After two games, senior **Shi-Heria Shipp** (Salisbury, N.C.) is the Owls' leading scorer with 14.0 points and 7.4 rebounds per game. Senior **Natasha Thames** (Port Huron, Mich.) follows with 13.5 ppg and 11.0 rpg, while junior **Tyonna Williams** (Fort Washington, Md.) adds 10.5 points and 5.5 assists per game.

SCOUTING AUBURN

The Tigers, under the guidance of second-year head coach **Terri Williams-Flournoy**, stand 2-0 on the season after a 66-49 win over Jacksonville State on Nov. 13.

Four Tigers average double-figure scoring. Senior G/F **Tyrese Tanner** is the team leader with 17.0 points and 7.0 rebounds per game, while sophomore F/C **Trac'Cee Tanner** follows with 16.5 ppg and 8.5 rpg. Freshman guard **Brandy Montgomery** adds 15.0 ppg, and senior center **Peyton Davis** rounds out the double-digit scorers with 14.5 ppg and team-best 9.5 rpg.

In series action, Auburn leads, 4-3. In the teams' meeting last fall in Alabama, Auburn claimed a 71-49 win at Auburn Arena. Senior Victoria Macaulay led the Owls with 18 points, while **Tyonna Williams** added 12 points. The Tigers, which shot 53 percent from the field, held TU to just 17 first-half points on 23 percent shooting.

SCOUTING MICHIGAN STATE

The Spartans, under the guidance of seventh-year head coach **Suzy Merchant**, stand 2-1 after a 81-62 loss to No. 6 Notre Dame on Nov. 12. MSU plays three games prior to visiting Temple on Nov. 26.

LAST GAME: TEMPLE 70, DELAWARE 58

Temple opened the 2013-14 season with two road wins. On Nov. 12, the Owls beat Delaware, 70-58, at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Senior **Natasha Thames** (Port Huron, Mich.) paced the Owls with 15 points and nine rebounds as five Owls netted double figures. Sophomore **Meghan Roxas** (Ridgewood, N.J.) had 12 points on a career-high four three-point buckets. Freshman point guard **Feyonda Fitzgerald** (Norfolk, Va.) also had 12 points, while senior **Shi-Heria Shipp** (Salisbury, N.C.) and junior **Tyonna Williams** (Fort Washington, Md.) added 10 points apiece.

Overall, Delaware out-rebounded Temple, 37-36. The Owls shot 42 percent from the floor (24-57) compared to the Hens' 39 percent (21-54).

SHIPP NAMED TO HONOR ROLLS

Senior **Shi-Heria Shipp** was named to the American Athletic Conference and Philadelphia Big 5 women's basketball Honor Rolls on Nov. 11, honoring players for the first week of play.

In Friday's Big 5 win at La Salle, Shipp led the team with a career-high 18 points in her debut as an Owl (previous high was 16 points at North Carolina A&T, 1/6/13). She also recorded a game-best five steals and shot a perfect 8-for-8 from the free throw line in 38 minutes of action. Eight of her 18 points came during a 19-0 run in the second half.

WE PLAY DEFENSE

In its first two games, Temple has played tremendous defense in the second half, limiting two opponents to a combined three field goals over the last 21 minutes of action. At La Salle, the Owls held the Explorers to two buckets over the last nine minutes, while TU held Delaware to just one basket over the final 12 minutes of play..

EXHIBITION ACTION

Temple sharpened its skills on Nov. 2 with a 116-59 win over West Chester in exhibition action at McGonigle Hall.

Six players netted double-figure scoring, including the five starters. Freshman guard **Feyonda Fitzgerald** led the Owls with 23 points and seven assists, while sophomore guard **Erica Covile** added 19 points. Seniors **Natasha Thames** and **Shi-Heria Shipp** each recorded double-doubles. Thames finished with 17 points and 12 boards, while Shipp had 13 points and 12 rebounds.

DOUBLE DIPPING

Senior **Natasha Thames** recorded her sixth career double-double in the season opening win at La Salle with 12 points and 13 rebounds.

