Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- Auburn is 25-19 all-time against Kentucky, but the Wildcats have won the last seven meetings
- The teams met in Lexington last season with Kentucky claiming a 78-57 victory at Memorial Coliseum on Jan. 8
- This is the fourth-straight meeting with Kentucky when the Wildcats have been ranked in the top 10
- Auburn's last win over a top-10 opponent came Jan. 31, 2010, vs. #9 Georgia (67-53)
- Auburn's last win over a ranked team was Feb. 13, 2014, at #16 Vanderbilt (68-62)
- Auburn's next three opponents are ranked in the nation's top 15 (#7 Kentucky, #8 Miss. State, #13 Tennessee)
- Auburn is 16-20 in SEC openers; 2-1 under Coach Flo
- The Tigers are 19-17 all-time in home conference openers, including a 2-3 mark at Auburn Arena
- Auburn finished non-conference play with a 10-3 mark, one game better than their 2014-15 non-SEC record
- Junior Brandy Montgomery is just 14 points shy of 1,000 for her career
- Montgomery is third in scoring in the SEC with 17.8 points per game and second in the SEC in steals (2.7/game)
- Junior Katie Frerking leads the SEC in steals (2.8/game)
- Montgomery scored a season-high 28 points on 10-of-16 shooting (6-10 3FG) vs. George Mason (12/23)
- Montgomery scored 25 points and made the tying and game-winning 3-pointers in overtime win vs. Minnesota (11/28)
- Montgomery has scored 20+ points in 8 of 13 games this year and 11 of 18 dating back to last season
- Montgomery and Tanner each had double-doubles in Auburn's loss at Marquette; first dual double-doubles for Auburn since Peyton Davis and Tyrese Tanner did so vs. Alabama A&M in 2013
- Senior Tra'Cee Tanner has four double-doubles on the season (UAB, Boise State, Marquette, FGCU) and 12 career
- Tanner pulled down a career-high 19 rebounds at FGCU (12/30); first player with 19+ rebounds since KeKe Carrier (2010)
- With her 11th point vs. Boise State on Nov. 27 - a free throw in the third quarter - Tra'Cee Tanner became the 30th player in Auburn history with 1,000 career points
- Tanner is second in the SEC in field goal percentage (62.2%) and fifth in rebounding (8.5/game)
- Janiah McKay was named SEC Freshman of the Week on Dec. 22 after a 23-point, 7-rebound game at Towson (12/20)
- Auburn tied a school record with 24 steals vs. East Carolina (12/5) and forced 33 turnovers, 9th most in AU history
- Auburn forced Winthrop into 35 turnovers (12/16), seventh-most in Auburn history and fifth-most vs. a Division I opponent
- Auburn is 193-124 all-time in the month of January
- Auburn has forced 25+ turnovers five times this season (35 vs. Winthrop; 33 vs. ECU; 30 vs. George Mason; 27 vs. Boise State; 25 vs. Savannah State); Tigers are 5-0 in those games
- With 85 points vs. UAB and 80 at Southeastern Louisiana, Auburn scored 80+ points in back-to-back games for the first time since the 2013 WNIT (80 vs. UAB; 84 vs. WKU)
- Auburn has scored 80+ points five times this season; the Tigers did it just three times all of last season

OPENING TIP

» Auburn opens the 2016 SEC season at home Sunday, Jan. 3, as the Tigers host No. 7 Kentucky at Auburn Arena. Tip is set for 2 p.m. CT.

» The Tigers enter Saturday's game at 10-3 overall, having won four of their last five games. The Wildcats are 11-0, one of three remaining unbeaten teams in the SEC.

IN THE RANKINGS

» Auburn is receiving votes in the USA Today Coaches' Poll. Kentucky is ranked No. 7 in both polls.

LAST TIME OUT

» Tra'Cee Tanner had her fourth double-double of the season, but turnovers and a long scoring drought in the second and third quarters led to a 52-45 Auburn loss at Florida Gulf Coast on Wednesday night.

» The Tigers were equal or better in most statistical categories on the night, out-shooting and out-rebounding FGCU. But Auburn turned the ball over 19 times, and the Eagles knocked down 10 3-pointers while only turning it over six times.

