Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- Auburn is facing Louisiana-Lafayette for the third time; the Tigers are 2-0 in two previous meetings
- Unique Thompson scored a career-high 29 points in the Tigers' 70-60 win in Lafayette last season
- This is the eighth consecutive home non-conference game for Auburn against a school from Louisiana, dating back to last season
- Auburn is 93-13 against current members of the Sun Belt Conference
- The Tigers are playing their first game in 12 days after a whirlwind 3-games-in-5-days stretch in the preseason WNIT
- The Tigers scored at least 80 points in each of their first two games; Auburn scored 80 points just twice all last season
- The Tigers scored 97 points against Grambling (11/6), the most of the Coach Flo era and the highest total since scoring 119 vs. Sam Houston State in 2008
- Under Coach Flo, Auburn is 4-0 when scoring at least 90 points and 25-1 when scoring at least 80 points
- Six Auburn players scored in double-figures vs. Grambling; the first time Auburn has done that since 2008 vs. Sam Houston State
- Janiah McKay (16 pts/10 assists) and Unique Thompson (14 pts/13 rebs) both had double-doubles in the season-opening win over Grambling; Thompson now has 8 double-doubles in 29 career games
- McKay moved up to 21st all-time in scoring at Auburn with 14 points at Iowa State; she now has 1,262 points
- McKay leads Auburn in scoring through three games with 15.8 ppg; she also averages 6.5 assists
- Thompson's 19-point, 14-rebound double-double at Iowa State was her 3rd of the season and 9th of her career
- Thompson's 19 rebounds at New Mexico were a career-high and the most by an Auburn player since 2015
- Auburn is 70-30 in non-conference games under Terri Williams-FLOURNOY and has won 15 out of their last 16 at home
- The Tigers have won nine consecutive home non-conference games dating back to the 2016-17 season
- Auburn is 138-40 all-time in the month of November; Coach Flo is 30-13 in November at Auburn
- Auburn returns four starters and six letterwinners from the 2017-18 squad that finished 14-15 overall (5-11 SEC)
- Auburn finished the 2017-18 season ranked No. 2 in the nation in steals/game (13.2) and No. 3 in turnovers forced (22.9)
- Senior guard Janiah McKay and sophomore forward Unique Thompson were named Preseason All-SEC (2nd team)
- McKay is Auburn's leading returner in scoring (16.6 ppg), assists (4.4/game) and minutes played (32.3/game)
- Thompson averaged 11.5 ppg last year and recorded 7 double-doubles, tying DeWanna Bonner for the Auburn freshman record; she was named to the All-SEC Freshman Team
- Junior guard Daisa Alexander averaged 14.2 ppg last season and led the SEC with 2.8 steals/game; she was named to the SEC All-Defensive Team
- Auburn's 2018-19 freshman class was ranked the No. 13 signing class in the nation by ESPN HoopGurlz
- Coach Terri Williams-FLOURNOY is in her seventh season at Auburn, her 15th as a head coach, and her 27th overall in college coaching
- In SEC preseason polls, Auburn was picked to finish 8th by both the media and the league's coaches

OPENING TIP

» After an 11-day break, the Auburn women's basketball team returns to action Sunday, Nov. 25, hosting Louisiana-Lafayette at 2 p.m. at Auburn Arena.

» Auburn is 3-1 on the season; the Tigers advanced to the semifinals of the Preseason WNIT before falling on the road at Iowa State 67-64 last Tuesday.

» The Ragin' Cajuns are 2-2 on the year and are coming off a 68-61 victory over Jackson State on Monday.

LAST TIME OUT

» A furious comeback by the Auburn women's basketball team fell just short Tuesday night as the Tigers dropped a 67-64 battle at Iowa State in the Preseason WNIT semifinal.

» Trailing by 10 with less than two minutes to play, senior Janiah McKay made three straight 3-pointers in less than a minute - the last coming with 41 seconds left - to tie the game at 64-all. But the Tigers were unable to get a shot away in their final two possessions, and a Cyclone layup with 9 seconds to play was the difference.

» Sophomore Unique Thompson had her second straight double-double and third of the season with 19 points and 14 rebounds. Emari Jones matched a season-high with 15 points, and McKay's late flurry gave her a 14-point night.

» Thompson dominated both ends of the floor in the first half, racking up 16 points and 10 rebounds by halftime. Meanwhile, Iowa State started cold, shooting 18 percent in the first quarter and 28 percent in the first half as the Tigers were able to build an early lead. Auburn led by as many as 15 late in the second quarter before the Cyclones cut the lead to nine at the break, 38-29.

