# **Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters**

- This is the sixth meeting between Auburn and Missouri in women's basketball
- Auburn is 3-2 all-time against Missouri in a series that dates back to 1983
- This is the fourth meeting between the teams since Missouri joined the SEC in 2012-13
- Missouri won the only previous meeting in Columbia, Mo. (82-76 on Jan. 6, 2013)
- Auburn is 4-2 all-time against teams from the state of Missouri (3-2 vs. Mizzou; 1-0 vs. (SW) Missouri State)
- This will be the fourth game Auburn women's basketball has played in the state of Missouri (all in CoMo)
- The Tigers faced six top-20 teams in their first nine SEC games
- The Tigers' win at FIU on Dec. 29 snapped a six-game road losing streak
- Auburn is 6-4 all-time on February 8 and 163-109 all-time in the month of February
- Auburn is 5-1 this season when forcing 25 or more turnovers but 2-5 when committing 20+ turnovers
- The Tigers have recorded 15 or more steals five times this year, going 5-0 in those games
- Auburn has started three freshmen (Jazmine Jones, Jessica Jones, Neydja Petithomme) twice this season
- Auburn has used eight different starting lineups in 2014-15
- Auburn is third in the SEC in blocks (4.5) per game, and fourth in assists (13.9) and steals (11.1)
- Sophomores Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking were named to the FIU Fun & Sun all-tournament team
- Sophomore Katie Frerking has led Auburn in rebounding in 9 games
- Frerking scored a career-high 15 points at Alabama (1/22)
- Brandy Montgomery has four 20+ point games this season: 24 at Virginia (11/23), 20 at FIU (12/29), 21 vs. Mississippi State (1/26), and 23 vs. LSU (2/5)
- Sophomore Khady Dieng was named to the St. John's All-Tournament Team after scoring 26 points in two games
- Dieng had a career-high 8 rebounds at Arkansas (1/29) while playing point guard for the first time
- Junior Tra'Cee Tanner has four double-doubles this season (Troy, St. John's, Florida, Texas A&M)
- Tanner has two 20+ point games this season: 31 vs. Grambling (11/17) and 23 at Kentucky (1/8)
- Tanner has been Auburn's leading scorer in 12 of 23 games
- Tanner is Auburn's leading scorer (11.8 ppg) and rebounder (5.9 rpg)
- Auburn is in its 44th season of women's basketball and has 858 program wins

Auburn has a week off before returning home to take on Arkansas on Sunday, Feb. 15. Tip is set for 1 p.m. CT at Auburn Arena, and the game will be televised by SEC Network.

Auburn is in its 44th season of women's basketball and sports an all-time record of 858-421... Auburn has made 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, five WNIT appearances and three Final Fours in the program's history... Head Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is 47-44 in her third season at Auburn... She has a 190-148 record as a head coach... Auburn advanced to the 2013 WNIT Quarterfinals and the 2014 WNIT Third Round... The Tigers are coming off back-to-back 19-15 seasons.

# **AGAINST THE SEC**

- Auburn has an all-time record of 204-198 (.507) against the other 13 members of the Southeastern Conference (in league games).
- The Tigers have won five SEC regular-season titles (most recently 2009) and four SEC Tournament championships.

# **AUBURN-MISSOURI SERIES**

- This is just the sixth meeting between Auburn and Missouri in women's basketball.
- Auburn owns a 3-2 advantage in the five previous meetings, but Mizzou won the only prior meeting in Columbia, Mo., in 2013.
   Mizzou is 2-1 against Auburn since joining the Southeastern Conference in 2012-13.

# **COACH FLO VS. MISSOURI**

 Auburn coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is 1-3 all-time against Missouri. Three of those meetings have come since she took over as head coach at Auburn; her first meeting with Mizzou came while head coach at Georgetown.

# **AGAINST THE SHOW-ME STATE**

Auburn has only faced two opponents from the state of Missouri: Missouri and Missouri State. The Tigers are 3-2 all-time against Mizzou and won the only prior meeting with Missouri State (then known as Southwest Missouri State) in the 2000 NCAA Tournament.

# LAST MEETING: MIZZOU 68, AUBURN 58 (2/16/14)

Missouri streaked to a 28-point halftime lead, finished with a game-sapping 12 3-pointers and beat the Tigers 68-58 in Auburn Arena on Feb. 16, 2014. Auburn cut the lead to seven late before the teams traded free throws in the final minute.

Auburn was looking to build on consecutive wins over Arkansas, Mississippi State and especially Vanderbilt. Instead, the Tigers fell to 14-11 overall and 5-7 in the SEC while Missouri improved to 15-10 overall and 4-8 in the league.

It wasn't the kind of show Auburn was looking for, not with the Tigers' three Final Four teams from the 1988, '89 and '90 seasons being honored at halftime.

Missouri had more 3-pointers at the half (eight of them) than Auburn had field goals (only six). Missouri added four 3-pointers in the second half on a day in which the team fired up 26 long-range shots.

Tanner rebounded from a scoreless first half to finish with a team-high 22 points. Tra'Cee Tanner added 15 points.

# **SCOUTING AUBURN**

- Auburn is 9-14 overall, 0-10 in SEC play, coming off a 60-49 loss to LSU on Thursday night. The Tigers have wrapped up a stretch where they played four ranked teams in a five-game stretch and six top-20 teams in their first nine conference contests.
- Junior Tra'Cee Tanner continues to be the Tigers' top scoring threat, averaging 11.8 points and shooting 57.3% in the first 23 aames.
- Tanner has four double-doubles this season: 16 points, 10 rebounds vs. Troy (11/14); 12 points, 10 rebounds at St. John's (12/20); 12 points, 10 rebounds vs. Florida (1/4); and 10 points, 10 rebounds at Texas A&M (2/1).
- She followed up her first double-double with a career-high 31 points on 14-of-18 shooting vs. Grambling State. She then scored 19 points in a win over FGCU, 23 in a loss at Kentucky, and has led Auburn in scoring in 12 of 22 games.

game of the season in Thursday's loss to LSU. She scored 23 against the Lady Tigers on 8-14 shooting (6-11 3FG), and she also had a 20-point effort at FIU (12/29), 21 points vs. Mississippi State (1/26) and a season-high 24 points at Virginia (11/23).

