Auburn has made 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, five WNIT appearances and three Final Fours in the program's history... Head Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is 47-39 in her third season at Auburn... She has a 190-143 record as a head coach... Auburn advanced to the 2013 WNIT Quarterfinals and the 2014 WNIT Third Round... The Tigers are coming off back-to-back 19-15 seasons.

AGAINST THE SEC

- Auburn has an all-time record of 204-193 (.516) against the other 13 members of the Southeastern Conference (in league games).
- The Tigers have won five SEC regular-season titles (most recently 2009) and four SEC Tournament championships.

LAST MEETING: AUBURN 70, ALABAMA 65 (20T)

Hasina Muhammad, almost falling out of bounds, hit the jumper that gave Auburn's women's the lead for good with 33 seconds left as they fought back from a 17-point deficit and beat Alabama 70-65 in double overtime Thursday night at Auburn Arena. Freshman Brandy Montgomery brashly hit a 3-pointer and hit four crucial free throws in the final seconds.

But when the Tigers trailed 39-22 after an Ashley Williams layup with 15:59 left, it was senior Tyrese Tanner who was not going to have it. Not against this team. Not in her last regular-season home game in an Auburn uniform.

Auburn coach Terri Williams-Flournoy said she knew when Tanner took control that her team had a chance to come back.

"She was incredible," Williams-Flournoy said. "She becomes focused. She is trying to get everyone around her together as well as herself together. She is just a phenomenal player."

Tanner made jump shots. She went hard to the basket. She blocked Alabama shots. She got assists. And the Tigers came marching back. They tied it at 51-51 at the end of regulation, wiped out a 4-point Alabama lead to force a second overtime and finally won it with Tanner on the bench with five fouls.

Tanner finished with 26 points, 19 in the second half. She had 11 rebounds, nine in the second half, and blocked four shots.

LAST MEETING IN TUSCALOOSA: AUBURN 61, ALABAMA 39

Running, leaping and swarming everything in white, Auburn's women's basketball team put Alabama down and out before it was even halftime on Thursday night at Foster Auditorium.

In the first half alone, the Tigers held Alabama to 5-of-30 shooting, blocked six shots, forced 13 turnovers, shot 51.5 percent from the field, scored the final 17 points of the half and raced away to a 41-14 lead. Alabama was done.

The second half was for appearances only as the Tigers romped

to a 61-39 victory before an announced crowd of 2,453.

Auburn coach Terri Williams-Flournoy told her players that dealing with junior point guard Daisha Simmons, averaging 14.9 points, 5.2 assists and 5.9 rebounds a game, would be a key. They dealt with her, all right. Simmons was 0-for-11 from the field, scored two points, had three assists and seven turnovers.

"I was just really proud of the young ladies for coming out in the first half and just setting the tone right away," Williams-Flournoy said. "I thought they did a really good job of changing defenses. We wanted to keep Simmons off balance a little bit, because she's a very good point guard and that's all we could do."

The Tigers outscored Alabama 30-14 inside, won the rebounding battle 52-38 and blocked 10 shots, five by Hasina Muhammad.

Sophomore forward Tra'Cee Tanner was a force inside with 14 points, 10 rebounds, three assists and four steals. Senior Tyrese Tanner, Tra'Cee's older sister, had 15 points, nine rebounds, an assist and three blocks. Freshman guard Brandy Montgomery had 10 points.

Auburn's pressing defense forced 21 turnovers and held Alabama to just 21.7 percent shooting on 13-of-60.

SCOUTING THE TIGERS

- Auburn is 9-9 overall, 0-5 in SEC play, coming off a 54-42 loss to No. 6 Tennessee at home last Thursday. The Tigers have wrapped up a stretch where they played four ranked teams in a five-game stretch, but continue a streak of playing five top-25 teams in their first seven SEC games.
- Junior Tra'Cee Tanner has been the Tigers' top offensive threat thus far, averaging 12.8 points and shooting an SEC-best 57.6% in the first 18 games.
- Tanner has three double-doubles this season: 16 points, 10 rebounds vs. Troy (11/14), 12 points, 10 rebounds at St. John's (12/20) and 12 points, 10 rebounds vs. Florida (1/4).
- She followed up her first double-double with a career-high 31 points on 14-of-18 shooting vs. Grambling State. She then scored 19 points in a win over FGCU, 23 in a loss at Kentucky, and has led Auburn in scoring in 10 of 18 games.
- Senior Hasina Muhammad has stepped up her game in SEC play, averaging 15.4 points/game in league contests to rank third in the conference. She scored a season-high 26 against No. 1 South Carolina.
- Muhammad had her second career double-double against Georgia on Jan. 11, scoring 18 points (16 in 2nd half) and adding 10 rebounds.
- Pressure defense remains a staple of Coach Flo's system.
 After averaging 20.0 forced turnovers per game during her first two seasons, the Tigers have forced an average of 20.2 turnovers in the first 18 games of this season while racking up 11.8 steals/game.