» Auburn shot 41.1% for the game, but just 31% in the second half. Meanwhile, Iowa State shot 47% in the second half, including 40% on 3-pointers. The Cyclones won the rebounding battle 42-36, including 16 offensive rebounds which turned into 14 second-chance points. Auburn turned the ball over 16 times to Iowa State's 15; both teams scored 19 points off the other's turnovers.

» Auburn will make its second road trip of the year - this one regularly scheduled - traveling to NAIA side Xavier (La.) on Wednesday, Nov. 28. Game time is 6 p.m. CT at the XULA Convocation Center.

AN AUBURN WIN WOULD...

» Be the Tigers' 10th straight home non-conference win.

» Be Auburn's 10th non-conference win in its last 11 games.

» Give Coach Flo her 500th win as a collegiate coach (251 as an assistant; 249 as a head coach).

TIGERS-CAJUNS SERIES

» This is the third meeting all-time between Auburn and Louisiana-Lafayette. The Tigers have won both prior meetings.

» Auburn is 93-13 all-time against current members of the Sun Belt Conference. This is the first of two contests against Sun Belt members this season; the Tigers will face Coastal Carolina on Dec. 18.

LAST MEETING:**Auburn 70, UL-Lafayette 60 (Dec. 8, 2017)**

» Freshman Unique Thompson scored a career-high 29 points along with 12 rebounds, and Auburn held off a scrappy Louisiana-Lafayette team for a 70-60 win at the Cajundome.

» The Tigers saw the Ragin' Cajuns get hot from outside early, and turnovers were not as easy to come by as usual, but a scoring burst from Thompson in the fourth quarter helped Auburn pull away late.

» Thompson's 29 points and 12 rebounds were her second double-double of the season. She had 15 points in the fourth quarter alone. For the night, she was 11-of-13 from the field and 7-of-8 from the free-throw line. Nine of her 12 rebounds came on the offensive glass.

» Janiah McKay and Daisa Alexander had 10 points apiece, and McKay added nine assists. Auburn shot a season-high 51.9% from the field, including 61.5% in the fourth quarter. The Tigers had 34 points in the paint to ULL's 20, and 15 second-chance points off 10 offensive rebounds.

SCOUTING THE CAJUNS

» Louisiana-Lafayette is 2-2 on the year. Their last time out, the Ragin' Cajuns defeated Jackson State 68-61.

» The Cajuns defeated McNeese State 70-59 for their other victory on the year but have losses to Lamar and Dillard.

» Ty'Ronna Doucet leads the Cajuns in most statistical categories, including scoring (20.5 ppg), rebounding (15.0 rpg) and field goal percentage (69.0%).

» Through four games, the Cajuns are averaging 71.0 points while giving up 67.8 and shooting 42.2% from the floor.

SCOUTING AUBURN

» Auburn is 3-1 on the season after advancing to the semifinals of the preseason WNIT. The Tigers have wins over Grambling State, Nicholls State and New Mexico while dropping a 3-point game at Iowa State.

» Senior point guard Janiah McKay leads the Tigers in scoring with 15.8 points/game; she also leads the SEC with 6.5 assists/game. McKay is the Tigers' leading returning scorer for the second straight season after averaging 16.6 ppg last season. McKay ranks 21st in career scoring at Auburn with 1,262 points.

» Sophomore forward Unique Thompson is a force under the basket and has been key to Auburn's success early this year. She has three double-doubles in four games and is averaging 14.5 points and 14.0 rebounds. As a freshman last season, she averaged 11.5 ppg and 8.4 rpg with 7 double-doubles, tying the Auburn freshman record.

» Junior Daisa Alexander had a breakout sophomore season where she scored 14.2 points/game and led the SEC with 2.8 steals/game, earning a nod to the SEC All-Defensive Team. So far this season, Alexander is averaging 12.8 points/game.

» Senior Emari Jones has been one of Auburn's most consistent scorers so far in 2018-19, averaging 12.0 points/game and scoring in double-figures in three of four games so far. In 2017-18, she started 16 games and averaged 5.0 points. She transferred to Auburn prior to the 2016-17 season after a year at Shawnee CC in Ullin, Ill., where she was the nation's leading junior college scorer with 746 points in 2015-16.

» Redshirt junior Crystal Primm has given Auburn

consistent minutes through her first four games on The Plains, averaging 10.0 points and 3.8 rebounds. Primm transferred from Duke following the 2016-17 season.

» The Tigers' incoming freshman class was ranked No. 13 by ESPN HoopGurlz and included two top-50 prospects in Robyn Benton (#17 overall; #6 guard) and Brooke Moore (#42 overall; #11 guard).

