The Cardinals Nest

- Head Coach Brady Sallee is in his second season at the helm of the Ball State women's basketball team, where he led the Cardinals to a 17-16 overall record in 2012-13. He now owns a 153-128 career head coaching record, including his 136-109 mark in eight seasons at Eastern Illinois.

- Sallee helped Ball State post one of the most dramatic turnarounds in Mid-American Conference history a year ago as the Cardinals earned the No. 2 seed in the MAC Tournament with a 12-4 league mark. Ball State improved eight games from its 4-12 MAC mark in 2011-12, which ties as the biggest MAC turnaround in the last 20 years. Sallee also became just the second coach in program history to start MAC play 8-1 in their first season.

- The Cardinals will face six teams in non-conference action that were postseason participants in 2012-13. Louisville and Purdue both went to the NCAA Tournament last season, while Auburn, Western Kentucky and Wyoming played in the Women's National Invitation Tournament and Detroit in the Women's Basketball Invitational.

- Ball State is ranked No. 2 in the MAC West Division preseason poll. This is the first time the Cardinals have been ranked this high in the MAC preseason poll since the 2008-09 season, when the Cardinals were picked to finish first.

- The Ball State women's basketball team will face Auburn Friday at 3 p.m. (ET) and then close out play at the South Point shootout Saturday against Tennessee Tech with a 3 p.m. tipoff (ET). Auburn and Ball State have only met once which resulted in an 89-49 loss in 2000-01 at the South Florida Classic. It will be the first time in program history when the Cardinals face Tennessee Tech when the teams meet Saturday.

Quick Hitters

• Auburn enters Friday's contest with a 3-2 record after the Tigers lost to Chattanooga by a score of 80-52, Nov. 24, on the road. Auburn has wins over Georgia Southern (69-59), Jacksonville State (66-49) and Alabama A&M (77-49). The Tigers have suffered losses to Temple (78-74) and Chattanooga (80-52). Auburn is a member of the Southeastern Conference.

• Tennessee Tech is off to a 2-2 start with wins over Tennessee Wesleyan (94-41) and Valparaiso (84-78) but have suffered losses to fellow Mid-American Conference member Akron (118-71) and Mississippi State (90-45). The Golden Eagles are a member of the Ohio Valley Conference.

• In 2012-13, the Mid-American Conference owned a 6-6 record against the Ohio Valley Conference and a 1-0 ledger versus Tennessee Tech. The MAC went 0-3 versus Southeastern Conference opponents last season with no league school facing Auburn.

• Junior guard Brittany Carter's 15-point performance against Detroit marked the 35th game in her career she has scored in double figures. Carter has now surpassed the 600 point mark for her career with 643 points.

• After tying her career high with a 23-point performance in the Cardinals win at Detroit, sophomore forward Nathalie Fontaine has now scored in double digits 30 times out of 36 total games in her career. Fontaine needs 15 points to reach the 500 mark.

• In her first season at Ball State, Nathalie Fontaine the 2012-13 MAC Freshman of the Year, averaged 13.2 points per game and 6.6 rebounds. Fontaine was named to the MAC All-Freshmen squad, while also earning All-MAC Second Team honors. As a true freshman, Fontaine ended the season just eight points shy of what Ball State's all-time leading scorer Tamara Bowie had when she was a true freshman. Fontaine ended the season with 423 points while Bowie tallied 431 points her freshman year.

• Ball State for the first time since 2009 was the the second seed in the MAC Tournament. The Cardinals also knocked off eventual MAC Tournament Champion Central Michigan twice during the MAC regular season. The success earned Ball State to its fourth appearance in the WNIT and first since the 2006-07 season.

• The Cardinals pulled off one of the biggest upsets in the WNIT with a hard-fought, 53-48 first-round victory at Big Ten foe Minnesota.

• Ball State continued its WNIT run by knocking off Northern Iowa, 51-48, at Worthen Arena to win two WNIT games for the first time in program history, advancing the Cardinals to the Final 16.