• Alabama is 9-11 overall, 0-5 in SEC play, and coming off

a loss to No. 14 Mississippi State, 66-50. The Crimson Tide enter Thursday's game on a five-game losing skid, all in conference play.

- Alabama went 14-16 in 2013-14 in its first season under head coach Kristy Curry. The Tide was 7-9 in SEC play.
- The Tide averages 63.3 points per game on the season while allowing 61.7/game. Alabama shoots 38.2% from the field and pulls down 42.0 rebounds per game, out-rebounding the opposition by 5.9/game.
- Ashley Williams leads Alabama in scoring (13.8 ppg), rebounding (6.3 rpg), field goal percentage (54.9%) and minutes played (28.4/qame).

LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN

Auburn's defense held No. 6 Tennessee to its lowest scoring output of the season, but the Tigers could not generate much offense of their own in a 54-42 loss to the Lady Vols on Thursday night at Auburn Arena.

Auburn shot 32.2 percent from the field in the game (19-of-59) while Tennessee (15-2, 5-0 SEC) connected on 22-of-52 attempts for 42.3 percent. The Lady Vols also hit five 3-pointers in the game while a pair of treys from sophomore Katie Frerking were Auburn's only points from beyond the arc.

After a buzzer-beating jumper gave Tennessee a 26-18 lead at the half, the Lady Vols scored four straight to open the second period and take a 12-point lead. As they have done in most games in conference play, though, Auburn made a push midway through the second half, cutting it to a seven-point game at 42-35 on a Frerking 3-pointer with just under 10 minutes to play. From that point, though, Auburn would make just three more shots the rest of the way.

Junior Tra'Cee Tanner led all scorers with 14 points on 7-of-11 shooting and also pulled down six rebounds. Senior Hasina Muhammad, and sophomores Brandy Montgomery and Frerking had eight points each; Muhammad added a team-best nine rebounds.

Tennessee was out-rebounded for just the fourth time this season as Auburn pulled down 39 boards to the Lady Vols' 33. Of those, 18 of Auburn's rebounds were on the offensive glass; however, the Tigers converted those into just 11 points.

LAST TIME OUT FOR ALABAMA

Alabama dropped a 66-50 decision at No. 15/18 Mississippi State on Sunday at Humphrey Coliseum. With the loss, the Crimson Tide drops to 11-9 overall and 0-5 in Southeastern Conference play, while the win lifts the Bulldogs to 19-2 on the season and 4-2 against league opponents.

Freshman Meoshonti Knight scored double figures for the third straight game to lead Alabama in scoring with 13 points, while sophomore Ashley Williams was just shy of a double-double with nine points and nine rebounds. Mississippi State was led by senior Kendra Grant who had 17 points.

For the game, Alabama was 30.2 percent (13-43) from the

- 65th in assists per game (15.1)

HOME SWEET HOME

- Auburn has won 11 out of their last 14 games at Auburn Arena, including the final two regular season games and two WNIT games in the 2013-14 season and the first six games of 2014-15.
- Dating back to a win over Alabama on Feb. 17, 2013, Auburn has won 23 of its last 31 home games, including a 17-1 mark against non-conference opponents.
- With 11 straight wins, Auburn matched the longest home win streak since Auburn Arena opened in 2010. Auburn previously won 11 straight over the last two games of 2011-12 and the first nine games of 2012-13.
 - Auburn is 49-25 (.662) in its fifth season at Auburn Arena.

IN AND OUT

- With Auburn's high-intensity defensive pressure, the Tigers must rotate multiple players to keep fresh legs on the floor at all time. As a result, 10 different players are averaging at least 10 minutes played per game, and no player is averaging 30 minutes or more.
- Brandy Montgomery has played the most minutes, averaging 28.1, followed by Tra'Cee Tanner (26.1), Katie Frerking (23.7), Hasina Muhammad (22.4), Kiani Parker (21.1), and Khady Dieng (20.8).

I SEE YOU, C-MO

- Senior Hasina Muhammad put together her best performance of the season and one of the best of her career, scoring 26 points (two shy of a career-best) at No. 1 South Carolina on Jan. 2. She was 8-of-18 from the field and a perfect 10-of-10 at the free-throw line. Muhammad also had three steals and three blocks in the game.
- Muhammad had her first double-double of the season and second of her career on Jan. 11 vs. Georgia with 18 points and 10 rebounds.
- With 15.6 points/game in SEC play, Muhammad is third in the conference in scoring in league games.
- Muhammad currently leads the SEC in blocks (2.1/game) and is in the top 10 in steals (2.1/game).

TAKING OUR TALENTS TO SOUTH BEACH

- Sophomores Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking were named to the FIU Fun & Sun Classic all-tournament team in late December.
- Montgomery scored 20 points in 20 minutes and had a career-high 5 steals in a win over FIU, and Katie Frerking scored 12 points on 6-6 shooting against FIU and had a career-high 10 rebounds against Hampton.