BALANCED SCORING RETURNS

» For the first time since 2008, Auburn had six players finish in double-figures in the Tigers' 97-48 win over Grambling on Nov. 6.

» Junior Jannah McKay and freshman Robyn Benton led the way with 16 points, followed by junior Crystal Primm (15), sophomore Unique Thompson (14), and junior Daisa Alexander and senior Emari Jones (13).

» The last time Auburn had at least six players score 10+ points, seven players did it against Sam Houston State on Dec. 5, 2008, when the Tigers set a school record with 119 points. That night, it was KeKe Carrier (19), DeWanna Bonner (18), Alli Smalley (16), Whitney Boddie (13), Reneisha Hobbs (13), Chantel Hilliard (13) and Sherell Hobbs (13).

» Through the first four games, Auburn has five players averaging double-digit scoring.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

» With 97 points in the season-opening win over Grambling, Auburn hit the 90-point plateau for the fourth time in the Coach Flo era and the first since scoring 92 on Nov. 17, 2014 - also against Grambling.

» Under Coach Flo, Auburn is 4-0 when scoring at least 90 points and 25-1 when scoring at least 80 points.

» Auburn's total of 256 points through three games were its most since the 2008-09 season, when the Tigers scored 257 against Alabama A&M (91), Temple (95) and Georgia Southern (71).

SEEING DOUBLE

» Auburn players have recorded four double-doubles through four games with three coming from sophomore Unique THompson.

» With her 19-point, 14-rebound effort at Iowa State, Thompson recorded her 10th career double-double. She had reached the milestone by halftime with 16 points and 10 rebounds in the opening 20 minutes; it was the second time in her career she had a double-double by halftime.

» Thompson's 19-point, 19-rebound double-double at New Mexico was her second of the season and marked a career-high in rebounding for the Auburn sophomore.

» For the first time since 2015, Auburn had two players record a double-double in the same game as Thompson and Jannah McKay each had one against Grambling.

» Thompson picked up where she left off in 2017-18 with her eighth career double-double, notching 14 points and 13 rebounds in the season-opener. And McKay earned the second of her career with 16 points and 10 assists.

» The last time two Auburn players had a double-double in the same game was Dec. 13, 2015, at Marquette, when Tra'Cee Tanner (13 pts/12 rebs) and Brandy Montgomery (24 pts/12 rebs) did so.

CRASHING THE BOARDS

» After rebounding had been a struggle for Auburn much of the last two seasons, the Tigers have been a force on the glass so far in 2018-19. The Tigers average

44.0 rebounds/game and had 53 in the opener vs. Grambling, their most in a game in two seasons.

» Unique Thompson is the Tigers' leading rebounder, averaging 14.0 through four games. Her 19-rebound effort at New Mexico was a career-high, surpassing the 16 boards she pulled down in her collegiate debut at Virginia Tech on Nov. 13, 2017. She was one board shy of another rare Auburn milestone - the Tigers have not had a 20-rebound game since 1995.

» Through games of Nov. 19, Thompson ranks 9th in the country in rebounds/game and 8th nationally in defensive rebounds/game (10.0).

TURNING UP THE PRESSURE

» Auburn ranked No. 2 in the nation in steals (13.2/game) and No. 3 in turnovers forced (22.9) for the 2017-18 season.

» Last year, the Tigers forced at least 20 turnovers in 23 of 29 games last year, including 10 games with at least 25 opponent turnovers. Auburn was 8-2 last year and has won 26 of its last 29 when forcing at least 25 turnovers.

» Auburn's season high of turnovers forced last year was 35 against ULM, which tied for the second-most by Auburn under Coach Flo and the eighth-most in program history.

» Auburn forced 24 turnovers against Nicholls State on Nov. 9, including 18 steals, and turned those into 29 points.

» The Tigers' 2018-19 freshman class was rated the No. 13 signing class in the country by ESPN HoopGurlz.

» Redshirt junior G Crystal Primm (West Palm Beach, Fla.) is eligible this season after sitting out last year under NCAA transfer rules. She transferred to Auburn from Duke in the summer of 2017 and has two years of eligibility.

» Redshirt freshman Kiyae' White (Macungie, Pa.) will be in action this season after sitting out last year while rehabbing an injury.

WELCOME TO THE FAMILY

» Auburn signed five players to NLI's during the early signing period in November.

» The Tigers will welcome **Lauren Hansen** (5-8, G, Setauket, N.Y.); **Annie Hughes** (5-9, G, Pisgah, Ala.); **Maliya Perry** (6-0, G/F, Pickerington, Ohio); **Morgan Robinson-Nwagwu** (5-8, G, Norcross, Ga.); and **Sania Wells** (5-7, G, Hurley, Miss.) to The Plains beginning in the fall of 2019.