Winchester Wonder: Jill Morrison made her first start as a true freshman, Saturday, at Detroit. Morrison tallied a season best 15 points, which included two three point baskets and played a total of 39 minutes.

Small Height Big Numbers: Senior Brandy Woody, a 5-foot-4 guard for the Cardinals led Ball State with 13 rebounds against Pittsurgh on Nov. 14 while pulling down 10 boards at Evansville, Nov. 20. Woody is first on the team in rebounding, averaging 8.0 rebounds per game. Woody's 13 rebounds against Pitt tied her personal best rebounding performance. The last time Woody pulled down 13 boards was against Western Michigan, March 3, 2013.

The Unforgettable Five: The Cardinals will be led by sophomore forward Nathalie Fontaine, along with senior guard Brandy Woody and forward Katie Murphy. Junior guards Brittany Carter and Shelby Justice also return from last year's starting five. Fontaine averaged 13.2 points per game and 6.6 rebounds. Woody, a Third Team All-MAC honoree, averaged 10.9 points and 5.8 rebounds per game last season. Rounding out the starting five from last season are, Carter, Justice and Murphy. The three players combined for 807 points of the Cardinals scoring in

WBB Wins Behind Fontaine's 23 Points: Sophomore forward Nathalie Fontaine tied her career high with 23 points in the Ball State women's basketball (1-3) 80-74 victory at Detroit Mercy (1-5) Saturday afternoon in Calihan Hall. The Cardinals opened the second half with a 6-2 run, to build their biggest lead of the ball game, 50-36, on free throws from freshman guard Jill Morrison, senior forward Katie Murphy and junior guard Shelbie Justice. The Titans closed the gap to 63-62 with 7:45 left in the game after scoring 27 points to Ball State's 13 over a span of 10 minutes. Brittany Carter hit a three-point basket in the Cardinals next possession to put Ball State back up by four, 66-62. With 1:22 remaining, Detroit had a chance to tie the game but the Titans Senee Shearer missed a jumper with 25 seconds on the clock. Detroit was forced to foul Carter, who would then go 4-for-4 from the free throw line to seal the victory for Ball State. Carter finished the game with 18 points, including four three pointers and remains perfect from the free throw line for the season after going 6-for-6. Freshman Jill Morrison tallied 15 points in her first career start. Justice also added 15 points in the win.

Auburn Tigers Points

• Auburn's head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is in her second season with the Tigers. Williams-Flournoy picked up her 150th career victory Dec. 12 at George Washington. She finished her first season at Auburn with a 19-15 overall record and a 5-11 SEC ledger. Williams-Flournoy guided the Tigers to the WNIT quarterfinals. With over 20 years of experience as a head coach and assistant coach, Williams-Flournoy was an assistant coach at Georgetown (1992-93), Georgia (1996-02) and Southwest Missouri State (2002-04). Williams-Flournoy served as the head coach of Georgetown (2004-12) before she was hired at Auburn. As a women's basketball player, she was a four-year letterwinner at Penn State (1987-91).

• The Tigers have four players averaging double figures with Tyrese Tanner leading the way after averaging 15.8 in her last five games. Brandy Montgomery is averaging 12.3, while teammate Tra'Ceé Tanner is scoring 12.2 per contest and Peyton Davis with 10.8.

WBB Inks Three Prep Players To NLI's For 2014-15:

Ball State women's basketball second-year head coach Brady Sallee announced the signing of three players to national letters of intent Wednesday, Nov. 14.

Moriah Monaco (Dover, Ohio/Dover HS), Khadijah Moore (Elkhart, Ind./Elkhart Memorial HS) and Brionna Simond (Milwaukee, Wis./Riverside University HS) have each signed NLI's to play basketball at Ball State.

"Building off our class from last year, I think this year's group takes it to another level", said Sallee. In Moriah, Khadijah and Bri, we have added skill, length and athleticism and a ton of character."

