Series Notes: Auburn has won four of the last five meetings in the series. Alabama won the last game in Tuscaloosa, 51-50, on Jan. 22, 2015, and its last win in Auburn came on Feb. 17, 2011 (59-51).

OPENING TIP

- ▶ Alabama (12-4, 1-2 SEC) will play its second Southeastern Conference road game of the season on Thursday when it takes on the Auburn Tigers (11-5, 1-2 SEC) in Auburn Arena. The game will tip off at 6 p.m. CT.
- ▶ Thursday's game will air live on SEC Network + with Rod Bramblett on play-by-play and Joe Ciampi as the analyst. The game will also be available via the Crimson Tide Sports Network on Tide 99.1 locally, with Roger Hoover calling all the action. Fans will be able to follow along with live scoring on RollTide.com and game updates will be available on Twitter via @AlabamaWBB.
- ▶ This is the 82nd meeting between Alabama and Auburn and the 37th on The Plains. The Tigers lead the overall series, 46-35, and have won 28 of the 26 matchups in Auburn. AU has come out on top in four of the last five contests, including last year's regular season finale, 80-73. The Crimson Tide won the last meeting in Tuscaloosa, 51-50, while its last win in Auburn came on Feb. 17, 2011, 59-51.
- ▶ Alabama dropped its second straight Southeastern Conference game with a 54-48 loss to Vanderbilt on Sunday afternoon. Junior Breanna Hayden, who made her first start of the season, led the Crimson Tide in scoring with 10 points. She was followed by sophomores Quanetria Bolton and Karyla Middlebrook, who added nine points each. Hayden also collected a careerhigh and game-best eight rebounds. For the game, Alabama actually had a better percentage from the floor than Vanderbilt did, hitting 34.6 percent (18-52) compared to 31.9 percent (15-47), however the Commodores hit seven three-pointers and were 17-of-21 from the free throw line. The Tide made five threes and was 7-of-13 from the stripe.

ABOUT ALABAMA'S OPPONENT — AUBURN

- The Tigers are under the direction of fourth-year head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, who in her first season at Auburn, reached the quarterfinals of the Women's National Invitation Tournament and the third round in 2014. In her 11 complete seasons as a head coach, Williams-Flournoy has guided her teams to the postseason six times, advancing to the NCAA Tournament in three of those years. Prior to taking over at Auburn, she was head coach at Georgetown from 2004-12. Assistant coaching stops for Williams-Flournoy include Southwest Missouri State (2002-04), Georgia (1996-2002) and Georgetown (1992-96).
- Last time out, Auburn dropped a 79-52 decision at Tennessee for the Tigers' third loss in its last four games (52-45 loss at Florida Gulf Coast on Dec. 30; 60-45 loss at Mississippi State on Jan. 7). Auburn took 68 shots in the game, however it was only able to convert on 29.4 percent of those attempts, while the Lady Volunteers finished the game 59.6 percent (34-57) from the floor. Despite the loss, senior center Tra'Cee Tanner came up with her sixth double-double of the season, recording 12 points and 10 rebounds.
- The Tigers are led in scoring by junior Brandy Montgomery, who averages 17.3 points. She is followed by senior Tra'Cee Tanner, who averages 14.0 points and a team-best 8.6 rebounds per contest. Junior Katie Frerking is the team's leader in assists with 2.9 per game. As a team, Auburn is averaging 67.6 points and 38.3 rebounds per game.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. - Alabama lost its first game of the season at home on Sunday, falling 54-48, to Vanderbilt in Southeastern Conference action at Foster Auditorium. The Crimson Tide (12-4, 1-2 SEC) led for the majority of the game, but the Commodores (12-4, 1-2 SEC) outscored UA, 23-12, in the final quarter for the win.

Junior Breanna Hayden, making her first start of the season, nailed a jumper on the opening possession, sparking a 7-2 run for Alabama over the first 4:30. Vanderbilt responded, scoring six of the final eight points of the quarter, but the Tide remained in front at the end of the first, 9-8.

Alabama would, again, score on its first trip down the court as freshman Shaquera Wade drained a three-pointer at the 9:19 mark. The Tide went on to lead by as many as five in the quarter and would take a 20-17 advantage into the locker room at the half.

The Commodores strung together a 9-5 run at the start of the third to take its first lead of the game, 26-25, with 7:01 remaining in the quarter. Vanderbilt held on for the next few minutes, but eight unanswered points for Alabama to end the third gave the Tide the lead back and a 36-31 edge heading into the final quarter.

