

First Decade 1980'S - 1990'S

Alwaleed Philanthropies (AP) began with a vision structured around flexibility and a holistic outlook focusing on **developmental**, **cultural**, **educational**, **and health investments** via partners and community institutions that are actively developing individuals and society in general, and women and youth in particular.

During this decade, AP supported many **infrastructure projects**, building roads, bridges, mosques and providing electricity to rural areas.



Second Decade 1990'S - 2000'S

After its first decade, Alwaleed Philanthropies expanded its humanitarian efforts, **aiding those in dire need of basic necessities** of living and providing assistance all around the globe to those affected by natural disasters such as earthquakes, floods, as well as human-caused disasters and wars.

AP also worked on giving back to communities by supporting **educational and cultural initiatives.**



Third Decade 2000'S - 2010'S

Alwaleed Philanthropies continued to support initiatives that develop communities by upgrading health centers, building housing units for war-affected and under-privileged people, printing books for primary schools and more.

It also exponentially expanded its support of women and youth projects, training women on practical skills to make a better living and developing youth competencies.

In addition, AP established several prestigious academic and research centers at leading universities to bridge cultures together and provided disaster relief to families and individuals in need.



Fourth Decade 2010'S - 2020'S

During the 2010's, Alwaleed Philanthropies expanded its areas of contribution, developing communities via supporting initiatives in the field of health, building schools and investing in large housing projects, among other.

It has also empowered women greatly through projects aiming to improve the economic and social situation of women such as the Captinah program, which provides additional income for women.

In the field of Disaster Relief, AP has aided those affected by disasters such as famine and drought, as well as Syrian refugees displaced by the war.

It has also inaugurated two museums for Islamic Arts and funded an electronic platform that brings together university students from different countries for dialogue and cultural exchange.

In 2022, we worked on satisfying 100% of the SDG, We contributed to the non-profit Saudi sector covering 48% of its Vision 2030 designated objectives.


Our strife for a better world continued. We pursued equal rights for youth & women helping them achieve their full potential of change.




Ongoing National Initiatives in 2022

Housing and Cars Projects

(Phase II with the Ministry of Municipal & Rural Affairs and Housing)

In pursuit of what was stipulated in the Saudi Vision 2030 in terms of creating the necessary environment for the non-profit sector to take the initiative in facing challenges and seizing opportunities, and what was stated therein that the state will work with the non-profit sector to provide appropriate housing subsidy for families most in need of social security beneficiaries and the like, where Alwaleed Philanthropies is a non-profit organization that works in various fields that contribute to the development of society and provide its needs in various areas, as it also believes in its role and its social responsibility and continues to support community initiatives that make an impact on society. And where the third party is also an institution specialized in the development housing sector, and it manages and operates the Jood-Eskan platform, which seeks to promote the participation of community members in supporting the provision of housing for the neediest families in society. Therefore, the three parties agreed to cooperate with a view to providing adequate housing for families most in need in all regions of Saudi Arabia, as well as granting cars to develop beneficiaries. It is agreed to agree to invest in each party's potential and capabilities, and also to define the obligations, duties, and rights of each party, taking into account the laws in force in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.





World Scout Project (Phase II):

The project aims to activate the participation of Saudi youth in volunteer and community work in eight universities in KSA through the scout movement, build organized scout groups in Saudi universities to support the participation of women and youth in the scout movement locally and internationally, and encourage more participation in community volunteer work in the higher education sector. By aligning volunteer programs in Saudi universities with the framework of the World Organization of the Scout Movement, as well as preparing students to participate in non-profit development projects, as the project works to develop the educational program for the higher education sector and integrate 500 university students within the scout movement and influence 100,000 young people in KSA through community and voluntary initiatives. The project is also considered one of the basic projects to support female scouts in KSA, qualify human resources from leaders, and develop membership in the scouting phase.

