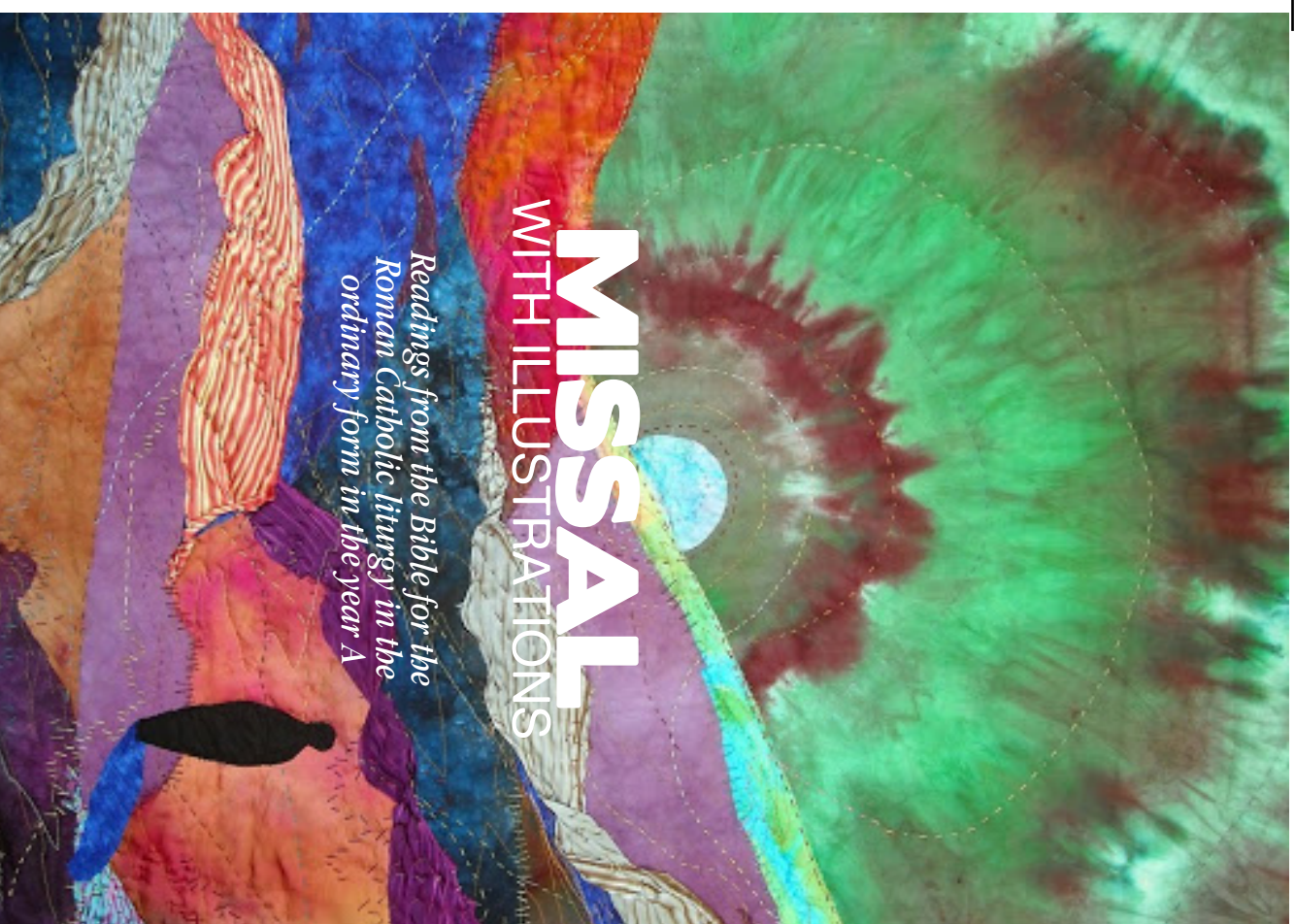

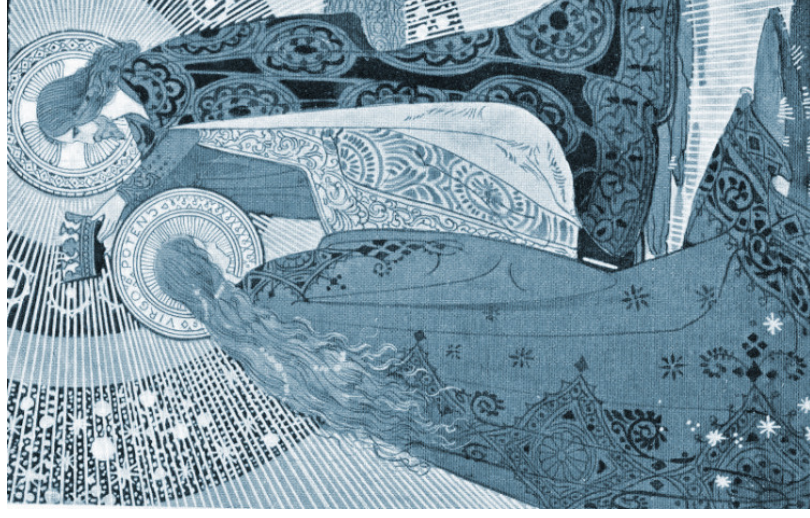

Ten Commandments

TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