- Auburn utilized its eighth different starting lineup of the season at Georgia
- This will be the sixth meeting between Auburn and Tennessee Tech with Auburn leading 4-1: 2-0 in Cookeville
- Auburn is coming off a 49-47 loss to Mississippi State in the first round of the SEC Tournament; Tennessee Tech is coming off an 82-76 loss to UT Martin in the OVC Tournament Championship
- Auburn won the last meeting, 73-54, over Tennessee Tech in the first round of the 1990 NCAA Tournament
- · This will be the first meeting between Nell Fortner and TTU's Sytia Messer
- · Auburn is 3-0 all-time when playing on March 17 with all three games coming in the NCAA Tournament
- The Tigers are 81-46 all-time in the month of March, 8-10 under Fortner
- · Auburn is 29-43 all-time against teams from the state of Tennessee
- AU is 25-2 all-time vs. team from the Ohio Valley Conference; one of the two losses is to Tennessee Tech
- When playing in the state of Tennessee, Auburn has a 29-43 record; 4-1 when playing in Cookeville
- Senior Alli Smalley moved into the top 10 in career scoring at Auburn against LSU; she now has 1,571 points
- Smalley recorded her 200th career 3-pointer vs. Ole Miss, becoming the first Auburn player ever to reach the plateau
- Auburn is 85-2 under Fortner when scoring 70 or more points
- The Tigers are averaging 17.8 points per game scored on turnovers and have scored 20 or more points off turnovers on nine occasions this season
- Sophomore Blanche Alverson was named to the Capital One Academic All-District Second Team
- Auburn is playing its first season in the new \$86 million Auburn Arena
- The season-opening win over Mercer was the first regular-season Auburn win, men or women, in the new facility
- Alli Smalley broke the Auburn career 3-point record against Temple, she now has 218 on her career
- Alli Smalley and Tyrese Tanner were named to the Junkanoo Jam All-Tournament Team on Nov. 27
- Auburn was picked sixth in the SEC Preseason Media and Coaches' polls, Tennessee was picked to win the league
- Alli Smalley was picked the the Coaches' Preseason All-SEC First Team and to the media's Second Team
- Nell Fortner is beginning her seventh season at Auburn, marking her longest tenure at any job
- The Tigers welcome five newcomers: Peyton Davis, Camille Glymph, Courtney Strain, Tyrese Tanner, Jassany Williams
- Auburn is a first- and second-round host of the 2011 NCAA Tournament in the new Auburn Arena

Auburn is in its 40th season of women's basketball and sports an all-time record of 794-361... AU has made 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, three WNIT appearances and three Final Fours in the program's history... Head Coach Nell Fortner is in her seventh season at Auburn with a 148-99 career record and a 131-88 record on the Plains... The Tigers are coming off a 15-16 season in 2010.

AUBURN-TENNESSEE TECH SERIES

This will be the sixth meeting between Auburn and Tennessee Tech with the Tigers leading, 4-1. Auburn leads the series 2-0 when playing in Cookeville, Tenn., and won the only postseason meeting, which was in the 1990 NCAA Tournament.

SCOUTING AUBURN

After entering the month of February in a tie for second place in the SEC, the Tigers struggled to finish out the season with a 2-6 mark in the month and a loss in the first round of the SEC Tournament. Auburn managed to finish the season in a tie for fifth in the SEC and a .500, 15-15, overall record to earn a bid to the WNIT.

It marks the fourth time in the last five years for the Tigers to advance to the postseason. The WNIT appearance is Auburn's third appearance in the tournament.

The Tigers have lived off their defense this season, averaging 8.6 steals and 3.9 blocks per game. Auburn opponents average 18.8 turnovers per game with the Tigers scoring an average of 17.8 points per game off of turnovers.

Senior Alli Smalley, an All-SEC First Team selection, leads the team with 12.1 points per game, followed by sophomore Blanche Alverson with 10.5 per game. Smalley and Alverson have also combined to average 3.2 3-pointers made per game.

Alverson also leads the team in rebounding with 4.6 boards per game, followed by freshman Jassany Williams with 3.7 per game. Sophomore Morgan Toles averages 8.6 points and 5.1 assists per game, good enough for first in the SEC.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH

Tennessee Tech stormed through the season, compiling a 23-7 record and a 15-3 mark in the Ohio Valley Conference - good enough for the league's regular-season championship. The Golden Eagles advanced to the finals of the OVC Tournament, falling to Tennessee-Martin, 82-76.

The Tigers and Golden Eagles have three common opponents from the season in Alabama A&M, Jacksonville State and Kentucky. Tennessee Tech went 3-1 in four games against those teams, losing only to Kentucky. TTU's seven losses this season came against Middle Tennessee State, Kentucky, Central Florida, Morehead State and UT Martin - all NCAA Tournament teams, with the exception of Morehead State.

