arkansas in an 8-0 win vs. Auburn in the 1993 semifinals and equaled by Vanderbilt in an 8-3 win against Arkansas in the 1997 quarterfinals.

## STRONG SECOND HALFS

The Aggies have been dominant in the second half and overtime of matches, outscoring opponents 27-7 after halftime. The margin includes 24-7 in the second half and 3-0 in overtime periods.

## NIP-AND-TUCK

The Aggies have fared well in tightly contested matches in 2017, going 11-1-1 (.885) in matches decided by one goal or less. This year A&M has posted one-goal wins over Pepperdine (1-0, ot), Florida (2-1), Arkansas (2-1), Utah Valley (1-0), Georgia (2-1, 2ot), Ole Miss (1-0), LSU (1-0), Vanderbilt (2-1), Mississippi State (2-1) and again against Florida (2-1) and Arkansas (2-1). They played Oklahoma State to a 2-2 draw and suffered a 1-0 loss at Auburn.

Last season the Maroon & White didn't fare as well in the same scenario, going 8-5-2 (.600).

## LONE STAR DOMINANCE

With the 1-0 win at TCU in the NCAA Championship first round, the Aggies improved to 26-0-5 (.919) against in-state rivals since 2008, including an 11-0-4 record against their former Big 12 Conference colleagues. During the regular-season, the Aggies burned Rice 4-1. In 2015, Texas A&M went 3-0-0 against teams from Texas, toppling Rice (4-2) Abilene Christian (4-1) and North Texas (2-1).

## SERIES VS. LAMAR

This marks the Aggies' first-ever meeting against the Cardinals.

## SCOUTING LAMAR

The Cardinals enter play with an 18-3-1 overall mark and a 12-match win streak. Lamar won the Southland Conference regular-season title with a 10-1-0 mark and completed the double with victories over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (1-0), Central Arkansas (2-1) and Stephen F. Austin (2-0) at the league tournament.

Kelso Peskin leads Lamar in scoring with 27 points on eight goals and 11 assists. Lucy Ashworth has added 16 points on four goals and eight assists. Madison Ledet (6 g, 3 a) and Juliana Ocampo (4 g, 7 a) each have 15 points.

Lauren Lovejoy has played all 2,000 minutes in goal for the Cardinals. She owns a 0.90 goals-against average, .817 save percentage and 10 shutouts.

Lamar is playing in its first NCAA Championship. The Cardinals, who went from worst to first in the Southland this season, began play in 2007. This marks just their third winning season and second campaign with double digits in the win column. Prior to this year, the best season came in 2012 when Lamar finished 11-9-1 overall and 6-2-0 in the Southland Conference.

## WATT'S OFFENSIVE TURNAROUND

After struggling to find her footing the first eight matches, sophomore forward **ALLY WATT** has turned it on the last 12 matches. Over that stretch the mercurial Colorado Springs, Colo., native has tallied 22 points on 10 goals and two assists while the Aggies have gone 12-0-0. In the first eight matches, Watt scored just one goal as the A&M started the year 5-2-1.

## CONFERENCE WIN STREAK

The Aggies ended the regular season with a nine-match win streak in league play, the longest streak as a member of the SEC for Texas A&M. Their previous long was an eight-match streak in 2013. Texas A&M also won eight consecutive matches as a member of the Big 12 in 2010. The school record for a conference win streak is 14 games in Big 12 action between Oct. 4, 1996 and Oct. 10, 1997. A&M also boasts a 12-match Big 12 win streak between Oct. 21, 2005 and Oct. 22, 2006, a nine-match Big 12 win streak between Oct. 11, 1998 and Aug. 29, 1999 and an eight-match Big 12 win streak from Oct. 19, 2001 and Oct. 6, 2002.

### MALHERBE FULFILLS OLYMPIC DREAM

Junior midfielder **STEPHANIE MALHERBE** fulfilled the dreams of every soccer player, taking the pitch at the Olympics. She played at the Rio Olympics as a member of the South African National Team. Malherbe played all 270 minutes for Banyana Banyana as they went 0-2-1 at the tournament. Playing a holding midfield position, Malherbe helped out a squad that yielded just two goals in the three contests.