The Commodores used another strong start, outscoring Alabama 9-0, to take a 40-36 lead. Vanderbilt would hold on for the duration, leading by as many as eight down the stretch.

Hayden led the Tide in scoring with 10 points. She was followed by sophomores Quanetria Bolton and Karyla Middlebrook, who added nine points each. Hayden also collected a career-high and game-best eight rebounds. The Commodores were led by sophomore Christa Reed, who scored 17 points.

For the game, Alabama actually had a better percentage from the floor than Vanderbilt did, hitting 34.6 percent (18-52) compared to 31.9 percent (15-47), however the Commodores hit seven three-pointers and were 17-of-21 from the free throw line. The Tide made five threes and was 7-of-13 from the stripe.

ALABAMA WINS 10th STRAIGHT AT HOME

With its 62-45 victory over LSU on Jan. 3, Alabama won its 10th home game of the season. The last time the Crimson Tide went 10-0 to start the season at home was in 1997-98 when it won 12 consecutive games.

HOME SCORING

Through 10 home games, Alabama is averaging 80.5 points per game and has scored 90 or more points four times. A year ago, the Crimson Tide only averaged 60.1 points per game in Tuscaloosa.

MARTINEZ CRACKS MOST BLOCKS IN A GAME TOP 10 LIST TWICE IN TWO GAMES

Sophomore Diamanté Martinez cemented her name in the top 10 in blocks in a single game twice this season. Her six rejections on Nov. 13 versus Alabama A&M tied for third in Alabama history for blocks in a single game and was the most since Yolanda Watkins collected the same amount on Dec. 4, 1994, against Tennessee State. She followed that up with five against Appalachian State, which ranks seventh in the Tide annals.

BALANCED ATTACK

The Crimson Tide has had at least three players score in double figures in 10 of its 16 games this season. Alabama had a whopping seven reach 10 points or more in the season opener versus Alabama A&M, four in the win over Appalachian State, five in the victory against Mississippi Valley State, four against Georgia State, three versus Utah Valley, six against Alcorn State, four versus Georgetown and three against North Florida, Grambling State and Lipscomb.

ALL ABOUT THAT PACE

It doesn't take long to pick up on the importance of the word "pace" with this season's squad. It is one thing that head coach Kristy Curry preaches, and it has certainly paid dividends. Through 16 games, Alabama has forced 325 turnovers, nearly half of those (159) coming from steals and is outrebounding its opponents, 676-608. The Tide has also shot the ball over 50 times more than its opponents, making 41.4 percent of its attempts. Curry attributes a lot of the improvement to strength and conditioning coach Terry Jones. Although a veteran coach with over 28 years of experience at Alabama, Jones joined the women's basketball team in the spring of 2015 and has made an immediate impact on the squad.

GETTING TO THE LINE

Alabama ranks 29th in the nation in free throw attempts (335) and 22nd in free throws made (241) while averaging 71.9 percent made per game. Last year, the Tide finished the regular season ranked third in free throw attempts, taking 723 shots from the line in 2014-15.

YOUTH LEADS TIDE IN NUMBERS

Throughout the 2014-15, Alabama was led statistically by its youth, and that trend is continuing this season. After 16 games, the Tide's freshmen and sophomores have accounted for 850 of its 1,155 points (73.6 percent), 412 of its 676 rebounds (60.9 percent), 143 of its 200 assists (71.5 percent), 58 of its 92 blocks (63.0 percent) and 120 of its 159 steals (75.5 percent).

GRIT AND GRATITUDE

One of the team's mottos for this season that you will hear head coach Kristy Curry talk a lot about is grit and gratitude. At the beginning of the season she said, "We talk a lot about grit, and we talk a lot about gratitude. We want to be the grittiest and the most thankful in everything that we do, on and off the floor. If we can do those two things the scoreboard will take care of itself."

THE HARD HAT

Over the summer, the team read Jon Gordon's book titled *The Hard Hat*, which is the true story of George Boiardi, a selfless, loyal, joyful, hard-working, competitive and compassionate leader and teammate and the

FORZATIDE

The Alabama women's basketball team embarked on a 10-day tour of Italy in August, visiting Rome, Florence, Venice and Como. Not only did the Crimson Tide come home with a wealth of knowledge about the country and its history, but it also gained valuable on-court time, playing three games against three different teams of varying levels. Sophomore Hannah Cook averaged 17.0 points per game to lead the UA offense largely in part to going 13-for-21 from three-point range. Junior Breanna Hayden was solid all-around for the Tide as she finished with an average of 9.3 points per game, a team-best 6.3 rebounds and 2.7 assists per contest.

