- O Facilitated eyelid surgery for 53,379 people.
- Assisted Ethiopia's national program to distribute 13,142,715 antibiotic doses.
- Facilitated ongoing health education in 3,459 Kebeles (group of villages) and approximately 7,800 schools, focusing promotion of facial cleanliness and latrine construction, participation in Trachoma Campaigns, and referrals to community-level health posts.
- Promoted the use, development, and maintenance of household latrines. Regular latrine use inhibits fly breeding and thus the spread of trachoma.
- 50 of 178 districts no longer harbor active trachoma as a public health emergency, which equates to 28 percent of the areas (about 4.9 million people).

This project aims to end the five most prevalent neglected tropical diseases (NTDs), which affect over 1.5 billion of the world's poorest and most vulnerable people.

- As of June 2018, the END Fund has supported projects in 27 countries.
- In 2017, together with our partners, we provided over 152 million NTD treatments and projects to provide a total of 240 million by the end of 2018.
- O In 2017, we reached 98 million people with NTD treatment, and are on track to surpass 100 million people reached in 2018.
- In 2017, Alwaleed philanthropies helped administer over 1,000 surgeries for people suffering from advanced stages of trachoma and lymphatic filariasis, and are on track to complete over 1,000 in 2018.
- In 2017, we worked with partners to train 345,000 health workers, with over 655,000 projected in 2018.

