# Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- This is the 43rd meeting between Auburn and Georgia in women's basketball
- Georgia leads the all-time series 25-17, but Auburn leads 10-8 in Auburn
- · Auburn has won four of the last six meetings
- Auburn's loss to Florida last Sunday snapped an 11-game home winning streak at Auburn Arena
- Auburn is 7-1 at home this season
- Today marks Auburn's third game against a ranked opponent in their last four contests
- The Tigers' win at FIU on Dec. 29 snapped a six-game road losing streak
- Auburn is 94-174 all-time against top-25 opponents, 53-56
- The Tigers are 6-5 all-time on January 11 and 193-119 all-time in the month of January
- Auburn is 47-51 all-time against teams from the state of Georgia (1-0 this season)
- Auburn is 5-1 this season when forcing 25 or more turnovers
- Auburn's defense converts turnovers into an average of 20.7 points per game
- The Tigers have recorded 15 or more steals five times this year, going 5-0 in those games
- Auburn is second in the SEC in assists (15.5/game), third in blocks (5.0/game) and fourth in steals (12.2/game)
- The Tigers hold opponents to 55.4 points per game, fifth-best in the SEC
- Senior Hasina Muhammad scored a season-high 26 points at No. 1 South Carolina; 8-18 FG, 10-10 FT
- Muhammad leads the SEC in blocked shots (2.3/game) and is 10th in steals (2.1/game)
- Sophomores Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking were named to the FIU Fun & Sun all-tournament team
- Montgomery has two 20+ point games this season, both on the road 24 at Virginia (11/23) and 20 at FIU (11/29)
- Sophomore Khady Dieng was named to the St. John's All-Tournament Team after scoring 26 points in two games
- Senior Kiani Parker is 5th in the SEC in assists (3.8/game)
- Junior Tra'Cee Tanner has held or shared the Auburn lead in scoring in 10 of 16 games this year
- Tanner has three double-doubles this season (Troy, St. John's, Florida)
- Tanner leads the SEC in field goal percentage (.572) and is 13th in scoring (12.8 ppg)

Auburn remains at home for a second-straight game as the Tigers host the 7th-ranked Tennessee Lady Vols on Thursday, Jan. 11. Tip is set for 7 p.m. at Auburn Arena, and the game will be televised by FSN.

# IN THE RANKINGS

Auburn is unranked. Georgia is ranked 20th by the Associated Press and 19th in the USA Today Coaches' Poll.

# **QUICK HITS**

Auburn finished its non-conference schedule at 9-4... The Tigers have opened SEC play 0-3... Auburn won its 850th all-time game with its win over Troy on Nov. 14, becoming the 19th team in NCAA history with 850 victories ... Auburn is in its 44th season of women's basketball and sports an all-time record of 858-415... Auburn has made 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, five WNIT appearances and three Final Fours in the program's history... Head Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is 47-37 in her third season at Auburn... She has a 190-141 record as a head coach... Auburn advanced to the 2013 WNIT Quarterfinals and the 2014 WNIT Third Round... The Tigers are coming off back-to-back 19-15 seasons.

# **AGAINST THE SEC**

Auburn has an all-time record of 204-191 (.518) against the other 13 members of the Southeastern Conference (in league games). The Tigers have won five SEC regular-season titles (most recently 2009) and four SEC Tournament championships.

# **AUBURN-GEORGIA SERIES**

This is the 43rd meeting between Auburn and Georgia. The Lady Bulldogs own a 25-17 edge in the all-time series that dates back to 1975. The Tigers are 10-8 all-time in games played in Auburn, including a 1-1 mark at Auburn Arena.

# LAST MEETING: AUBURN 67, GEORGIA 59

Tyrese Tanner was a threat to miss her Senior Day, considering she only played three minutes in the first half because of, yet again, perplexing foul trouble.

But Tanner showed up in the second half, and in a big way, to score all of her 21 points to help Auburn beat Georgia 67-59 Sunday in Auburn Arena.

Tanner and Peyton Davis were honored on Senior Day and responded with a combined 24 points and 10 rebounds. A freshman gpt in the scoring act, too. Brandy Montgomery had 21 points, too.