TIGERS IN THE PROS

» DeWanna Bonner completed her ninth season in the WNBA in 2018, all with the Phoenix Mercury, after taking the 2017 season off for the birth of her twins. Bonner had one of her best pro seasons, averaging 17.3 points, 7.2 rebounds and 3.2 assists while starting all 34 games. She was a beast in the 2018 playoffs, averaging 24.0 points and 11.1 rebounds in seven postseason games. Bonner was named the Associated Press' WNBA Comeback Player of the Year.

» Brandy Montgomery is playing in Europe for her second season, currently on the roster of Luxembourg side Etzella Ettelbruck. Last year, she played for Visby in Sweden, averaging 16.3 points, 5.1 rebounds and 1.8 assists while helping her team to the league semifinals.

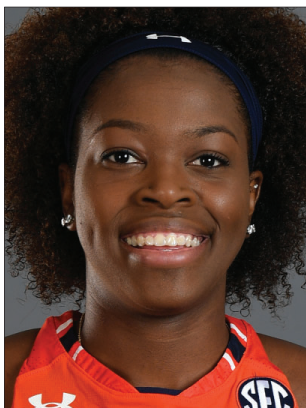

AUBURN --Janiah McKay and Unique Thompson both recorded double-doubles as the Auburn women's basketball team posted its highest scoring output of the Terri Williams-Flournoy era with a 97-48 victory over Grambling State Tuesday at Auburn Arena.

Led by 16 points from McKay and freshman Robyn Benton, Auburn (1-0) had six players in double figures, the first time for the Tigers to hit that mark since the 2008-09 season.

Along with the 16 points from McKay and Benton, the Tigers got 15 points from redshirt junior Crystal Primm in her Auburn debut, 14 points from Thompson, and 13 each from Daisa Alexander and Emari Jones.

Thompson posted her eighth career double-double with a team-high 13 rebounds to go with her 14 points. And McKay recorded the second double-double of her career, notching 10 assists to go with her 16 points. It was the first time for Auburn to have two players with a double-double in the same game since the 2015-16 season when Tra'Ce'e Tanner and Brandy Montgomery pulled off the feat.

Auburn shot 53.5 percent from the field, scored 97 points and had 53 rebounds - all higher totals than in any game last season. The Tigers' 97 points were the most of the Coach Flo era and the highest output since scoring 119 against Sam Houston State in 2008 - also the last time the Tigers had at least six players in double-figures.

Every player that dressed for Auburn scored. Sophomore Abigail Jackson had four points along with five rebounds, and freshmen Kiyae' White (3 points, 4 rebounds), Erin Howard (2 points, 3 rebounds) and Natalie Kelly (1 point, 1 rebound) found the stat sheet in their Auburn debuts.

After Grambling scored the first four points of the game and took a 6-3 lead, Auburn went on a 16-1 run over the next four-plus minutes to take a 19-9 lead. Grambling would get no closer than 9 points the rest of the way. Auburn ended the first half on a 12-0 run to take a 44-20 lead by the break.

AUBURN -- Auburn jumped out to a big early lead and had another strong offensive performance Friday night in an 80-59 win over Nicholls State in the first round of the Preseason Women's NIT.

It was Auburn's second-straight game scoring at least 80 points; the Tigers scored 80 or more just twice all of last season. Despite a cold fourth quarter, Auburn shot 45.1% from the field and made 12-of-13 free throws.

Daisa Alexander led Auburn with 20 points while also racking up five rebounds and two steals. Emari Jones added 15 points and pulled down 8 rebounds for the second straight game along with three assists and two steals. Janiah McKay finished with 14 points and seven assists. And Unique Thompson scored six points and pulled down a game-high 10 rebounds to go along with four steals and two blocks while playing just 24 minutes.

Auburn jumped out to a 9-0 lead in the first two minutes and had another 9-0 run in the first quarter to take a 23-10 lead after 10 minutes. Nicholls took advantage of an Auburn cold stretch in the second to cut the lead to as few as seven points, but the Tigers took a 37-26 lead to the break.

The Tigers pulled away in the third quarter and increased their lead to as many as 29 in the fourth before a cold stretch late saw the final margin trimmed to 21.

The Tigers took full advantage of being several inches taller at most every position, out-rebounding the Colonels 42-28 and racking up five blocked shots. Auburn also had 18 steals in forcing 24 Nicholls turnovers, turning those into 29 points.