HEGSTETTER NAMED ALLSTATE WBCA GOOD WORKS NOMINEE FOR THIRD CONSECUTIVE SEASON

Senior forward Nikki Hegstetter was named a nominee for the 2016 Allstate WBCA Good Works Teams, marking the third time she has been recognized. The award recognizes a select group of college basketball student-athletes who have made significant contributions to the greater good of their communities through volunteerism and civic service. Hegstetter continues to be involved in several aspects of the community, including Habitat for Humanity, The Miracle League of Tuscaloosa and Alabama women's basketball's Fifth Grade Fastbreak program. She has also spent time volunteering at local high school basketball camps, elementary schools, the DCH Manderson Cancer Center and Capstone Village Retirement Community.

HEGSTETTER HONORED BY CULVERHOUSE COLLEGE OF COMMERCE

Forward Nikki Hegstetter earned a pair of prestigious awards from Alabama's Culverhouse College of Commerce as part of the University's Honors Day celebration. Hegstetter was named the Austin Scholar for Outstanding Senior in the Culverhouse College of Commerce, which is presented annually to the outstanding undergraduate student in the Culverhouse College of Commerce and Business Administration, as selected by the entire college faculty. In addition, she received the James Larry Carmichael Department of Marketing Outstanding Student Service Award, which is given to the student with the most distinguished reputation for service to the entire University community.

FANS EXCITED ABOUT WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Season ticket sales have increased over 50 percent since Kristy Curry took over at the Capstone. Foster Auditorium drew a crowd of 2,678 for its win over Georgia on Jan. 26, 2014, setting a new record attendance for women's basketball in the historic building. Fans then answered the call to top that number the next week against Tennessee, and would set another record as 3,002 packed into Foster to watch the Tide and Lady Vols. The record was broken, yet again, in 2015 when 3,133 were on hand for the Mississippi State game. Alabama's average attendance has continued to grow and is up an average of 1,405 per game since Curry's arrival (1,145 in 2012-13; 1,992 in 2013-14; 2,550 in 2014-15).

ALABAMA INKS THREE DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

The Alabama women's basketball team added three of the top prospects in the 2016 class with the signing of Cierra Johnson, Ashley Knight and Jordan Lewis.

"All three of these young ladies bring a style of play that is fun to watch, and all three are truly committed to making an immediate impact in our process," said Curry. "This class compliments our current roster and will compete on a daily basis to impact our program both on and off the court in a major way as freshmen."





With the win, the Crimson Tide moves to 6-0 for the first time since the 2002 season, while the loss drops the Wolverines to 6-2 Wolverines to 6-2.

Alabama defeated Grambling State, 72-57, for its 10th win of the season. The Crimson Tide (10-2) blocked nine shots and held the Tigers (2-8) to only two points in the second quarter.

Grambling State got off to a hot start, making nine shots from the field in a row at one point en route to an 11-of-14 performance in the first quarter. The Tigers would lead by as many as 11 points with one minute left in the period, but Alabama closed to within seven at 27-20. Monisha Neal paced Grambling State with 11 points in the opening 10 minutes.

The Tide dominated the second quarter, outscoring the visitors 15-2 to take a six-point advantage into the locker room. Alabama put together an 11-0 run as the Tigers took over seven minutes to convert a field goal. Sophomore Quanetria Bolton, junior Breanna Hayden and senior Nikki Hegstetter all had eight points at the half.

Grambling State would recapture the lead twice in the opening minutes of the third quarter, but a jumper by Bolton put the Tide ahead for good at 40-39. Her basket sparked a 9-0 run as Alabama stretched its lead to 49-40.

A bucket by Hegstetter gave the Tide a double-digit lead in the opening minute of the final period. Eleven points is the closest the Tigers would get the rest of the way, as Alabama led by as many as 18 points.