KHADY IN THE BIG APPLE

- Sophomore Khady Dieng had two of her best performances of the season in the St. John's Chartwells Holiday Classic, scoring 27 points over two games against St. John's and SMU on Dec. 20-21.
- Her 14 points against SMU were a season-high, and she was named to the all-tournament team.

BIG NIGHTS FOR TRA'CEE

- Junior Tro'Cee Tanner had a career-high 31 points in a 92-42 win over Grambling State on Nov. 17. It was the first time an Auburn player scored 30 or more points since Blanche Alverson had 32 against Mississippi State on March 3, 2013.
- Tanner's performance was the 35th time in Auburn history that a player scored 30 or more points in a single game.
- Tanner had another big night in the season's third SEC game, scoring 23 points at No. 10 Kentucky on Jan. 8.

BRANDY FROM DOWNTOWN

- Sophomore Brandy Montgomery scored a career-high 24
 points against Virginia on Nov. 23, including six 3-pointers. It
 marked the most 3-pointers in a game by an Auburn player since
 Ruth Ketcham had six vs. Colgate on Dec. 5, 2007.
- Montgomery needs just 15 more made 3-pointers to move into the all-time Auburn top 10.

CLUB PRESS

- Auburn's high-pressure, full-court defense under coach Terri
 Williams-Flournoy, refered to by the players as "Club Press," has
 ranked as one of the best ever at Auburn over the last two seasons.
 In 2012-13, Auburn's 402 steals set a new school record for a
 single season while the 701 turnovers forced went down as second
 all-time on The Plains.
- In 2013-14, the Tigers forced 659 opponent turnovers while recording 354 steals, remaining a major force on defense in the Southeastern Conference.
- Auburn has forced 25 or more turnovers in a game 116 times since 1987 and has done so six times this season. Auburn forced 29 turnovers in the season-opener vs. Troy, 25 in the win over Grambling and 27 in wins over Marquette, Samford and FIU.
- The Tigers have also tallied 15 or more steals in a game on 105 occasions since 1987, doing so five times last season and five times already in 2014-15.

• The Tigers used the defense to fuel their offense, averaging 19.3 points per game off turnovers last year. So far this year, Auburn scored 29 points off turnovers in the season-opener vs. Troy, 34 against Grambling, 28 vs. Marquette and 27 vs. Samford.

BACK-TO-BACK 19-WIN SEASONS

 Auburn has posted back-to-back seasons with a 19-15 record, which tie for the most wins in a season since the Tigers' SEC Championship season of 2009. The Tigers advanced to the WNIT quarterfinals in 2013 and the WNIT third round in 2014.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

- The Tigers will play a challenging schedule this season, playing as many as seven non-conference games against teams that advanced to the postseason a year ago. Florida Gulf Coast, Winthrop, St. John's and Hampton all played in the NCAA Tournament last year, while SMU, Marquette and Bowling Green advanced to the WNIT.
- Auburn's first five SEC opponents South Carolina, Florida, Kentucky, Georgia, and Tennessee - all advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season. Texas A&M, LSU and Vanderbilt all made the Big Dance, while Mississippi State and Missouri joined Auburn in the WNIT.

SISTER ACT

- For just the fourth time ever, Auburn's roster features a sister combination as twin freshmen Jazmine and Jessica Jones will be in uniform for the Tigers. It gives Auburn a pair of sisters on the roster for the third-straight year as Tyrese and Tra'Cee Tanner played together the last two seasons.
- Other sister combinations to play together at Auburn include Tyrese (2010-14) and Tra'Cee Tanner (2012-present); Sherell (2004-09) and Reneisha (2006-10) Hobbs, and Ruthie (1985-89) and Mae Ola (1984-88) Bolton.

NEW FACES

- Auburn welcomes five newcomers to the roster for 2014-15, all freshmen. Joining the Tigers this year are G Bria Johnson (Baton Rouge, La.), F Jazmine Jones (Winston-Salem, N.C.), F Jessica Jones (Winston-Salem, N.C.), PG Neydja Petithomme (Boca Raton, Fla.) and F Asia Robeson (Kalamazoo, Mich.).
- The Jones twins, Petithomme and Robeson made their collegiate debuts vs. Troy on Nov. 14, and Johnson saw her first action in an Auburn uniform vs. Grambling State on Nov. 17.

ON THE TUBE

• A total of 22 Auburn games will be televised on either digital or linear networks during the course of the 2014-15 season. Eleven games will appear on SEC Network +, which is available online and on mobile devices via the WatchESPN platform. The Tigers' game at St. John's on Dec. 20 will also be available online via

ESPN3.

 Ten games will appear on linear networks, with the SEC Network and Fox Sports Net broadcasting five games each.

TIGERS PICKED 10TH IN PRESEASON POLLS

 Auburn was picked to finish 10th in both the SEC Preseason Media and Coaches polls. South Carolina was tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the SEC title in both polls.