» Tanner finished with 15 points and a career-high 19 rebounds, the most rebounds by an Auburn player since KeKe Carrier had 19 against Valparaiso on Dec. 28, 2010. It was the fourth double-double of the season and the 12th of Tanner's career.

» The Tigers shot 40.0 percent (18-of-45), besting the Eagles' 32.1-percent night, but Auburn was 0-for-10 from 3-point range while FGCU knocked down 10-of-32 attempts beyond the arc. It was the first time for Auburn to fail to connect on a 3-point try since the 2014 WNIT third-round loss at Mississippi State.

UP NEXT

» Auburn plays its first conference road game of the season as they travel to Starkville, Miss., to face Mississippi State on Thursday, Jan. 7. Tip is set for 7:30 p.m. with SEC Network whip-around coverage.

QUICK HITS

» Auburn is in its 45th season of women's basketball and sports an all-time record of 872-429 ... The Tigers are 207-201 all-time in SEC play... Auburn has made 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, five WNIT appearances and three Final Fours in the program's history ... Head Coach Terri Williams-

Flournoy is in her fourth season at Auburn ... She has a 204-155 record as a head coach and is 61-51 at Auburn ... Coach Flo won her 200th career game against East Carolina on Dec. 5.

SCOUTING KENTUCKY

» Kentucky is 11-0, ranked No. 7 in both polls and one of three unbeaten teams remaining in the SEC.

» The Wildcats have won their first 11 games by an average of 28.4 points. Their closest game was a 68-64 overtime win at Arizona State on Nov. 15. Kentucky averages 81.4 points per game while giving up just 53.0. No opponent has scored more than 67 points against UK this year.

» Makayla Epps leads Kentucky in scoring with 16.6 points/game. She shoots 52.5% from the floor. Janee Thompson adds 13.7 points/game and is UK's top 3-point shooter at 47.9% (23-of-48).

LAST MEETING: UK 78, AUBURN 57 (1/8/15)

» Tra'Cee Tanner scored 23 points, but Auburn fell short on the road at No. 10 Kentucky, dropping a 78-57 decision at Memorial Coliseum on Jan. 8, 2015.

» The Tigers committed a season-high 25 turnovers while forcing Kentucky into just 12 giveaways, a season-low for an Auburn opponent. Consequently, the Wildcats scored 23 points off turnovers while Auburn had just six.

» On multiple occasions in the second half, Auburn cut Kentucky's lead to single digits, getting as close as eight points at 56-48 with just over eight minutes to play. From that point, however, the Tigers connected on just two field goal attempts while committing seven turnovers and missing seven of their final nine shots.

» Auburn out-rebounded Kentucky 45-35. The Tigers shot 37.3 percent from the field and connected on just one 3-pointer on five attempts. Kentucky was 43.1 percent from the floor and shot 7-of-19 from 3-point range.

SCOUTING AUBURN

» Auburn is off to a 10-3 start to the 2015-16 season and has won eight of their last 10.

» Junior Brandy Montgomery is the SEC's third-leading scorer, averaging 17.8 points/game. She also averages 2.7 steals per contest, second-best in the league. Montgomery scored a season-high 28 in the

win over George Mason and has topped the 20-point mark eight times in 13 games. She also had her second career double-double with 24 points and 12 rebounds at Marquette.

» Senior Tra'Cee Tanner is second in the SEC in field goal percentage (62.2%) and in offensive rebounds (4.2/game). She averages 13.8 points and a team-leading 8.5 rebounds per game.

» Junior Katie Frerking leads the SEC with 2.8 steals per game. She also averages 12.0 points and 5.6 rebounds per contest.

» The Tigers won their final three regular season games in 2014-15 and a first-round game in the SEC Tournament after going on a 14-game skid through January and most of February.

» Pressure defense remains a staple of Coach Flo's strategy as the Tigers forced an average of 19.6 turnovers per game in her first three seasons. Auburn has forced 20 or more turnovers in eight of its last 10 games, including 35 vs. Winthrop, 33 vs. East Carolina, 30 vs. George Mason, 27 vs. Boise State and 25 at Savannah State.

BIG-TIME BRANDY

» Junior Brandy Montgomery has been a major offensive weapon for Auburn, leading the Tigers in scoring eight times this year while averaging 17.8 points/game.

» Montgomery needs just 14 more points for 1,000 in her career. She would be the 31st player in Auburn history to reach that milestone and the second this season, along with senior Tra'Cee Tanner.