Tacarra Hayes is Tennessee Tech's do-everything player. She leads the team in scoring (16.8 ppg), rebounding (7.7 rpg), assists (4.7 apg) and steals (1.7 spg). Molly Heads averages 9.0 points per game while center Brittany Darling averages 7.6 points and 6.2 rebounds per game.

As a team, the Golden Eagles shoot 40.7 percent from the field and 31.1 percent from 3-point range. Eight different players have hit a 3-pointer this season with Rachel Glidden leading the way with 45 at a 30.2 percent clip.

LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN

An Alli Smalley jumper from the right corner that would have tied the game rimmed out as time expired, handing the Auburn women's basketball team a 49-47 loss to Mississippi State in the first round of the Southeastern Conference Tournament on March 3.

Junior Chantel Hilliard, a native of Biloxi, Miss., notched her first career double-double as she led the Tigers with 18 points and 11 rebounds. Alli Smalley, Auburn's lone senior on the squad, followed with 14 points.

Auburn led by as many as 11 points in the second half, holding a 41-30 lead with 9:48 remaining. The Bulldogs out-scored the Tigers 19-6 the rest of the game, taking the lead for good on a jumper from Diamber Johnson with 1:27 left in the game.

Johnson led Mississippi State in scoring with 16 points, all coming in the second half. Senior Mary Kathryn Govero followed with 15 points while Catina Bett added 10. Ashley Brown pulled down a team-high nine rebounds for MSU.

Auburn was able to get the ball to the basket and draw fouls in the game, making it to the free throw line 16 times. But, the Tigers could only connect on 10 of the 16 attempts for 43.8 percent.

Auburn shot just 34.5 percent from the field, connecting on 20-of-58 attempts. The Tigers were also held without a 3-point field goal, shooting 0-for-8 from beyond the arc. Auburn won the rebounding battle, 40-35, and forced 19 Bulldog turnovers, transitioning them into 17 points on the other end.

LAST TIME OUT FOR TENNESSEE TECH

Down 17 midway through the second half, Tennessee Tech rallied back but ran out of time as UT Martin downed the Golden Eagles, 82-76, in the OVC Tournament championship game. Tacarra Hayes hit a 3-pointer with two seconds remaining to cut the final margin to six.

TTU scored the first four points of the game and led 8-7 at the first media timeout. But, the Skyhawks came out of the timeout on a 14-4~run to take a lead it would not give up.

Hayes scored 33 of Tennessee Tech's points. She also finished with seven rebounds, six assists and four steals. Molly Heady came off the bench for 14 points while Kylie Cook added 11.

The Golden Eagles shot 41.5 percent for the game and 40.5 percent from 3-point range. TTU also won the rebounding battle, 38-35.

FORTNER VS. MESSER

This will be the first meeting between Nell Fortner and Tennessee Tech's Sytia Messer. Messer is no stronger to Auburn or the SEC as she played at Arkansas, helping the Razorbacks to a Final Four appearance in 1998 and the WNIT championship in 1999.

Fortner is in her seventh season at Auburn and eighth overall as a collegiate head coach, holding a 148-99 career record. Messer is in her second season as a collegiate head coach at Tennessee Tech and holds a 37-23 record.

LAST TIME VS. TENNESSEE TECH (March 18, 1990)

Auburn and Tennessee Tech last met almost exactly 11 years ago, facing off in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Auburn, Ala. The Tigers pulled out the 73-54 win as the first step in a run to the NCAA Championship game. Auburn eventually fell to Stanford, 88-81.

ON THIS DATE...

Auburn is 3-0 all-time when playing on March 17. All three games on March 17 have come in the NCAA Tournament. The last game on March 17 was a 78-74 win over Missouri State in the first round of the 2000 NCAA Tournament in State College, Pa.

LAST TIME IN THE WNIT

Auburn last played in the WNIT in 2007, going 2-1 in the tournament with a quarterfinal appearance. The Tigers downed Alabama-Birmingham, 74-60, at home in the first round of the tournament. Auburn then traveled to Kansas State for a 67-54 win before falling at Virginia Tech, 81-73.

2003 WNIT CHAMPIONS

Auburn's first WNIT appearance was a good one as the Tigers won the tournament title. Auburn played the first three rounds at home, downing South Alabama (77-53), Florida State (68-57) and Richmond (59-53). The Tigers then traveled to Creighton for a 73-62 before wrapping up the title with a 64-63 win at Baylor.