 Auburn has held opponents to an average of 56.4 points per game this season, seventh-best in the SEC and 31st-best in the country.

## **SCOUTING MISSOURI**

- Missouri is 12-11 overall, 2-8 in SEC play in 2014-15. Both Mizzou wins in conference play have come against Florida.
- Mizzou is coming off a 55-48 loss at home to Texas A&M on Thursday.
- The Tigers, in their fifth season under coach Robin Pingeton, were picked to finish 11th in the SEC by both the league's coaches and the media. Missouri advanced to the WNIT in 2014, falling at Creighton 77-51 in the first round.
- Missouri is the third-most difficult team in the league to shoot against as they allow opponents to shoot just 34.6% from the floor.
   The Tigers have made (169) and attempted (539) more 3-pointers than any team in the league, connecting on 31.4 percent of their attempts.
- Sophomore Jordan Frericks averages a double-double, leading Mizzou in scoring (13.6 ppg) and rebounding (10.2 rpg).
   Morgan Eye is one of the league's best 3-point shooters, averaging 2.6 made per game and hitting at a 35.1% clip from outside.

# LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN

Sophomore Brandy Montgomery scored a game-high 23 points, but Auburn's comeback attempt fell short as LSU earned a 60-49 win Thursday night at Auburn Arena.

For the fourth time in five games, Auburn out-shot its opponent from the floor (39.0 percent to 37.9 percent), but 24 turnovers were too much for Auburn to overcome.

Montgomery's 23 points came mostly courtesy of six 3-pointers, which matched a career-high that she set earlier this seasno at Virginia. She was 8-of-14 from the floor, playing a season-high 35 minutes, and was Auburn's only player in double figures. Katie Frerking had eight points and a game-high nine rebounds.

After LSU took a 25-18 lead into halftime, the Lady Tigers extended that to as many as 15 points at 38-23 with 14:27 to play. But Montgomery had a 9-0 run by herself, knocking down three consecutive 3-point tries over the next 2:30 to cut the LSU lead to six points at 38-32.

LSU would again move ahead by 11 points at 44-33 with 9:57 to play. But once again, Auburn would answer with an 8-0 run, sparked by another Montgomery 3-pointer, a Montgomery layup after a Khady Dieng steal, and a Dieng trey to cut the LSU lead to three at 44-41. From there, though, Auburn would be unable to get any closer. It was 50-46 with just over four minutes to play, but LSU ended the game on a 10-3 run.

LSU scored 28 points off Auburn's 24 turnovers and also took advantage of 16 offensive rebounds, turning those into 13 second-chance points. Danielle Ballard led LSU with 13 points and also recorded seven rebounds and six steals. LSU was a perfect 14-of-14 at the free-throw line.

# LAST TIME OUT FOR MISSOURI

A stellar night for sophomore forward Jordan Frericks on both ends of the floor was not enough as the Tigers hung with the No. 14-ranked Texas A&M Aggies, falling 55-48. The Tigers drop to 12-11 overall and 2-8 in SEC play.

Mizzou stayed close to the No. 14-ranked team in the nation, trailing at halftime only 28-21. Frericks continued to be a force in the paint grabbing 10 of her 16 total rebounds in the first half. The Tigers were led in scoring in the first half by guard Maddie Stock with eight points, who hit two big three-pointers to keep the game close to end the half. The junior finished the night 12 points overall. Mizzou found scoring in the first half from five different players, including two off of the pine.

Maddie Stock opened up the second half with yet another field goal to bring the Tigers with in five, but the Aggies would come back down the floor to answer. The second half was largely a back and forth effort with Mizzou cutting the lead to three at three separate times in the half. Each time the Aggies continued their offensive pressure to pull away.

Jordan Frericks led the team with 15 points and 16 rebounds, one shy of her season-high total. Mizzou demonstrated unselfish play, assisting on 14 of 19 field goals, with six Tigers contributing to that total. The Tigers also found stability at the charity stripe going 5-for-5, good for 100-percent shooting. Mizzou last shot lights out from the line on Nov. 20, 2011 against North Florida.

# **ON FEBRUARY 8**

- This will be Auburn's 11th all-time game on Feb. 8. The Tigers are 6-4 on this date with the last game being an 81-54 win at Alabama in 2009.
- Auburn is 163-109 all-time in the month of February (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that season). Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy has a record of 7-9 in February as Auburn's head coach.

 Auburn has employed eight different starting lineups this year, four in the last five games.

## **HOME SWEET HOME**

- Auburn has won 11 out of their last 16 games at Auburn Arena, including the final two regular season games and two WNIT games in the 2013-14 season and the first seven games of 2014-15
- Dating back to a win over Alabama on Feb. 17, 2013, Auburn has won 23 of its last 33 home games, including a 17-1 mark against non-conference opponents.
- With 11 straight wins spanning parts of two seasons, Auburn matched the longest home win streak since Auburn Arena opened in 2010. Auburn previously won 11 straight over the last two games of 2011-12 and the first nine games of 2012-13.
  - Auburn is 49-27 (.648) in its fifth season at Auburn Arena.

- Sophomore Brandy Montgomery scored a career-high 24
  points against Virginia on Nov. 23, including six 3-pointers. It
  marked the most 3-pointers in a game by an Auburn player since
  Ruth Ketcham had six vs. Colgate on Dec. 5, 2007.
- She matched her earlier output in a game with LSU on Feb. 5, hitting six 3-pointers on 11 attempts to finish with 23 points.
- Montgomery needs just 8 more made 3-pointers to move into the all-time Auburn top 10.