Mt 22:15-21

Went off and plotted how they might entrap him in speech. 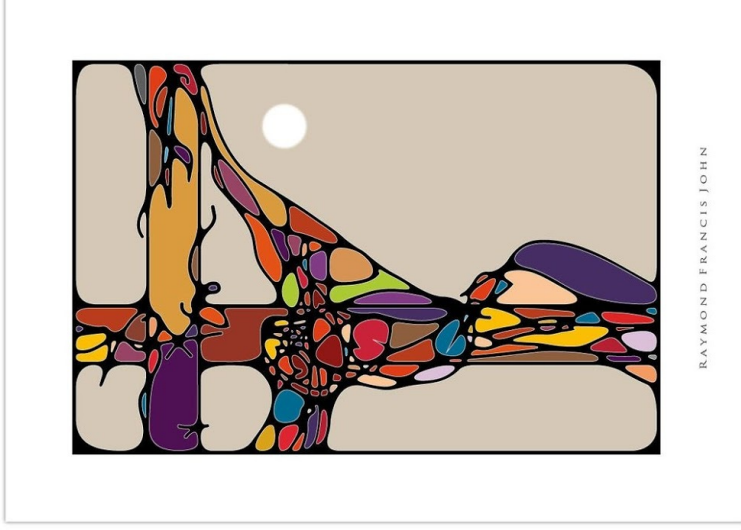