Malherbe was one of the 18 players selected for the Olympic roster. She started training with the South Africans in January and appeared in 10 international matches. She also started for South Africa in a match against the United States Women's National Team in Chicago. Malherbe and her teammates impressed the world with their performance, hanging with the U.S. for the entire 90 minutes in a 1-0 defeat.

## GUERRIERI RANKS AMONG THE NATION'S WINNINGEST COACHES

Texas A&M head coach **G GUERRIERI** ranks among the leaders in winning percentage and victories among active Division I coaches. With a career record of 440-138-34 (.747), he ranks fourth in victories and sixth in winning percentage (minimum five years as a Division I head coach). Guerrieri ranks fourth all-time among NCAA Division I coaches in victories, trailing North Carolina's Anson Dorrance (824), Florida's Becky Burleigh (486) and Santa Clara's Jerry Smith (463). Connecticut's Len Tsantiris announced his retirement with 570 career victories under his belt.

## TEXAS A&M AT THE SEC TOURNAMENT

The Aggies are 13-3 (.813) all-time in the SEC Tournament. Texas A&M has advanced to the championship match in four of the six seasons they have been in the league, including winning titles in 2013, '14 and '17. The Maroon & White are 3-1 in tournament action against South Carolina. They are 2-1 against Florida and 1-1 against Auburn. The Aggies are 1-0 against Alabama, Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky, Missouri, Ole Miss and LSU.

## CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

The Aggies have a tradition of success at conference tournaments with an overall mark of 36-13-4 (.717) in league tournaments, winning seven conference tournament crowns, including SEC Tournament crowns in 2013, '14 and '17.

A&M posted a 23-10-4 (.676) record at the Big 12 Championship and won the title in five of the tournament's first 16 years. The Aggies won titles in 1997, 2001, '04, '05 and '11.

## SUCCESSFUL SENIORS

**MIKAELA HARVEY, STEPHANIE MALHERBE, MCKAYLA PAULSON** and **HALEY POUNDS** represent one of the winningest active senior classes in the nation. The quartet have enjoyed a record of 68-20-7 over their four years. The fearsome foursome has combined for 334 appearances, including 271 starts. They've accounted for 135 points on 47 goals and 41 assists. The quartet has played on squads that combined for two Elite Eight runs and one College Cup appearances. The impact they made was immediate as they logged a combined 36 starts on the 2014 squad that claimed the SEC Double, winning regular season and tournament crowns.

## SCORING OUTBURSTS

Texas A&M has a pair of 5-1 road wins this season, including Sept. 10 at then-No. 19 Kansas and Sept. 24 against Missouri. The last season the Aggies posted two road games in which they scored five or more goals was 2001 when the Maroon & White had triumphs at Missouri (5-2) and Texas (6-0).

The Sept. 10 match marked the most goals for the Aggies in a game since November 21, 2014 when Texas A&M toppled Arizona 7-2 in the second round of the NCAA Championship. The output was the most for the Aggies in a road match since beating Vanderbilt 6-2 in Nashville on October 10, 2014. The five goals marked the most for the Aggies' in a game against a Top 25 team since throttling then-No. 5 Texas, 6-0, in Austin on November 2, 2001.

Impressively, in the Missouri match three of the goals came in the last 33 minutes with Texas A&M playing one woman down due to **BRIANA ALSTON**'s second yellow card of the contest.

The Aggies added a 7-1 victory over Missouri in the SEC Quarterfinal round. It marked the highest scoring output for the Texas A&M at a league tournament match, topping the 6-0 defeat of Iowa State in the 1998 Big 12 Championship quarterfinal.

## WATT NAMED TO MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

**ALLY WATT** was tabbed to the 30-player preseason watch list for the Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy, the most prestigious individual award in NCAA Soccer. Watt returned to the roster after redshirting the 2016 campaign while playing for the United States Under-20 Women's National Team. She played in 14 matches for the United States U20 squad, including five matches at the FIFA Women's World Cup in Papua New Guinea. She notched seven goals during her time with the United States U20 squad, including two tallies in World Cup action.

