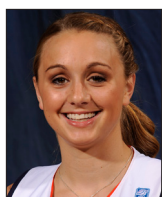

- Sophomore Camille Glymph is Auburn's lone South Carolina native on the roster
- Auburn assistant coach Carla McGhee served as an assistant at South Carolina from 2008-10
- Auburn point guard Najat Ouardad leads the league in SEC-only games in steals with 3.4 per game
- Four of Auburn's first six SEC games have come against teams either ranked or receiving votes in the major polls
- Najat Ouardad had 7 steals at Vanderbilt Thursday, a mark that ties for 6th all-time at AU in single-game steals
- Sophomore Jassany Williams ranks second in the SEC and 33rd in the nation in blocks per game (2.3)
- Freshman Hasina Muhammad is 26th in the SEC in scoring (9.9 ppg), but second among freshmen
- Auburn picked up its 800th win in program history on Nov. 15 against Belmont, 80-53
- Blanche Alverson moved into sixth all-time at Auburn in career 3-pointers in the Purdue game
- Auburn is coming off an 59-39 loss at Arkansas; South Carolina is coming off a 66-58 loss at LSU
- The Tigers used their seventh different starting lineup at Vanderbilt, nine different Tigers have started this season
- This will be the 36th meeting between Auburn and South Carolina with the Tigers holding a 20-15 series lead
- Auburn leads the all-time series in Auburn, 11-5
- South Carolina won the last meeting with Auburn, a 65-49 decision in Columbia on Feb. 20, 2011
- The Tigers won the last meeting in Auburn, a 54-47 win on Jan. 30, 2011
- Auburn is 188-162 all-time in Southeastern Conference games
- This will be the sixth meeting between Nell Fortner and USC's Dawn Staley with Staley holding an 3-2 lead
- Fortner coached Staley on both the 1996 and 2000 Olympic teams
- Fortner and Staley are both former Olympic coaches, Fortner a head coach in 2000 and Staley an assistant in 2008
- Ten Tigers have faced South Carolina before; Blanche Alverson 9 pts and 7 rebs vs. USC last season in Auburn
- Auburn is 7-3 all-time on Jan. 19 and 187-102 all-time in the month of January (24-30 under Fortner)
- The Tigers are 33-18 all-time when playing a team from the State of South Carolina
- Auburn is 89-2 under Nell Fortner when scoring 70 or more points in a game
- Auburn's bench has out-scored the opponent in two games this season
- Auburn's defense has averaged scoring 19.5 points off turnovers, forcing 19.4 turnovers per game
- The Tiger bench has stepped up, averaging 24.2 points per game this season, accounting for 40.4% of AU's offense
- Hasina Muhammad was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Dec. 26
- Muhammad and sophomore Tyrese Tanner were named to the FIU Sun & Fun Classic All-Tournament Team
- Junior Blanche Alverson was named to the New York Life Holiday Tournament All-Tournament Team
- Senior Chantel Hilliard earned her degree in political science from Auburn on Dec. 12
- The Tigers return three starters from last season, along with seven players who saw time as a starter a year ago
- Auburn was picked ninth in the SEC Preseason Media and Coaches polls, Tennessee was picked to win the league
- Nell Fortner is in her eighth season at Auburn, marking her longest tenure at any job
- The Tigers welcome two newcomers: junior college transfer Najat Ouardad and freshman Hasina Muhammad
- Auburn is coming off a 16-16 season in 2010-11, one that ended with a berth in the WNIT
- The Tigers have advanced to the post-season in four of the last five seasons
- Auburn signed four players during the Early Signing Period: Cabriana Capers (6-1, F, Bolingbrook, Ill.), Chadarryl Clay (5-7, G, Chattanooga, Tenn.), Nicole Tanner (6-3, F, Hoover, Ala.) and Nariah Taylor (6-5, P, Indianapolis, Ind.)

AUBURN'S POST-GAME PROCEDURE

The Auburn locker room is closed. Coach Nell Fortner and selected Tiger players will be brought to the interview room after the 10-minute "cooling off" period.