Auburn, trying to improve its tournament stock, improved to 15-12 overall and 6-8 in the SEC with two regular-season games remaining. Georgia fell to 18-9 overall and 6-8 in the league.

The game was played inside, considering the two teams combined to hit 4-of-32 3-point tries. Williams-Flournoy wanted credit for holding Georgia to 1-of-14 shooting from beyond the arc.

Auburn scored 34 points on Georgia's 24 turnovers. The Tigers also got a boost by hitting 24-of-31 free throws, quite a feat considering the Tigers shot only one free throw in the first half.

Georgia led 29-28 at the half of a close game that featured 10 lead changes and 10 ties.

# **SCOUTING THE TIGERS**

Auburn is 9-7 overall, 0-3 in SEC play, coming off a 78-57 loss at Kentucky on Thursday. The Tigers are in the midst of a stretch where they play four ranked teams in a five-game stretch and five top-25 teams in seven games.

Junior Tra'Cee Tanner has been the Tigers' top offensive threat thus far, averaging 12.8 points and shooting an SEC-best 57.2% in the first 15 games. She has three double-doubles this season: 16 points, 10 rebounds vs. Troy (11/14), 12 points, 10 rebounds at St. John's (12/20) and 12 points, 10 rebounds vs. Florida (1/4). She followed up her first double-double with a career-high 31 points on 14-of-18 shooting vs. Grambling State. She then scored 19 points in a win over FGCU, 23 in a loss at Kentucky, and has led Auburn in scoring in 9 of 16 games.

Sophomore Brandy Montgomery is averaging 10.6 points per game, including a career-high 24 at Virginia and 20 at FIU, and senior Hasina Muhammad has contributed 9.0 points per game,

mostly off the bench with one start, including 17.0 per game in the first three SEC contests. Sophomore Katie Frerking is the team's top rebounder at 5.9 boards/game.

Pressure defense remains a staple of Coach Flo's system. After averaging 20.0 forced turnovers per game during her first two seasons, the Tigers have forced an average of 21.0 turnovers in the first 16 games of this season while racking up 12.2 steals/game.

# **SCOUTING THE LADY BULLDOGS**

Georgia enters Sunday's game at 14-2 overall, 2-1 in SEC play. The Lady Bulldogs, ranked 20th in the AP poll, have SEC wins over Missouri and Alabama while falling to No. 14 Misssissippi State. In SEC games, Georgia is allowing just 53 points per game.

Shacobia Barbee leads Georgia with 12.4 points per game while also contributing 6.7 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 2.5 steals. Barbee was a preseason All-SEC second team selection. Tiaria Griffin adds 11.9 points per game and is the team's leading 3-point shooter with 34 makes on the year (38.6%).

Georgia was picked sixth by the media and fifth by the coaches in the preseason SEC poll. The Lady Bulldogs advanced to their 20th consecutive NCAA Tournament in 2014, and coach Andy Landers is in his 36th year at Georgia, where he has won more than 850 games.

# LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN

Junior Tra'Cee Tanner scored 23 points, but Auburn fell short on the road at No. 10 Kentucky, dropping a 78-57 decision at Memorial Coliseum on Thursday night.

The Tigers (9-7, 0-3) committed a season-high 25 turnovers while forcing Kentucky (14-2, 3-0) into just 12 giveaways, a season-low for an Auburn opponent. Consequently, the Wildcats scored 23 points off turnovers while Auburn had just six.

On multiple occasions in the second half, Auburn cut Kentucky's lead to single digits, getting as close as eight points at 56-48 with just over eight minutes to play. From that point, however, the Tigers connected on just two field goal attemps while committing seven turnovers and missing seven of their final nine shots.

Kentucky led 37-25 at halftime. It was a nine-point game as the final second were ticking down, but UK's Makayla Epps connected on a 3-pointer from the corner just before the horn sounded.