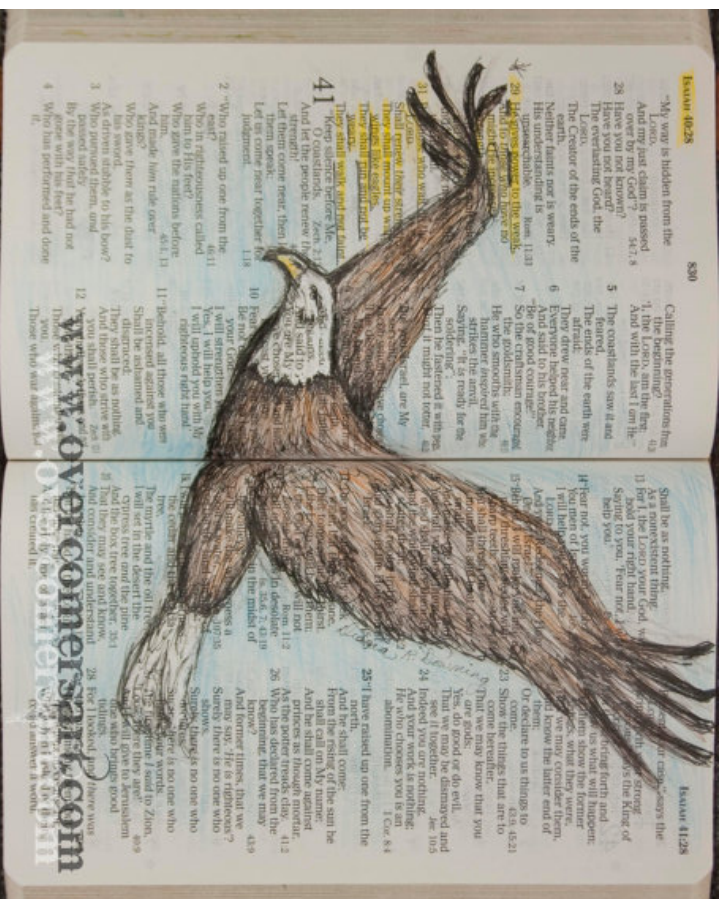

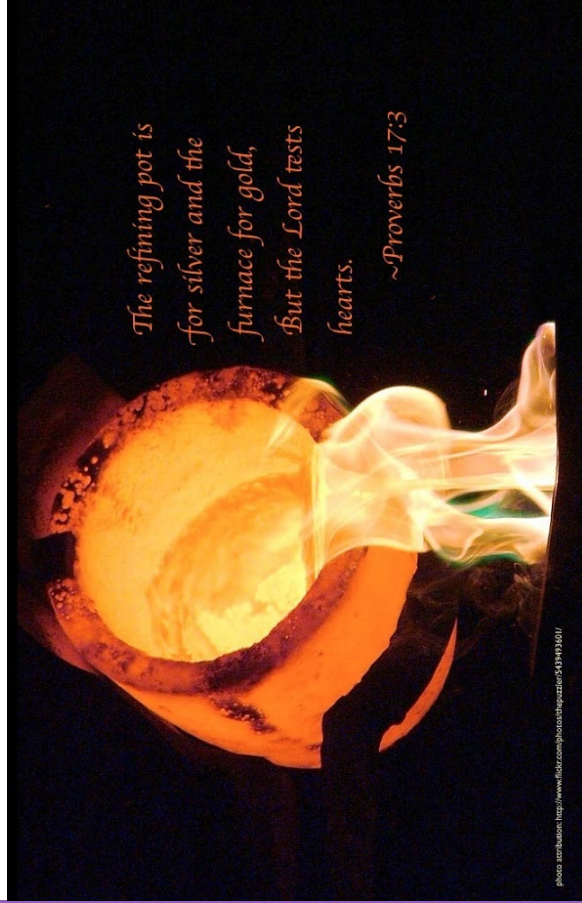

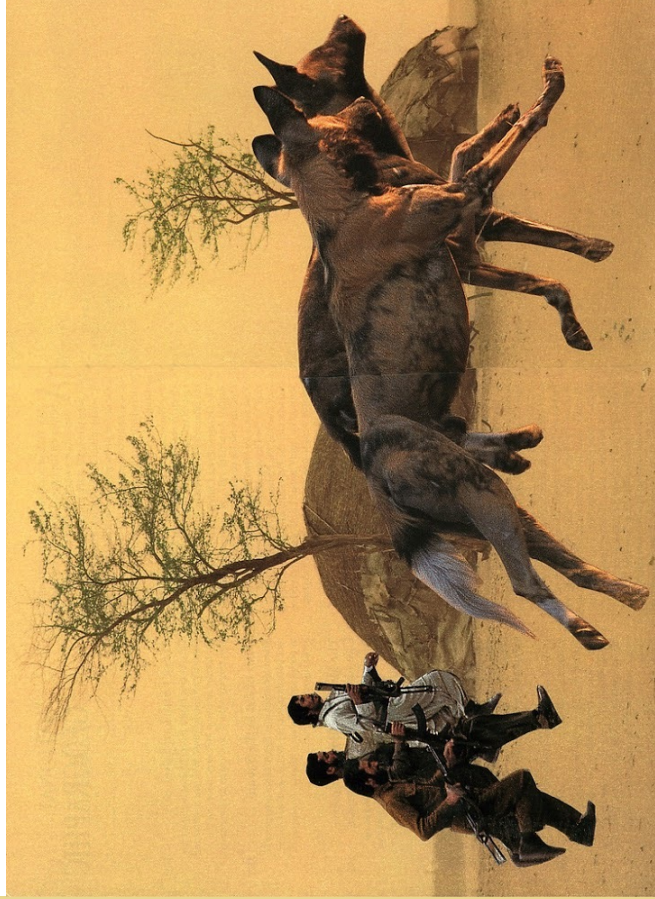