ALLI SMALLEY NAMED TO ALL-SEC FIRST TEAM

Auburn senior Alli Smalley was named to the All-SEC First Team, the league announced March 1. Smalley, a native of Arab, Ala., finished the regular season averaging 12.1 points and 3.2 rebounds per game. She posted 11.6 points and 3.6 rebounds in SEC play and she scored more than 20 points in three games this season, including the last two.

She also led the Tigers in steals, averaging 1.7 per game this season, good enough to rank 10th in the SEC.

Smalley was also named honorable meniton All-SEC by the

Associated Press.

POST-SEASON ELIGIBLE

With its 63-58 win at #22 Georgia on Feb. 24, Auburn picked up its 15th victory of the season, making the team post-season eligible. With 15 wins, the Tigers were guaranteed to finish at least .500 on the season.

In the 30 years since the creation of the NCAA Tournament, Auburn has advanced to postseason play 21 times.

SENIOR DAY SPOILERS

Playing on Georgia's Senior Night on Feb. 24, Auburn served as the spoiler by defeating the Bulldogs, 63-58. The victory was Auburn's first over a ranked team this season and the first for the Tigers in Athens, Ga., since Feb. 7, 1993.

COUNTING DOWN TO 800

The Auburn women's basketball teamis counting down to 800 victories in the program's history, currently sitting at 794. With postseason play coming up, Auburn could reach the 800 plateau this season.

1,500 FOR ALLI

With her 19 points at Arkansas on Feb. 13, senior Alli Smalley joined an exclusive club as she became just the ninth Auburn player ever to score 1,500 career points. The 19 points gave her exactly 1,500 points on her career. She is the second player recruited to Auburn by Nell Fortner to reach the plateau, joining DeWanna Bonner.

DEADLY TANDEM

Alli Smalley and Blanche Alverson have hit 307 combined 3-pointers in their career, making them the second-most dangerous long-range duo in Auburn's history.

Samantha Williams and Kristen Mulligan hold the honor as Auburn's most prolific 3-point duo, connecting on 310 from 1992-96.

STINGY TIGERS

Five different Tigers have at least 20 steals so far this season. Senior Alli Smalley leads the way with 48, followed by Morgan Toles with 30. Blanche Alverson has 26 while freshman Jassany Williams and junior Morgan Jennings have 25 and 26, respectively.

A NEW LINEUP

With the departure of Jordan Greenleaf from the team, Auburn utilized its sixth different starting lineup of the season Feb. 10 at LSU. Included in the lineup was freshman Jassany Williams, who earned the first start of her career. Sophomore Blanche Alverson is the only Tiger to have started in ever game this season.

With sophomore Morgan Toles out indefinitely with an injury, Auburn has used its seventh and eighth starting lineups of the season.

BOUNCING BACK

After winning the season-opener, Auburn went on to lose the next four games, including two to ranked teams. Since then, the Tigers have notched a 14-11 record to move above .500 for the first time since the season-opener.

ALVERSON NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (Jan. 17)

For the first time in her career, Auburn sophomore Blanche Alverson was named the Southeastern Conference Player of the Week, the league announced Jan. 17. Alverson earned the award after leading the Tigers to a 2-0 record during the previous week, averaging 18.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 3.5 steals per game.

Included in the week was a career-high 27 points and five 3-pointers vs. Ole Miss. She also tallied a career-high four steals vs. LSU along with two blocked shots.

TURNING ON THE DEFENSE

Senior Alli Smalley has turned up the defensive pressure lately. The senior has 48 steals on the season, but 32 of them have come in the last 18 games. Since the Dec. 30 game vs. Jacksonville State, Smalley is averaging 1.8 steals per game. Her 1.6 steals per game on the season tie her 11th in the SEC.

DONE AT 106

Senior Alli Smalley earned her first career start on Dec. 29, 2007 at Saint Joseph's, the 14th game of her collegiate career. That would be the first of 106 consecutive starts for Smalley. The run ended Feb. 6 as she was held out of the starting lineup vs. Mississippi State because of illness

Her 106-game consecutive start streak is the second-longest in team history, trailing only Kristen Mulligan and her 118-game consecutive start streak from 1992-96.

BREAKING INTO THE TOP 10

With her layup at the 3:42 mark of the first half of the Jan. 16 game vs. LSU, senior Alli Smalley tied former Tiger Lori Monroe (1979-83) for 10th all-time in career scoring at Auburn with 1,409 points.

Smalley went on to score 10 points in the game, giving her sole posession of 10th. She currently ranks ninth with 1,571 career points.

BOMBS AWAY

With her two 3-pointers on Jan. 20 at Mississippi State, sophomore Blanche Alverson moved into Auburn's top-10 career 3-point list. The pair gave her 75 on her career, moving her past DeWanna Bonner for sole posession of 10th all-time.