Tanner's 23 points marked her second-best output of the season, behind only her 31-point effort against Grambling on Nov. 17. She also had six rebounds and three blocks. Senior Hasina Muhammad scored 12 points along with six rebounds, five blocks and three assists. Muhammad's five blocks tied a career-high.

Auburn out-rebounded Kentucky 45-35. The Tigers shot 37.3 percent from the field and connected on just one 3-pointer on five attempts. Kentucky was 43.1 percent from the floor and shot 7-of-

19 from 3-point range.

# LAST TIME OUT FOR GEORGIA

Fueled by a 16-point night from Tiaria Griffin, the No. 20 Georgia Lady Bulldogs defeated Missouri 69-48 on Thursday night at Stegeman Coliseum. With the victory, Georgia remains undefeated at home with 10-straight wins.

Griffin led Georgia's shooting campaign with 16 points, and Shacobia Barbee added 12 points. Krista Donald tallied a teambest nine rebounds.

With a 21-18 lead nearing the break, Barbee hit a jumper to ignite a Georgia run. Marjorie Butler capitalized on a Missouri turnover, hitting consecutive shots, one from behind the arc, and Barbee added another basket to put the Lady Bulldogs up 30-18 at halftime

Georgia continued its run in the second stanza, outscoring the Tigers 14-4 in the opening minutes of the half. Spanning both periods, the Lady Bulldogs kept Missouri away from the basket for more than eight minutes. But the Tigers rallied, narrowing the deficit from 23 points to 14 in a short 3:09. Griffin put Georgia back in control on a 3-pointer that was followed shortly by a jumper from Mackenzie Engram. Erika Ford and Jasmine Carter added shots in the final minutes of the game to give Georgia a 20-point advantage.

Georgia capitalized on turnovers, converting 22 Missouri miscues into 29 points, while the Tigers managed only six points on 11 Lady Bulldog turnovers. Georgia also tallied 12 second-change points and 31 points from the bench.

# **ON JANUARY 11**

This will be Auburn's 12th all-time game on January 8. The Tigers are 6-5 all-time on this date with the last contest being an 81-65 win over Florida in 2009.

# **HOME SWEET HOME**

Auburn has won 11 out of their last 12 games at Auburn Arena, including the final two regular season games and two WNIT games in the 2013-14 season and the first six games of 2014-15. Dating back to a win over Alabama on Feb. 17, 2013, Auburn has won 23 of its last 30 home games, including a 17-1 mark against non-conference opponents.

With 11 straight wins, Auburn matched the longest home win streak since Auburn Arena opened in 2010. Auburn previously won 11 straight over the last two games of 2011-12 and the first nine games of 2012-13.

Under Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, Auburn has a record of 22-1 in non-conference home games.

Auburn is 49-23 (.681) in its fifth season at Auburn Arena.

# IN AND OUT

With Auburn's high-intensity defensive pressure, the Tigers must rotate multiple players to keep fresh legs on the floor at all time. As a result, 10 different players are averaging at least 10 minutes played per game, and no player is averaging 30 minutes or more.

Brandy Montgomery has played the most minutes, averaging 28.3, followed by Tra'Cee Tanner (25.5), Katie Frerking (22.7) Kiani Parker (22.1), Khady Dieng (21.6), and Hasina Muhammad (21.4).

# I SEE YOU, C-MO

Senior Hasina Muhammad put together her best performance of the season and one of the best of her career, scoring 26 points (two shy of a career-best) at No. 1 South Carolina on Jan. 2. She was 8-of-18 from the field and a perfect 10-of-10 at the free-throw line. Muhammad also had three steals and three blocks in the game.

Muhammad currently leads the SEC in blocks (2.1/game) and is in the top 10 in steals (2.3/game).

# TAKING OUR TALENTS TO SOUTH BEACH

Sophomores Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking were named to the FIU Fun & Sun Classic all-tournament team in late December. Montgomery scored 20 points in 20 minutes and had a career-high 5 steals in a win over FIU, and Katie Frerking scored 12 points on 6-6 shooting against FIU and had a career-high 10 rebounds against Hampton.