» She has scored 20+ points in eight of 13 games this year and 11 of her last 18 dating back to the end of the 2014-15 season. Her season-high of 28 came on Dec. 23 against George Mason when she was 10-of-16 from the field and 6-of-10 from 3-point range.

» Montgomery has also been a big defensive threat as she ranks second in the SEC with 2.7 steals per game. She had a career-high 8 steals in Auburn's win over East Carolina on Dec. 5.

» In the win over George Mason on Dec. 23, Montgomery had a stretch where she hit seven consecutive shots - five of them 3-pointers - including a bank-shot trey at the first-half buzzer. She scored 21 of her 28 points in the game in a 10-minute stretch spanning the second and third quarters.

» In a 25-point night against Minnesota at the San

Juan Shootout in Puerto Rico, Montgomery hit the game-tying and game-winning 3-point field goals in overtime in the Tigers' 81-79 victory.

RECENT TRENDS

» Auburn has won 14 of the last 18 games it has played, dating back to a Feb. 22 victory at Georgia that snapped a 14-game losing streak.

» During last season's 14-game losing streak, Auburn averaged 47.9 points per game while giving up 59.8 ppg (-11.9 margin), shot 34.2% from the field, and averaged 18.9 turnovers/game while forcing just 15.5. The Tigers were held below 60 points in all 14 of those games.

» Starting with the win over Georgia and continuing through the next 17 games (across two seasons), Auburn has averaged 68.3 points per game, given up 57.3 ppg (-11.0 margin), shot 43.7% from the field, and averaged 17.1 turnovers/game while forcing 21.6. Auburn has scored 70 or more points in 10 of those 18 games and has held opponents below 60 in 13 of 18.

STELLAR DEBUT

» Freshman Janiah McKay made the most of her collegiate debut on Nov. 13 vs. UAB, scoring 20 points and dishing out 7 assists off the bench. It was the best performance by an Auburn freshman in their collegiate debut since Hasina Muhammad scored 20 points vs. Maine on Nov. 9, 2012, which was also Coach Flo's debut.

» McKay followed that up with a 14-point night at Southeastern Louisiana that included two stellar plays in the fourth quarter to help seal the victory for the Tigers. She then scored a team-leading 16 points vs. Virginia.

» McKay made her first collegiate start vs. Winthrop on Dec. 16, and three games later, scored 23 points and had 7 rebounds vs. Towson, earning SEC Freshman of the Week honors.

RETURN OF CLUB PRESS

» Auburn has forced 20 or more turnovers in eight of its last 10 games and 25 or more in five of those 10. Under Coach Flo, Auburn is 24-5 when forcing 25 or more opponent turnovers.

» Auburn has forced an average of 21.9 opponent turnovers through 13 games this season.

PLAYER TO WATCH: BRANDY MONTGOMERY

» Junior Brandy Montgomery is the SEC's third-leading scorer with 17.8 points/game. She has scored 20+ points in 8 of 13 games this year, including a season-high 28 vs. George Mason (12/23).



» Against East Carolina on Dec. 5, Auburn tied a school record with 24 steals (previous: 24 vs. Tennessee State in 2001) and forced 33 turnovers, tied for the ninth most in program history.

» One home game later, Auburn forced Winthrop into 35 turnovers, the most under Coach Flo at Auburn and seventh-most in program history (fourth-most vs. a Division I opponent).

» Brandy Montgomery (8 steals) and Katie Frerking (6 steals) set career highs vs. ECU. Montgomery's eight tied for the sixth-most in program history.

WORKING OVERTIME

» Auburn's 81-79 overtime win over Minnesota at the San Juan Shootout on Nov. 28 was the Tigers' first overtime game since the 2014 season when the Tigers lost in OT at Ole Miss.

» It only took two more games for Auburn to play its second OT game of the season, this a 70-69 loss at Marquette on Dec. 13.

» Auburn is now 18-19 all-time in overtime games. The Tigers are 2-2 in OT under Coach Flo.

» Auburn has played just one overtime game at Auburn Arena, a 70-65 double OT win over Alabama on Feb. 27, 2014.