She currently ranks ninth with 89 on her career.

CLEARING 20

Senior Alli Smalley became the first Tiger to clear the 20-point plateau this season, scoring 22 in Auburn's loss to Temple on Dec. 4. She did it again at Georgia on Feb. 24, tallying 22 points to lead the Tigers past the Bulldogs, and then again on Feb. 27 vs. Kentucky, scoring 24 points. It was the 16th time in her career for her to clear 20 points.

Sophomore Blanche Alverson followed with her first career 20-point game against Ole Miss on Jan. 13 with a career-high 27 points. Fellow Sophomore Morgan Toles notched one of her own on Jan. 30 against South Carolina, scoring a career-high 21 points in the win.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

Auburn tied its season-high with 85 points scored against Ole Miss on Jan. 13. It ties the mark the Tigers set earlier in the season against Seton Hall. The 85 points is also the most for the Tigers against an SEC opponent since Auburn racked up 94 points against Arkansas on March 1, 2009.

DOUBLE DOWN

Senior Jordan Greenleaf pulled down 12 rebounds with 16 points in the season-opener against Florida State, earning her first double-double of the season and fourth of her career. She came back with another at South Florida, scoring 13 points with 10 rebounds.

Against Jacksonville State, sophomore point guard Morgan Toles notched her first career double-double with 10 points and 10 assists. She became the first Auburn player to record a points-assists double-double since Whitney Boddie accomplished the feat against Ole Miss on March 6, 2009 in the SEC Tournament.

Against her home-state team of Mississippi State, junior Chantel Hilliard tallied her first career double-double in the SEC Tournament, notchina 18 points with 11 rebounds.

LEAGUE BEST

Sophomore Morgan Toles has proven herself to be among the best point guards in the SEC this season. She currently leads the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio and assists. Toles has a league-best 2.4 assist-to-turnover ratio, well ahead of second-place Jence Rhoads (1.7) of Vanderbilt. Toles also averages 5.1 assists per game, leading Rhoads and her 4.8 per game.

DEFENSE MAKES OFFENSE

Auburn has used its defense to create its offense this season. So far, the Tigers have scored a total of 534 points off of turnovers (nearly 30 percent of Auburn's total points scored), including a season-high mark of 39 against Alabama A&M. AU has scored 20 or more points off turnovers in nine games this season.

While averaging 8.6 steals, 3.9 blocks and 18.8 opponent turnovers per game this season, Auburn has turned the efforts into an average of 17.8 points off turnovers per game.

SEC Women's Basketball Notes

- The SEC has posted impressive non-conference records in the last decade.
 The SEC compiled a 121-45 (.729) non-conference record during the 2009-10 season.
- Since the 1990 season, the SEC has compiled a 2,774-844 (.767) record
 against other conferences. The league has recorded 150 + wins during eight
 seasons and has never recorded a non-conference winning percentage below
 .723.
- SEC teams have earned appearances in 25 of 29 NCAA Final Fours, an accomplishment unmatched by any other league.
- Overall, SEC squads have filled 34 of the 116 Final Four berths, including having two Final Four teams in 1988 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1989 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1995 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1996 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1998 (Arkansas, Tennessee), 2004 (LSU, Tennessee), 2005 (LSU, Tennessee), 2007 (LSU, Tennessee) and 2008 (LSU, Tennessee).
- SEC teams have made 18 appearances in a nation-high 16 NCAA Championship games, winning eight NCAA Championships (Tennessee: 1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).
- The league also had the distinction of providing both national finalists twice in its history in 1996 (Tennessee 83, Georgia 65) and in 1989 (Tennessee 76, Auburn 60).
 - SEC teams have won 329 NCAA Tournament games against 168 losses (.662) for an average of 11.4 NCAA wins per year.
- In addition, all 12 current members have appeared in the NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC has paced the pack in NCAA tournament bids 21 times in its 29-year history.

- The SEC was also the first league to ever have seven teams invited to the NCAA Tournament and earned this honor a leading seven times (1986, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2004).
- The SEC is one of a handful of leagues to have won three national tournament titles with eight NCAA, two WNIT and three NWIT. Along with the eight NCAA championships won by Tennessee, Arkansas (1999) and Auburn (2003) captured the current Women's NIT titles. But the first-ever SEC national title belongs to Georgia, winners of the 1981 NWIT which predates the current NCAA tournament. LSU (1985) and Kentucky (1990) each won NWIT titles. Both Arkansas (1987) and South Carolina (1979) won the WNIT as members of their previous conferences.
- In 2003, Auburn won the WNIT title with wins over South Alabama, Florida State, Richmond, Creighton and Baylor. In 1999, the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks defeated Wisconsin 76-64 to claim the SEC's first WNIT championship.
- In 1981, Georgia defeated Pittsburg, California and Arizona State (in OT) to capture the NWIT Championship, the first-ever national championship of any kind for the SEC in women's basketball.