WELCOME TO THE FAMILY

Auburn will welcome two top prospects to its women's basketball team in 2015 as head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy received a pair of National Letters of Intent in November.

Auburn will welcome forward Jonika Garvin (6-0, Lake Worth, Fla./Lake Worth Community HS) and point guard Janiah McKay (5-6, Gainesville, Fla./Gainesville HS) to The Plains in the fall of 2015.

"I think we really signed what we needed for our 2015 class,"
Williams-Flournoy said. "We're losing two seniors in Hasina Muhammad and Kiani Parker. Jonika is very athletic and can help us at
the top of our press, and Janiah helps fill that point guard position
in losing Kiani. Both of them could be very good defensive players.
We definitely filled some needs."

AUBURN, Ala. - Junior Tra'Cee Tanner had her fourth career double-double, and the Auburn women's basketball team used a huge run around halftime to earn a season-opening 71-54 win over Troy on Friday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (1-0) kept up their trademark defensive pressure throughout the game, forcing 29 turnovers while amassing 22 steals on the night, falling just two swipes shy of a school record.

Tanner led the way both shooting and on the boards, scoring 16 points and pulling down 10 rebounds to earn her first double-double since posting 14 points and 10 boards at Tennessee last season.

Auburn controlled the boards on the night, out-rebounding Troy 51-41. The Tigers also had 21 assists to Troy's 10 and shot 43.5 percent while holding the Trojans to a 26.6-percent night.

Four Auburn players hit double-figures on the night. Along with Tanner's 16, sophomore Khady Dieng contributed 13 points while sophomore Katie Frerking and senior Hasina Muhammad had 10 apiece.

Frerking narrowly missed a double-double of her own, pulling down a career-high nine rebounds. She also had a career-best five steals along with two assists and a block.

Auburn led for more than 37 minutes on the night, but the big run came just before and just after halftime. The Tigers outscored the Trojans 16-0 over the final 2:24 of the first half and the first 1:32 of the second stanza, opening up an 18-point lead. Troy would get no closer than 14 points the rest of the way.

AUBURN, Ala. — Tra'Cee Tanner's career-high 31 points led three Tigers in double-figures as Auburn defeated Grambling State 92-42 Monday night in women's basketball action at Auburn Arena.

Auburn (2-0) has now won six straight games at Auburn Arena, dating back to the last four games of the 2013-14 season.

Tanner scored 12 of the first 14 points for Auburn as a small Grambling lineup had no answer for the 6-3 junior. She would finish with 31, a career-high and the most for an Auburn player since Blanche Alverson scored 32 against Mississippi State on March 3, 2013.

Montgomery had a career-high seven assists along with 18 points, six rebounds and three steals. Freshman Jessica Jones hit double-digits in her second collegiate game with 11 points and six rebounds, and sophomore Khady Dieng filled the stat sheet with nine points, six rebounds, five assists and four steals. Eleven of 12 players on Auburn's roster scored in the game.

Auburn never trailed in the game and controlled the action from the opening tip. Auburn shot 59.4 percent for the game, holding Grambling to 28.3 percent from the field. The homestanding Tigers also outrebounded the visitors 47-24, holding Grambling to just seven offensive rebounds.

A whopping 74 of Auburn's 92 points came in the paint as Auburn took full advantage of their edge in size. Auburn also forced Grambling into 25 turnovers while committing just 15 of their own. Auburn led 46-20 at halftime.

AUBURN, Ala. — Two drawn charges in the final minute and clutch shots from several players helped secure a 72-69 win for the Auburn women's basketball team over Florida Gulf Coast on Thursday night at Auburn Arena.

Last FG - FGCU 2nd-00:12, AU 2nd-00:22.

The Tigers (3-0) won their seventh-straight game at Auburn Arena, dating back to the 2013-14 season, and head into their first road trip this weekend on a high note after a hard-fought win. Auburn is 3-0 for the first time since their 2008-09 SEC Championship season when the Tigers won their first 20 contests.

Tied at 66-66 with just over a minute to play, Hasina Muhammad knocked down a jumper at the one-minute mark to give the Tigers a 68-66 lead. At the other end, Katie Frerking stood tall and drew a charge, setting up a Kiani Parker 15-footer to extend Auburn's lead to four.

But the Eagles answered with a 3-pointer from the corner to cut the lead to one with 12 seconds left, then fouled immediately. Frerking hit one of two free throws to put Auburn ahead by two, then Tra'Cee Tanner drew another charge with 3.1 seconds to play. After another FGCU foul, Khady Dieng hit one of two free throws to make it a three-point game, and the Eagles' desperation heave fell short.

Tanner had another big night offensively, leading the Tigers with 19 points on 7-of-11 shooting. She also tied for the team lead with six rebounds and was a perfect 5-of-5 at the free-throw line. Three other players scored in double figures, led by 11 points from Dieng and 10 apiece from Muhammad and Brandy Montgomery. Muhammad also blocked three shots on the night.