WHO'S BACK

Junior **Tyonna Williams** is the top returning scorer from last season. One of just two players to play and start all 32 games, the 5-6 guard averaged 9.4 points per game while dishing out a team-best 161 assists.

Senior **Natasha Thames** follows. Last season the 6-0 forward averaged 7.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game.

Sophomores **Erica Covile**, **May Dayan** (Ashdod, Israel), and **Meghan Roxas** saw action last season on the nation's second-youngest team. Covile played in 16 games with seven starts and averaged 4.6 points. Dayan played in 30 games with six starts and chipped in 1.7 points. Roxas played in 30 games with 11 starts and averaged 3.5 points.

Guard **Monaye Merritt** (Philadelphia, Pa.) returns for her sophomore season after sitting out last year with a knee injury. As a true freshman in 2011-12, she played in 23 games off the bench and averaged 1.7 points.

SHIPP TRANSFERS TO TEMPLE

Fifth-year senior **Shi-Heria Shipp** joins the Owls this season after four seasons at former A-10 rival George Washington. In 2012-13 the 5-10 guard started 20 games and was the Colonials' third-highest scorer with 9.6 points per game.

Shipp, who received her bachelor's degree in sociology from GW in May 2013, is pursuing a master's degree in adult & organizational development at Temple. She was granted a fifth year of eligibility by the NCAA after missing the 2010-11 season with a knee injury.

MEET THE FRESHMEN

Temple welcomes three freshmen to the squad this season. Guard **Feyonda Fitzgerald** (Norfolk, Va.), center **Safiya Martin** (Fayetteville, Ga.), and center **Taylor Robinson** (St. Louis, Mo.) hope to make an immediate impact.

The 5-7 Fitzgerald was a part of two Virginia state championship teams at Lake Taylor HS. The VHSCA AAA Girls' Hoops State Player of the Year in Virginia last season, Fitzgerald set the state tournament scoring record with 96 points in three games. She averaged 22.6 ppg and 6.5 rpg as a senior.

The 6-4 Martin made two consecutive appearances in the Georgia state championship game. A Class AAAA Honorable Mention All-State selection by the Georgia Sportswriters Association, Martin was also an All-Conference pick.

The 6-4 Robinson was a 2013 McDonald's All-America nominee. Named the Suburban East Player of the Year as a junior, she averaged 20 points and nine rebounds per game.

CARDOZA'S LEADERSHIP

In her sixth season at the helm of Temple women's basketball is **Tonya Cardoza**. In five seasons, she's led the Owls to four post-season berths, including three NCAA Tournament appearances. The 2011 Atlantic 10 Conference Coach of the Year and three-time Big 5 Coach of the Year notched her 100th career win last season at St. Bonaventure (1/13/13).

Prior to taking the reigns at TU from former college teammate **Dawn Staley**, Cardoza spent 14 seasons as an assistant coach at Connecticut with **Geno Auriemma**. During her tenure, the Huskies captured five national championships.

GOING INTERNATIONAL

While all, but one, of the Temple players hail from outside Pennsylvania, sophomore **May Dayan** has traveled the farthest to compete as an Owl. The 5-7 guard calls Ashdod, Israel, home. She is the first overseas player to play for Temple since at least 1980.

NEW CONFERENCE, NEW TRADITIONS, NEW RIVALRIES

Beginning this season, Temple women's basketball will compete as a member of the American Athletic Conference after 30 seasons with the Atlantic 10 Conference. For the first time in school history, the majority of Temple's sports teams will compete in the same conference.

TOUGH COMPETITION

Twelve of Temple's 29 contests in 2013-14 will be against teams that played in the NCAA Tournament last year, including defending national champion Connecticut and national runner-up Louisville. In the coaches' USA Today/ESPN preseason poll, UConn is No. 1 and Louisville is No. 5. Other TU opponents making the list at No. 18 is Michigan State as well as South Florida, Rutgers, Syracuse, and Delaware, all receiving votes.

Six of the American teams will be first-time opponents for Temple— Cincinnati, Houston, Louisville, Memphis, SMU, and USF. With the exception of Rutgers, which has played Temple since 1977, the Owls' combined record against their new conference opponents is 2-2 (2-1 vs. Connecticut and 0-1 vs. UCF).