## **CLUB PRESS**

- Auburn's high-pressure, full-court defense under coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, refered to by the players as "Club Press," has ranked as one of the best ever at Auburn over the last two seasons.
   In 2012-13, Auburn's 402 steals set a new school record for a single season while the 701 turnovers forced went down as second all-time on The Plains.
- In 2013-14, the Tigers forced 659 opponent turnovers while recording 354 steals, remaining a major force on defense in the Southeastern Conference.
- Auburn has forced 25 or more turnovers in a game 116 times since 1987 and has done so six times this season. Auburn forced 29 turnovers in the season-opener vs. Troy, 25 in the win over Grambling and 27 in wins over Marquette, Samford and FIU.
- The Tigers have also tallied 15 or more steals in a game on 105 occasions since 1987, doing so five times last season and five times already in 2014-15.
- The Tigers used the defense to fuel their offense, averaging
   19.3 points per game off turnovers last year. So far this year,
   Auburn scored 29 points off turnovers in the season-opener vs.
   Troy, 34 against Grambling, 28 vs. Marquette and 27 vs. Samford.

# **BACK-TO-BACK 19-WIN SEASONS**

 Auburn has posted back-to-back seasons with a 19-15 record, which tie for the most wins in a season since the Tigers' SEC Championship season of 2009. The Tigers advanced to the WNIT quarterfinals in 2013 and the WNIT third round in 2014.

# **TOUGH SCHEDULE**

 The Tigers will play a challenging schedule this season, playing as many as seven non-conference games against teams that advanced to the postseason a year ago. Florida Gulf Coast, Winthrop, St. John's and Hampton all played in the NCAA Tournament last year, while SMU, Marquette and Bowling Green advanced to the WNIT.

- Auburn's first five SEC opponents South Carolina, Florida, Kentucky, Georgia, and Tennessee - all advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season. Texas A&M, LSU and Vanderbilt all made the Big Dance, while Mississippi State and Missouri joined Auburn in the WNIT.
- Six of Auburn's first nine SEC opponents will have been ranked in the top 20 at the time Auburn faced them: No. 1 South Carolina, No. 6 Tennessee, No. 10 Kentucky, No. 12 Texas A&M,
   No. 18 Mississippi State and No. 20 Georgia.

## SISTER ACT

- For just the fourth time ever, Auburn's roster features a sister combination as twin freshmen Jazmine and Jessica Jones will be in uniform for the Tigers. It gives Auburn a pair of sisters on the roster for the third-straight year as Tyrese and Tra'Cee Tanner played together the last two seasons.
- Other sister combinations to play together at Auburn include Tyrese (2010-14) and Tra'Cee Tanner (2012-present); Sherell (2004-09) and Reneisha (2006-10) Hobbs, and Ruthie (1985-89) and Mae Ola (1984-88) Bolton.

# **NEW FACES**

- Auburn welcomes five newcomers to the roster for 2014-15, all freshmen. Joining the Tigers this year are G Bria Johnson (Baton Rouge, La.), F Jazmine Jones (Winston-Salem, N.C.), F Jessica Jones (Winston-Salem, N.C.), PG Neydja Petithomme (Boca Raton, Fla.) and F Asia Robeson (Kalamazoo, Mich.).
- The Jones twins, Petithomme and Robeson made their collegiate debuts vs. Troy on Nov. 14, and Johnson saw her first action in an Auburn uniform vs. Grambling State on Nov. 17.
- Both Jones twins and Petithomme have earned starts this season.

## ON THE TUBE

- A total of 22 Auburn games will be televised on either digital
  or linear networks during the course of the 2014-15 season. Eleven
  games will appear on SEC Network +, which is available online

Jonika is very athletic and can help us at the top of our press, and Janiah helps fill that point guard position in losing Kiani. Both of them could be very good defensive players. We definitely filled some needs."

AUBURN, Ala Junior Tra'Cee Tanner had her fourth career
double-double, and the Auburn women's basketball team used a huge

run around halftime to earn a season-opening 71-54 win over Troy on

Friday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (1-0) kept up their trademark defensive pressure throughout the game, forcing 29 turnovers while amassing 22 steals on the night, falling just two swipes shy of a school record.

Tanner led the way both shooting and on the boards, scoring 16 points and pulling down 10 rebounds to earn her first double-double since posting 14 points and 10 boards at Tennessee last season.

Auburn controlled the boards on the night, out-rebounding Troy 51-41. The Tigers also had 21 assists to Troy's 10 and shot 43.5 percent while holding the Trojans to a 26.6-percent night.

Four Auburn players hit double-figures on the night. Along with Tanner's 16, sophomore Khady Dieng contributed 13 points while sophomore Katie Frerking and senior Hasina Muhammad had 10 apiece.

Frerking narrowly missed a double-double of her own, pulling down a career-high nine rebounds. She also had a career-best five steals along with two assists and a block.

Auburn led for more than 37 minutes on the night, but the big run came just before and just after halftime. The Tigers outscored the Trojans 16-0 over the final 2:24 of the first half and the first 1:32 of the second stanza, opening up an 18-point lead. Troy would get no closer than 14 points the rest of the way.

Tanner scored 12 of the first 14 points for Auburn as a small Grambling lineup had no answer for the 6-3 junior. She would finish with 31, a career-high and the most for an Auburn player since Blanche Alverson scored 32 against Mississippi State on March 3, 2013.

Montgomery had a career-high seven assists along with 18 points, six rebounds and three steals. Freshman Jessica Jones hit double-digits in her second collegiate game with 11 points and six rebounds, and sophomore Khady Dieng filled the stat sheet with nine points, six rebounds, five assists and four steals. Eleven of 12 players on Auburn's roster scored in the game.

Auburn never trailed in the game and controlled the action from the opening tip. Auburn shot 59.4 percent for the game, holding Grambling to 28.3 percent from the field. The homestanding Tigers also outrebounded the visitors 47-24, holding Grambling to just seven offensive rebounds.

A whopping 74 of Auburn's 92 points came in the paint as Auburn took full advantage of their edge in size. Auburn also forced Grambling into 25 turnovers while committing just 15 of their own. Auburn led 46-20 at halftime.