LOVING THAT ISLAND LIFE

» Auburn put together a 2-0 weekend at the San Juan Shootout in Puerto Rico over Thanksgiving weekend, earning a pair of close wins over Boise State (55-53) and Minnesota (81-79, OT).

» It was the second trip Auburn has made to Puerto Rico for women's basketball; the Tigers have amassed a 5-0 record when playing in Puerto Rico.

MILESTONE FOR TRA'CEE

» Senior Tra'Cee Tanner hit the 1,000-point career mark in Auburn's win over Boise State in Puerto Rico on Nov. 27, getting her 1,000th point on a free throw late in the third quarter.

» In doing so, she became just the fifth player in Auburn history with 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 100 assists, 100 blocks and 100 steals - one of whom is her older sister, Tyrese Tanner:

SEEING DOUBLE

» Brandy Montgomery and Tra'Cee Tanner each collected a double-double in Auburn's loss to Marquette on Dec. 13. Montgomery had 24 points and a career-high 12 rebounds, and Tanner had 13 points and matched her career-best with 12 boards.

» Tanner opened the season on a high note with her ninth career double-double, posting 18 points and 10 rebounds in the opener vs. UAB (Nov. 13).

» Tanner posted her second double-double of the year with 17 points and 11 rebounds in a 55-53 win over Boise State in Puerto Rico (Nov. 27).

» Tanner's fourth double-double included 15 points and a career-high 19 rebounds at Florida Gulf Coast (Dec. 30). It was Auburn's first 19-rebound game since KeKe Carrier had 19 vs. Valparaiso on Dec. 28, 2010.

» Jazmine Jones had the first double-double of her career with 13 points and 10 rebounds in the win over East Carolina on Dec. 5.

ON THIS DATE

» Auburn is 12-2 all-time on January 3. The Tigers' last game on this date was a 50-47 win over Arkansas at home in 2013.

IN JANUARY

» Auburn is 193-124 all-time in the month of December (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that year).

TOUGH SCHEDULE

» In addition to the rigors of the Southeastern Conference, Auburn faces a non-conference schedule that includes five opponents that advanced to postseason play last season.

» Auburn faces NCAA participants Savannah State, Boise State, Minnesota and Florida Gulf Coast in the pre-SEC slate, along with WNIT participant Virginia.

» Six of Auburn's first seven SEC contests will be against teams that were NCAA participants last season - Kentucky (twice), Mississippi State, Tennessee, South Carolina and Arkansas.

SISTER ACT

» For the fourth-straight season, Auburn's roster features a sister combination as twin sophomores Jazmine and Jessica Jones return for the Tigers.

» Other sister combinations to play together at Auburn include Tyrese (2010-14) and Tra'Cee Tanner (2012-present); Sherell (2004-09) and Reneisha Hobbs (2006-10), and Ruthie (1985-89) and Mae Ola Bolton (1984-88).

NEW FACES

» Auburn welcomes four newcomers to the roster for 2015-16, with three freshmen and one junior.

» Joining the Tigers to compete this season are F Jonika Garvin (Lake Worth, Fla.), G Janiah McKay (Gainesville, Fla.) and G Erica Sanders (San Antonio, Texas).

» Junior G Tiffany Lewis (Chattanooga, Tenn.) transferred to Auburn from Clemson during the offseason, but she will be ineligible for the 2015-16 season due to NCAA transfer rules.

WELCOME TO THE FAMILY

» Tyra Johnson of Decatur, Ala., signed with Auburn in the early signing period in November.

» Johnson was the Decatur Daily's Player of the Year as a junior, a first-team all-state selection in 2015, and averaged 15.4 points and 3.2 assists as a junior.

GUAYNABO, Puerto Rico -- Auburn battled back from a 12-point deficit and used a smothering defense in the second half to hold off Boise State, 55-53, on Friday night at the San Juan Shootout.

Senior Tra'Cee Tanner scored her 1,000th career point for the Tigers (4-1) and picked up her second double-double of the season with 17 points and 11 rebounds to lead Auburn in both categories.

But the Auburn defense was the story of the game as the Tigers forced BSU into 27 turnovers - 16 of them in the second half - leading to 28 points. Auburn also took advantage of second chances, pulling down 18 offensive rebounds and converting those into 19 second-chance points.