# **KHADY IN THE BIG APPLE**

Sophomore Khady Dieng had two of her best performances of the season in the St. John's Chartwells Holiday Classic, scoring 27 points over two games against St. John's and SMU on Dec. 20-21. Her 14 points against SMU were a season-high, and she was named to the all-tournament team.

# **BIG NIGHTS FOR TRA'CEE**

Junior Tra'Cee Tanner had a career-high 31 points in a 92-42 win over Grambling State on Nov. 17. It was the first time an Auburn player scored 30 or more points since Blanche Alverson had 32 against Mississippi State on March 3, 2013.

Tanner's performance was the 35th time in Auburn history that a player scored 30 or more points in a single game.

Tanner had another big night in the season's third SEC game, scoring 23 points at No. 10 Kentucky on Jan. 8.

# **BRANDY FROM DOWNTOWN**

Sophomore Brandy Montgomery scored a career-high 24 points against Virginia on Nov. 23, including six 3-pointers. It marked the most 3-pointers in a game by an Auburn player since Ruth Ketcham had six vs. Colgate on Dec. 5, 2007.

Montgomery needs just 16 more made 3-pointers to move into the all-time Auburn top 10.

# **CLUB PRESS**

Auburn's high-pressure, full-court defense under coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, refered to by the players as "Club Press," has ranked as one of the best ever at Auburn over the last two seasons. In 2012-13, Auburn's 402 steals set a new school record for a single season while the 701 turnovers forced went down as second all-time on The Plains.

In 2013-14, the Tigers forced 659 opponent turnovers while recording 354 steals, remaining a major force on defense in the Southeastern Conference

Auburn has forced 25 or more turnovers in a game 116 times since 1987 and has done so six times this season. Auburn forced 29 turnovers in the season-opener vs. Troy, 25 in the win over Grambling and 27 in wins over Marquette, Samford and FIU. The Tigers have also tallied 15 or more steals in a game on 105 occasions since 1987, doing so five times last season and five times already in 2014-15.

The Tigers used the defense to fuel their offense, averaging 19.3 points per game off turnovers last year. So far this year, Auburn scored 29 points off turnovers in the season-opener vs. Troy, 34 against Grambling, 28 vs. Marquette and 27 vs. Samford.

# **BACK-TO-BACK 19-WIN SEASONS**

Auburn has posted back-to-back seasons with a 19-15 record, which tie for the most wins in a season since the Tigers' SEC Championship season of 2009. The Tigers advanced to the WNIT quarterfinals in 2013 and the WNIT third round in 2014.

# **LOCKDOWN DEFENDER**

Hasina Muhammad returns for her senior season as one of the top defensive players in the Southeastern Conference. A selection to the SEC All-Defensive Team in 2014, Muhammad ranked second in the SEC in steals (2.4/game) and fourth in the league in blocks (2.1/game). She also ranked in the top 50 nationally in both categories in 2014.

Muhammad currently ranks second in the SEC in blocks (1.8/game) and ninth in steals (2.2/game).

# **TOUGH SCHEDULE**

The Tigers will play a challenging schedule this season, playing as many as seven non-conference games against teams that advanced to the postseason a year ago. Florida Gulf Coast, Winthrop, St. John's and Hampton all played in the NCAA Tournament last year, while SMU, Marquette and Bowling Green advanced to the WNIT.

Auburn's first five SEC opponents - South Carolina, Florida, Kentucky, Georgia, and Tennessee - all advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season. Texas A&M, LSU and Vanderbilt all made the Big Dance, while Mississippi State and Missouri joined Auburn in the WNIT.

# SISTER ACT

For just the fourth time ever, Auburn's roster features a sister combination as twin freshmen Jazmine and Jessica Jones will be in uniform for the Tigers. It gives Auburn a pair of sisters on the roster for the third-straight year as Tyrese and Tra'Cee Tanner played together the last two seasons.

Other sister combinations to play together at Auburn include Tyrese (2010-14) and Tra'Cee Tanner (2012-present); Sherell (2004-09) and Reneisha (2006-10) Hobbs, and Ruthie (1985-89) and Mae Ola (1984-88) Bolton.