Auburn shot 52.7 percent from the field and saw vast improvement at the free-throw line, hitting 9-of-11 shots on the night. FGCU, which hit seven 3-pointers in the first half, was held to just 3-of-8 in the final 20 minutes from beyond the arc as Auburn got several key stops late in the game.

Auburn (3-1) trailed by just five at halftime, but Virginia (4-0) went on a 10-0 run early in the second half and never looked back. The Cavaliers led by as many as 21 before the Tigers made a few baskets late to cut the final deficit to 15.

The Tigers shot 32.3 percent for the game, including 29 percent in the second half. Meanwhile, the Cavaliers were 50 percent from the field in the game but hit 13 of 20 attempts (65%) in the second half.

Montgomery hit a career-high six 3-pointers and finished with 24 points, eclipsing her previous career-high of 22 from last season's game at LSU. She hit 9-of-20 attempts from the field, including 6-of-11 from 3-point range.

Katie Frerking led the Tigers on the boards, pulling down six rebounds while scoring three points. Tra'Cee Tanner, Auburn's leading scorer in the first three games, had six points and four rebounds.

Auburn trailed 33-28 at halftime. Virginia attempted 11 free throws in the first half, converting on nine, while Auburn did not get to the line until late in the period, making just one of three attempts. The Tigers were 3-for-12 at the line for the game.

Virginia was led by Sarah Imovbioh with 21 points and 13 rebounds; she had a double-double by halftime. Faith Randolph added 18 points for the Cavaliers.

ROCK HILL, S.C. - A pair of late Auburn turnovers that led to four Winthrop free throws in the final 18 seconds gave the Eagles a 56-54 win over the Tigers on Saturday afternoon at Winthrop Coliseum.

Auburn (3-2) led 54-49 with 2:45 to play after Katie Frerking knocked down Auburn's seventh 3-pointer of the game. But Winthrop (3-2) answered with a triple of their own with just under two minutes left, and the Eagles' Aliyah Kilpatrick hit four three throws in the final 18 seconds to send the Tigers to their second straight road defeat.

Kilpatrick scored a game-high 16 points with 10 of those coming at the free-throw line. Winthrop got to the line 25 times in the game, hitting 16 of their attempts, while Auburn was just 3-of-4 at the charity stripe.

Tra'Cee Tanner and Brandy Montgomery led Auburn with 11 points apiece, and Khady Dieng contributed 10. All of Tanner's scoring came in the second half after she picked up two fouls in the first 90 seconds, relegating her to the bench for the rest of the first half.

Auburn forced 20 Winthrop turnovers but was only able to convert those into $15\ points$.

Both teams got off to a sloppy start as the two sides combined for more turnovers in the first half (20) than made field goals (19). Auburn shot 25.7 percent in the opening half, missing their first nine attempts from the floor. The Tigers did force Winthrop into 14 turnovers; however, Auburn only capitalized for four points off those takeaways.

AUBURN, Ala. - A big second half, sparked by a 20-2 run to start the period, propelled the Auburn women's basketball team to a 79-53 win over Marquette on Tuesday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (4-2) quickly turned a 32-30 halftime lead into a 20-point cushion and never looked back after outscoring the Golden Eagles 20-2 in the first seven minutes of the second half. Auburn continued its sharp shooting for the remainder of the game as they made 19-of-34 field goal attempts (55.9%) and 7-of-8 free throws in the final 20 minutes.

Marquette (2-5) was only able to make 16-of-59 field goals (27.1%) as Auburn's full-court pressure forced them into 27 turnovers, 13 of which came in the second half and led to 20 Auburn points. The Tigers also outscored the Golden Eagles 24-2 on the fast break, 46-18 in the paint and 33-16 off the bench.

Similar to their fast start in the second half, Auburn jumped out to a 15-8 lead at the under-12 media timeout in the first half. However, Marquette was able to settle down, get the Tigers into foul trouble and cut the lead to two at halftime. But a rejuvenated Auburn team outscored Marquette 47-23 in the second half, where the Tigers led by as many as 31.

On a consistent scoring night for the Tigers, Tra'Cee Tanner led the way with a game-high 16 points and was joined in double figures by Brandy Montgomery with 13 points and Hasina Muhammad with 10. It was Montgomery's fifth consecutive game in which she scored double-digit points. Montgomery also picked up four steals, matching a career-high.

After missing 10 of 11 shots to open the game and falling behind by eight points, the Tigers (5-2) hit 29 of their final 46 attempts and saw a five-point halftime lead swell to as much as 29 late in the second half. It was the ninth straight home victory for Auburn, dating back to last season.

Junior Tra'Cee Tanner overcame a 1-for-7 start to finish with a game-high 15 points on 7-of-14 shooting. She was also Auburn's leading rebounder with six boards on the night. Sophomore Brandy Montgomery added 14 points on a 6-of-8 night from the floor that included a pair of 3-pointers.

Freshmen Jessica Jones and Neydja Petithomme put together one of the best games of their young careers, each scoring a career-high 11 points off the bench. Jones did not miss from the field (5-for-5) and Petithomme had a season-high six assists. The Auburn bench outscored the Lady Lions' reserves 30-9.