AUBURN, Ala. — Two drawn charges in the final minute and clutch shots from several players helped secure a 72-69 win for the Auburn women's basketball team over Florida Gulf Coast on Thursday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (3-0) won their seventh-straight game at Auburn Arena, dating back to the 2013-14 season, and head into their first road trip this weekend on a high note after a hard-fought win. Auburn is 3-0 for the first time since their 2008-09 SEC Championship season when the Tigers won their first 20 contests.

Tied at 66-66 with just over a minute to play, Hasina Muhammad knocked down a jumper at the one-minute mark to give the Tigers a 68-66 lead. At the other end, Katie Frerking stood tall and drew a charge, setting up a Kiani Parker 15-footer to extend Auburn's lead to four.

But the Eagles answered with a 3-pointer from the corner to cut the lead to one with 12 seconds left, then fouled immediately. Frerking hit one of two free throws to put Auburn ahead by two, then Tra'Cee Tanner drew another charge with 3.1 seconds to play. After another FGCU foul, Khady Dieng hit one of two free throws to make it a three-point game, and the Eagles' desperation heave fell short.

Tanner had another big night offensively, leading the Tigers with 19 points on 7-of-11 shooting. She also tied for the team lead with six rebounds and was a perfect 5-of-5 at the free-throw line. Three other players scored in double figures, led by 11 points from Dieng and 10 apiece from Muhammad and Brandy Montgomery. Muhammad also blocked three shots on the night.

Auburn shot 52.7 percent from the field and saw vast improvement at the free-throw line, hitting 9-of-11 shots on the night. FGCU, which hit seven 3-pointers in the first half, was held to just 3-of-8 in the final 20 minutes from beyond the arc as Auburn got several key stops late in the game.

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. - Sophomore Brandy Montgomery scored a career-high 24 points, but Auburn's women could not overcome a red-hot Virginia team in a 66-51 loss at John Paul Jones Arena on Sunday afternoon.

Auburn (3-1) trailed by just five at halftime, but Virginia (4-0) went on a 10-0 run early in the second half and never looked back. The Cavaliers led by as many as 21 before the Tigers made a few baskets late to cut the final deficit to 15.

The Tigers shot 32.3 percent for the game, including 29 percent in the second half. Meanwhile, the Cavaliers were 50 percent from the field in the game but hit 13 of 20 attempts (65%) in the second half.

Montgomery hit a career-high six 3-pointers and finished with 24 points, eclipsing her previous career-high of 22 from last season's game at LSU. She hit 9-of-20 attempts from the field, including 6-of-11 from 3-point range.

Katie Frerking led the Tigers on the boards, pulling down six rebounds while scoring three points. Tra'Cee Tanner, Auburn's leading scorer in the first three games, had six points and four rebounds.

Auburn trailed 33-28 at halftime. Virginia attempted 11 free throws in the first half, converting on nine, while Auburn did not get to the line until late in the period, making just one of three attempts. The Tigers were 3-for-12 at the line for the game.

Virginia was led by Sarah Imovbioh with 21 points and 13 rebounds; she had a double-double by halftime. Faith Randolph added 18 points for the Cavaliers.

ROCK HILL, S.C. - A pair of late Auburn turnovers that led to four Winthrop free throws in the final 18 seconds gave the Eagles a 56-54 win over the Tigers on Saturday afternoon at Winthrop Coliseum.

Auburn (3-2) led 54-49 with 2:45 to play after Katie Frerking knocked down Auburn's seventh 3-pointer of the game. But Winthrop (3-2) answered with a triple of their own with just under two minutes left, and the Eagles' Aliyah Kilpatrick hit four three throws in the final 18 seconds to send the Tigers to their second straight road defeat.

Kilpatrick scored a game-high 16 points with 10 of those coming at the free-throw line. Winthrop got to the line 25 times in the game, hitting 16 of their attempts, while Auburn was just 3-of-4 at the charity stripe.

Tra'Cee Tanner and Brandy Montgomery led Auburn with 11 points apiece, and Khady Dieng contributed 10. All of Tanner's scoring came in the second half after she picked up two fouls in the first 90 seconds, relegating her to the bench for the rest of the first half.

Auburn forced 20 Winthrop turnovers but was only able to convert those into  $15\ points$ .

Both teams got off to a sloppy start as the two sides combined for more turnovers in the first half (20) than made field goals (19). Auburn shot 25.7 percent in the opening half, missing their first nine attempts from the floor. The Tigers did force Winthrop into 14 turnovers; however, Auburn only capitalized for four points off those takeaways.

AUBURN, Ala. - A big second half, sparked by a 20-2 run to start the period, propelled the Auburn women's basketball team to a 79-53 win over Marquette on Tuesday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (4-2) quickly turned a 32-30 halftime lead into a 20-point cushion and never looked back after outscoring the Golden Eagles 20-2 in the first seven minutes of the second half. Auburn continued its sharp shooting for the remainder of the game as they made 19-of-34 field goal attempts (55.9%) and 7-of-8 free throws in the final 20 minutes.

Marquette (2-5) was only able to make 16-of-59 field goals (27.1%) as Auburn's full-court pressure forced them into 27 turnovers, 13 of which came in the second half and led to 20 Auburn points. The Tigers also outscored the Golden Eagles 24-2 on the fast break, 46-18 in the paint and 33-16 off the bench.

Similar to their fast start in the second half, Auburn jumped out to a 15-8 lead at the under-12 media timeout in the first half. However, Marquette was able to settle down, get the Tigers into foul trouble and cut the lead to two at halftime. But a rejuvenated Auburn team outscored Marquette 47-23 in the second half, where the Tigers led by as many as 31.

On a consistent scoring night for the Tigers, Tra'Cee Tanner led the way with a game-high 16 points and was joined in double figures by Brandy Montgomery with 13 points and Hasina Muhammad with 10. It was Montgomery's fifth consecutive game in which she scored double-digit points. Montgomery also picked up four steals, matching a career-high.

The Tigers (6-2) have now won 10 straight home games at Auburn Arena, one shy of the arena record. Auburn is now 21-1 in non-conference home games under coach Terri Williams-Flournoy.