# **NEW FACES**

Auburn welcomes five newcomers to the roster for 2014-15, all freshmen. Joining the Tigers this year are G Bria Johnson (Baton Rouge, La.), F Jazmine Jones (Winston-Salem, N.C.), F Jessica Jones (Winston-Salem, N.C.), PG Neydja Petithomme (Boca Raton, Fla.) and F Asia Robeson (Kalamazoo, Mich.).

The Jones twins, Petithomme and Robeson made their collegiate debuts vs. Troy on Nov. 14, and Johnson saw her first action in an

Auburn uniform vs. Grambling State on Nov. 17.

# ON THE TUBE

A total of 22 Auburn games will be televised on either digital or linear networks during the course of the 2014-15 season. Eleven games will appear on SEC Network +, which is available online and on mobile devices via the WatchESPN platform. The Tigers' game at St. John's on Dec. 20 will also be available online via ESPN3. Ten games will appear on linear networks, with the SEC Network and Fox Sports Net broadcasting five games each.

AUBURN, Ala. — Tra'Cee Tanner's career-high 31 points led three Tigers in double-figures as Auburn defeated Grambling State 92-42 Monday night in women's basketball action at Auburn Arena.

Auburn (2-0) has now won six straight games at Auburn Arena, dating back to the last four games of the 2013-14 season.

Tanner scored 12 of the first 14 points for Auburn as a small Grambling lineup had no answer for the 6-3 junior. She would finish with 31, a career-high and the most for an Auburn player since Blanche Alverson scored 32 against Mississippi State on March 3, 2013.

Montgomery had a career-high seven assists along with 18 points, six rebounds and three steals. Freshman Jessica Jones hit double-digits in her second collegiate game with 11 points and six rebounds, and sophomore Khady Dieng filled the stat sheet with nine points, six rebounds, five assists and four steals. Eleven of 12 players on Auburn's roster scored in the game.

Auburn never trailed in the game and controlled the action from the opening tip. Auburn shot 59.4 percent for the game, holding Grambling to 28.3 percent from the field. The homestanding Tigers also outrebounded the visitors 47-24, holding Grambling to just seven offensive rebounds.

A whopping 74 of Auburn's 92 points came in the paint as Auburn took full advantage of their edge in size. Auburn also forced Grambling into 25 turnovers while committing just 15 of their own. Auburn led 46-20 at halftime.

AUBURN, Ala. — Two drawn charges in the final minute and clutch shots from several players helped secure a 72-69 win for the Auburn women's basketball team over Florida Gulf Coast on Thursday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (3-0) won their seventh-straight game at Auburn Arena, dating back to the 2013-14 season, and head into their first road trip this weekend on a high note after a hard-fought win. Auburn is 3-0 for the first time since their 2008-09 SEC Championship season when the Tigers won their first 20 contests.

Tied at 66-66 with just over a minute to play, Hasina Muhammad knocked down a jumper at the one-minute mark to give the Tigers a 68-66 lead. At the other end, Katie Frerking stood tall and drew a charge, setting up a Kiani Parker 15-footer to extend Auburn's lead to four.

But the Eagles answered with a 3-pointer from the corner to cut the lead to one with 12 seconds left, then fouled immediately. Frerking hit one of two free throws to put Auburn ahead by two, then Tra'Cee Tanner drew another charge with 3.1 seconds to play. After another FGCU foul, Khady Dieng hit one of two free throws to make it a three-point game, and the Eagles' desperation heave fell short.

Tanner had another big night offensively, leading the Tigers with 19 points on 7-of-11 shooting. She also tied for the team lead with six rebounds and was a perfect 5-of-5 at the free-throw line. Three other players scored in double figures, led by 11 points from Dieng and 10 apiece from Muhammad and Brandy Montgomery. Muhammad also blocked three shots on the night.

Auburn shot 52.7 percent from the field and saw vast improvement at the free-throw line, hitting 9-of-11 shots on the night. FGCU, which hit seven 3-pointers in the first half, was held to just 3-of-8 in the final 20 minutes from beyond the arc as Auburn got several key stops late in the game.