The Tigers shared the ball exceptionally well, recording 26 assists. Petithomme's six led the way while Kiani Parker and Katie Frerking had five apiece.

Auburn led by five at the half after struggling for much of the opening period. But much like in their win over Marquette, the Tigers found a spark out of the break and went on a 24-5 run over the first nine minutes of the second half, shooting as high as 80 percent during that stretch.

AUBURN, Ala. - Auburn's women's basketball team got 38 points from its bench and held off a late Savannah State rally to pick up a 62-56 victory Wednesday night at Auburn Arena, the Tigers' 11th-straight home win.

The Tigers (7-2), who led by as much as 17 with less than seven minutes to play, saw that lead evaporate as Savannah State (4-4) began converting Auburn turnovers into points. A 14-1 SSU run cut the lead to as few as two points with 2:12 to play, but Auburn made five of six free throws down the stretch to preserve the victory and the home winning streak.

With their 11th straight home victory - final four games of last season, plus seven straight to open this year - the Tigers have matched the Auburn Arena record for consecutive home wins. Auburn won 11 straight over the final two games of 2011-12 and the first nine home contests in 2012-13.

Auburn turned the ball over 22 times on the night, second-most this season, while forcing Savannah State into 21 turnovers. It was just the second time this year that Auburn had more turnovers than its opponent.

Hasina Muhammad led Auburn in scoring for the first time this season, netting a season-best 14 points on 6-of-9 shooting. The senior also tied for the team lead with six rebounds while picking up four assists, two blocks and a steal. Muhammad has had at least one block in eight of nine games this season.

Katie Frerking started out 3-of-3 from the field, including a pair of 3-pointers, and finished with 10 points, six rebounds and four steals.

Auburn led 31-19 at halftime, shooting 52 percent from the field in the opening half while holding Savannah State below 30 percent. For the game, the Tigers' bench outscored Savannah State's reserves 38-7, but SSU controlled points in the paint (34-26) and scored more off turnovers, in second-chance situations and on fast breaks than did Auburn.

NEW YORK - Junior Tra'Cee Tanner had her second double-double of the season, but the Auburn women's basketball team's rally from a big early deficit came up short in a 56-49 loss at 25th-ranked St. John's on Saturday.

The Tigers (7-3) trailed by as much as 17 late in the first half but put together a second-half rally that saw them get within three points on two occasions. However, Auburn could not quite get over the hump despite putting major pressure on the Red Storm (10-0) throughout the second half.

Tanner led Auburn with 12 points and 10 rebounds, including seven boards on the offensive end. It was her second double-double of the year to go along with 16 points and 10 rebounds in the season-opener against Troy. Sophomore Khady Dieng matched Tanner's scoring output with 12 points of her own on 5-of-8 shooting.

Kiani Parker had a strong day at the point guard position, scoring eight points along with five assists. She was key in the second-half defensive effort, recording three steals and putting constant pressure on the ball in the backcourt.

Twice in the second half, Auburn cut the deficit to as little as three points. Auburn came out of the gate strong and cut the lead to 40-37 with 13:04 to play. After St. John's moved back ahead by 10 points late in the half, the Tigers ramped up the pressure and forced several turnovers to cut the lead to three points again at 52-49 with just over a minute to play. However, St. John's Aliyyah Handford hit a clutch baseline jumper with 50 seconds to play to make it a five-point game, and then two late free throws sealed the deal for the Red Storm.

The Tigers hit their first three shots and opened the game with a 6-0 lead, but the Red Storm would go on a 23-4 run from that point to take a 23-10 lead. After making their first three attempts, the Tigers would only connect on two of their next 16 shots. Despite trailing by as many as 17, Auburn would cut the deficit to 10 at the half at 32-22.

Auburn forced 13 St. John's turnovers on the day - the fewest of the season by a Tiger opponent - but 10 of those came in the second half. The Tigers out-rebounded the Red Storm 35-27, including a 16-9 advantage on the offensive glass.

NEW YORK - Auburn built a 23-point lead early in the second half but had to hold off a late SMU rally for a 56-43 win Sunday afternoon in the consolation game of the St. John's Chartwells Holiday Classic.

Sophomore Khady Dieng led the Tigers (8-3) with a season-high 14 points and was named to the all-tournament team for her effort throughout the weekend. Senior Kiani Parker contributed a career-high 11 points and five rebounds in the winning effort.

Auburn led by 20 with 10:22 to play after a three-point play by Hasina Muhammad gave the Tigers a 47-27 lead. From that point, however, SMU (4-7) tightened down on defense and forced the Tigers into six turnovers the rest of the way and held Auburn to just one field goal for the remainder of the game.

SMU got as close as eight points at 51-43 with just over two minutes to play as foul trouble plagued both teams late in the game - both teams' leading scorers would foul out in the final five minutes. But with Auburn in the double bonus and SMU in a fouling situation, Parker converted 5-of-9 free throws in the final minute to increase the margin back to double-digits and seal the Tigers' eighth victory.