A Tanner layup with 1:26 to play gave the Tigers a 54-51 lead, but the Broncos (2-2) answered with a mid-range jumper to cut the lead to one point. Trying to run the clock out, the Tigers missed a pair of shots in the final minute but pulled down two key offensive rebounds, forcing Boise to commit three fouls in five seconds to get the Tigers into the bonus. Katie Frerking hit one of two attempts with :15.3 to play to give Auburn a 55-53 lead.

After Boise called its final timeout to advance the ball to the frontcourt, Auburn once again used a suffocating defense to keep the Broncos from running a play, forcing them to settle for a desperation heave that fell short as time expired.

The Tigers had a season-high 14 steals - Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking had three apiece, while Jazmine Jones, Jessica Jones and Jonika Garvin had two each.

Offensively, Tanner's 17 points led the night for Auburn while Frerking had 11 and Montgomery added 10. Frerking also pulled down a season-high eight rebounds.

After a cold first half, the Tigers shot 44.1 percent in the second half and held the Broncos to a 37.5-percent clip in the final 20 minutes. The biggest chunk of Boise's offense came from guard Brooke Pahukoa, who hit five 3-pointers en route to a 21-point night.

MILWAUKEE -- Tra'Cee Tanner and Brandy Montgomery had double-doubles for Auburn, but a late Marquette rally forced overtime and the Tigers fell 70-69 Sunday afternoon at the Al McGuire Center.

The Tigers (6-2) led by as many as nine points midway through the fourth period, but Marquette (4-5) knocked down three 3-pointers in the final 1:20, including a tying basket with eight seconds left. Meanwhile, the Tigers went cold at the free-throw line and were unable to ice the game despite several opportunities late.

Tied 60-all at the end of regulation, Marquette jumped out to a five-point lead in overtime, but a Cabrana Capers layup cut it to a one-possession game at 69-66 with 1:29 to play. After each team went 1-of-2 on free throw opportunities in the final minute, Auburn had the ball down by three with 16 seconds left. However, no one could get open for a 3-point try, and a Capers layup off a missed attempt with less than a second to go made the final margin 70-69.

Montgomery recorded her second career double-double with 24 points and 12 rebounds, scoring 13 points in the fourth quarter to give Auburn its biggest lead. Tanner recorded her third double-double of the season with 13 points and 12 rebounds.

It was the first time for two Auburn players to have a double-double in the same game since Peyton Davis and Tyrese Tanner did so at Alabama A&M in 2013.

As a team, Auburn had a season-high 57 rebounds with 23 of those on the offensive glass, but had their worst shooting day of the season at 32.5 percent from the field. The difference in the game, however, was free-throw shooting: Auburn was 13-of-30 at the line, including 4-of-14 in the second half and 3-of-6 in overtime. Marquette was not much better at 14-of-26, but the Golden Eagles hit 5-of-7 attempts in the extra period. The Tigers' depth took several hits throughout the game, and Auburn was missing three starters by overtime. Starting point guard Khady Dieng suffered a shoulder injury in the first quarter and did not return, Jazmine Jones fouled out with just over two minutes left in regulation, and Katie Frerking picked up her fifth foul early in the overtime period.

TOWSON, Md. -- Brandy Montgomery posted her fifth straight game with 20 or more points to lead Auburn to a 69-54 win over Coppin State Saturday afternoon at Towson's SECU Arena.

The Tigers (8-2) overcame a sloppy start to the game and general all-around miscues throughout to pull away midway through the second half and secure their third neutral-site win of the season.

Auburn broke open a close game early in the third quarter, opening the period on a 15-4 run to turn a three-point lead into a 14-point advantage at 46-32. The Eagles rallied to cut the deficit to just nine points at the end of three quarters at 50-41, but a 9-0 run to start the fourth quarter pushed Auburn's advantage to 18, and the Eagles got no closer than 14 points the rest of the way.

Montgomery finished with 24 points, scoring 18 of them in the second half as Auburn shot 52 percent in the final 20 minutes. She is now averaging 19.7 points per game and continues to lead the SEC in scoring. In Saturday's game, she was 8-of-13 from the field, including 5-of-8 from 3-point range, and added three steals and three rebounds.

Tra'Cee Tanner scored 16 points along with five rebounds and three steals, and Jazmine Jones was 4-of-5 from the field and 5-of-7 at the free-throw line to post a 13-point day. Senior Cabriana Capers was the Tigers' leading rebounder off the bench, matching a career-high with eight boards.