BALANCED SCORING

Auburn had five players score in double figures in its last two non-conference games. Against Alabama A&M, it was Greenleaf (15), Alverson (14), Smalley (12), Hilliard (12) and Toles (11). Against Jacksonville State, it was Alverson (17), Greenleaf (15), Smalley (11), Tanner (11) and Toles (10).

Against Florida in the SEC home opener, the Tigers had four players score in double figures: Hilliard (17), Alverson (15), Greenleaf (11) and Smalley (10). The Tigers wrapped up SEC play just how it started with four players in double figures: Smalley (24), Jennings (16), Alverson (10) and Hilliard (10).

It marked the sixth time this season for Auburn to have four players in double figures. The other times were against South Alabama with Smalley (15), Williams (13), Greenleaf (11) and Toles (10) scoring in double figures; and against Seton Hall with Smalley (15), Jennings (14), Toles (12) and Alverson (12).

DOMINATING THE PAINT

Auburn has out-scored its opponents in the paint 15 times this season, but against Alabama A&M it was a dominating effort with 44 points scored in the pait. It marked the most points scored by the Tigers in the paint in almost two years as it was the most since Auburn tallied 56 against Arkansas on March 1, 2009.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

After freshman Tyrese Tanner led Auburn with 15 points at Chicago State, she became the sixth Tiger this season to lead Auburn in scoring. Others are Alli Smalley, Blanche Alverson, Chantel Hilliard, Morgan Toles and Jordan Greenleaf.

LONG DISTANCE RECORD BREAKER

With her 3-pointer with 1:22 left in the Temple game on Dec. 4, Auburn senior Alli Smalley recorded the 185th 3-pointer of her Auburn career, giving her sole possession of the AU 3-point record. She now has 218 on her career.

NO. 200 FOR NELL

The Dec. 21 game at Chicago State marked the 200th for Nell Fortner as Auburn's head coach. She picked up the win and had a 121-79 record through her first 200 games.

STARTING OFF WITH A WIN

Auburn opened SEC play at Alabama on Jan. 3 with a 66-55 victory, marking the third time under Nell Fortner for the Tigers to win their SEC opener and just the second time for Auburn to win its SEC road opener. All-time, the Tigers are now 12-20 in SEC road openers.

The Tigers came out in their next game to defeat Florida, 73-56, in Auburn's first SEC game in the new Auburn Arena. AU is now 18-14 in SEC home openers and 3-4 under Nell Fortner.

AGAINST THE SEC

Auburn has a 187-158 all-time record in the Southeastern Conference. The Tigers have won five SEC titles and four SEC Tournament titles, most recently winning the regular-season title in 2009 after 14-2 league mark.

TOUGH START

Auburn is coming off its most difficult start to a season in the program's history. After opening against Mercer, Auburn played 16th-ranked Florida State and sixth-ranked Duke, giving the Tigers two ranked opponents in the first three games for the frist time in school history.

BREAKING THE STREAK

Auburn's 85-51 win over Seton Hall broke a four-game losing streak for the Tigers - a streak that tied for the longest losing streak since the 2004-05 season. Auburn has not lost more than four consecutive games since it lost six in a row from Dec. 31, 2004 - Jan. 20, 2005.

TURN IT IN TO POINTS

The Tigers have notched a pair of impressive defensive performances this season. In the first, Auburn forced 31 Seton Hall turnovers on Nov. 27, turning them in to 36 points on the other end of the floor.

The Tigers were at it again against Alabama A&M, forcing 29 turnovers on 18 steals, turning them into 39 points on the other end. It marked the most points scored by the Tigers off turnovers since Auburn scored 39 against Sam Houston State on Dec. 5, 2008. The 18 steals were also the most since AU picked up 22 against Alabama A&M on Nov. 14, 2008.

DISHING IT OUT

By playing in her 30th career game against Mercer, Auburn sophomore became eligible for the career assist rankings. With 267 on her career, she ranks fifth all-time at Auburn with 4.8 per game.

I'M FIRST!

While it was Mercer's Sharnea Boykin who scored the first field goal in Auburn Arena, sophomore Blanche Alverson came down on the very next posession to pick up Auburn's first field goal and the first 3-pointer in the facility.

