

Another reason is that it may cause disturbance to the teachers and students. After school hours, people stay behind for different reasons. Some club members will decorate the notice board, the exam candidates will stay behind for revision, and even teachers will have to mark students' assignments. If the public are allowed to use school facilities, they may generate noise and disturb those who are working. In addition, as these people have no obligation to follow school rules and obey the staff, it would be impossible to control them. This is totally unfair to teachers and students who desire a silent and peaceful place at school.

Lastly, if we give the public the permission to use school facilities, it will increase the administrative and maintenance cost. In order to manage these people, additional staff members need to be allocated. They have to fulfill multiple duties, such as the booking of equipment, checking the identities and handling enquiries. Thus, some may consider it advisable that the public should be permitted to use sports facilities at schools when class is over. Unfortunately, I am against this idea owing to the insufficient facilities for sports clubs, the disturbance caused, and the high administrative cost.

Sports facilities at schools should not be made available to the public as it deprives students of their chance to use them. Most sports teams at schools, including badminton, volleyball and basketball teams, need an open area to practise and thus enhance their sports skills. Yet, because of the inadequate space, only by taking turns can everyone have an equal chance to use the sports courts. Besides, a lot of the sports teams have already been booking training areas outside of school. It is not uncommon to see them practising in a public sports centre wearing school uniforms. Making school facilities open to the public would not solve the core of the problem, but it would instead aggravate the problem. It is the students who should have the top priority to use the facilities at their own school.



Another reason that deserves our attention is that it may cause disturbance to people within the school area. When class is over, the campus is always crowded with those who stay behind for some reasons. Examples include the club members who are responsible for decorating the notice board, the exam candidates who need a space for revision, and even teachers with a pile of assignments to mark. If the public are allowed to use school facilities, it is unavoidable that they will generate noise and thus disturb those at work. Worse still, as these people have no obligation to follow school rules and obey the staff, it would be impossible to control them. This is absolutely unfair to those who desire a silent and peaceful place to work.

On top of that, the increasing use of sports facilities will ultimately lead to unnecessary expenses, namely high administrative and maintenance cost. For one thing, if the public are granted access to using school facilities, additional staff members have to be allocated so as to manage them. These members have to fulfill multiple duties - the booking and borrowing of equipment, checking the identities of incoming users and handling enquiries. For another thing, the more frequently sports facilities are used, the more easily they will get damaged. Regardless of the cause, sending them to repair or purchasing new equipment would be inevitable. These costs are definitely a financial burden to school.

In brief, never should the public be allowed to use sports facilities at schools as it will do more harm than good. To grapple with the root of the problem, there are other alternatives such as reconstructing old buildings and turning them into sports centres. Hopefully, all sports lovers will be able to participate in any sports activities without worrying about the booking of facilities.