The Tigers sprinted to a huge early lead, holding SMU to just three field goals in the first 14 minutes of the game as Auburn built a 27-7 lead at the 7:43 mark. A 9-0 run pulled the Mustangs within 11 at 27-16, but Auburn finished the half on an 8-2 run to take a 35-18 lead into the break. The 18 SMU points were the fewest allowed by Auburn this season.

Auburn outscored SMU in the paint 28-14, but foul trouble on the Tigers' bigs kept Auburn from pushing the ball inside in the second half. The Tigers forced SMU into 23 turnovers, scoring 24 points on the Mustangs' giveaways.

Despite going cold over the final 10 minutes, Auburn shot 40 percent for the game, holding SMU to 26.3 percent from the field.

MIAMI - Sophomore Brandy Montgomery's 20 points led five Auburn players in double-figures as the Tigers ran away from Florida International 81-44 on Monday in the opening game of the FIU Fun & Sun Classic.

Auburn (9-3) shot 55 percent from the floor for the game and held FIU (2-8) to 23.8 percent, the lowest of the season by an Auburn opponent. The win snapped a six-game skid in true road games, dating back to the end of last season.

The Tigers created their offense with their press, putting together a 34-2 run midway through the first half. Sixteen of those points came on the fast break as Auburn's defense forced FIU into 18 first-half turnovers. The Panthers had 27 turnovers for the game with Auburn collecting 20 steals

Montgomery scored 20 points in 20 minutes - her second 20 + point effort of the season - on 10-of-16 shooting. She also recorded a career-high five steals - all in the first half - with three of those leading directly to transition layups.

Four other Tigers hit double-digits on the night. Katie Frerking had a season-high 12 points on a perfect 6-of-6 night from the field and shared the Auburn lead with six rebounds. Hasina Muhammad contributed 12 of her own along with four steals and four blocks. Sophomore Khady Dieng and freshman Neydja Petithomme posted 10 points each; Petithomme also had a career-high eight assists and Dieng had four assists and three steals.

It marked the first time for Auburn to have five players in double figures since a win over Old Dominion in last season's WNIT.

MIAMI - Auburn fought back from a nine-point halftime deficit but came up just short in a 44-42 loss to Hampton in the championship game of the FIU Fun & Sun Classic Tuesday afternoon at FIU Arena.

The Tigers (9-4) struggled to score in the first half but were able to create turnovers in the second half, keeping things close to the final horn. Auburn found itself down by 10 points in the latter stages of the game but fought back to a two-point margin. However, Auburn's inconsistency at the free-throw line - 9-for-17 in the game - proved to be a major difference in the two-point loss.

Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking were named to the all-tournament team. Montgomery scored eight points and pulled down six rebounds to go along with her 20-point, five-steal performance against FIU Monday. Frerking had a career-high 10 rebounds in Tuesday's game along with seven points; she scored 12 in the FIU win Monday.

Despite foul trouble that kept her on the bench most of the first half, Tra'Cee Tanner led Auburn with 13 points on 5-of-8 shooting. Junior Cabriana Capers came off the bench and put together one of her best games in an Auburn uniform, tying a career-high with eight points and pulling down seven rebounds in 14 minutes of action.

The Tigers turned up the defensive pressure in the second half, forcing Hampton (5-8) into four 10-second violations, and a 10-0 run to start the half gave Auburn a 22-21 lead. The Lady Pirates would move back ahead by as many as 10 points at 39-29 with just over eight minutes to play, but the Tigers kept chipping away. A Capers layup with just over three minutes to play made it a three-point game, and a Frerking free throw cut it to two. However, the Tigers could not take advantage of their last four possessions with a chance to tie or take the lead, missing their final six shots of the game.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Auburn's women's basketball team put a second-half scare into No. 1 South Carolina, but the Gamecocks pulled away late for a 77-58 win in front of 16,465 fans at Colonial Life Arena.

Senior Hasina Muhammad led the Tigers (9-5, 0-1 SEC) with a season-high 26 points, shooting 8-of-18 from the field and draining all 10 of her free-throw attempts. Muhammad also had three blocks and three steals on the night. Neydja Petithomme added 10 points, and Brandy Montgomery pulled down a team-best seven rebounds.

After trailing by 17 at halftime, Auburn came out of the break on fire. The Tigers shot better than 60 percent over the first eight minutes of the second half and went on a 16-4 run to cut the South Carolina lead to single digits at 48-40. From there, however, the Gamecocks went on a 19-4 run and found several ways to get to the free throw line, pushing the lead to more than 20 points.

The Tigers were only outscored by two points in the second half, mostly thanks to increased defensive intensity. Auburn forced South Carolina into 18 turnovers with 10 of those coming in the second half.