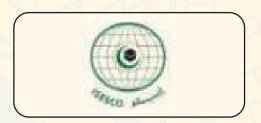

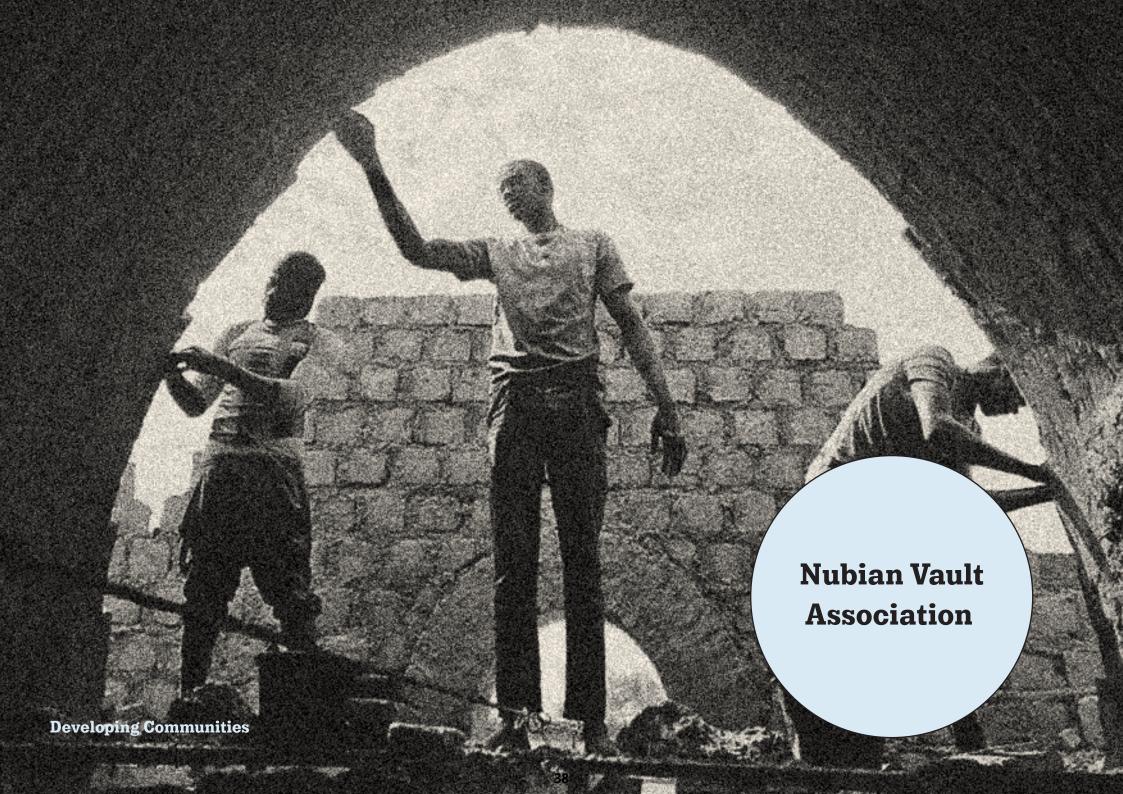

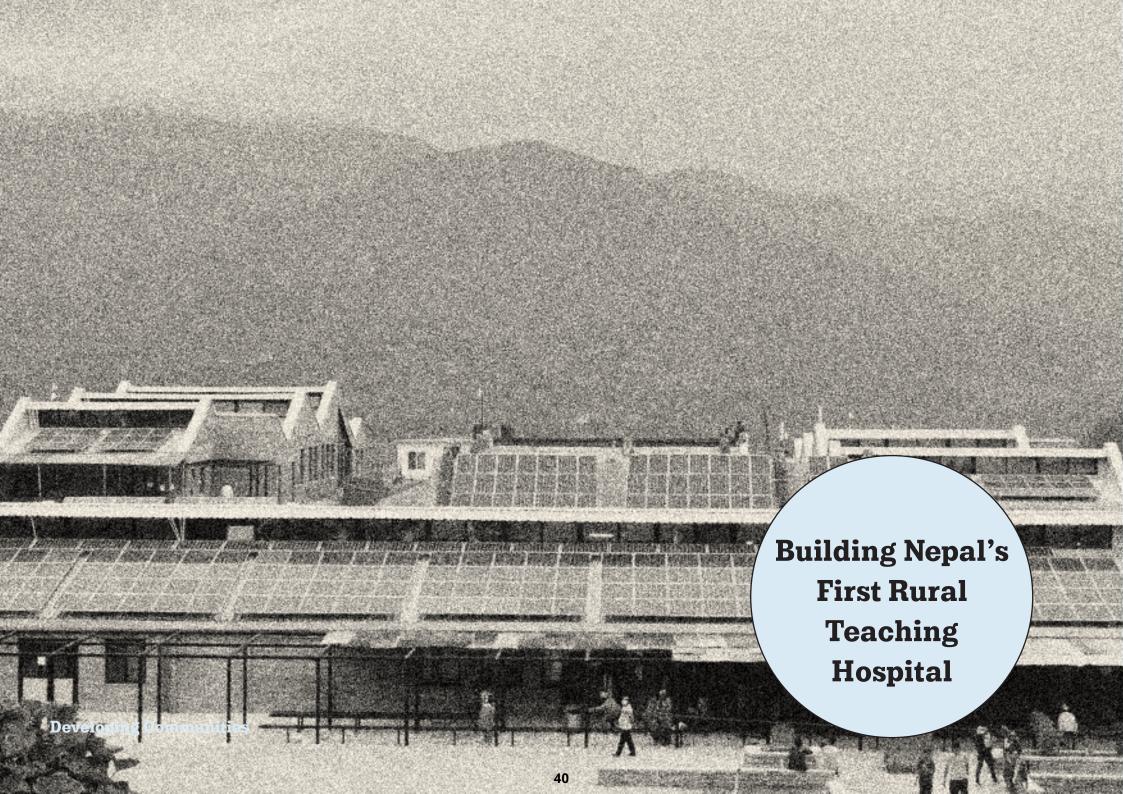

Egypt

Sotra project is a collaboration between Alwaleed Philanthropies and Misr AlKheir Foundation, one of the largest development projects in the Arab Republic of Egypt. The project aims at improving the residential environment for 10,000 Egyptian families in all governorates of the Arab Republic of Egypt except Cairo, North Sinai and South Sinai.