QUICK HITS

Auburn is in its 41st season of women's basketball and sports an all-time record of 807-370... AU has made 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, three WNIT appearances and three Final Fours in the program's history... Head Coach Nell Fortner is in her eighth season at Auburn with a 158-109 career record and a 141-98 record on the Plains... The Tigers are coming off a 16-16 season in 2011 with an appearance in the second round of the WNIT.

800 AND COUNTING

Auburn picked up its 800th program victory Nov. 15, defeating Belmont 80-53. Of the 800 wins, Auburn head coach Nell Fortner had coached the Tigers to 134 of them.

By reaching 800, the Tigers became the 14th team in NCAA Division I history to reach the 800-win plateau.

AUBURN-SOUTH CAROLINA SERIES

This will be the 36th meeting between Auburn and South Carolina with the Tigers leading, 20-15. When playing in Auburn, the Tigers lead 11-5. South Carolina has a 6-4 lead in the last 10 meetings.

SCOUTING SOUTH CAROLINA

South Carolina comes into Auburn with a 14-2 record and a 3-2 mark in league play. The Gamecocks went 11-2 in non-conference play with the losses coming to No. 11/12 Penn State (55-50) and North Carolina State (55-53). Included in the 11 wins were victories over Illinois (71-52), Clemson (65-48) and No. 18/16 North Carolina (79-48). USC started off league play with three straight wins over Alabama, Vanderbilt and Florida. Since then, the Gamecocks have dropped decisions to LSU (58-48) and No. 9/8 Kentucky (66-58).

South Carolina has a balanced scoring attack with no play averaging double figures, but eight averaging four or more points per game for a team average of 61.6 points per game.

Markeshia Grant leads the team with 9.6 points, followed by Aleighsa Welch with 9.3 and La'Keisha Sutton with 8.8. Welch also leads the team on the boards with 6.3 per game.

The Gamecocks have the best 3-point defense in the nation, allowing just 28 on the season, holding opponents to 19.9 percent from beyond the arc.

SCOUTING AUBURN

Auburn is 9-9 on the season and 1-4 in SEC play after a 39-59 road loss to Arkansas on Sunday.

Depth and Defense have been the key words for Auburn this season. Nine different Tigers have started in seven different starting lineups while five different players have led the team in scoring. Nine players are averaging at least 15.0 minutes per game this season.

Leading the way is sophomore Tyrese Tanner with 11.1 points per game, good enough to rank 19th in the SEC. Right behind her is freshman Hasina Muhammad with 9.9 points per game, a mark that ranks her 26th in the SEC and second among league freshmen.

Two other Tigers are near double figures as Camille Glymph and Blanche Alverson average 9.0 and 8.7 points per game, respectively. Senior Parrisha Simmons leads the team in rebounding with 5.7 boards per game.

LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN

Auburn's Tyrese Tanner scored a career-high 22 points as the Tigers dropped a 59-39 decision to Arkansas.

The Tigers never led in the game while three Razorbacks finished in double figures. Sarah Watkins and Ashley Daniels scored 12 points each while C'eira Ricketts added 11.

Arkansas led the entire first half, but Auburn twice cut the Razorback lead to two in the last 8:01. The last time came on a Tanner jumper. Tanner had the chance to tie it up on the next possession, but missed a pair of free throws.

Arkansas closed the half on a 10-2 run after Tanner's basket, taking a 28-18 lead into the locker room, the team's largest lead of the game.

The Tigers were able to keep the Hogs' lead in check for most of the second half, cutting it twice back to 10 after it got as high as 15. A 10-2 run late in the first half, book-ended by a pair of Harris 3-pointers, extended the Arkansas lead to 18. The Razorbacks would lead by as many as 22 before taking the 59-39 win.

Tanner, Hasina Muhammad and Parrisha Simmons pulled down six rebounds each to lead Auburn. Majay Ouardad dished a team-high three assists with a game-high four steals.

LAST TIME OUT FOR SOUTH CAROLINA

No. 24 South Carolina dropped a 66-58 decision to No. 9/8 Kentucky Jan. 15 at Colonial Life Arena. The Gamecocks out-rebounded the Wildcats on the afternoon but saw Kentucky's 11 second-half offensive rebounds help them to the comeback victory.