Katie Frerking had just four points but filled the stat sheet with a career-high eight assists along with six rebounds, a block and a steal.

Despite committing 26 turnovers and giving up 20 offensive rebounds, the Tigers shot 49.0 percent from the field and held Coppin State (2-8) to a 33.8-percent day. Auburn was 6-of-13 from 3-point range while holding the Eagles to a 1-of-13 day from outside.

Auburn led 31-28 at halftime, but let the Eagles close the second period on a 6-0 run after the Tigers had led by as many as nine points. The Tigers shot 45.8 percent in the first half but turned the ball over 14 times in the first 20 minutes and gave up nine offensive rebounds.

TOWSON, Md. -- Freshman guard Janiah McKay posted career-highs in points and rebounds to lead the Auburn women's basketball team to a 74-52 win at Towson on Sunday afternoon.

Auburn (9-2) finished off a 2-0 weekend in Towson with Sunday's win, following a 69-54 victory over Coppin State on Saturday. The Tigers finished with four players in double figures and held Towson (2-7) to 20 points below their season scoring average.

McKay's 23 points and seven rebounds were the best numbers of her young career, including a 5-for-9 day from 3-point range, and she also contributed three assists, a block and a steal in the winning effort. She was making just the third start of her freshman season in place of injured junior guard Khady Dieng.

Despite playing less than 24 hours before - while Towson had not played in 14 days - the Tigers showed no signs of fatigue late in the game. In fact, the Tigers were the stronger team in the closing minutes, holding Towson to just one field goal and seven points in the fourth quarter.

Tra'Cee Tanner finished one rebound shy of a double-double with 14 points and nine boards, and Katie Frerking hit her first six shots en route to a 15-point, eight-rebound, four-steal day. Jazmine Jones was the Tigers' fourth player in double digits, scoring 10 points to go along with six rebounds and two steals.

Brandy Montgomery had a rare off-day shooting the ball, going scoreless in the game, but contributed to the effort with six rebounds and four assists. Freshman Erica Sanders contributed eight points and six rebounds off the bench, and senior Cabriana Capers gave Auburn 12 good minutes with four points and four rebounds.

Auburn shot 43.9 percent for the game, including 8-of-19 (42.1%) from 3-point range and 8-of-12 at the free-throw line. Towson, meanwhile, shot 28.6 percent from the floor, including 21.9 percent in the second half.

FORT MYERS, Fla. -- Tra'Cee Tanner had her fourth double-double of the season, but turnovers and a long scoring drought in the second and third quarters led to a 52-45 Auburn loss at Florida Gulf Coast on Wednesday night.

The Tigers (10-3) were equal or better in most statistical categories on the night, out-shooting and out-rebounding FGCU (11-4). But Auburn turned the ball over 19 times, and the Eagles knocked down 10 3-pointers while only turning it over six times.

Tanner finished with 15 points and a career-high 19 rebounds, the most rebounds by an Auburn player since KeKe Carrier had 19 against Valparaiso on Dec. 28, 2010. It was the fourth double-double of the season and the 12th of Tanner's career.

The Tigers shot 40.0 percent (18-of-45), besting the Eagles' 32.1-percent night, but Auburn was 0-for-10 from 3-point range while FGCU knocked down 10-of-32 attempts beyond the arc. It was the first time for Auburn to fail to connect on a 3-point try since the 2014 WNIT third-round loss at Mississippi State.

Rebounding, however, was not a problem for the Tigers as they pulled down 43 and held FGCU to 23 boards on the night. Auburn turned 12 offensive rebounds into 11 second-chance points. The Tigers' trademark pressure defense, however, was not effective as the Eagles committed just six turnovers, the lowest of the season by an Auburn opponent.

The Tigers led 14-13 after one period, thanks to seven points from McKay and a cold-shooting FGCU team in the opening 10 minutes. Auburn, however, would score just six points in the second quarter and connect on just one field goal attempt in the final eight minutes of the period as FGCU took a 23-20 lead to the break.

The Eagles opened the third quarter on an 8-0 run and eventually led by as many as 13 midway through the third quarter. Auburn found some offense late in the quarter, but FGCU led 40-30 after three period. Auburn cut the lead to as few as six points midway through the fourth quarter, but tough man-to-man defense from the Eagles forced the Tigers into taking contested shots and several shot clock violations.