# 2017 TEXAS A&M SOCCER GAME NOTES

## INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

Texas A&M comes into 2017 with four players who have gained recent international experience. **MIKAELA HARVEY, JIMENA LOPEZ, STEPHANIE MALHERBE** and **ALLY WATT** have all played among the world's best in the last two seasons.

Harvey helped the United States to the championship in the CONCACAF Women's U20 Championship in December 2015. Harvey started four of the five matches in the tournament and played the entire 90 minutes in the title match win over Canada. The tournament win earned the United States a spot at the 2016 FIFA Women's U20 World Cup.

Lopez has several years of experience with Team Mexico. The freshman from Mexico City has played in 17 international matches for Mexican National Teams since 2012. Most recently Lopez took part in the FIFA Women's U17 World Cup in Jordan.

Watt played for the United States at the 2016 FIFA Women's U20 World Cup in Papua New Guinea. The stint required Watt to redshirt the 2016 season. She scored a pair of goals, saw action in five of the six matches and earned FIFA Player of the Match recognition for her performance in the United States' win over Mexico.

## FORMER BALLGIRL

As a College Station resident, **CALYN WALTON** served as a ball girl at Texas A&M soccer games during her days as a youth club player. Walton, as a child, is visible in several historical photos in Texas A&M's clubhouse.

## RELATIVELY SPEAKING

Freshman forward **RHEAGEN SMITH** is the daughter of NFL Hall of Fame running back Emmitt Smith. Rheagen has seen action in five Aggie matches, totaling 117 minutes off the bench. The reserve attacker is searching for her first point of the season. Smith scored her first career goal in the SEC Tournament semifinal match against her father's alma mater on her birthday.

## MORCHÉ NAMED SEC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

On Oct. 9, Morché was named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week. The junior goalkeeper from Lawrenceville, Ga., allowed just one goal in 290 minutes of play, registering two shutouts as the Maroon & White were wrapping up a grueling portion of the slate that included four matches in 10 days. Posting a 0.31 goals-against average for the week, Morché blanked both Utah Valley and Alabama. In the double overtime win against Georgia, she came up with two big saves in the second overtime period before Grace Piper was able to put away the winning goal in the 109th minute.

## WATT NAMED SEC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

On Oct. 2, Texas A&M forward **ALLY WATT** was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week as she scored both Aggie goals in a 2-1 win over Arkansas, who had allowed just one goal in their previous three SEC matches. The Colorado Springs, Colo.-native notched the first goal just 98 seconds into the match, scoring a roofer from 15 yards out on the left side of the penalty box. She then added an insurance goal just 2:30 into the second half. This time she scored on a half volley from the top of the penalty box after **KENDALL RITCHIE's** free kick was cleared with a header by the Arkansas backline.

## ARRIETA NAMED SEC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

On Sept. 25, Texas A&M midfielder **CIENNA ARRIETA** was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week as she came off the bench to score goals in both of the Aggies' wins. In the 2-1 victory over No. 6 Florida, Arrieta scored within two minutes of entering the contest as her 34th minute goal gave Texas A&M a 1-0 lead. In the Sunday match, Arrieta scored on one of the finest free kicks you will ever see. Lining up from 20 yards out to the right of the penalty arc, she buzzed the tower on the five-player defensive wall and hit the inside of the right post for the goal.

## LOPEZ NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

The opening weekend, Texas A&M defender **JIMENA LOPEZ** was named the SEC Freshman of the Week for her performances in the Aggies' two victories in California. In her Aggie debut, Lopez launched a missile into the back of the net from 18 yards in the 94th minute for the golden goal in A&M's 1-0 victory against Pepperdine. Two days later the Mexico City product buried a penalty kick in the 65th minute of a 2-0 win against San Diego. Lopez played left back for all 184 minutes of play as the Aggies' defense stymied their two opponents, holding them to a combined four shots on goal.