South Carolina was led by junior leasia Walker, who posted 14 points. Senior La'Keisha Sutton added 12 points, while Charenee Stephens pulled down a season-high eight rebounds.

Up by one at halftime, South Carolina out-scored Kentucky 16-8 in the first 10 minutes of the second half for a 45-36 lead. Kentucky came back and tied the game in less than two minutes, the beginning of a 20-4 run that gave the Wildcats a seven-point lead with 3:53 left in the game. UK did not let the Gamecocks come closer than five points the rest of the way for the 66-58 win.

LAST TIME VS. SOUTH CAROLINA (Feb. 20, 2011)

A 17-3 South Carolina run to open the second half put the Auburn women's basketball team in a hole it could not dig out of as the Tigers dropped a 65-49 decision to the Gamecocks Feb. 20, 2011 in Columbia, S.C.

Morgan Toles and Chantel Hilliard led Auburn with 11 points each in the loss. Toles also added a game-high seven assists while Blanche Alverson and Morgan Jennings led Auburn with four rebounds each.

Freshman Camille Glymph, the lone South Carolina native on the team, came off the bench for five points, two assists and two rebounds.

Auburn jumped out to a quick 8-0 lead to start the game and held the lead as late as the 3:50 mark in the first half. But, a pair of 3-pointers from USC's Valeria Nainima and a jumper from La'Keisha Sutton gave the Gamecocks a 27-22 lead at halftime.

South Carolina picked right back up where it left off in the second half, hitting four 3-pointers in the first 5:00 to extend its lead. The Gamecocks led by as many as 19 points in the second half.

Auburn was never able to recover, cutting the deficit to as few as 13 points three occasions before taking the 65-49 loss.

Sutton scored a game-high 24 points to lead the Gamecocks. Nainima followed with 15 points while Ashley Brunder scored 14 points with a game-high six rebounds.

LAST TIME VS. SOUTH CAROLINA IN AUBURN**(Jan. 30, 2011)**

Auburn's Morgan Toles scored a career-high 21 points as the Auburn women's basketball team claimed a 54-47 win over the South Carolina Gamecocks Jan. 30, 2011 at the Auburn Arena.

Alli Smalley added 11 points while Blanche Alverson pulled down a career-high nine rebounds along with seven points.

Auburn led from the start and went on to lead by as many as 11 points before South Carolina mounted its comeback. The Gamecocks responded with a 12-1 run that tied the game at 39-39.

The Tigers did not trail until South Carolina took a 42-41 lead on an Iesia Walker 3-pointer. The teams would exchange the lead twice more before Toles hit a pair of free throws with 5:30 left in the game to tie it up, 47-47.

Toles scored all nine of Auburn's points in the last 5:30, taking the Tigers from down two to up seven for the 54-47 win.

Ashley Bruner came off the bench to lead the Gamecocks with 15 points and eight rebounds. Walker scored 12 points with six rebounds while La'Keisha Sutton dished out a game-high four assists.

Auburn held the Gamecocks to just 32.2 percent from the field. South Carolina finished 4-of-15 from beyond the arc and 5-of-13 from the free throw line. The Tigers also forced 18 USC turnovers, led by four steals from Smalley. Auburn went on to score 17 points off turnovers in the game.

CAREER VS. SOUTH CAROLINA

Auburn has 10 members of the team who have seen action against the Gamecocks during their careers. Junior Blanche Alverson had seven points and nine rebounds at home vs. South Carolina last year. On her career, she averages 3.8 points and 4.5 rebounds per game against USC. Sophomore Camille Glymph had one of the best games of her shortened freshman season against her home-state Gamecocks. She scored five points with a pair of assists last season in Columbia. Senior Parrisha Simmons averages 4.0 points and 4.5 rebounds in four career meetings against South Carolina.

FORTNER VS. STALEY

This will be the sixth meeting between Nell Fortner and South Carolina's Dawn Staley with Staley holding a 3-2 lead.

Fortner is in her eighth season at Auburn and holds a 141-98 record on The Plains. Staley is in her fourth season at South Carolina and holds a 56-52 record.