AUBURN, Ala. - Auburn's women's basketball team got 38 points from its bench and held off a late Savannah State rally to pick up a 62-56 victory Wednesday night at Auburn Arena, the Tigers' 11th-straight home win

The Tigers (7-2), who led by as much as 17 with less than seven minutes to play, saw that lead evaporate as Savannah State (4-4) began converting Auburn turnovers into points. A 14-1 SSU run cut the lead to as few as two points with 2:12 to play, but Auburn made five of six free throws down the stretch to preserve the victory and the home winning streak.

With their 11th straight home victory - final four games of last season, plus seven straight to open this year - the Tigers have matched the Auburn Arena record for consecutive home wins. Auburn won 11 straight over the final two games of 2011-12 and the first nine home contests in 2012-13.


Auburn turned the ball over 22 times on the night, second-most this season, while forcing Savannah State into 21 turnovers. It was just the second time this year that Auburn had more turnovers than its opponent.

Hasina Muhammad led Auburn in scoring for the first time this season, netting a season-best 14 points on 6-of-9 shooting. The senior also tied for the team lead with six rebounds while picking up four assists, two blocks and a steal. Muhammad has had at least one block in eight of nine games this season.

Katie Frerking started out 3-of-3 from the field, including a pair of 3-pointers, and finished with 10 points, six rebounds and four steals.

Auburn led 31-19 at halftime, shooting 52 percent from the field in the opening half while holding Savannah State below 30 percent. For the game, the Tigers' bench outscored Savannah State's reserves 38-7, but SSU controlled points in the paint (34-26) and scored more off turnovers, in second-chance situations and on fast breaks than did Auburn.

# Game 10: Dec. 20, 2014 (25) St. John's 56, Auburn 49 Carnesecca Arena Queens, N.Y.



NEW YORK - Junior Tra'Cee Tanner had her second double-double of the season, but the Auburn women's basketball team's rally from a big early deficit came up short in a 56-49 loss at 25th-ranked St. John's on Saturday.

The Tigers (7-3) trailed by as much as 17 late in the first half but put together a second-half rally that saw them get within three points on two occasions. However, Auburn could not quite get over the hump despite putting major pressure on the Red Storm (10-0) throughout the second half.

Tanner led Auburn with 12 points and 10 rebounds, including seven boards on the offensive end. It was her second double-double of the year to go along with 16 points and 10 rebounds in the season-opener against Troy. Sophomore Khady Dieng matched Tanner's scoring output with 12 points of her own on 5-of-8 shooting.

Kiani Parker had a strong day at the point guard position, scoring eight points along with five assists. She was key in the second-half defensive effort, recording three steals and putting constant pressure on the ball in the backcourt.

Twice in the second half, Auburn cut the deficit to as little as three points. Auburn came out of the gate strong and cut the lead to 40-37 with 13:04 to play. After St. John's moved back ahead by 10 points late in the half, the Tigers ramped up the pressure and forced several turnovers to cut the lead to three points again at 52-49 with just over a minute to play. However, St. John's Aliyyah Handford hit a clutch baseline jumper with 50 seconds to play to make it a five-point game, and then two late free throws sealed the deal for the Red Storm.

The Tigers hit their first three shots and opened the game with a 6-0 lead, but the Red Storm would go on a 23-4 run from that point to take a 23-10 lead. After making their first three attempts, the Tigers would only connect on two of their next 16 shots. Despite trailing by as many as 17, Auburn would cut the deficit to 10 at the half at 32-22.

Auburn forced 13 St. John's turnovers on the day - the fewest of the season by a Tiger opponent - but 10 of those came in the second half. The Tigers out-rebounded the Red Storm 35-27, including a 16-9 advantage on the offensive glass.

NEW YORK - Auburn built a 23-point lead early in the second half but had to hold off a late SMU rally for a 56-43 win Sunday afternoon in the consolation game of the St. John's Chartwells Holiday Classic.

Sophomore Khady Dieng led the Tigers (8-3) with a season-high 14 points and was named to the all-tournament team for her effort throughout the weekend. Senior Kiani Parker contributed a career-high 11 points and five rebounds in the winning effort.

Auburn led by 20 with 10:22 to play after a three-point play by Hasina Muhammad gave the Tigers a 47-27 lead. From that point, however, SMU (4-7) tightened down on defense and forced the Tigers into six turnovers the rest of the way and held Auburn to just one field goal for the remainder of the game.

SMU got as close as eight points at 51-43 with just over two minutes to play as foul trouble plagued both teams late in the game - both teams' leading scorers would foul out in the final five minutes. But with Auburn in the double bonus and SMU in a fouling situation, Parker converted 5-of-9 free throws in the final minute to increase the margin back to double-digits and seal the Tigers' eighth victory.

The Tigers sprinted to a huge early lead, holding SMU to just three field goals in the first 14 minutes of the game as Auburn built a 27-7 lead at the 7:43 mark. A 9-0 run pulled the Mustangs within 11 at 27-16, but Auburn finished the half on an 8-2 run to take a 35-18 lead into the break. The 18 SMU points were the fewest allowed by Auburn this season.

Auburn outscored SMU in the paint 28-14, but foul trouble on the Tigers' bigs kept Auburn from pushing the ball inside in the second half. The Tigers forced SMU into 23 turnovers, scoring 24 points on the Mustangs' giveaways.

Despite going cold over the final 10 minutes, Auburn shot 40 percent for the game, holding SMU to 26.3 percent from the field.

MIAMI - Sophomore Brandy Montgomery's 20 points led five Auburn players in double-figures as the Tigers ran away from Florida International 81-44 on Monday in the opening game of the FIU Fun & Sun Classic.

Auburn (9-3) shot 55 percent from the floor for the game and held FIU (2-8) to 23.8 percent, the lowest of the season by an Auburn opponent. The win snapped a six-game skid in true road games, dating back to the end of last season.