Improving the housing environment for 1,000 houses in the following governorates: Aswan, New Valley, Giza, Qena, Luxor, Alexandria, Dakahlia, Fayoum. With a %99.99 completion rate and six remaining homes expected to be delivered in mid-December.

- Splash reached every governmental orphanage across China with clean water systems.
- Conducted a survey of 964 orphanage sites to assess the continued functioning of the water filtration systems.
- Completed service and maintenance trips to seven provinces and 263 orphanages, as well as installing spare parts and providing training to ensure that safe water keeps flowing.
- Continued relationship building with the Chinese Ministry of Civil Affairs, Provincial Civil Affairs Bureaus, China Charity Federation, and the China Association of Social Welfare to encourage government adoption of the program by 2020.
- Partnered with a global water filtration system company,
 Antunes, to provide long-term service and maintenance to the
 majority of Splash-served project sites, helping ensure their
 functioning for the long-term.

A total of \$ 1,719,000 was utilized in 2018 in 8 countries and the Middle East and North Africa Region (MENA)

Countries Supported:

- Central Africa Republic Reaching 104,000 children with Measles vaccine among the displaced populations.
- O **Ethiopia** because of political unrest only 64,000 children were reached with antigens (vaccines) including Measles in 2018.
- **Lebanon -** By end 2017, 189 out of 209 Cadasters had been reached. Activities in 2018 targeted the remaining 20 Cadasters.
- O **Philippines** continuation of the long term commitment to improve vaccination among the urban poor.
- O **Liberia -** 17,300 more children vaccinated in 2018.
- O **Iraq** Social Mobilization activities to vaccinate 5.2 million children in a Measles campaign.
- O **MENA** Deployment of Immunization by an Emergencies Specialist who has conducted 7 missions in support of the revitalization of immunization in southern Syria and Cholera control in Yemen.

USA

Breakthrough Energy Ventures (BEV) is an investor-led fund that will finance emerging energy breakthroughs to deliver affordable and reliable energy with the goal of reducing global greenhouse gas emissions to near-zero.

- BEV invested \$ 60.4M this year, bringing the total invested capital to \$ 95.2 M. Activity this year includes investments in seven new portfolio companies (Alego, Cambridge Crops, Dimien, Malta, Motif Ingredients, Pivot Bio, and QuantumScape) and follow-on investment in KoBold Metals.
- In September, BEV publicly disclosed a portion of its portfolio for the first time by adding nine companies to the website.





Multiple countries

The Polio Eradication Fund is a collaborative funding mechanism created by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. It pools the contributions of Alwaleed Philanthropies with 11 other donors and makes grants to support the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI).

- The number of annual wild polio cases has dropped more than 99 percent: from the 350,000 cases across 125 countries in the 1980s to 22 cases in just two countries.
- More than 16 million people are healthy and walking today who would otherwise have been paralyzed by the virus.
- Of the three wild Poliovirus strains, only type 1 is still actively circulating. Type 2 has been declared eradicated, and no case of type 3 has been identified since 2012.