AN OLYMPIC RING TO IT

Thursday's game against South Carolina will mark the second time this season that Auburn head coach Nell Fortner, who was head coach of the U.S. National Team at the 2000 Sydney Olympics, will face another Olympic coach. USC head coach Dawn Staley served as an assistant coach at the 2008 Beijing Olympics. She has an 0-1 record so far this season against former Olympic coaches after falling to Tennessee's Pat Summitt.

THE FORTNER CONNECTION

Auburn head coach Nell Fortner will see some familiar faces when the Tigers take on South Carolina. USC third-year head coach Dawn Staley played for Fortner on the 2000 Olympic team that won a gold medal in Sydney, Australia. Also on that team was current Gamecock assistant coach Nikki McCray. McCray also played for Fortner in the WNBA while with the Indiana Fever and on the 2000 U.S. Olympic Team.

FACING OLD FRIENDS

Auburn assistant coach Carla McGhee will have a reunion on Sunday as she faces her former players and co-workers. McGhee spent three seasons as an assistant coach under Dawn Staley, one at Temple (2003-04) and two at South Carolina (2008-10).

SOUTH CAROLINA TIGER

Sophomore Camille Glymph is the lone South Carolina native on Auburn's roster. She is a native of Greenville, S.C., and attended J.L. Mann High School. She is one of two Tigers all-time from the Palmetto State, joining Nancy Derrick (2000-04) of Johnston, S.C.

AGAINST THE SEC

Auburn has a 188-162 all-time record in the Southeastern Conference. The Tigers have won five SEC titles and four SEC Tournament titles, most recently winning the regular-season title in 2009 after 14-2 league mark.

ON THIS DATE...

Auburn is 7-3 all time when playing on Jan. 19. The Tigers have never played South Carolina on this date and are 5-1 at home on Jan. 19. The Tigers' last game on Jan. 19 was a 71-57 win over Kentucky in 2006.

IN JANUARY

Auburn is 187-102 all-time in the month of January, including a 24-29 mark under Nell Fortner (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that season).

AGAINST THE PALMETTO STATE

Auburn holds a 33-18 all-time record against teams from South Carolina. Records against South Carolina teams: Charleston Southern (3-0), Clemson (4-3), Furman (5-0), South Carolina (20-15) and South Carolina-Upstate (1-0).

TOUGH START

The Tigers have had a difficult road to start the SEC season. Of Auburn's first four league opponents, three were ranked in the top 25 in the nation.

STINGY TIGERS

A pair of Tigers have had big defensive performances this season.

Junior point guard Najat Ouardad collected five steals against Troy on Nov. 30, the most steals for an Auburn player since DeWanna Bonner picked up six against Tennessee on Jan. 25, 2009. She topped that at Vanderbilt tallying seven steals, a mark that ties her for sixth all-time at Auburn in single-game steals.

Fellow junior Blanche Alverson picked up six steals against Central Connecticut State on Dec. 22. Her six steals rank in a tie for 10th all-time at Auburn in single-game steals.

LEAGUE BEST

Junior point guard Najat Ouardad is tops in the SEC in league-only games this season with 3.4 steals per game. Through five games, she has 17 steals, including a career-high of seven at Vanderbilt.

SEC LEADERS

A group of Tigers are among the leaders in the most recent SEC rankings. Sophomore Jassany Williams is second in blocked shots with 2.3 per game. Freshman Hasina Muhammad ranks 26th in the SEC in scoring with 9.9 points per game, but is second in the league among freshmen. Sophomore Tyrese Tanner is just ahead of her in 19th in the SEC with 11.1 points per game.

Two of the league's top 3-point shooters are on Auburn's roster. Camille Glymph is fifth in the league in treys per game while Blanche Alverson is 11th. Glymph is 14th in the SEC in 3-point percentage while Alverson is fifth.

Najat Ouardad ranks eighth in the league in overall games in steals with 2.1 per game.

BLOCK PARTY

Auburn has ranked among the leaders in the nation this year in blocked shots. The Tigers average 6.4 per game, good enough to lead the SEC and rank seventh in the nation.

