## **BUSINESS HIGHLIGHTS – Q1 FY 23**



- Successful trials of Plastic piping Product plant at Guwahati (Assam) has been completed and the same has gone into commercial production w.e.f. 1<sup>st</sup> July'22.
- Raw Material Prices continue to slide down. The prices of different Polymers particularly for polypropylene (PP), Low Denier Polyethylene (LDPE) and Poly Vinyl Chloride (PVC) have gone down between Rs. 19 per kg to Rs. 46 per kg since beginning of the year till now i.e. a reduction between 13% to 32%. Severest fall among them is in PVC Resin where prices have fallen by Rs. 46 per kg. i.e. 32 % from beginning of the year.







- For Q1 FY23, Revenue at ₹ 2206 crore compared to ₹ 1342 crore in Q1 FY22, grew by 64%







  - Provided healthcare facilities & oxygen plant, other medical equipment etc. for Covid & other treatment at local hospitals in Rajasthan