OFFENSE WINS GAMES

Auburn is 85-2 when scoring 70 or more points in the Nell Fortner era. The only times Auburn has lost when scoring at least 70 points was on Jan. 20, 2005 vs. No. 7 Tennessee, 71-81 and Feb. 19, 2009 at No. 18 Vanderbilt, 73-70. When scoring less than 70 points, Auburn is 46-86 during the Fortner era.

HOME COOKIN'

Since a 77-70 loss to Virginia on Jan. 5, 1992, the Auburn Tigers have compiled a 129-10 record against non-conference opponents when playing at home.

Nell Fortner has guided the Tigers to a 78-33 ledger in non-conference play. When playing at home, Fortner's teams have posted a 33-7 mark. The only seven non-conference losses at home came from Xavier on Dec. 2, 2005 (58-60), No. 2 Duke on Dec. 31, 2004 (61-80), No. 20 George Washington on Jan. 3, 2008 (66-68), No. 15 Texas A&M on Nov. 22, 2009 (59-79), No. 16 Florida State on Nov. 15, 2010 (61-67), No. 6 Duke on Nov. 18, 2010 (62-75) and Temple on Dec. 4, 2010 (62-61).

BUILDING WITH EXPERIENCE

Auburn entered the 2010-11 season with a mix of youth and experience. Nine of the 14 players on the opening-day roster were either freshmen or sophomores, but among the nine returning players, Auburn brought back 250 games of experience as a starter.

BLANCHE ALVERSON NAMED TO SEC COMMUNITY SERVICE TEAM

Auburn sophomore Blanche Alverson has been named to the 2011 Southeastern Conference Women's Basketball Community Service Team, the league announced at the SEC Tournament.

Alverson has been involved with several community service projects during her time at Auburn. She has spent time greeting students at Ogletree Elementary School and Drake Middle School and has also worked with the "Wild About Reading Read-A-Thon." She has volunteered at the East Alabama Medical Center/Opelika Sportsplex Camp Good Grief and helped collect food for the East Alabama Food Bank. She also worked with the children at Storybook Farm, a therapeutic horse farm and volunteered to work the Auburn City Schools Educational Foundation FACES 2nd Annual 5k Run/Walk.

ALVERSON NAMED TO CAPITAL ONE ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT IV SECOND TEAM

Sophomore Blanche Alverson was named to the Capital One Academic All-District IV Second Team, the College Sports Information Directors of America announced Feb. 3.

Alverson, a native of Andalusia, Ala., who is on a pre-med path, has a 3.62 grade-point average.

SMALLEY AND TANNER NAMED TO JUNKANOO JAM ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

For their play at the Junkanoo Jam, senior Alli Smalley and freshman Tyrese Tanner were named to the Junkanoo Jam All-Tournament Team.

Smalley averaged 13.5 points, 2.5 assists and 2.5 rebounds per game in the two games, scoring a team-high 15 points in Auburn's win over Seton Hall. Tanner averaged 6.0 points and 3.5 rebounds, along with a team-high 2.5 steals per game on the week.

Also on the all-tournament team were Boston College's Stafanie Murphy and Sacred Heart's Callan Taylor. BC's Carolyn Swords was named the tournament MVP.

SMALLEY NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Auburn senior Alli Smalley was named to the Preseason All-SEC team by both the coaches and the media. The Coaches selected Smalley to the Preseason All-SEC First Team while the media voted her to the Second Team

Smalley averaged 15.7 points per game last season, chipping in 4.4 rebounds and 2.3 assists per outing.

AUBURN PICKED SIXTH IN SEC PRESEASON MEDIA AND COACHES POLLS

Coming off a 15-16 season, the Auburn women's basketball team was picked sixth in the preseason SEC media and coaches polls. Tennessee was the preseason favorite in both polls.

FIRST GAME IN AUBURN ARENA

Auburn won its inaugural game in the new \$86 million Auburn Arena. The Tigers defeated Mercer, 79-61, for the first regular-season Auburn win, men or women, in the new facility.

The Tigers move across the street this season from its former home, Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum - the team's home since 1974. Auburn played its first game in BEMC on Jan. 11, 1974, defeating in-state rival Alabama, 69-31.

MAKING IT HOME

Nell Fortner enters her seventh season as Auburn's head coach, marking her longest tenure at any position in her career. The longest Fortner had stayed at a job prior to Auburn came from 1990-95 while she was an assistant coach at Louisiana Tech under legendary head coach Leon Barmore.

NEW FACES

Auburn welcomes five new faces to its lineup this season in freshmen Peyton Davis (Birmingham, Ala.), Camille Glymph (Greenville, S.C.), Courtney Strain (Woodland, Ala.), Tyrese Tanner (Birmingham, Ala.) and Jassany Williams (Davie, Fla.). The recruiting class was ranked 18th in the country by ESPN.com's HoopGurlz.

