Series Record vs. Auburn: Hofstra will be playing Auburn for the first time in program history when the Pride travels to Alabama. Last season, Auburn participated in Hofstra's New York Life Holiday Invitational at the Mack Sports Complex. The Tigers lost to Marist before defeating Central Connecticut State in the consolation round. Hofstra won the tournament with victories over CCSU and Marist.

Auburn enters the weekend having won its last two games and four of the last five overall. The Tigers are 2-0 at home after defeating local rivals Alabama State and Alabama A&M.

The Tigers have scored nearly 100 more points than their opponents with three players averaging in double figures. Auburn is hitting a collective 44 percent from the field while holding opponents to a 36.8 field goal percentage. Auburn's only losses have come to N.C. State and San Diego State.

Quick Hitters...

- Dating to last season, senior forward Shante Evans has double-doubles in 19 of Hofstra's last 29 games.
- Shante Evans has scored in double figures in all seven games for Hofstra this season.
- Andreana Thomas has taken on an increased workload this season, averaging 34.4 minutes per game.

Milestone Reached: Senior forward Shante Evans made history in Hofstra's road game at Marist on Nov. 28. By corralling the first of her 14 rebounds in the contest, Evans became Hofstra's all-time leading rebounder. She surpassed Kate Gordon's previous record of 1,031 career rebounds, which she set in a career that spanned 1994-98.

Career High: Junior guard Annie Payton set a career high when she scored 17 points to lead the Pride to a season-opening win against Stetson on Nov. 9. Her previous high was 15 set against Delaware on Jan. 2, 2011.

Career High, Part II: Junior Anma Onyeuku continued her stellar start to her first season as a starter when she hauled in a career-high 13 rebounds as part of a double-double effort against Harvard on Dec. 1.

Recognizing Success: Before Hofstra's contest against Harvard on Dec. 1, the Pride unveiled a WNIT banner in the Mack Sports Complex's rafters to commemorate the appearance in 2011-12. Last season marked the fourth time Hofstra had qualified for the WNIT.

Tiger Time: Hofstra will be playing a team with the same nickname in back-to-back games. The Pride opposed the Princeton Tigers before taking on the Auburn Tigers on Dec. 9. The last time Hofstra played two teams with the same nickname in such a short span was 2005-06 when Hofstra played the UConn Huskies and Northeastern Huskies in a three-game span (Harvard was the middle game).

Streaks, Trends and Notes:

- Hofstra has won six of its last 19, seven of its last 21, 11 of its last 26 games, 14 of its last 30, 20 of its last 37, 24 of its last 42, 39 of its last 68 and 45 of its last 78.
- Hofstra had won 14 straight games against teams from the state of New York, including 2-0 in 2011-12, before falling to nationally ranked St. John's on Nov. 17.
- Hofstra has won five of its last seven games against schools from the Big East Conference.
- Hofstra has won 12 of its last 19 home games and 31 of its last 44 home games (including 20 of its last 29 and 24 of its last 34).
- Shante Evans averaged 19.2 points and 10.5 rebounds per game last season, becoming the first player to lead the team in scoring and rebounding in three straight years since Kate Gordon achieved that feat from 1995-98.
- Hofstra has made a three-pointer in 409 of its last 415 games. The streak is now 96 games in a row.
- Hofstra had made at least four three-pointers in every game this season through the first five contests before the streak was snapped on Dec. 1.
- The Pride is 72-16 in its last 88 games when they hold their opponent under 60 points (3-0 last season).

- Since becoming a Division I program in the 1982-83 season, Hofstra is 64-13 all-time when scoring 80 or more points in a game.

- Hofstra has won three of its last five overtime contests and six of its last 10 overtime games.

Helping Hand: Andreana Thomas has performed yeoman's work for Hofstra this season, averaging 34.4 minutes per game. She has also worked admirably to fill the backcourt void led by graduating seniors Candice Bellocchio and Nicole Capurso. Thomas notched a pair of seven-assist games through the opening five contests. Thomas has also been clutch at the line, going 14-for-17 for a Hofstra-leading .824 percentage.

Good Competition: Hofstra packed the non-conference portion of the schedule with quality teams, giving the Pride a chance to match up against power conference schools that are playoff tested. The Pride's first seven games came against postseason qualifiers in 2011-12, with a win over WNIT participant Stetson before falling to a Texas squad that was nationally ranked in the second week and a St. John's squad that was ranked 20th in the Associated Press poll when Hofstra visited the Red Storm.

Thus far, every team Hofstra has played qualified for the postseason last year. Princeton, which was the preseason favorite in the Ivy League, has already been the fourth NCAA Tournament team Hofstra has opposed in the non-conference portion of the schedule in the current campaign with Texas, St. John's and Marist also on that list.

Hot Treys: Candace Bond has continued to be an impact player on both ends of the court for Hofstra. Bond is third in the CAA in steals, averaging 2.7 per game. On the offensive side, Bond is fifth in the league in three-point efficiency, shooting 46.7 percent.

CAA Preseason Poll: The Hofstra Women's Basketball program was picked third in the Colonial Athletic Association preseason poll. The poll was conducted by the league's

coaches, media relations directors and media members and announced at the conference's annual media day.