Achievements until 2022

- Detailed plans have been prepared to adopt the program for the three universities that were targeted this year: Imam Abdulrahman Bin Faisal University, King Khalid University, and the Diriyah Gate Development Authority, and present plans through a series of coordination meetings with the supervisory boards that have been appointed by the specialized deanships in universities and partners
- Signing the contract with Imam Abdulrahman Bin Faisal University on March 13, 2022, in Dammam
- Completing a follow-up with Princess Nourah bint Abdulrahman University, where female students undertook a series of activities in the first half of the year, including holding a field visit to follow up on the project and meet with female leaders in Riyadh under the supervision of the Girls' Committee, followed by a change in the university's assignment to the relevant deanship and project follow-up to support the deanship in charge of following up on tribes and implementing project activities effectively.
- Qualify 15 personnel from Abdulrahman Bin Faisal University of the supervisory committee and the female leaders' candidates in the introductory course on the scouting program from September 11-15, 2022 virtually.
- Qualify 10 female leaders from Abdulrahman Bin Faisal University in the founding study 17-21 September 2022 with the participation of Saudi female leaders in the training
- Female leaders from Princess Nourah bint Abdulrahman University completed the wooden badge research, in addition, 4 research studies were presented pending accreditation from the committee and the association.
- Periodic meetings with the Girl Scout Committee to follow up and prepare qualification programs for universities, program development, and project follow-up.

Legal Empowerment of Women Project (Wa'iyah-7)

In continuation of the work in the legal Wa'iyah initiative, which includes providing support and legal assistance to women and their representation before the judiciary in order to support the oppressed and restitution of rights, whether for abused women or others. Wa'iyah initiative seeks to raise the level of legal, societal, and cognitive awareness among society in general.

First: Providing support and legal assistance to women, whether they are victims of domestic violence or cyber-crimes cases, in addition to everything related to women, pleading, and representing them before the judiciary and the competent authorities.

Second: Training and qualifying female lawyers and providing them with the exchange of experiences with male and female lawyers and allowing them to participate in volunteer work and pleading.

Third: Work on an electronic Wa'iyah application to contribute to spreading awareness and legal culture for women and providing legal advice.

Fourth: Work on awareness-raising legal programs (women's and children's rights under the Law and Islamic Sharia) and present them on a large scale to a number of villages in Saudi Arabia.



Achievements in 2022

- Holding a series of courses that seek to empower Saudi female lawyers in the field of human rights and international treaties and covenants, in cooperation with the High Commissioner for Human Rights. These courses dealt with many topics and hosted a group of international and local speakers in this field.
- Partnership with Prince Sultan Bin Abdulaziz Humanitarian City, where a number of meetings were held dealing with the field of cooperation between Wa'iyah, Prince Sultan Bin Abdulaziz Humanitarian City, and Alwaleed Philanthropies to provide psychological support to the beneficiaries of Wa'iyah initiative who were victims of domestic violence crimes.
- Partnership between Alwaleed Philanthropies, Aseer Development Authority, and Wa'iyah initiative. A group of villages were visited and the appropriate villages were determined to be included in the Wa'iyah legal empowerment convoy.
- In the process of partnership between Alwaleed Philanthropies and the Saudi Data and Artificial Intelligence Authority (SDAIA), where coordination has been made to hold a specialized, qualitative training course for female lawyers in data protection and information security.
- Adopting and supporting 350 cases of women who are subjected to violence and abuse, as well as cases of fraud and cyber-crimes.
- Providing 3000 legal consultations.
- Holding various training and awareness workshops.
- Providing a course for frontline employees in the family safety program who deal with reports of violence and abuse.

Empowering Women Craftsmanship & National Heritage Preservation Project

An integrated development program based on the development of the production line for craftswomen through training courses that deal with the development of handicrafts that characterize the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia to preserve the Saudi heritage, in addition to selecting the product and improving production and marketing thereof. The third phase is to support heritage products in design and production and provide training and employment opportunities for craftsmen, in addition to providing the craftsman with a diploma in partnership with Princess Nourah bint Abdulrahman University, which is considered the first of its kind in the Kingdom.