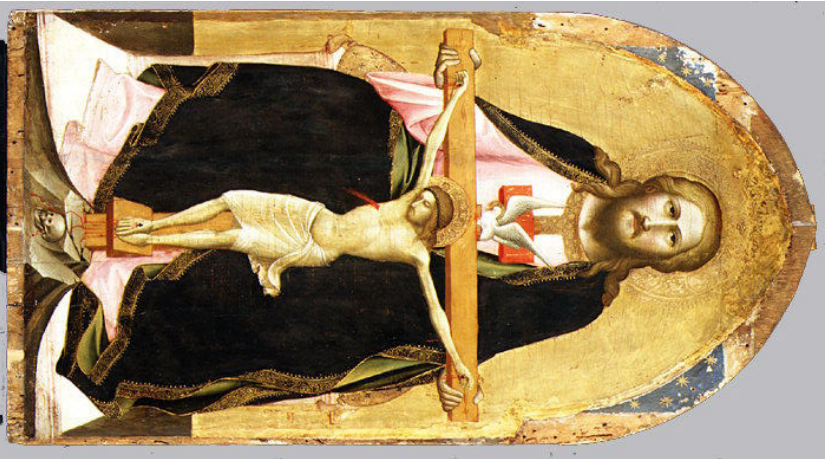

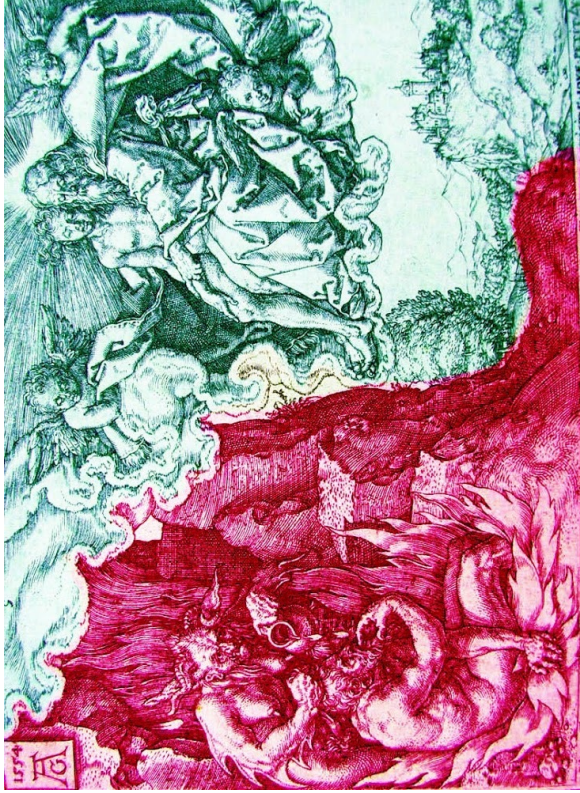

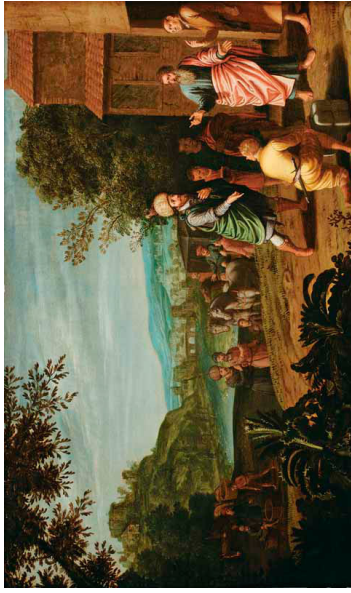

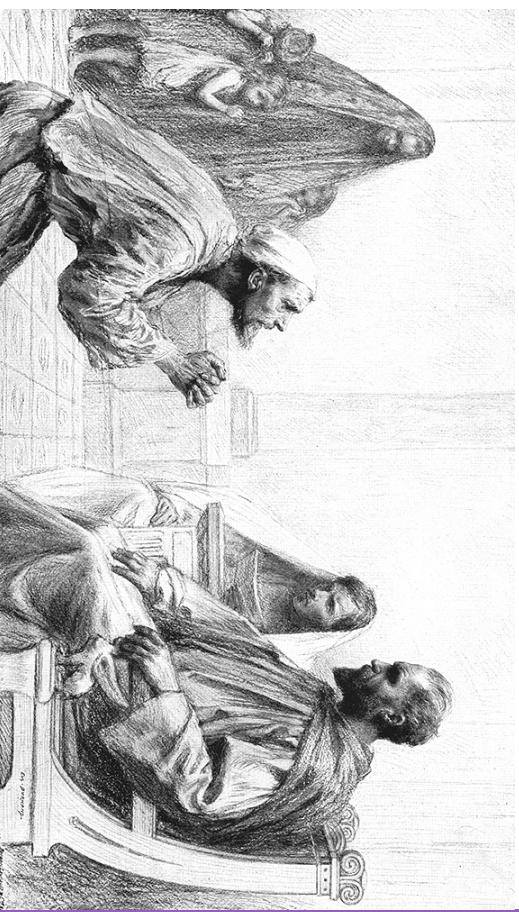