Senior forward Shante Evans was also named to the preseason All-CAA First Team.

Delaware, which returns all five starters from last season's team that finished 31-2, was picked to win the CAA Women's Basketball championship. The results of the poll were announced during CAA Basketball Media Day at Champps-Pentagon Row in Arlington, Va.

Hofstra finished 19-12 overall last season and qualified for its fourth postseason appearance by making the WNIT. The Pride returns a pair of senior starters in Evans and Candace Bond. Evans, a two-time All-CAA first team and two-time honorable mention All-America honoree, ranked fourth in the league in scoring (19.2 points-per-game) and second in rebounding (10.5 rpg) last season. Bond (7.8 ppg/5.4 rpg) led the CAA in steals with 2.7 per outing.

James Madison, which reached the WNIT championship round in its seventh consecutive postseason appearance, was picked to finish second. Drexel, which advanced to the second round of the WNIT in 2011-12, was selected fourth.

Rounding out the field was Old Dominion in fifth followed by Northeastern, George Mason and UNCW were tied for seventh. Towson and William and Mary tied for ninth and Georgia State followed.

The Evans File: Senior forward Shante Evans has scored in double figures in every game for Hofstra this season. A two-time All-American, Evans has made numerous watch lists for prestigious awards, as seen below:

Wooden Award: Forward Shante Evans continues to pile up the accolades for her strong play. The senior was named to the John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top-30 watch list by the Los Angeles Athletic Club.

Evans was one of just 30 women's basketball players who were tabbed as early front-runners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. The selections were based on last year's individual performance and team records. The list was chosen by a preseason poll of national college women's basketball media members.

Last season, Evans was named to the Wooden Award Midseason Top-20 list. As a junior, Evans garnered her second *Associated Press* All-American selection. She averaged 19.2 points and 10.5 rebounds per game. Evans was one of just two players from the Colonial Athletic Association to make the list, joining Delaware's Elena Delle Donne.

The 37th annual Wooden Award ceremony will honor the men's and Women's Wooden Award winners the weekend of April 5-7, 2013. It will include the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams.

She was Hofstra's first ever nominee for either award and following her sophomore season she was Hofstra's first-ever *Associated Press* All-American (honorable mention) before duplicating that feat at the end of the 2011-12 season.

Senior CLASS Award: Shante Evans was selected as a candidate for the Senior CLASS Award.

Evans (West Chester, PA) was one of just 30 women's basketball players picked to be a candidate for the prestigious award. To be eligible, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.

From the list of 30 candidates, a national media committee will select ten finalists for the 2012 Senior CLASS Award in February. Those 10 names will then be placed on the official ballot for a nationwide vote. Fan balloting will be coupled with votes from coaches and media to determine the recipient of the award.

Besides her athletic accomplishments, Evans' off-the-court work helped her earn the nomination. She has served as a team captain while also participating with teammates and staff in charitable initiatives like volunteering with the Interfaith Nutrition Network. In the classroom, she is pursuing a degree in history. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award honors the attributes of senior student-athletes in four areas: community, classroom, character and competition. The award program is designed exclusively for college seniors who are utilizing their complete athletic eligibility, remaining committed to their university and pursuing the many rewards a senior season can bring.

Naismith Trophy: Shante Evans was named to the Naismith Trophy early season watch list, the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced on Nov. 15.

Evans was one of just 50 players selected to the list for an award that is the most prestigious national award presented annually to college basketball's player of the year.

The West Chester, Pa. native made the Naismith Trophy watch list for the second consecutive season. Evans earned the distinction last November and was also one of just 32 players selected to the midseason list for 2012.

In late February, the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors will compile a mid-season team of the top 30 players in the nation. In March, the Naismith Trophy voting academy will vote to narrow the list to the four finalists.

Notable Naismith Women's College Player of the Year winners include Chamique Holdsclaw, Lisa Leslie, Rebecca Lobo, and Tina Charles.

Evans is one of just two players from Colonial Athletic Association schools to be added to the list, joining Delaware's Elena Delle Donne.

Double Up: Shante Evans picked up the third double-double of the season and the 53rd of her career when she added 19 points and 14 rebounds at Marist. In the previous game, Evans also scored 19 points and added 15 boards against Saint Joseph's.

Chasing CAA History: With 1,057 career rebounds, Shante Evans will now be looking to pick up the conference record in addition to Hofstra's all-time mark. The CAA record is held by James Madison's Meredith Alexis (2004-07) who hauled in 1,313 rebounds. Evans is on pace to challenge Alexis' mark this season. With 23 games left (including at least one CAA Tournament contest), Evans would need to average slightly

more than 11.1 rebounds per game to break the record. Evans' current average is 9.3 boards per game.

Weekly Award: Freshman guard Asia Jackson was named the Colonial Athletic Association's Rookie of the Week, the league announced on Nov. 12.

Jackson scored 21 combined points in two games in the season-opening WBI Tip-Off Classic at Ocean Center in Daytona Beach, Fla. The 5-foot-5 guard helped the Pride earn a split with a win against Stetson before Hofstra fell to Texas.