Individually, sophomore Jassany Williams is 33rd in the nation with 2.3 blocks per game.

SWATTING AWAY

Auburn blocked 13 shots against Troy on Nov. 30, marking the most blocked shots for the Tigers since swatting a school-record 17 against Alabama A&M on Nov. 19, 2009. It also set a new Auburn Arena record for blocked shots and was the second time this season for the Tigers to block more than 10 shots in a game.

MUHAMMAD NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Auburn freshman Hasina Muhammad was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Dec. 26, becoming the first Tiger to earn such an honor in nearly four years.

Muhammad, a native of Memphis, Tenn., earned the honor after her performance Dec. 21-22 at the New York Life Holiday Tournament hosted by Hofstra. She averaged 12.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 1.0 blocks and 1.5 steals per game in the two tournament games, helping the Tigers to a third-place finish.

MUHAMMAD AND TANNER NAMED TO SUN & FUN CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Auburn freshman Hasina Muhammad and sophomore Tyrese Tanner were both named to the Flu Sun & Fun Classic All-Tournament Team.

Tanner led the Tigers with 17 points off the bench vs. FIU. Fifteen of her 17 points came in the second half, fueling the Tiger comeback. She was the only Tiger to score in double figures in both tournament games, averaging 14.0 points per game for the two games.

Muhammad scored 12 points against Charlotte and eight against FIU. She averaged 10.0 points and 3.0 steals per game in the two games.

ALVERSON NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Junior Blanche Alverson was named to the New York Life Holiday Invitational All-Tournament Team for her efforts in the two tournament games. She averaged 13.5 points, 4.0 rebounds and 3.5 steals per game in the two games. Included in those was a season-high 20 points vs. Marist and six steals against CCSU, a mark that ranks in a tie for ninth all-time at Auburn.

THE GRADUATE

Auburn senior Chantel Hilliard got a step up on the next phase of her life on Dec. 12 as she graduated from Auburn with a degree in political science.

HOME COOKIN'

Since a 77-70 loss to Virginia on Jan. 5, 1992, the Auburn Tigers have compiled a 134-11 record against non-conference opponents when playing at home.

GOING TO THE BENCH

Auburn's bench has stepped up this season, scoring 435 points in the 18 games, averaging 24.2 points per game. In two games alone, the Auburn bench has out-scored the opponent (35-34 vs. USC-Upstate and 48-47 against Troy). Overall, Auburn's bench has accounted for 40.4 percent of the team's offense this season.

DEPTH PROVIDES BOOST

Auburn has banked off its depth so far in the 2011-12 season, utilizing nine different starters in seven different starting lineups. Five different players (Blanche Alverson, Camille Glymph, Chantel Hilliard, Hasina Muhammad and Tyrese Tanner) have led the Tigers in scoring this season.

CHAIRWOMAN OF THE BOARD

Senior Parrisha Simmons has dominated the boards this season, pulling down a team-high 5.7 rebounds per game. Included in that total are 16 rebounds she tallied against Purdue. It was the most rebounds in a single game for an Auburn player since Jordan Greenleaf pulled down 16 against Mississippi State on Jan. 3, 2010.

Quoting Head Coach Nell Fortner

On Arkansas...

"South Carolina is having a really good year. These last two ball games, they played Kentucky really well. They played LSU well at LSU, and it just kind of got away from them there at the end. They are a very good defensive team. They have players that can create off the dribble and they are tough to guard. They are having a good year, and they are feeding off of that."

On South Carolina's guards...

"South Carolina is very guard-oriented, which makes them very quick and makes them tough defenders. You're not going to get anything easy offensively from them. They can be very physical on the inside, and Dawn Staley has players coming off the bench that are really contributing."

On "We Back Pat" Week...

"I think it's just incredibly important. Pat Summitt is the reason why the SEC is the SEC. Her standards were high for her own program, but she also helped everyone else in this conference raise the standard of their own program, which made the SEC the strongest conference in the country. I think we owe her the recognition, we owe her the backing and the support of her for so many reasons. Not just because we love her and we appreciate what she's done, but to show these kids that are playing now and that are coming up just how important she has been to the game of women's basketball."