Achievements in 2022

- Organizing 4 training workshops under the supervision of Alwaleed Philanthropies at Princess Nourah bint Abdulrahman University
- The workshops were established at Princess Nourah bint Abdulrahman University from the project revenue in 2019-2021
- The workshops were opened in March 2022
- 80 craftswomen have been recruited, in each workshop, there are 20 craftswomen
- 1,813 training items were executed
- 120 wooden boxes have been executed for the international jewelry company, Chaumet
- The first batch of the training items in the PIK platform has been sold
- 100 wooden boxes and 100 ceramic mugs were delivered as gifts to Four Seasons Hotel guests
- TOQA order of wooden and ceramic dishes has been delivered
- A collaboration has been made with the Four Seasons Hotel to create special sculptures to be displayed at the hotel
- Alwaleed Philanthropies' financial return from this project is estimated to be more than half a million SAR
- Four craftswomen were selected and trained to run each workshop





Aseer development project

A. The Architectural Identity Project:

Alwaleed Philanthropies intends, especially after the announcement of the Aseer Development Authority of Qimam and Shem Strategy, where a workshop was held to find out ways of cooperation, and this resulted in an initial agreement to start arranging the necessary procedures to implement the urban development initiative that reflects the identity of Aseer and focus on preserving the heritage identity of Aseer region through Alwaleed Philanthropies' partner "Nubian Houses Organization" since 2014, when the project received recognition from UNESCO in addition to the Global Housing Award after its success in East Africa in Burkina Faso, Benin, Mali, Senegal and Ghana, to achieve sustainable housing solutions by exploiting the local resources for each region and train its indigenous people how to be good at building and construction. B. Artisans Project (Creative Center)

One of Qimam and Shem's strategies is to empower craftswomen, therefore cooperation with the Ministries of Culture and Human Resources & Social Development has been made as part of the economic empowerment program for craftsmen in the Khairat Asir project in addition to an academy for practical training through workshops, as well as theoretical training and motivational courses, where cooperation will take place with our global partner, the Jordan River Foundation, to cooperate in achieving the strategy initiatives of Aseer Development Authority through a partnership with Alwaleed Philanthropies to enable local producers, craftsmen, and farmers to develop local products and industries through the establishment of a creative center for craftsmen and the preparation of the place.

The Human Rights Commission aims to protect and promote human rights in accordance with international human rights standards in all fields and spread awareness about it and contribute to ensuring its application in the light of the provisions of Islamic law. And where the Commission is the competent body to express opinion and advice with regard to human rights issues. And because Alwaleed Philanthropies has initiatives and projects aimed at developing societies and empowering women and youth to participate and contribute effectively to achieving this goal, building bridges between cultures, and proceeding with disaster relief. Therefore, cooperation with the commission was carried out on three initiatives: Supporting abused women's files, training female lawyers (Wa'iyah 6), and establishing indicators to support the rights of people with disabilities, women, and children.





3- Interventions:

- 100% of villages reporting one or more human case or animal GW infection were protected with ABATE larvicide at least monthly during GW transmission periods and 100% of villages reporting one or more human case or animal infection with no access to safe water had cloth filters.
- 4- A Summit in March 2022 occurred to celebrate reaching closer to eradicating this disease. They announced a historically low number of reported cases of Guinea Worm disease worldwide reaching to 15 human cases.









- 1- The COVID-19 Therapeutics Accelerator (CTA) aims to speed up dramatically the process of identifying potential treatments for COVID-19, fast-track their development, and advance manufacturing for low and middle income countries (LMICs).
- 2- AP's support is enabling CHAI, PATH, and Build Health International (BHI) to increase the supply of medical oxygen by repairing broken oxygen plants in LMICs while building local capacity to ensure sustained maintenance over time.

AP's final commitment to the CTA also enabled CHAI and PATH to expand their work from pandemic response to ensure long-term, sustainable access to oxygen services as the key to addressing hypoxemia—low blood oxygen—more effectively.