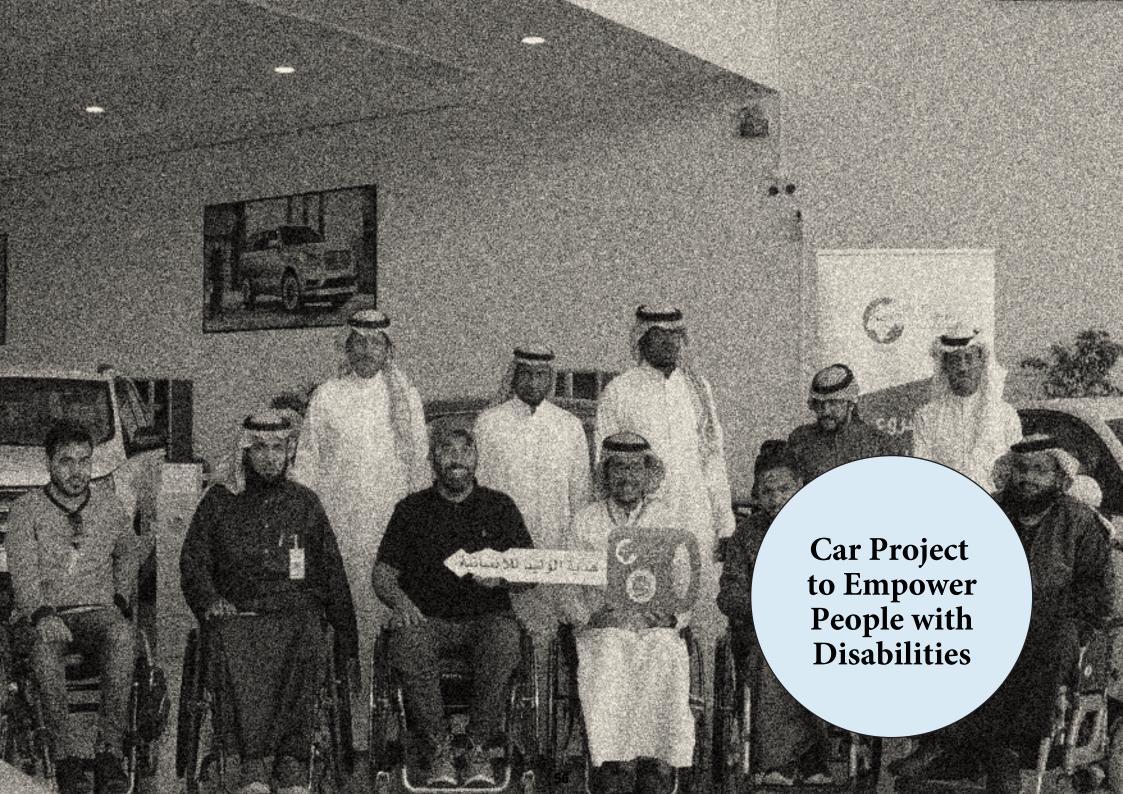

To improve the quality of life of individuals in the community by providing 1,000 housing units and 1,000 vehicles annually to Saudi beneficiaries across the Kingdom for a period of 10 years, as part of a sustainable strategy that includes those who do not meet the Ministry of Housing's criteria in Saudi Arabia. This reflects Alwaleed Philanthropies' commitment to complementing government sectors.

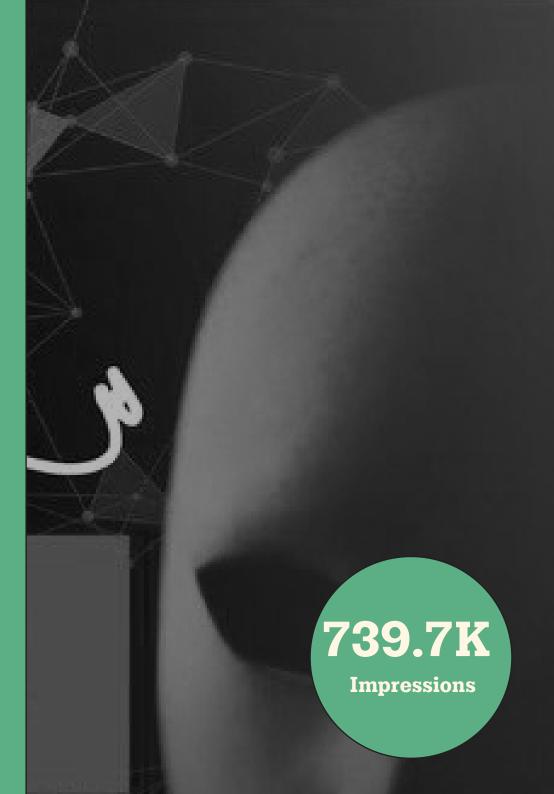
4- National Dialogue.