- The SEC has posted impressive non-conference records in the last decade. The SEC compiled a 131-49 (.728) non-conference record for the 2009-10 season.
- Since the 1990 season, the SEC has compiled a 2914-894 (.765) record against other conferences. The league has recorded 150+ wins during eight seasons and has never recorded a non-conference winning percentage below .723.
- SEC teams have earned appearances in 25 of 30 NCAA Final Fours, an accomplishment unmatched by any other league.
- Overall, SEC squads have filled 34 of the 120 Final Four berths, including having two Final Four teams in 1988 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1989 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1995 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1996 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1998 (Arkansas, Tennessee), 2004 (LSU, Tennessee), 2005 (LSU, Tennessee), 2007 (LSU, Tennessee) and 2008 (LSU, Tennessee).
- SEC teams have made 18 appearances in a nation-high 16 NCAA Championship games, winning eight NCAA Championships (Tennessee: 1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).
- The league also had the distinction of providing both national finalists twice in its history in 1996 (Tennessee 83, Georgia 65) and in 1989 (Tennessee 76, Auburn 60).
- SEC teams have won 335 NCAA Tournament games against 172 losses (.661) for an average of 11.2 NCAA wins per year.
- In addition, all 12 current members have appeared in the NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC has paced the pack in NCAA tournament bids 21 times in its 30-year history.
- The SEC was the first league to ever have eight teams invited to the NCAA Tournament, doing so in 1999 and 2002.
- The SEC was also the first league to ever have seven teams invited to the NCAA Tournament and earned this honor a leading seven times (1986, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2004).
- The SEC is one of a handful of leagues to have won three national tournament titles with eight NCAA, two WNIT and three NWIT. Along with the eight NCAA championships won by Tennessee, Arkansas (1999) and Auburn (2003) captured the current Women's NIT titles. But the first-ever SEC national title belongs to Georgia, winners of the 1981 NWIT which predates the current NCAA tournament. LSU (1985) and Kentucky (1990) each won NWIT titles. Both Arkansas (1987) and South Carolina (1979) won the WNIT as members of their previous conferences.
- In 2003, Auburn won the WNIT title with wins over South Alabama, Florida State, Richmond, Creighton and Baylor. In 1999, the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks defeated Wisconsin 76-64 to claim the SEC's first WNIT championship.
- In 1981, Georgia defeated Pittsburg, California and Arizona State (in OT) to capture the NWIT Championship, the first-ever national championship of any kind for the SEC in women's basketball.

MOVING ON UP

Junior Blanche Alverson hit five 3-pointers against Purdue, moving her past former Tiger Carolyn Jones (1988-91) into sixth place all-time at Auburn in career 3-pointers.

She currently has 120 on her career as she moves toward Kristen Mulligan's (1992-96) 149.

OFFENSE WINS GAMES

Auburn is 89-2 when scoring 70 or more points in the Nell Fortner era. The only times Auburn has lost when scoring at least 70 points was on Jan. 20, 2005 vs. No. 7 Tennessee, 71-81 and Feb. 19, 2009 at No. 18 Vanderbilt, 73-70. When scoring less than 70 points, Auburn is 52-96 during the Fortner era.

DEFENSE MAKES OFFENSE

In Auburn's 18 games of the season, the Tigers have used their defense to spark their offense. Auburn has forced 350 turnovers (19.4 per game) this season on 181 steals (10.1 per game), turning them into 19.5 points per game (351 total points).

Auburn has scored 20 or more points off turnovers in nine games this season.

TURNOVER MACHINE

Auburn's defense has wreaked havoc on opponents this season, causing an average of 19.4 turnovers per game. Against Central Connecticut State, Auburn forced 37 CCSU turnovers, the most since Auburn forced 37 against Alabama A&M on Nov. 14, 2008.

The CCSU game was the fifth this season where Auburn forced 20 or more turnovers. The Tigers now have forced 20 or more turnovers in seven games.