The Tigers created their offense with their press, putting together a 34-2 run midway through the first half. Sixteen of those points came on the fast break as Auburn's defense forced FIU into 18 first-half turnovers. The Panthers had 27 turnovers for the game with Auburn collecting 20 steals

Montgomery scored 20 points in 20 minutes - her second 20 + point effort of the season - on 10-of-16 shooting. She also recorded a career-high five steals - all in the first half - with three of those leading directly to transition layups.

Four other Tigers hit double-digits on the night. Katie Frerking had a season-high 12 points on a perfect 6-of-6 night from the field and shared the Auburn lead with six rebounds. Hasina Muhammad contributed 12 of her own along with four steals and four blocks. Sophomore Khady Dieng and freshman Neydja Petithomme posted 10 points each; Petithomme also had a career-high eight assists and Dieng had four assists and three steals.

It marked the first time for Auburn to have five players in double figures since a win over Old Dominion in last season's WNIT.

# Game 13: Dec. 30, 2014 Hampton 44, Auburn 42 FIU Arena Miami, Fla.



MIAMI - Auburn fought back from a nine-point halftime deficit but came up just short in a 44-42 loss to Hampton in the championship game of the FIU Fun & Sun Classic Tuesday afternoon at FIU Arena.

The Tigers (9-4) struggled to score in the first half but were able to create turnovers in the second half, keeping things close to the final horn. Auburn found itself down by 10 points in the latter stages of the game but fought back to a two-point margin. However, Auburn's inconsistency at the free-throw line - 9-for-17 in the game - proved to be a major difference in the two-point loss.

Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking were named to the all-tournament team. Montgomery scored eight points and pulled down six rebounds to go along with her 20-point, five-steal performance against FIU Monday. Frerking had a career-high 10 rebounds in Tuesday's game along with seven points; she scored 12 in the FIU win Monday.

Despite foul trouble that kept her on the bench most of the first half, Tra'Cee Tanner led Auburn with 13 points on 5-of-8 shooting. Junior Cabriana Capers came off the bench and put together one of her best games in an Auburn uniform, tying a career-high with eight points and pulling down seven rebounds in 14 minutes of action.

The Tigers turned up the defensive pressure in the second half, forcing Hampton (5-8) into four 10-second violations, and a 10-0 run to start the half gave Auburn a 22-21 lead. The Lady Pirates would move back ahead by as many as 10 points at 39-29 with just over eight minutes to play, but the Tigers kept chipping away. A Capers layup with just over three minutes to play made it a three-point game, and a Frerking free throw cut it to two. However, the Tigers could not take advantage of their last four possessions with a chance to tie or take the lead, missing their final six shots of the game.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Auburn's women's basketball team put a second-half scare into No. 1 South Carolina, but the Gamecocks pulled away late for a 77-58 win in front of 16,465 fans at Colonial Life Arena.

Senior Hasina Muhammad led the Tigers (9-5, 0-1 SEC) with a season-high 26 points, shooting 8-of-18 from the field and draining all 10 of her free-throw attempts. Muhammad also had three blocks and three steals on the night. Neydja Petithomme added 10 points, and Brandy Montgomery pulled down a team-best seven rebounds.

After trailing by 17 at halftime, Auburn came out of the break on fire. The Tigers shot better than 60 percent over the first eight minutes of the second half and went on a 16-4 run to cut the South Carolina lead to single digits at 48-40. From there, however, the Gamecocks went on a 19-4 run and found several ways to get to the free throw line, pushing the lead to more than 20 points.

The Tigers were only outscored by two points in the second half, mostly thanks to increased defensive intensity. Auburn forced South Carolina into 18 turnovers with 10 of those coming in the second half.

Carolina scored the first seven points of the game as Auburn struggled to find any open looks early. The much taller Gamecocks had five blocks on Auburn's first nine shot attempts and forced the Tigers into nine first-half turnovers. Auburn found some offense toward the end of the half, but South Carolina led 34-17 at the break.

Auburn shot 33.9 percent from the field for the game but showed dramatic improvement at the free-throw line, knocking down 12-of-14 attempts (85.7%). South Carolina shot 48.4 percent and had five players in double figures. Auburn had 11 steals to Carolina's eight, and both teams finished with six blocked shots.

A'ja Wilson (12 points, 10 rebounds) and Alaina Coates (11 points, 14 rebounds) had double-doubles to lead South Carolina. Aleigha Welch also had 12 points on 6-of-6 shooting.

The South Carolina crowd of 16,465 was the largest crowd to ever witness a regular-season Auburn women's basketball game. The only two larger crowds to see an Auburn game came at the 1990 Women's Final Four in Knoxville.

AUBURN, Ala. - Auburn's women's basketball team could not overcome 20 turnovers and a cold-shooting second half in a 63-50 loss to Florida at Auburn Arena on Sunday afternoon.

The Tigers (9-6, 0-2 SEC) fell at home for the first time this season, snapping an 11-game winning streak at Auburn Arena. The teams combined for 47 turnovers on the day; Auburn forced the Gators into 27 giveaways but only converted those into 17 points.

After heading into halftime tied 29-29, Florida came out hot and Auburn went cold in the second half. The Gators (9-6, 1-1 SEC) hit 13-of-22 shots (59.1%) in the second half while Auburn was just 9-of-32 (28.1%) from the field. Trailing 44-41 with just over 11 minutes to play, Auburn would score just two points over the next six minutes as Florida built a 15-point lead with five minutes to play. The Tigers would get no closer than 11 the rest of the way.

Auburn shot 33.3 percent for the game while Florida was at 45.1 percent. The Tigers hit just one 3-pointer in 11 attempts while Florida was 8-of-20 from beyond the arc.

Junior forward Tra'Cee Tanner posted her third double-double of the season with 12 points and 10 rebounds. Tanner was also 6-for-8 at the free-throw line, matching a season-best. Senior Hasina Muhammad led all scorers with 13 points and pulled down four rebounds along with four blocks, two assists and two steals.

LEXINGTON, Ky. - Junior Tra'Cee Tanner scored 23 points, but Auburn fell short on the road at No. 10 Kentucky, dropping a 78-57 decision at Memorial Coliseum on Thursday night.