THIS IS AUBURN ... ATHLETICS

ACADEMICS

- » In the 2014-15 academic year, 108 student-athletes graduated from Auburn University.
- » A record 346 student-athletes received the Top Tiger Award in 2014-15 with a GPA of 3.0.
- » During the 2014-2015 academic year, more than 200 Auburn University student-athletes were honored as members of the All-SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- » All 12 players on the 2014-15 Auburn volleyball roster were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- » Junior volleyball player Stephanie Campbell was named an Academic All-District selection by the College Sports Information Directors of America.
- » During Autumn of 2014, Auburn swimmer Tofey Leon was selected as a Rhodes Scholarship Finalist. Former Auburn University football player Partick Young was a nominee for the Rhodes Scholarship while former Auburn University football player Ashton Richardson was selected as one of 40 Marshall Scholarship recipients.

FINANCIALS

- » In the last 23 years, the Athletics Department budget has grown from \$21 million to \$128.7 million.
- » In back-to-back years, the Auburn football program had its highest sale of season tickets in school history in 2014 and 2015. In 2015, Auburn sold out of season tickets on June 8, two months earlier than in 2014.
- » Men's basketball season ticket sales increased 122.8% for the 2014-15, selling out premium seating for the first time in the history of Auburn Arena. TUF sales are up 75% year-to-date in 2015-16.
- » Baseball season ticket sales increased 23.4% in 2015.

FACILITIES

- » During 2014, Auburn Athletics funded more than \$7.5 million in facility improvements.
- » Installed prior to the 2015 season, Jordan-Hare Stadium boasts the nation's largest video board, which is 57 feet tall by 190 feet wide.
- » Opened in August 2014, the state-of-the-art Auburn Wellness Kitchen provides student-athletes, students and the general population a dining facility that has six action stations and accommodates those with special dietary needs.
- » The 2014-15 academic year witnessed the launch of the SEC Network which saw major infrastructure work completed necessary to support the SEC Network and War Eagle Productions.

GAME DAY

- » Auburn's game day experience named by outside parties as offering the best tailgating and the best traditions.
- » Per a survey done by the SEC, in which they measured 60 attributes related to the overall game day experience, Auburn scored better than the SEC average on 56 of the 60 measured attributes. Two of the below average rated attributes related to food & beverage prices, for which we in response reduced the price of water and hot dogs to very positive response from our fans.
- » Over 96% of Auburn's donors and fans indicate that the frequency of communication, the transparency of communication, and the content of communication from Auburn Athletics meets or exceeds their needs.

WINNING

- » Auburn has finished in the top 10 percent of the NACDA Director's Cup for 10 consecutive years.
- » Auburn has won 13 national titles since 2004, which is third-most in the SEC. National Champion teams include Football, Men's Swimming and Diving, Women's Swimming and Diving, Equestrian, and Women's Outdoor Track and Field.
- » Auburn has won 20 SEC titles in the past 10 years, tied for fourth-most in the conference.
- » Sixteen of Auburn's 21 sports participated in postseason competition in 2014-15, with four programs achieving Top 10 finishes nationally.
- » The Auburn football team has won a National Championship and two Southeastern Conference Championships in the last five years, and played for the national title for the second time in four years in 2013.
- » No school has won more SEC Football Championships in the last 10 years than Auburn.
- » The Auburn softball team had its best season in school history, advancing to its' first-ever Women's College World Series, where it advanced to the semifinals.
- » Gymnastics advanced to the NCAA Super Six for the first time in 22 years and second time in school history in 2015, finishing sixth while breaking 52 program records.
- » Men's Swimming & Diving team has recorded 23 consecutive top-10 NCAA finish and has won 18 of the last 22 SEC Championships (including 16 consecutive titles from 1997-2012).
- » Women's Golf has won three SEC titles in the last seven years, five in the last 11 years, and seven in the last 16.

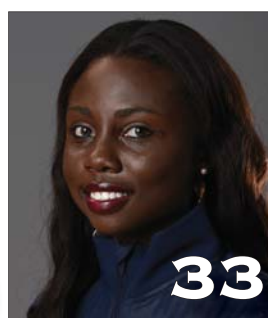
