As not all online instruction is equal, we believe that building relationships with students, providing one-to-one support, and providing students with opportunities to redo/resubmit assignments are the keys to a successful computer science program. Online courses offered by 2Sigma School Inc are firmly based on research, best practices, and active involvement.

The courses cater to a diverse audience, encompassing part-time students, accelerated learners, at-risk students, and those with different learning requirements.

Moreover, teachers will send an introductory email to students, sharing their background and contact information. Throughout the semester, teachers will hold scheduled weekly meetings, make weekly announcements and maintain active communication with students through email. They are committed to responding to student inquiries within 24 hours.

Courses at 2Sigma School Inc. are conducted using a mix of live class sessions and asynchronous learning. However, teachers maintain consistent daily hours on all school days, typically available from 8 am to 4 pm EST.

Educator Performance

2Sigma School regularly monitors the performance of our instructors. School leadership frequently reviews recorded class sessions, reviews student performance, and meets with instructors monthly. All instructors develop goals related to improving performance with measurable milestones which are reviewed each meeting with leadership. Instructors who are not meeting expectations are provided additional training and support.

Academic Integrity and Plagiarism

With the prevalence of information online, students can get hints, help, or sometimes direct answers to almost any question or task in today's digital world, and most of 2Sigma School coursework are no exception. However, students are only cheating themselves when they turn to the internet for answers. Coding is learned through trial and error, through mistakes and



mishaps. It is the struggle to figure out why the code will not work correctly when learning really occurs.

Students who choose to use other's work as their own are only hurting themselves. The 2Sigma School team will use 1-1 conversations with students and other automated analysis of submitted work to determine if students are truly learning the material. If the 2Sigma School team suspects students are using someone else's work and claiming it as their own, the following steps will be taken:

First Offense: Teacher has a conversation with the student and notifies the parent/guardian. The student will have an opportunity to redo the assignment.

Second Offense: Parent/guardian is notified of the occurrence. The students will be allowed to redo the assignment and will receive a grade reduction of one (1) full letter grade.

Third and Subsequent Offenses: Parent/guardian is notified of the occurrence. The student will receive a score of 0 (zero) on the plagiarized assignments.

Under no circumstances will a student be permitted to cheat or plagiarize, and appropriate measures will be taken in the event of this type of student misbehavior continues.

Equal Employment and Affirmative Action Disclosures

2Sigma School ensures strict adherence to the anti-discrimination provisions of Section 1000.05 of the Florida statutes, as well as all applicable federal laws related to Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) and Affirmative Action.

In order to be considered for employment, applicants are required to fulfill the following prerequisites:

- 1. Submit a thoroughly completed application.
- 2. Possess an up-to-date and valid Florida Educator's Certificate.
- 3. Demonstrate eligibility for employment within the United States, and present authentic documentation for the employer to facilitate completion of the Department of Homeland Security's US Citizenship and Immigration Services I-9 Employment Eligibility Verification.
- 4. Undergo fingerprinting within a designated time frame, as clearance based on fingerprint verification is an obligatory condition for securing employment.



Florida Statewide Assessment Program

The Florida Statewide Assessment Program is not included in the courses offered by 2Sigma School, and we do not conduct these exams. FERPA Information

In order to deliver our instructional services, 2Sigma School must access, retain, and process specific personally identifiable information (PII) pertaining to students.