One of two wing players coming to Ball State in 2014-15, Monaco comes from Dover High School where she averages 19.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.0 steals and 2.3 assists. For the last three years the 6-foot-1 player has been named First Team East Central Ohio League and has been an All-Eastern District selection. As a junior, Monaco received Second Team All-Ohio honors. Heading into Monaco's senior season she has already scored over 1,000 points. Monaco is a two-sport athlete who also plays volleyball, earning First Team East Central Ohio and Eastern District honors for two years. She is expected to end her high school career as a four-year letterwinner in basketball and volleyball.

"The first thing you notice is Moriah's ability to shoot the ball but you quickly see an eye-popping versatility that will make her a match-up nightmare. Moriah will be an absolute stat stuffer during her time in Muncie!"

Moore, a 5'11 wing player from Elkhart High School, averaged 14.7 points and 8.8 rebounds while shooting 50 percent from the field and, leading the team in all three categories. She is a four year starter that has earned First Team All-Northern Indiana Conference honors as a sophomore and junior. Moore was tabbed most valuable player her junior season for the Blazers. As a junior, Moore received honorable mention on the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association All-State team. She has helped Elkhart High School win two sectionals and make it to the Sweet 16 two out of her three years. Khadijah was ranked 114 nationally according to Blue Star Basketball Report.

"Khadijah, simply put, is a player! She is one of the best in Indiana and a player that with the ball in her hands, can't be stopped. She is strong, athletic and long with an ability to shoot it from deep. Khadijah is a game-changer for sure."

Simond, a 5'6 guard from Riverside University High School, has played AAU basketball with the Playground Elite under head coach Jeff Smith since the sixth grade. Simond started her high school career at Dominican High School as a freshman playing varsity. She helped the Lady Knights compete for the state championship before transferring to Riverside. As a sophomore, Simond scored a career high 24 points against Chicago's top high school Montini. She ended her sophomore season averaging 12.0 points, 3.0 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game. Simond made the all-area conference team and was selected to the USJN All-Star squad as a sophomore. She helped Riverside win the state title as a junior. A four year letterwinner, Simond is one of the top 50 seniors in the state of Wisconsin, according to wissports.net and was ranked in the top 100 by Midwest recruiting report. Simond is a four year honor roll student.

"Bri is quick on quick! She is a playmaker and can dominate a game on the defensive end of the floor. What separates her from others, in my mind is her leadership abilities. I can't wait to coach Bri!"

• Tennessee Tech's head coach Jim Davis is in his second season with the Golden Eagles. Davis returned to his alma mater in 2012-13, and led Tennessee Tech to a share of the Ohio Valley Conference regular season championship, a 19-12 overall record and a 12-4 mark in the OVC. Davis' coaching resume includes junior high and high school positions, a six-year span at Roane State Community College, one championship year at Middle Tennessee State, 18 successful seasons at Clemson, a year in the WNBA with the Minnesota Lynx, and the past two seasons as an assistant coach at Young Harris College in Georgia.

• Tennessee Tech has two players averaging double figures with Diamon Henderson leading the way after averaging 16.0 in her last four games and Hannah Goolsby is averaging 13.8 per contest.

• Terri Williams-Flournoy (Auburn), Jim Davis (Tennessee Tech) and Brady Sallee (Ball State) are all in their second seasons at their respective institutions. All three had winning seasons, and Williams-Flournoy and Sallee both advanced to the WNIT.

• Ball State Director of Operations Audrey McDonald-Spencer was a part of three teams that were crowned Mid-American Conference West Division Champions (2006-07, 2007-08, 2008-09). McDonald-Spencer was a member of the only Ball State women's basketball team to win a MAC Tournament Championship and participate in the NCAA Tournament in 2008-09.

• Second-year head coach Brady Sallee is familiar with the MAC as he was an assistant women's basketball coach from 1996-2002 at Kent State. He helped the Golden Flashes to five regular-season MAC Championships and three tournament titles. The Golden Flashes participated in the NCAA Tournament four of his seven years while posting a combined record of 155-56.