The Tigers (9-7, 0-3) committed a season-high 25 turnovers while forcing Kentucky (14-2, 3-0) into just 12 giveaways, a season-low for an Auburn opponent. Consequently, the Wildcats scored 23 points off turnovers while Auburn had just six.

On multiple occasions in the second half, Auburn cut Kentucky's lead to single digits, getting as close as eight points at 56-48 with just over eight minutes to play. From that point, however, the Tigers connected on just two field goal attemps while committing seven turnovers and missing seven of their final nine shots.

Kentucky led 37-25 at halftime. It was a nine-point game as the final second were ticking down, but UK's Makayla Epps connected on a 3-pointer from the corner just before the horn sounded.

Tanner's 23 points marked her second-best output of the season, behind only her 31-point effort against Grambling on Nov. 17. She also had six rebounds and three blocks. Senior Hasina Muhammad scored 12 points along with six rebounds, five blocks and three assists. Muhammad's five blocks tied a career-high.

Auburn out-rebounded Kentucky 45-35. The Tigers shot 37.3 percent from the field and connected on just one 3-pointer on five attempts. Kentucky was 43.1 percent from the floor and shot 7-of-19 from 3-point range.

The Wildcats had four players in double figures, led by Jennifer O'Neill with 17 points, 15 of which came on 3-pointers. Alexis Jennings and Epps had 12 each.

AUBURN - Senior Hasina Muhammad had her second career double-double, but the Auburn women's basketball team fell just short to No. 20 Georgia in a 57-52 loss Sunday at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers, facing their third nationally ranked opponent in the last four games, dominated the stat sheet in nearly every category. But Georgia connected on 24-of-31 attempts from the free-throw line (16-21 in the second half) while Auburn went to the line just 10 times, making six of their attempts.

A 15-foot jumper by Muhammad gave Auburn a 47-46 lead with just under four minutes to play, but Georgia's Tiaria Griffin answered with a 3-pointer and then another to put the Lady Bulldogs ahead by five. Two UGA free throws made it a seven-point game, but a quick five-point burst by the Tigers - highlighted by a 3-pointer from Montgomery - made it a three-point game with 34 seconds to play. However, Auburn could not cut the lead any further, and Georgia hit 5-of-8 at the line down the stretch.

Auburn led by as many as 11 points in the first half but saw that lead cut to 28-26 at halftime as the Lady Bulldogs finished the half on an 11-2 run over the final five minutes.

Muhammad finished with 18 points and 10 rebounds for her first double-double this season. Her 10 rebounds matched a career-high, and her 18 points were the second-most this season. The senior from Memphis scored 16 of her 18 points in the second half on 6-of-10 shooting. Tra'Cee Tanner added 12 points.

AUBURN - Auburn's defense held No. 6 Tennessee to its lowest scoring output of the season, but the Tigers could not generate much offense of their own in a 54-42 loss to the Lady Vols on Thursday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (9-9, 0-5 SEC) will have a much-needed Sunday off in SEC play before traveling to Alabama next Thursday night. Auburn has faced four top-20 teams - including three in the top 10 - in their first five SEC games.


Auburn shot 32.2 percent from the field in the game (19-of-59) while Tennessee (15-2, 5-0 SEC) connected on 22-of-52 attempts for 42.3 percent. The Lady Vols also hit five 3-pointers in the game while a pair of treys from sophomore Katie Frerking were Auburn's only points from beyond the arc.

After a buzzer-beating jumper gave Tennessee a 26-18 lead at the half, the Lady Vols scored four straight to open the second period and take a 12-point lead. As they have done in most games in conference play, though, Auburn made a push midway through the second half, cutting it to a seven-point game at 42-35 on a Frerking 3-pointer with just under 10 minutes to play. From that point, though, Auburn would make just three more shots the rest of the way.

Junior Tra'Cee Tanner led all scorers with 14 points on 7-of-11 shooting and also pulled down six rebounds. Senior Hasina Muhammad, and sophomores Brandy Montgomery and Frerking had eight points each; Muhammad added a team-best nine rebounds.

Tennessee was out-rebounded for just the fourth time this season as Auburn pulled down 39 boards to the Lady Vols' 33. Of those, 18 of Auburn's rebounds were on the offensive glass; however, the Tigers converted those into just 11 points.

# Game 19: Jan. 22, 2015 Alabama 51, Auburn 50 Foster Auditorium Tuscaloosa, Ala.



TUSCALOOSA, Ala. - Auburn fought back from a big early deficit and had a two-point lead late, but Alabama came back and held on for a 51-50 win in a wild game Thursday night at Foster Auditorium.

The Tigers turned the ball over a season-high 29 times in the game, but had a chance to win in the final seconds. A pair of missed Alabama free throws led to an Auburn rebound, and the Tigers called timeout with 12.5 seconds left and trailing by one. However, the Tigers could not get a decent look, and Brandy Montgomery's shot at the buzzer was blocked to give Alabama the win.

Sophomore Katie Frerking scored a career-high 15 points and pulled down eight rebounds to lead the Auburn effort alongside Montgomery, who had 16 points. Tra'Cee Tanner added nine points and a game-high 10 rebounds.

Auburn fought back to take a 47-45 lead on a Frerking 3-pointer with 3:43 to play. But a Montgomery 3-pointer in the final minute would be the only points Auburn would score the rest of the way. Meanwhile, Alabama found its way to the free-throw line six times in the final three minutes, hitting three of their attempts. Alabama was 14-of-22 at the line while Auburn connected on 10-of-14 attempts.

Auburn controlled the major statistical categories in the game, save for turnovers. The Tigers shot 38 percent to Alabama's 30.2 and had 39 turnovers to Alabama's 33. But the Tigers' 29 turnovers (Alabama had 20) and the 31 points Alabama scored off those turnovers were too much to overcome.

At the 1:17 mark of the first half, a fight broke out that resulted in three players - Auburn's Hasina Muhammad and Alabama's Breanna Hayden and Meoshonti Knight - being ejected from the game.

