01. OVERVIEW The present Open Call for Projects took place between April 9 and June 3, 2019. A total of 82 applications have been submitted through the website of the Porto Design Biennale, in the section reserved for this Open Call.

The jury has assessed the applications on the basis of their absolute and relative merits, thus unanimously selecting 10 projects. A total amount of 54.695€ has been granted to a set of 9 projects. One of the selected projects has not been granted monetary support.

The jury has praised the number and quality of the applications. Most hold great potential as critical reflections on the main theme of this year's edition of the Porto Design Biennale, rethinking the traditional formats of public presentations in order to reach and interact with a broader audience.