Auburn trailed 33-28 at halftime. Virginia attempted 11 free throws in the first half, converting on nine, while Auburn did not get to the line until late in the period, making just one of three attempts. The Tigers were 3-for-12 at the line for the game.

Virginia was led by Sarah Imovbioh with 21 points and 13 rebounds; she had a double-double by halftime. Faith Randolph added 18 points for the Cavaliers.

AUBURN, Ala. - Auburn's women's basketball team got 38 points from its bench and held off a late Savannah State rally to pick up a 62-56 victory Wednesday night at Auburn Arena, the Tigers' 11th-straight home win.

The Tigers (7-2), who led by as much as 17 with less than seven minutes to play, saw that lead evaporate as Savannah State (4-4) began converting Auburn turnovers into points. A 14-1 SSU run cut the lead to as few as two points with 2:12 to play, but Auburn made five of six free throws down the stretch to preserve the victory and the home winning streak.

With their 11th straight home victory - final four games of last season, plus seven straight to open this year - the Tigers have matched the Auburn Arena record for consecutive home wins. Auburn won 11 straight over the final two games of 2011-12 and the first nine home contests in 2012-13.


Auburn turned the ball over 22 times on the night, second-most this season, while forcing Savannah State into 21 turnovers. It was just the second time this year that Auburn had more turnovers than its opponent.

Hasina Muhammad led Auburn in scoring for the first time this season, netting a season-best 14 points on 6-of-9 shooting. The senior also tied for the team lead with six rebounds while picking up four assists, two blocks and a steal. Muhammad has had at least one block in eight of nine games this season.

Katie Frerking started out 3-of-3 from the field, including a pair of 3-pointers, and finished with 10 points, six rebounds and four steals.

Auburn led 31-19 at halftime, shooting 52 percent from the field in the opening half while holding Savannah State below 30 percent. For the game, the Tigers' bench outscored Savannah State's reserves 38-7, but SSU controlled points in the paint (34-26) and scored more off turnovers, in second-chance situations and on fast breaks than did Auburn.

# Game 10: Dec. 20, 2014 (25) St. John's 56, Auburn 49 Carnesecca Arena Queens, N.Y.



NEW YORK - Junior Tra'Cee Tanner had her second double-double of the season, but the Auburn women's basketball team's rally from a big early deficit came up short in a 56-49 loss at 25th-ranked St. John's on Saturday.

The Tigers (7-3) trailed by as much as 17 late in the first half but put together a second-half rally that saw them get within three points on two occasions. However, Auburn could not quite get over the hump despite putting major pressure on the Red Storm (10-0) throughout the second half.

Tanner led Auburn with 12 points and 10 rebounds, including seven boards on the offensive end. It was her second double-double of the year to go along with 16 points and 10 rebounds in the season-opener against Troy. Sophomore Khady Dieng matched Tanner's scoring output with 12 points of her own on 5-of-8 shooting.

Kiani Parker had a strong day at the point guard position, scoring eight points along with five assists. She was key in the second-half defensive effort, recording three steals and putting constant pressure on the ball in the backcourt.

Twice in the second half, Auburn cut the deficit to as little as three points. Auburn came out of the gate strong and cut the lead to 40-37 with 13:04 to play. After St. John's moved back ahead by 10 points late in the half, the Tigers ramped up the pressure and forced several turnovers to cut the lead to three points again at 52-49 with just over a minute to play. However, St. John's Aliyyah Handford hit a clutch baseline jumper with 50 seconds to play to make it a five-point game, and then two late free throws sealed the deal for the Red Storm.

The Tigers hit their first three shots and opened the game with a 6-0 lead, but the Red Storm would go on a 23-4 run from that point to take a 23-10 lead. After making their first three attempts, the Tigers would only connect on two of their next 16 shots. Despite trailing by as many as 17, Auburn would cut the deficit to 10 at the half at 32-22.

Auburn forced 13 St. John's turnovers on the day - the fewest of the season by a Tiger opponent - but 10 of those came in the second half. The Tigers out-rebounded the Red Storm 35-27, including a 16-9 advantage on the offensive glass.