Auburn then scored the final nine points of the half to cut the Alabama lead to 30-24 at the break. Seven of those points came in the final 18 seconds - a Montgomery layup-and-one with 18.9 to play, a steal and two free throws by Khady Dieng with 10.7 left, and a steal and score by Montgomery right at the buzzer.

AUBURN, Ala. - Auburn sophomore Brandy Montgomery scored a game-high 21 points, but No. 18 Mississippi State pulled away early in the second half for a 59-48 win Monday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers led by as many as seven points late in the first half, but the Bulldogs took advantage of 23 Auburn turnovers and had 25 second-chance points after pulling down 17 offensive rebounds.

It was the third 20-point game for Montgomery this season as she led all scorers on the night. She shot 7-of-14 from the floor and 7-of-8 at the free-throw line, and she also had three steals on the night. Freshman Neydja Petithomme matched her career-high with 11 points.

Mississippi State turned a six-point halftime lead into a 10-point advantage less than two minutes into the second half. Auburn cut the lead back to six on a Montgomery jumper and a Petithomme layup with 16:56 to play, but the Tigers could get no closer. The Bulldogs would lead by as many as 20 before Auburn scored the game's final nine points.

A 15-2 Auburn run over a five-minute stretch turned an 11-5 defici into a 20-13 lead at the under-8 timeout. But the Bulldogs would put together a 15-2 run of their own, scoring twice in the final 30 seconds to take a 28-22 lead into halftime.

Auburn shot 40 percent (18-of-45) for the game and connected on 10-of-13 free throws. The Tigers also led in steals 12-10 - Katie Frerking had a game-high four swipes - and Auburn had six blocks to the Bulldogs' four. Tra'Cee Tanner had three blocks on the night.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. -- Auburn fought back from a 16-point halftime deficit to get as close as two points, but the Tigers could not complete the comeback, falling at Arkansas 52-47 Thursday night at Bud Walton Arena.

The shorthanded Tigers outscored Arkansas by 11 points in the second half and on two occasions cut the deficit to as little as two points. However, several turnovers in the final five minutes derailed Auburn's comeback hopes, and Arkansas free throws in the final minute sealed the result.


Despite playing with foul trouble most of the night, junior Tra'Cee Tanner led Auburn with 12 points, and sophomore Katie Frerking added 10. Sophomore Khady Dieng, playing as the backup point guard for the first time this season, was effective in her role with seven points and a career-high eight rebounds.

For the third straight game, Auburn out-shot its opponent from the floor. The Tigers posted a 39.1-percent field goal clip while Arkansas shot 35.4 percent. The Tigers also out-rebounded the Razorbacks (33-28) and outscored Arkansas in the paint 30-18.

Despite neither team shooting well throughout most of the first half, Arkansas closed the half on an 11-0 run to take a 31-15 lead at the break. But the Razorbacks made just one of their first 15 field goal attempts in the second half, allowing the Tigers to cut into the margin. Auburn forced three straight Arkansas turnovers, turning those into transition baskets and cutting the lead to 41-39 with 3:59 to play. But the Tigers would turn the ball over in some fashion on seven of their next nine offensive possessions.

Auburn, playing without seniors Hasina Muhammad (suspension) and Kiani Parker (injury), started a lineup with three freshmen for the first time in nine years as Neydja Petithomme, Jazmine Jones and Jessica Jones got the start.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas - Junior Tra'Cee Tanner had her fourth double-double of the season as the Auburn women's basketball team dropped a 78-45 decision to No. 12 Texas A&M Sunday at Reed Arena.

Tanner finished with 10 points and 10 rebounds, leading Auburn in both categories. She also shared the team lead in assists with three. Sophomore Brandy Montgomery shared the scoring lead with 10 points of her own.

Freshman Asia Robeson scored eight points, all in the second half, including a pair of 3-pointers for Auburn's tallest player (6-4) to match a career-high. She had two of Auburn's four treys on the day as fellow freshman Neydja Petithomme added two triples of her own to finish with six points. Katie Frerking added seven points.

Auburn shot 34 percent from the field for the game while Texas A&M hardly missed, finishing with a 55.4-percent shooting day. A&M's Courtney Williams led all scorers with 23 points and Courtney Walker added 13. Both teams excelled at the free-throw line with Auburn making 9-of-11 attempts and A&M hitting 13-of-15 from the line.

AUBURN - Sophomore Brandy Montgomery scored a game-high 23 points, but Auburn's comeback attempt fell short as LSU earned a 60-49 win Thursday night at Auburn Arena.

For the fourth time in five games, Auburn out-shot its opponent from the floor (39.0 percent to 37.9 percent), but 24 turnovers were too much for Auburn to overcome.

Montgomery's 23 points came mostly courtesy of six 3-pointers, which matched a career-high that she set earlier this seasno at Virginia. She was 8-of-14 from the floor, playing a season-high 35 minutes, and was Auburn's only player in double figures. Katie Frerking had eight points and a game-high nine rebounds.

After LSU took a 25-18 lead into halftime, the Lady Tigers extended that to as many as 15 points at 38-23 with 14:27 to play. But Montgomery had a 9-0 run by herself, knocking down three consecutive 3-point tries over the next 2:30 to cut the LSU lead to six points at 38-32.

LSU would again move ahead by 11 points at 44-33 with 9:57 to play. But once again, Auburn would answer with an 8-0 run, sparked by another Montgomery 3-pointer, a Montgomery layup after a Khady Dieng steal, and a Dieng trey to cut the LSU lead to three at 44-41. From there, though, Auburn would be unable to get any closer. It was 50-46 with just over four minutes to play, but LSU ended the game on a 10-3 run.

LSU scored 28 points off Auburn's 24 turnovers and also took advantage of 16 offensive rebounds, turning those into 13 second-chance points. Danielle Ballard led LSU with 13 points and also recorded seven rebounds and six steals. LSU was a perfect 14-of-14 at the free-throw line.