For the game, the Tide shot 30-for-64 (46.9 percent) from the field, made nine of its 12 free throw attempts, and grabbed 45 rebounds. Grambling State shot 22-of-58 (37.9 percent) from the floor, converted nine of its 11 foul shots, and hauled in 28 rebounds. Alabama controlled the paint on both ends, scoring 48 points in the paint and blocking nine shots defensively.

Hegstetter led the Tide with 17 points, matching her career high, and 10 rebounds. Hayden added 15 points, and Bolton put up 14. Hayden and sophomore Meoshonti Knight each grabbed six rebounds.

Alabama remains undefeated at home, picking up a 68-49 victory over Lipscomb on Monday evening in its final non-conference game of the season. The Crimson Tide used a 21-5 run to close the first half and produced a total of 31 points off of 21 Lady Bison turnovers. The nine straight wins at home is the best start in Tuscaloosa since 2006.

Alabama held the lead by as many as six points in Aladama neido rine lead by as many as its points in the opening quarter, but went scoreless for the remaining three minutes of the period to allow Lipscomb to pull within two at 14-12. The Tide dominated the second quarter, outscoring the Lady Bison 27-10, including an extended 21-5 run over the final 5:50 to head into the locker room with a comfortable 41-22 advantage.

Alabama forced 14 turnovers in the first 20 minutes of

play and scored 11 points at the foul line while Lipscomb did not attempt a free throw. Junior Breanna Hayden poured 11 points in the half and sophomore Hannah Cook chipped in 10.

Cook made two free throws to open the second half. but the Tide would go scoreless for the next 8:02 as the Lady Bison slowly cut into the lead. Alabama missed its first 12 bison slowly cut into the lead. Adadama finished just 1-of-shots from the field in the third quarter and finished just 1-of-14, as Hegstetter's layup put an end to an 11-0 Lipscomb stretch. The Lady Bison scored 14 points to just four for the Tide in the third period to trail by only nine points at 45-36 going into the final 10 minutes.

Cook drained a trey to spark a decisive 13-0 Alabama run that put the game away. The sophomore capped the run with another shot from behind the arc, which pushed the lead back up to 20 points at 57-37 with 6:10 remaining. Lipscomb tried to make one final push by firing a flurry of three point attempts, but could only get as close as 15.

Cook paced the offense with 20 points along with a team-best seven rebounds. Hayden finished with 13 points and tied her season high with six rebounds, while sophomore Quanetria Bolton tallied 10 points and grabbed six rebounds. Hegstetter also hauled in seven rebounds. along with shutting down Lipscomb's leading scorer, Ashley Southern, who came into the game averaging a double-double at 21.8 points and 10.5 rebounds. Alabama began Southeastern Conference play by knocking off the LSU Lady Tigers, 62-45, inside Foster Auditorium. The Crimson Tide forced 25 LSU turnovers for the game, resulting in 24 points. The victory gives Alabama

its first win in an SEC opener since 2008.

Alabama lost its first Southeastern Conference road game of the season, falling 73-48 at No. 10/9 Kentucky on Thursday in Memorial Coliseum. With the loss, the Crimson Tide dips to 12-3 overall and 1-1 in league play while the win lifts the Wildcats to 12-1 on the season and 1-1 against conference foes.

Alabama and Kentucky traded baskets for the majority of the first quarter, but an 8-0 run for the Wildcats over the final two minutes gave the home team a 15-9 lead at the break. UK pushed its lead out to as many as 14 in the second quarter before the Tide cut it to 10, 29-19, at halftime.

Sophomore Hannah Cook connected on a jumper to bring Alabama within eight on the opening possession of the third, however Kentucky extended its lead back out to double digits shortly after. The Wildcats outscored the Tide, 11-3, to the end quarter and take a 51-33 advantage into the final 10 minutes of play.

With Kentucky leading 53-33, Alabama embarked on an 11-2 run to cut its deficit to 11 with 6:51 to go, but that's as close as the Tide would get in the final quarter.

Sophomore Karyla Middlebrook led Alabama in scoring with 12 points, while Cook followed with 10. Senior Nikki Hegstetter pulled down a team-best eight rebounds. The Wildcats had five finish in double figures, led by junior Evelyn Akhator, who had 21 points. Sophomore Alexis Jennings finished with a double-double of 12 points and 10 rebounds.

For the game, Kentucky hit 43.5 percent (27-62), while Alabama was 30.4 percent (17-56) from the floor. The Wildcats outrebounded the Tide, 45-30, and outscored Alabama, 30-10, in the paint
