

NEW STUDY
ARRANGEMENTS

Each school of AIBT has adjusted their delivery modes to adapt to the COVID restrictions, wherever students are located. Through these new arrangements, students can continue their studies via eLearning, Online Live Stream, face-to-face classes, or a combination of all three. This will vary depending on the qualification.



eLearning

This is the most flexible delivery mode, it allows students to navigate their study at their own pace



Online Live Stream

This delivery mode has no location restrictions. Trainers deliver the classes live, which allows students to study anywhere around the world with real time interaction with trainers and peers.



Face-to-face

This mode is very critical when a course has practical components (or vocational placement), it allows students to learn and practice in front of their trainers (or placement supervisor).

* Different units of competency may include a combination of delivery methods depending on the theoretical/practical requirements of the unit.







eLearning

This is the most flexible delivery mode; it allows students to navigate their study at their own pace. Students have access to their study materials, such as pre-recorded lectures, learner guides, and assessment tools (workbook, quizzes).

Their learning is supplemented by:

General consultation (weekly)

This is an optional consultation session that provides students with an opportunity to discuss any study topics and ask any general questions about their course, placement requirements, workshop / kitchen hours, etc.

Specialised consultation (weekly)

This is a consultation session that focuses on a student's specific unit of competency. During this time, their trainer will conduct assessment training, and/or any assessment or activities that needs to be observed and/or assessed, such as role plays, group discussions, presentations etc.

Online Live Stream

This delivery mode has no location restrictions. Trainers deliver the classes live, which allows students to study anywhere around the world with real time interaction with their trainer and peers.

Theory classes

Trainers deliver a live lecture to students and provide an opportunity for students to ask questions about the unit.

Assessment discussion

Students can discuss their assessment with their trainer and peers, and receive feedback on their work.

Face-to-face

This mode is mandatory when a course has practical components (or vocational placement), it allows students to learn and practice in front of their trainer/placement supervisor...

Practical classes

These will vary from qualification to qualification but may include practical training in a workshop or restaurant, or simulation training.

Vocational placement (if applicable)

Vocational placement allows students to apply their knowledge and skills in a real-world environment.

Note: The study arrangements listed above are not optional and will depend on your area of study and the requirements of each unit.