VS. RANKED FOES

Since 1976, Temple has upset 12 teams ranked in the Top 25. The Owls' last upset came against No. 13 Xavier on Feb. 25, 2009, with a 74-65 victory at the Liacouras Center. TU has faced the nation's No. 1 team six times and is still looking for an upset.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION

This season Temple will make history with the most televised games in program history. Thanks to the American Athletic Conference, at least 13 Temple games will hit the airwaves. National broadcasts include games against Memphis (Feb. 9) on ESPNU and Louisville on ESPN3 twice (Jan. 1 and Feb. 12).

Both of TU's games with defending national champion Connecticut will be televised by SportsNet New York (SNY). The Jan. 28 game at McGonigle Hall may also air on ESPN3.

Additionally, all home games not televised commercially will be streamed live on Owls TV. The videostream is free to fans online at www.Owlsports.com. Temple students from the School of Broadcast, Telecommunications & Mass Media produce and direct the telecasts. Temple Associate AD/SWA and former coach **Kristen Foley** provides color commentary.

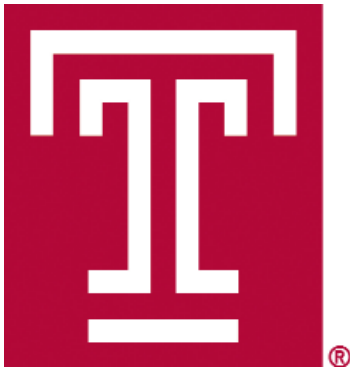

6th Season at Temple

Tonya Cardoza is in her sixth season on North Broad Street after proving time and again that she was the right person for the job of continuing and building upon the success of Temple women's basketball.

The 2013-14 season will perhaps be Cardoza's most challenging as the Owls usher in a new era of women's basketball— competing in the inaugural season of the American Athletic Conference.

The 2010-11 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year, Cardoza led the Owls to three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, advancing to the Second Round in both 2010 and 2011. The Owls narrowly missed earning a berth in the NCAA Tournament in 2011-12, but took a top spot in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT) and advanced to the third round.

Along with earning Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year honors for the Owls' performance in 2010-11, Cardoza was honored as the Big 5 Coach of the Year for a third time. She earned that honor in each of her first three seasons at Temple, and the Owls earned their sixth straight Big 5 title in her first year with the program. Temple won the Big 5 again in 2011, and finished as runner-up in both 2010 and 2012.

Already 107-57 all-time in her head coaching career, Cardoza led Temple to at least 20 wins in her first four years at the helm. During her inaugural season in 2008-09, Cardoza guided TU to a 21-10 mark and an NCAA Tournament appearance. She was a finalist for the National Rookie Coach of the Year award. The Owls reached 25 wins in 2009-10 which tied for the second-most in the history of the program. In 2010-11, the Owls finished 24-9 which included a 15-game win streak and a 13-1 record in the Atlantic 10. The 2011-12 season saw Temple go 23-10 and win 14 in a row, once again with a 13-1 mark in the conference. During their final year of Atlantic 10 Conference play in 2012-13, Cardoza guided the nation's second-youngest team (six freshmen).

After spending 14 years as assistant coach at the University of Connecticut under Hall of Fame coach Geno Auriemma, a tenure in which she helped the Huskies to five National Championships,

few doubted that Cardoza had what it takes to build a successful program.

The Owls finished in the Top 3 in the Atlantic 10 for three consecutive seasons. In Cardoza's first season she coached the squad to an upset over No. 13 Xavier, making her the first coach in TU women's basketball history to upset a ranked team during her rookie season.

Arriving at Connecticut at the start of the 1994-95 season, Cardoza helped guide the Huskies to an unprecedented 465-41 record, seven Final Four appearances and six No. 1 National Rankings in the final Associated Press poll.

A 1991 University of Virginia graduate with a degree in anthropology, Cardoza starred for the Cavaliers, leading the team to four consecutive NCAA National Tournaments.