• Brady Sallee was the former head coach at Eastern Illinois (2004-12) where he was a member of the Ohio Valley Conference. During his tenure at Eastern Illinois, Sallee led the Panthers to the institution's first ever Ohio Valley Conference title during the 2009-10 campaign. In 2011-12, Eastern Illinois was 22-9 overall, posted a 13-3 OVC mark and competed in the Women's National Invitational Tournament. Sallee owns a 10-8 career coaching record against Tennessee Tech. His last win over the Golden Eagles was 52-51, Feb. 13, 2012.

SECOND YEAR AT BALL STATE

Brady Sallee, was named the 11th Ball State head women's basketball coach May 10, 2012. In his first year at the helm of the Cardinals Sallee did an incredible job turning around a Ball State team that had posted a 9-21 overall record and a 4-12 league mark in 2011-12. This year Ball State ended with a 17-16 ledger and a 12-4 Mid-American Conference record.

The Cardinals' hard work did not go unnoticed as Ball State finished second in the Mid-American Conference and received an invitation to the 2013 Postseason Women's Invitational Tournament for only the fourth time in school history.

Sallee earned his first postseason win as a head coach when Ball State pulled off the 53-48 first- round WNIT upset at Big Ten foe Minnesota. The Cardinals continued to make history advancing to the WNIT Final 16 for the first time in program history after knocking off Northern Iowa 54-51 in Worthen Arena.

This season Sallee became only the second coach in their first year at Ball State to have managed an 8-1 Mid-American Conference record in their first nine league contests. The last time it happened was in 2002.

With Sallee's eight more conference wins than last year, the Cardinals ended the season tied for the biggest Mid-American Conference turnaround in the last 20 years.

This year Sallee coached three All-MAC selections including the MAC Freshman of the Year and MAC Sixth Man Award recipient.

Sallee has posted a 154-128 career coaching record in combination with his eight years as the head basketball coach at Eastern Illinois. During his tenure at Eastern Illinois, Sallee led the Panthers to the institution's first ever Ohio Valley Conference title during the 2009-10 campaign. In 2011-12, Eastern Illinois was 22-9 overall, posted a 13-3 OVC mark and competed in the Women's National Invitational Tournament.

In his last five seasons at EIU he guided the Panthers to 106 victories, which is the most in the school's history by an EIU women's basketball team over a five-year span.

Sallee coached Eastern Illinois to back-to-back 20 win seasons in 2008-09 and 2009-10. His team won 24 games in 2008-09, which marked the first time a women's basketball team from EIU had accomplished that feat since 1987-88. He also coached the Panthers to three Women's National Invitational Tournament appearances from 2010-12.

Throughout his eight seasons at Eastern Illinois, he coached 17 all-conference selections which included three OVC Freshman of the Year honorees, along with the two-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year in 2010 and 2012.

Under his tutelage the EIU women's basketball program set a school record for free throws made in a season (595, 2009-10) and made three pointers (180, 2008-09) while also scoring 2,736 points as a team in 2009-10 which was the third most in school history.

Academically his student-athletes excelled in the classroom, as they earned four consecutive OVC Academic Achievement Awards along with posting the highest percentage of players on the Commissioner's Honor Roll from 2007-10. His teams have ranked nationally among women's basketball programs with high grade-point averages earning the seventh-best team GPA in 2007-08 with a 3.475. The Panthers also ranked ninth in 2008-09 and tenth in 2006-07.

Before his tenure at Eastern Illinois he was the top assistant at East Carolina in 2002-03. From 1996-2002 he helped Kent State, a fellow member of the Mid-American Conference, to five regular-season MAC Championships and three tournament titles. The Golden Flashes participated in the NCAA Tournament four of his seven years while posting a combined record of 155-56. He also was an assistant coach at Idaho State in 1994-95.

A native of Lexington, Ky., Sallee played collegiate baseball at Thomas More College from 1990-93. While at Thomas More, he served as a student assistant with the women's basketball team. Sallee earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in 1993.

Sallee and his wife Mandy have three children -- Avery, Taryn and Drew.