TIGERS SIGN HASINA MUHAMMAD FOR 2011-12

The Auburn women's basketball signed 6-1 guard/forward Hasina Muhammad (Ridgeway HS, Memphis, Tenn.) to a National Letter of Intent, head coach Nell Fortner announced on Nov. 10.

Muhammad is ranked as the No. 66 overall player in the country by ESPN's HoopGurlz. She is also ranked as the 17th-best guard in the country and No. 2 prospect in Tennessee by HoopGurlz.

Muhammad was also ranked by two other recruiting services. She is the No. 50 overall prospect according to the All-Star Girls Report and No. 47 in the Girls Basketball Report.

WNBA CHAMPION... AGAIN

After winning a WNBA title in 2009 with the Phoenix Mercury, former Tiger Le'Coe Willingham put herself in select company when she turned around and won it again in 2010, this time with the Seattle Storm.

Willingham, a native of Augusta, Ga., averaged 5.5 points and 4.1 rebounds per game as she helped the Storm to a league-best 28-6 record.

The Storm swept Los Angeles in the first round of the playoffs, setting up a meeting of Willingham and her former team, the Mercury, in the conference finals. She defeated her old team, and former Tiger DeWanna Bonner, in a sweep for a trip to the WNBA finals.

Seattle made it a perfect run through the playoffs, sweeping the Atlanta Dream in three games for the title.

TIGERS ON THE TUBE

As part of the SEC's television agreement with ESPN, the Auburn women's basketball team will be televised six times this season on Fox Sports Net, CSS, the SEC Network and ESPN2. The SEC Tournament will be televised on Fox Sports Net, ESPNU and ESPN2. In all, the SEC will be televised in more than 70 games this season.

Auburn will be televised three times at home at the new Auburn Arena and three times on the road. The first will be the SEC-opener on Jan. 2 at Alabama on CSS, followed by a Jan. 16 home meeting with LSU on CSS. The Tigers will appear on CSS again a week later, on Jan. 23, as Tennessee comes to town.

Auburn will then make an ESPN2 appearance on Feb. 13 at Arkansas before traveling to South Carolina for a Feb. 20 game on the Fox Sports Net.

The Tigers will close out the regular season with a Feb. 27 home game against Kentucky on the SEC Network.

AUBURN TO HOST 2011 NCAA TOURNAMENT FIRST AND SECOND ROUNDS

The new Auburn Arena will close out its first season of operation, March 19-22, as a host site for the first and second rounds of the 2011 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament. Auburn's bid to host the opening rounds was selected by the NCAA and announced on Oct. 29, 2009.

The 2011 event will mark the first time for Auburn to host the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament under its current bid format. The Tigers hosted NCAA Tournament games on nine occasions between 1983 and 1993, posting an 11-0 record over that time. Auburn last hosted on March 21, 1993 when the Tigers downed Louisville, 66-61.

Auburn will be one of 16 first- and second-round sites in 2011. The complete list of host sites includes Albuquerque, N.M. (University of New Mexico, The Pit/Bob King Court); Auburn, Ala. (Auburn University, Auburn Arena); Charlottesville, Va. (University of Virginia, John Paul Jones Arena); Cincinnati, Ohio (Xavier University, Cintas Center); College Park, Md. (University of Maryland, Comcast Center); Columbus, Ohio (Ohio State University, St. John Arena); Durham, N.C. (Duke University, Cameron Indoor Stadium); Knoxville, Tenn. (University of Tennessee, Thompson-Boling Arena); Salt Lake City, Utah (University of Utah, John M. Huntsman Center); Spokane, Wash. (Gonzaga University, McCarthey Athletic Center); Shreveport, La. (Louisiana Tech University, CenturyTel Center); Stanford, Calif. (Stanford University, Maples Pavilion); Storrs, Conn. (University of Connecticut, Harry A. Gampel Pavilion); University Park, Penn. (Pennsylvania State University, Bryce Jordan Center); Waco,

Texas (Baylor University, Ferrell Center); and Wichita, Kan. (Wichita State University, INTRUST Bank Arena).

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. - A 14-3 Purdue run early in the first half put the Auburn women's basketball team in a hole it could not dig out of as Purdue went on to win the Boilermaker Blockbuster, 76-56, Dec. 18 at Conseco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, Ind.

Senior Alli Smalley led the Tigers with 18 points, followed by Blanche Alverson with 10. Freshman Jassany Williams led the team in rebounding with five while also collecting a blocked shot and a pair of steals.