OUTSIDE THE LEAGUE

Nell Fortner has guided the Tigers to an 87-39 ledger in non-conference play. When playing at home, Fortner's teams have posted a 38-8 mark. The only seven non-conference losses at home came from Xavier on Dec. 2, 2005 (58-60), No. 2 Duke on Dec. 31, 2004 (61-80), No. 20 George Washington on Jan. 3, 2008 (66-68), No. 15 Texas A&M on Nov. 22, 2009 (59-79), No. 16 Florida State on Nov. 15, 2010 (61-67), No. 6 Duke on Nov. 18, 2010 (62-75), Temple on Dec. 4, 2010 (62-61) and No. 22 Purdue on Dec. 18, 2011 (62-54).

TIGERS PICKED NINTH IN PRESEASON POLL

Auburn was predicted to finish ninth in the SEC in a voting of a select panel of both SEC and national media members. Tennessee was picked to win the league with all 22 first-place votes.

The Lady Vols were followed by Georgia (228), Kentucky (212), LSU (189), Vanderbilt (172) and Florida (151) rounding out the top half of the league. Arkansas (142), South Carolina (107), Auburn (94), Alabama (55), Mississippi State (54) and Ole Miss (48) round out the bottom half.

STARTING EXPERIENCE

Auburn has seven players on its roster that had started at least one game prior to the 2011-12 season. That group of seven also combined for 123 career starts, led by Blanche Alverson with 45. Senior Parrisha Simmons has started 41 while her classmates, Chantel Hilliard and Morgan Jennings, have started 12 each.

NEW FACES

The Tigers welcome two new faces to the roster this season in Hasina Muhammad and Najat Ouardad. Muhammad is a true freshman from Memphis, Tenn., playing at Ridgeway High School. Ouardad, a native of Orleans, France, comes to Auburn from Pensacola State College.

MAKING IT HOME

Nell Fortner enters her eighth season as Auburn's head coach, marking her longest tenure at any position in her career. The longest Fortner had stayed at a job prior to Auburn came from 1990-95 while she was an assistant coach at Louisiana Tech under legendary head coach Leon Barmore.

AUBURN SIGNS FOUR FOR 2012-13

Auburn head coach Nell Fortner has signed four players for the 2012-13 season during the Early Signing Period. They are Cabriana Capers, a 6-1 forward from Bolingbrook, Ill., Chadarryl Clay, a 5-7 guard from Chattanooga, Tenn., Nicole Tanner, a 6-3 forward from Hoover, Ala., and Nariah Taylor, a 6-5 post from Indianapolis, Ind.

Capers is rated a three-star prospect by ESPN's Hoopgurlz and is rated as the No. 35 post prospect in the country. Clay is rated as the No. 77 overall player in the country and 12th-best guard in the country according to ESPN's Hoopgurlz.

Tanner, the younger sister of Auburn sophomore Tyrese Tanner, is rated as one of the top five prospects in the state of Alabama and a top-100 post in the country. Taylor is ranked as the No. 14 post player in the country by ESPN's Hoopgurlz. She is also ranked as the No. 88 overall player in the nation by Blue Star Basketball and 97th by the All-Star Girls Report.

TIGERS ON THE TUBE

The Auburn women's basketball team will appear on television at least nine times during the 2011-12 season as part of the Southeastern Conference Women's Basketball Television Package, the league announced Sept. 22.

The Tigers will make their first appearance on Sunday, Jan. 1 with a 2 p.m. matchup against defending SEC champion Tennessee at Auburn Arena. Auburn will then appear on CSS in back-to-back games, first on Sunday, Jan. 8 at 1 p.m. against Georgia in Auburn. The next is an 8 p.m., Thursday, Jan. 12 game at Vanderbilt.

The Tigers' will make their first appearance on FSN on Jan. 15 in the first of three Sunday afternoon appearances on the network. Auburn will travel to Arkansas for a 1:30 p.m., Jan. 15 game before returning to the network on Jan. 29 for a 1 p.m. game at Ole Miss.

Auburn's lone appearances on the SEC Network, a part of the ESPN Regional Network, will be on Feb. 5 at Tennessee. The game is set for a 1 p.m. CT tipoff. The Tigers will then host Arkansas on Feb. 12 in a 1:30 p.m. game that will air live on ESPN2.