Carolina scored the first seven points of the game as Auburn struggled to find any open looks early. The much taller Gamecocks had five blocks on Auburn's first nine shot attempts and forced the Tigers into nine first-half turnovers. Auburn found some offense toward the end of the half, but South Carolina led 34-17 at the break.

Auburn shot 33.9 percent from the field for the game but showed dramatic improvement at the free-throw line, knocking down 12-of-14 attempts (85.7%). South Carolina shot 48.4 percent and had five players in double figures. Auburn had 11 steals to Carolina's eight, and both teams finished with six blocked shots.

A'ja Wilson (12 points, 10 rebounds) and Alaina Coates (11 points, 14 rebounds) had double-doubles to lead South Carolina. Aleigha Welch also had 12 points on 6-of-6 shooting.

The South Carolina crowd of 16,465 was the largest crowd to ever witness a regular-season Auburn women's basketball game. The only two larger crowds to see an Auburn game came at the 1990 Women's Final Four in Knoxville.

AUBURN, Ala. - Auburn's women's basketball team could not overcome 20 turnovers and a cold-shooting second half in a 63-50 loss to Florida at Auburn Arena on Sunday afternoon.

The Tigers (9-6, 0-2 SEC) fell at home for the first time this season, snapping an 11-game winning streak at Auburn Arena. The teams combined for 47 turnovers on the day; Auburn forced the Gators into 27 giveaways but only converted those into 17 points.

After heading into halftime tied 29-29, Florida came out hot and Auburn went cold in the second half. The Gators (9-6, 1-1 SEC) hit 13-of-22 shots (59.1%) in the second half while Auburn was just 9-of-32 (28.1%) from the field. Trailing 44-41 with just over 11 minutes to play, Auburn would score just two points over the next six minutes as Florida built a 15-point lead with five minutes to play. The Tigers would get no closer than 11 the rest of the way.

Auburn shot 33.3 percent for the game while Florida was at 45.1 percent. The Tigers hit just one 3-pointer in 11 attempts while Florida was 8-of-20 from beyond the arc.

Junior forward Tra'Cee Tanner posted her third double-double of the season with 12 points and 10 rebounds. Tanner was also 6-for-8 at the free-throw line, matching a season-best. Senior Hasina Muhammad led all scorers with 13 points and pulled down four rebounds along with four blocks, two assists and two steals.

LEXINGTON, Ky. - Junior Tra'Cee Tanner scored 23 points, but Auburn fell short on the road at No. 10 Kentucky, dropping a 78-57 decision at Memorial Coliseum on Thursday night.

The Tigers (9-7, 0-3) committed a season-high 25 turnovers while forcing Kentucky (14-2, 3-0) into just 12 giveaways, a season-low for an Auburn opponent. Consequently, the Wildcats scored 23 points off turnovers while Auburn had just six.

On multiple occasions in the second half, Auburn cut Kentucky's lead to single digits, getting as close as eight points at 56-48 with just over eight minutes to play. Senior Hasina Muhammad scored 12 points along with six rebounds, five blocks and three assists. Muhammad's five blocks tied a career-high.

Auburn out-rebounded Kentucky 45-35. The Tigers shot 37.3 percent from the field and connected on just one 3-pointer on five attempts. Kentucky was 43.1 percent from the floor and shot 7-of-19 from 3-point range.

The Wildcats had four players in double figures, led by Jennifer O'Neill with 17 points, 15 of which came on 3-pointers. Alexis Jennings and Epps had 12 each.

AUBURN - Auburn's defense held No. 6 Tennessee to its lowest scoring output of the season, but the Tigers could not generate much offense of their own in a 54-42 loss to the Lady Vols on Thursday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (9-9, 0-5 SEC) will have a much-needed Sunday off in SEC play before traveling to Alabama next Thursday night. Auburn has faced four top-20 teams - including three in the top 10 - in their first five SFC games.

Auburn shot 32.2 percent from the field in the game (19-of-59) while Tennessee (15-2, 5-0 SEC) connected on 22-of-52 attempts for 42.3 percent. The Lady Vols also hit five 3-pointers in the game while a pair of treys from sophomore Katie Frerking were Auburn's only points from beyond the arc.

After a buzzer-beating jumper gave Tennessee a 26-18 lead at the half, the Lady Vols scored four straight to open the second period and take a 12-point lead. As they have done in most games in conference play, though, Auburn made a push midway through the second half, cutting it to a seven-point game at 42-35 on a Frerking 3-pointer with just under 10 minutes to play. From that point, though, Auburn would make just three more shots the rest of the way.

Junior Tra'Cee Tanner led all scorers with 14 points on 7-of-11 shooting and also pulled down six rebounds. Senior Hasina Muhammad, and sophomores Brandy Montgomery and Frerking had eight points each; Muhammad added a team-best nine rebounds.

Tennessee was out-rebounded for just the fourth time this season as Auburn pulled down 39 boards to the Lady Vols' 33. Of those, 18 of Auburn's rebounds were on the offensive glass; however, the Tigers converted those into just 11 points.