NEW YORK - Auburn built a 23-point lead early in the second half but had to hold off a late SMU rally for a 56-43 win Sunday afternoon in the consolation game of the St. John's Chartwells Holiday Classic.

Sophomore Khady Dieng led the Tigers (8-3) with a season-high 14 points and was named to the all-tournament team for her effort throughout the weekend. Senior Kiani Parker contributed a career-high 11 points and five rebounds in the winning effort.

Auburn led by 20 with 10:22 to play after a three-point play by Hasina Muhammad gave the Tigers a 47-27 lead. From that point, however, SMU (4-7) tightened down on defense and forced the Tigers into six turnovers the rest of the way and held Auburn to just one field goal for the remainder of the game.

SMU got as close as eight points at 51-43 with just over two minutes to play as foul trouble plagued both teams late in the game - both teams' leading scorers would foul out in the final five minutes. But with Auburn in the double bonus and SMU in a fouling situation, Parker converted 5-of-9 free throws in the final minute to increase the margin back to double-digits and seal the Tigers' eighth victory.

The Tigers sprinted to a huge early lead, holding SMU to just three field goals in the first 14 minutes of the game as Auburn built a 27-7 lead at the 7:43 mark. A 9-0 run pulled the Mustangs within 11 at 27-16, but Auburn finished the half on an 8-2 run to take a 35-18 lead into the break. The 18 SMU points were the fewest allowed by Auburn this season.

Auburn outscored SMU in the paint 28-14, but foul trouble on the Tigers' bigs kept Auburn from pushing the ball inside in the second half. The Tigers forced SMU into 23 turnovers, scoring 24 points on the Mustangs' giveaways.

Despite going cold over the final 10 minutes, Auburn shot 40 percent for the game, holding SMU to 26.3 percent from the field.

MIAMI - Sophomore Brandy Montgomery's 20 points led five Auburn players in double-figures as the Tigers ran away from Florida International 81-44 on Monday in the opening game of the FIU Fun & Sun Classic.

Auburn (9-3) shot 55 percent from the floor for the game and held FIU (2-8) to 23.8 percent, the lowest of the season by an Auburn opponent. The win snapped a six-game skid in true road games, dating back to the end of last season.

The Tigers created their offense with their press, putting together a 34-2 run midway through the first half. Sixteen of those points came on the fast break as Auburn's defense forced FIU into 18 first-half turnovers. The Panthers had 27 turnovers for the game with Auburn collecting 20 steals

Montgomery scored 20 points in 20 minutes - her second 20 + point effort of the season - on 10-of-16 shooting. She also recorded a career-high five steals - all in the first half - with three of those leading directly to transition layups.

Four other Tigers hit double-digits on the night. Katie Frerking had a season-high 12 points on a perfect 6-of-6 night from the field and shared the Auburn lead with six rebounds. Hasina Muhammad contributed 12 of her own along with four steals and four blocks. Sophomore Khady Dieng and freshman Neydja Petithomme posted 10 points each; Petithomme also had a career-high eight assists and Dieng had four assists and three steals.

It marked the first time for Auburn to have five players in double figures since a win over Old Dominion in last season's WNIT.

MIAMI - Auburn fought back from a nine-point halftime deficit but came up just short in a 44-42 loss to Hampton in the championship game of the FIU Fun & Sun Classic Tuesday afternoon at FIU Arena.

The Tigers (9-4) struggled to score in the first half but were able to create turnovers in the second half, keeping things close to the final horn. Auburn found itself down by 10 points in the latter stages of the game but fought back to a two-point margin. However, Auburn's inconsistency at the free-throw line - 9-for-17 in the game - proved to be a major difference in the two-point loss.

Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking were named to the all-tournament team. Montgomery scored eight points and pulled down six rebounds to go along with her 20-point, five-steal performance against FIU Monday. Frerking had a career-high 10 rebounds in Tuesday's game along with seven points; she scored 12 in the FIU win Monday.