Auburn's final appearance on CSS will come on Thursday, Feb. 23 with in-state rival Alabama coming to town for an 8 p.m. matchup. The Tigers' final regular-season TV appearance will be Sunday, Feb. 26 on FSN with Auburn hosting Ole Miss at 2:30 p.m.

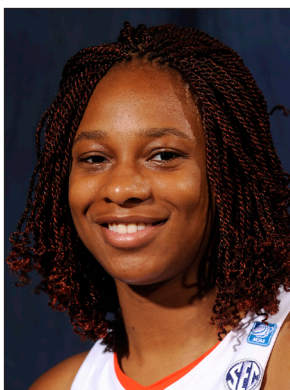

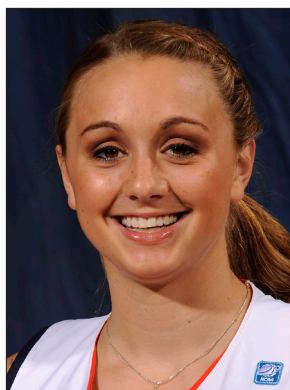

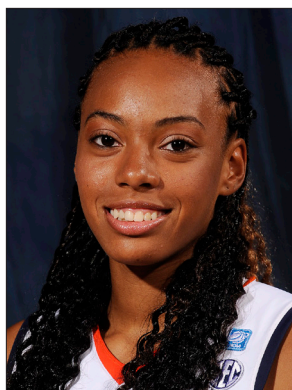

AUBURN - The Auburn women's basketball team took a decisive 85-25 win over Georgia College and State University in its exhibition game on Oct. 30 at the Auburn Arena. Sophomore Camille Glymph led the Tigers with 15 points off the bench while senior Chantel Hilliard notched a double-double with 10 points and 15 rebounds.

Senior Blanche Alverson started things off for Auburn, draining a 3-pointer just 18 seconds into the game. MACON, Ga. - Auburn scored the first 12 points of the game and never looked back as the Tigers trounced Mercer 77-43 Nov. 11 in Macon, Ga. Sophomore Tyrese Tanner started and led the Tigers with 14 points in the season-opening victory for the women's basketball team.

Tanner was one of three Tigers in double figures in the game, followed by freshman Hasina Muhammad and junior Blanche Alverson with 12 points each. Alverson tallied the first double-double of her career, also pulling down a career-high 10 rebounds.

DURHAM, N.C. - Duke's Elizabeth Williams notched a double-double with 18 points and 13 rebounds, leading the No. 8-ranked Blue Devils to a 73-50 win over Auburn, handing the Tigers their first loss of the season.

Sophomore Camille Glymph came off the bench and led the Tigers in scoring for the second game in a row, shooting 4-of-6 from 3-point range for a team-high 12 points. Freshman Hasina Muhammad also finished in double figures, finishing with 10 points and three rebounds.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. - Auburn sophomore Tyrese Tanner scored a career-high 22 points Jan. 15, breaking her previous high of 20 set at Alabama earlier this season, but the Tigers dropped the 59-39 decision to Arkansas.

The Tigers never led in the game while three Razorbacks finished in double figures. Sarah Watkins and Ashley Daniels scored 12 points each while C'eira Ricketts added 11.

Arkansas led the entire first half, but Auburn twice cut the Razorback lead to two in the last 8:01. The last time came on a Tanner jumper. Tanner had the chance to tie it up on the next possession, but missed a pair of free throws.

Arkansas closed the half on a 10-2 run after Tanner's basket, taking a 28-18 lead into the locker room, the team's largest lead of the game.

The Tigers were able to keep the Hogs' lead in check for most of the second half, cutting it twice back to 10 after it got as high as 15. A 10-2 run late in the first half, book-ended by a pair of Harris 3-pointers, extended the Arkansas lead to 18. The Razorbacks would lead by as many as 22 before taking the 59-39 win.

Tanner, Hasina Muhammad and Parrisha Simmons pulled down six rebounds each to lead Auburn. Majay Ouardad dished a team-high three assists with a game-high four steals.