The Boilermakers shot 50.0 percent from the field and outrebounded Auburn, 42-33. The Tigers shot just 30.6 percent from the field, but were able to force 19 Purdue turnovers, turning them into 17 points on the other end.

Purdue's early 14-3 run gave the Boilermakers an 11-point advantage halfway through the first half. Auburn cut the lead to five with 4:28 remaining after a pair of Smalley free throws, but Purdue closed out the period on an 8-2 run for a 40-29 halftime lead.

That would be the closest the Tigers would get as Purdue continued its run in the second half. The Boilermakers led by as many as 25 late in the game, but Auburn scored the final five points to cut it to 76-56 at the buzzer.

CHICAGO - Freshman Tyrese Tanner scored 13 of her team-high 15 points in the second half, leading an Auburn rally for a 67-63 win at Chicago State.

She scored seven-straight points for the Tigers late in the game, including the 3-pointer that put Auburn up for good. Tanner set a new career high with her 15 points. She was 4-of-6 from the field, including a 3-pointer, and made all six of her free-throw attempts - many coming in crucial times down the stretch.

The game was the final for Auburn before the team breaks for the Holidays. It capped off an eight-day, three-game road trip for the Tigers.

Auburn took an early 7-2 lead, but saw it slip away after a pair of Cougar 3-pointers. Chicago State would go on to lead most of the first half, capping it off with a Tressa Beckel jumper with 14 seconds remaining that gave CSU its largest lead of the game at 32-24.

The Tigers responded early in the second half, opening up with an 8-2 run to cut the Cougar lead to two. Chicago State would build its lead back up to six with 6:28 left in the game, but Tanner sparked an Auburn charge that would have the Tigers out-scoring CSU 22-12 in the final minutes.

Auburn finished the game 21-of-32 from the free throw and was 11-of-13 in the final 52 seconds of the game.

Morgan Toles scored 14 points followed by Blanche Alverson with 13. Jordan Greenleaf led Auburn on the boards with 12.

AUBURN - The Auburn women's basketball team was unable to hold off surging No. 20/20 Kentucky as the Tigers fell 76-62 to close out the regular season Feb. 27 at the Auburn Arena.

Senior Alli Smalley recorded a season-high 24 points in her final home game as a Tiger, followed by junior Morgan Jennings with a career-high 16. Junior Chantel Hilliard added 10 points while sophomore Blanche Alverson scored 10 and pulled down a team-high eight boards.

Auburn battled back-and-forth with the Wildcats in an opening half that saw seven ties and five lead changes. A pair of Kentucky free throws tied the game at 30 with 49 seconds left in the half. A Peyton Davis steal with just seconds remaining led into a 25-foot running buzzer-beater from Smalley, igniting the crowd and sending the Tigers into the half up. 33-30.

Although the Wildcat defense amped up the pressure in the second half, they were unable to slow Smalley who scored 15 second-half points. The Arab, Ala., native was 3-of-6 from outside the arc in the second half and connected on all four free-throw attempts.

The high-pressure Kentucky defense began to take its toll on the Auburn offense as the half wore on with the Wildcats slowly pulling away from the Tigers. A Victoria Dunlap layup with 4:57 left gave Kentucky its first double-digit lead of the game. The Tigers, however, could never bring the deficit back to single-digits as the Wildcats pulled away for the 76-62 win.

SEC Tournament First Round

NASHVILLE - An Alli Smalley jumper from the right corner that would have tied the game rimmed out as time expired, handing the Auburn women's basketball team a 49-47 loss to Mississippi State in the first round of the Southeastern Conference Tournament on March 3.

Junior Chantel Hilliard, a native of Biloxi, Miss., notched her first career double-double as she led the Tigers with 18 points and 11 rebounds. Alli Smalley, Auburn's lone senior on the squad, followed with 14 points.

Auburn led by as many as 11 points in the second half, holding a 41-30 lead with 9:48 remaining. The Bulldogs out-scored the Tigers 19-6 the rest of the game, taking the lead for good on a jumper from Diamber Johnson with 1:27 left in the game.

Johnson led Mississippi State in scoring with 16 points, all coming in the second half. Senior Mary Kathryn Govero followed with 15 points while Catina Bett added 10. Ashley Brown pulled down a team-high nine rebounds for MSU.

Auburn was able to get the ball to the basket and draw fouls in the game, making it to the free throw line 16 times. But, the Tigers could only connect on 10 of the 16 attempts for 43.8 percent.

Auburn shot just 34.5 percent from the field, connecting on 20-of-58 attempts. The Tigers were also held without a 3-point field goal, shooting 0-for-8 from beyond the arc. Auburn won the rebounding battle, 40-35, and forced 19 Bulldog turnovers, transitioning them into 17 points on the other end.