Despite foul trouble that kept her on the bench most of the first half, Tra'Cee Tanner led Auburn with 13 points on 5-of-8 shooting. Junior Cabriana Capers came off the bench and put together one of her best games in an Auburn uniform, tying a career-high with eight points and pulling down seven rebounds in 14 minutes of action.

The Tigers turned up the defensive pressure in the second half, forcing Hampton (5-8) into four 10-second violations, and a 10-0 run to start the half gave Auburn a 22-21 lead. The Lady Pirates would move back ahead by as many as 10 points at 39-29 with just over eight minutes to play, but the Tigers kept chipping away. A Capers layup with just over three minutes to play made it a three-point game, and a Frerking free throw cut it to two. However, the Tigers could not take advantage of their last four possessions with a chance to tie or take the lead, missing their final six shots of the game.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Auburn's women's basketball team put a second-half scare into No. 1 South Carolina, but the Gamecocks pulled away late for a 77-58 win in front of 16.465 fans at Colonial Life Arena.

Senior Hasina Muhammad led the Tigers (9-5, 0-1 SEC) with a season-high 26 points, shooting 8-of-18 from the field and draining all 10 of her free-throw attempts. Muhammad also had three blocks and three steals on the night. Neydja Petithomme added 10 points, and Brandy Montgomery pulled down a team-best seven rebounds.

After trailing by 17 at halftime, Auburn came out of the break on fire. The Tigers shot better than 60 percent over the first eight minutes of the second half and went on a 16-4 run to cut the South Carolina lead to single digits at 48-40. From there, however, the Gamecocks went on a 19-4 run and found several ways to get to the free throw line, pushing the lead to more than 20 points.

The Tigers were only outscored by two points in the second half, mostly thanks to increased defensive intensity. Auburn forced South Carolina into 18 turnovers with 10 of those coming in the second half.

Carolina scored the first seven points of the game as Auburn struggled to find any open looks early. The much taller Gamecocks had five blocks on Auburn's first nine shot attempts and forced the Tigers into nine first-half turnovers. Auburn found some offense toward the end of the half, but South Carolina led 34-17 at the break.

Auburn shot 33.9 percent from the field for the game but showed dramatic improvement at the free-throw line, knocking down 12-of-14 attempts (85.7%). South Carolina shot 48.4 percent and had five players in double figures. Auburn had 11 steals to Carolina's eight, and both teams finished with six blocked shots.

A'ja Wilson (12 points, 10 rebounds) and Alaina Coates (11 points, 14 rebounds) had double-doubles to lead South Carolina. Aleigha Welch also had 12 points on 6-of-6 shooting.

The South Carolina crowd of 16,465 was the largest crowd to ever witness a regular-season Auburn women's basketball game. The only two larger crowds to see an Auburn game came at the 1990 Women's Final Four in Knoxville.

The Tigers (9-6, 0-2 SEC) fell at home for the first time this season, snapping an 11-game winning streak at Auburn Arena. The teams combined for 47 turnovers on the day; Auburn forced the Gators into 27 giveaways but only converted those into 17 points.

Senior Hasina Muhammad led all scorers with 13 points and pulled down four rebounds along with four blocks, two assists and two steals.

LEXINGTON, Ky. - Junior Tra'Cee Tanner scored 23 points, but Auburn fell short on the road at No. 10 Kentucky, dropping a 78-57 decision at Memorial Coliseum on Thursday night.

The Tigers (9-7, 0-3) committed a season-high 25 turnovers while forcing Kentucky (14-2, 3-0) into just 12 giveaways, a season-low for an Auburn opponent. Consequently, the Wildcats scored 23 points off turnovers while Auburn had just six.

Auburn out-rebounded Kentucky 45-35. The Tigers shot 37.3 percent from the field and connected on just one 3-pointer on five attempts. Kentucky was 43.1 percent from the floor and shot 7-of-19 from 3-point range.

The Wildcats had four players in double figures, led by Jennifer O'Neill with 17 points, 15 of which came on 3-pointers. Alexis Jennings and Epps had 12 each.0