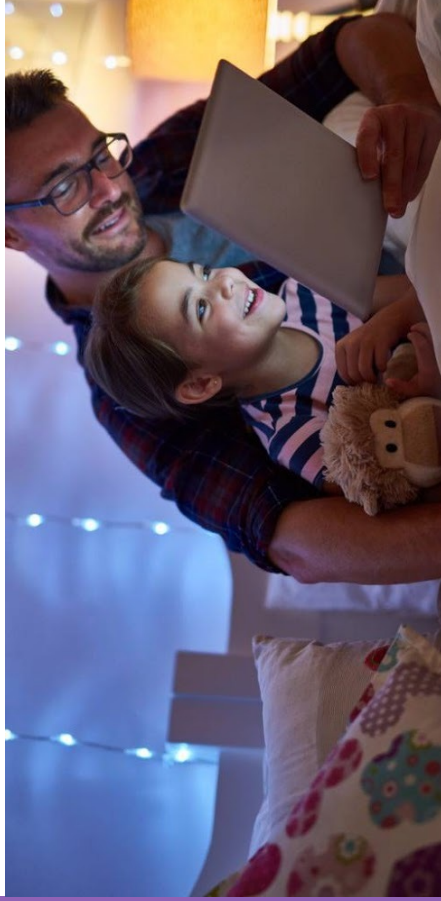

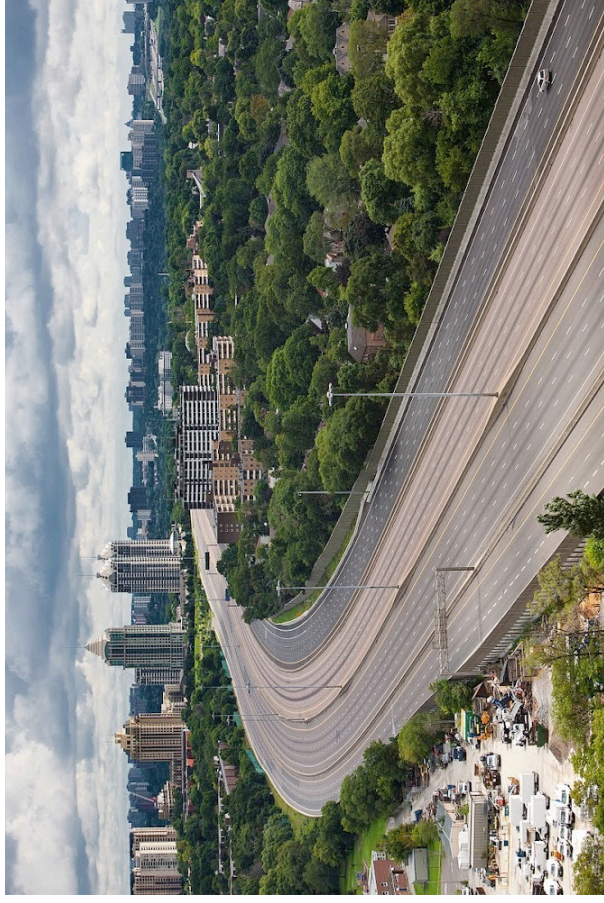

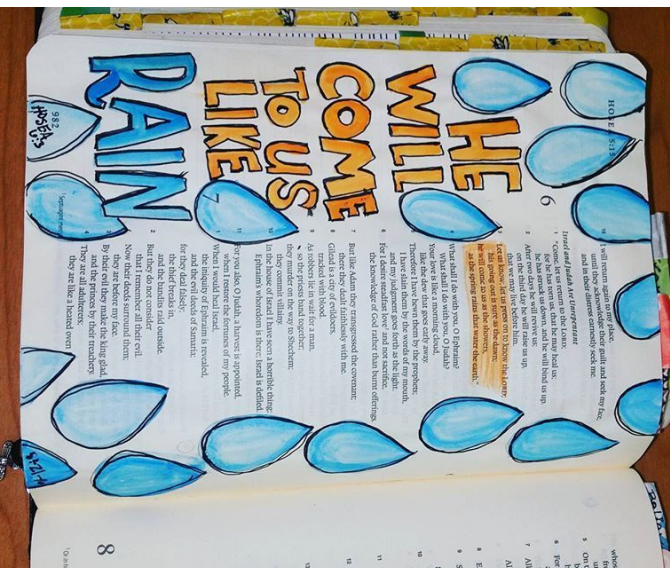
