

STUDENTS RETURNING TO AUSTRALIA GUIDE



Announced by the Australian Federal Government on 29th November 2021, <u>fully vaccinated eligible visa holders</u> can now travel to Australia without needing to apply for a travel exemption from 15th December 2021 onwards. The eligible visa holders include but are not limited to **Subclass 500 - Student visa and Subclass 485 - Temporary Graduate visa**. Please note that travel restrictions are now in place for people who have been in South Africa, Lesotho, Eswatini, Namibia, Botswana, Zimbabwe, Mozambique, or Malawi in the last 14 days.

This guide is to help the international students make informed travel plans and comply with the federal and state/territory governments' travel requirements, especially those students who are currently located overseas, enrolled/planning to enrol in a course in AIBT and planning to arrive to Australia to undertake their studies.



As AIBT operates its campuses in Sydney, Brisbane and Hobart, this guide will mainly provide information that is publicly announced by the Australian Federal Government, New South Wales State Government, Queensland State Government and Tasmania State Government.

Any students who are planning to travel to Australia for their studies must comply with the travel requirements that are set by both:

- 1. Australian Federal Government, and
- 2. The state/territory government where their campus of enrolment falls within.

After fulfilling the travel requirements and arriving in Australia, the students must continue to comply with the COVID-19 health and safety requirements set by the federal and state/territory governments, maintain their visa conditions and follow the AIBT International Students Returning to Australia Guide.

The above COVID-19 health and safety requirements, Student visa conditions and college guide include but are not limited to:

- **a.** Completing the quarantine according to the state government requirements (if applicable)
- **b.** Obtaining COVID-19 nose and throat PCR test within the required time frame (if it is required by the state government i.e., NSW Government requirement pre-departure and arrival information <u>Study NSW</u>).
- **c.** Visa condition 8501 Maintaining adequate health insurance (for Subclass 500 Student visa and Subclass 485 Temporary Graduate visa holders)



d. Updating the contact information to AIBT

Students must update their contact information to AIBT by emailing to <u>aibtstudentsupport@vconsultancy.com.au</u> within 7 days after arriving in Australia. The contact information include: valid contact number, email address, residential address (or the quarantine facility details if the student is undertaking the quarantine), emergency contact person and contact details.

1. Pre-departure Webinars

2. Reporting to campus

Students must report to AIBT campuses within 7 days after their arrival in Australia (or within 7 days after the completion of quarantine if the student is required to by the state/territory government). Our campuses operate from Monday to Friday, 9:00am to 5:00pm (excluding public holidays and new-year period). The addresses of our campuses are listed below.