Nicholls' Cassidy Barrios, the defending Southland Conference Player of the Year, shared the game lead in scoring with 20 points and pulled down 11 rebounds for her first double-double of the year.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. -- Sophomore Unique Thompson had 19 points and a career-high 19 rebounds as Auburn won a thriller at New Mexico, 79-76, to advance to the semifinals of the Preseason Women's NIT.

With 17 seconds to play and the score tied 76-all, junior Daisa Alexander hit a baseline jumper, got fouled, and made the free throw to give the Tigers (3-0) a three-point lead. New Mexico (1-1), who had hit 12 3-pointers in the game, had two blocks at a tying tray in the final three seconds but missed both as the clock expired.

Thompson's 19-point, 19-rebound effort marked her second double-double in three games and the ninth of her career. The 19 rebounds were the most by an Auburn player since Tra'Ce'e Tanner also had 19 at Florida Gulf Coast during the 2015-16 season.

Auburn took advantage of early New Mexico fouls, hitting 8-of-12 free throws in the first quarter and 15-of-20 in the first half. Those points were sorely needed because the Tigers managed just 30.3 percent from the field in the opening half. Despite that, Auburn finished the second quarter on a 7-0 run - a 3-pointer from Emari Jones and four points from Janiah McKay - to take a 36-33 lead to the break.

The foul count went down and the shooting percentages went up in the second half as the Tigers shot 52.9 percent in the final 20 minutes. The lead changed hands 10 different times during the second half alone - including the closing seconds of the third quarter. The Lobos took a 56-54 lead with five seconds to play on a pair of free throws, but freshman Erin Howard drained a buzzer-beating 3-pointer to give the Tigers a 57-56 lead through three periods.

Auburn then moved ahead by as many as five points with 4:40 to play, taking a 70-65 lead out of the final media timeout on a pair of Thompson free throws. But in a span of two New Mexico possessions, the Lobos were back ahead 71-70 on a pair of 3-pointers.

McKay hit a jumper to give the Tigers a 76-73 lead with exactly a minute to play, but the Lobos answered with their 12th 3-pointer of the game to knot the score at 76-76, setting up Alexander's game-winner.

AMES, Iowa -- A furious comeback by the Auburn women's basketball team fell just short Tuesday night as the Tigers dropped a 67-64 battle at Iowa State in the Preseason WNIT semifinal.

Trailing by 10 with less than two minutes to play, senior Janiah McKay made three straight 3-pointers in less than a minute - the last coming with 41 seconds left - to tie the game at 64-all. But the Tigers were unable to get a shot away in their final two possessions, and a Cyclone layup with 9 seconds to play was the difference.

Sophomore Unique Thompson had her second straight double-double and third of the season with 19 points and 14 rebounds. Emari Jones matched a season-high with 15 points, and McKay's late flurry gave her a 14-point night.

Auburn was playing its third game in five days in three different states and will have traveled over 3,700 miles since Saturday by the time the team returns home Wednesday.

Thompson dominated both ends of the floor in the first half, racking up 16 points and 10 rebounds by halftime. Meanwhile, Iowa State started cold, shooting 18 percent in the first quarter and 28 percent in the first half as the Tigers were able to build an early lead. Auburn led by as many as 15 late in the second quarter before the Cyclones cut the lead to nine at the break, 38-29.

A 3-pointer from Jones to start the second half pushed the Tigers' lead to 12. But from there, the Cyclones caught fire. A 10-0 ISU run cut the lead to two with 6:34 left in the quarter, and a buzzer-beating 3-pointer tied the game at 45-45.

The Cyclones took their first lead nine seconds into the fourth quarter and never trailed again, going on an 8-0 run to push the advantage to 10 points at 64-54 with 2:21 to play. But after a Jones free throw cut the deficit to nine, McKay, who had been quiet most of the night, hit three 3-pointers in a span of 47 seconds to tie the game.

Auburn shot 41.1% for the game, but just 31% in the second half. Meanwhile, Iowa State shot 47% in the second half, including 40% on 3-pointers. The Cyclones won the rebounding battle 42-36, including 16 offensive rebounds which turned into 14 second-chance points.

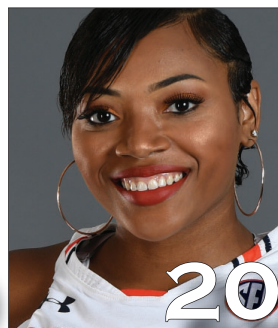

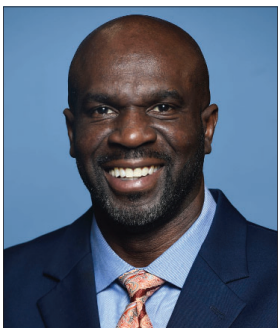