Jackson had a stealer collegiate debut, scoring 13 points and adding two steals and two rebounds during an Opening Day victory over the Hatters. She garnered the start in her first college game and logged 25 minutes.

The Peekskill, N.Y. saw more extensive playing time against the Big 12-member Longhorns, racking up eight points and three assists in 31 minutes.

AO Excels at REB: Junior Anna Onyeuku has become one of the best rebounders on the team, posting 10 boards in back-to-back games against St. John's and Saint Joseph's, respectively, to tie a career high.

She then shattered that mark with a 13-rebound effort versus Harvard on Dec. 1. By scoring 12 points in that contest, she notched her first double-double of the season and the second of her career.

Bench Boost: Though the box scores won't always list Annie Payton as a starter, the junior guard has logged minutes worthy of those who are out for the opening tap. Payton gave Hofstra huge lift as a reserve against Marist, scoring 16 points, including a pair of three-pointers, to help the Pride post a 22-20 advantage in bench points over the Red Foxes. For the season, Payton is one of just two players to average in double figures in points despite starting just three of the first seven games (10.1 PPG).

RPI: The NCAA released its final RPI rankings of the 2011-12 season on April 4 and Hofstra came in at No. 76. The Pride was the fourth-highest ranked CAA squad in the RPI.

Ranked Opponent: Delaware was highest-ranked opponent to play in the Mack Sports Complex since the building opened in 2000. Previously, Hofstra hosted No. 18 Old Dominion during the 2001-02 campaign. The Blue Hens were ranked 10th in the Associated Press poll and ninth in the coaches' poll when Delaware visited Hempstead on Feb. 16.

Formidable Slate: A challenging slate has greeted the Pride from the start as the season's schedule will feature 12 teams that made the postseason. Kilburn-Steveskey's squad will oppose five teams that made the NCAA Tournament, including a road loss against a St. John's squad that advanced to the Sweet 16 and a home-and-home with CAA rival Delaware, which was a three-seed.

This year's schedule has already featured teams from some of the nation's top conferences including the Big 12 (Texas), Big East (St. John's) as well as oncoming games against Southeastern (Auburn and Mississippi) and the Big 10 (Northwestern) opponents.

Hofstra faced schools from the Ivy League in consecutive games as the Pride made the short trip to face Ivy League preseason favorite Princeton on Dec. 5. Following that contest, Hofstra will take its last road trip of the 2012-13 non-conference season as the Pride travels to Auburn on Dec. 9.

The second annual Holiday Invitational will take place December 21-23 at the Mack Sports Complex and will once again feature a stellar field. Northwestern and Mississippi will join the Pride and will take part in the three-day round-robin

tournament. Hofstra will close the non-conference part of the schedule on Jan. 3 when it hosts Norfolk State.

The always-difficult CAA schedule commences Jan. 6 when the Pride hosts William & Mary. Hofstra will play Delaware on Feb. 3 and will conclude the home-and-home series against the Blue Hens on Feb. 28. The Pride will conclude the regular season March 6 at Northeastern. The CAA Championship will once again be held in the Show Place Arena in Upper Marlboro, Md.

We Preach Academics: Hofstra continued its string of success in the classroom with three players being named to the CAA All-Academic teams. Candice Bellocchio and Nicole Capurso were both second team selections in 2010-11 and again in 2011-12. Marie Malone was an all-academic honorable mention.

Team USA: Junior forward Shante Evans became the first Hofstra Basketball player (men's or women's basketball) to represent USA Basketball in international competition when she earned a spot on the USA Basketball Pan American Games squad. In four games (USA went 2-2 and finished seventh), Evans averaged 6.8 points, 7.8 rebounds and 17.8 minutes played. She ranked second on the team in rebounds per game, led the squad with 16 offensive rebounds and was fifth on the team in scoring. The tournament took place in Guadalajara, Mexico, in late October 2011.

Big East: With its wins over St. John's and Seton Hall last season, the Hofstra Women's Basketball team picked up its seventh and eighth all-time victories against teams currently in the Big East Conference. After falling to nationally ranked St. John's in the third game of the current season, Hofstra is now 8-22 all-time versus teams currently in the Big East and has won five of its last seven games against Big East schools. Did You Know?: Hofstra's .724 winning percentage (21-8) in its first Division I season of 1982-83 is the 39th best winning percentage of any team in its first season of Division I basketball.

Defensively Speaking: Senior Candace Bond earned her second straight CAA All-Defensive team selection. She led the CAA in steals for a second consecutive season. As a junior, her 84 steals was sixth-highest single season total in program history. While averaging 28.7 minutes per game, she also showed a good offensive game to complement her defensive prowess. Bond scored a career-high 18 points in WNIT loss to Harvard. She also added a career-best 14 rebounds versus Marist to go along with 15 points. She had at least one steal in 28 games.

Stolen Away: Candace Bond continued her propensity for steals, swiping 19 balls through the first seven games. She has at least one steal in 35 of the last 39 games dating to the start of the 2011-12 campaign.

Against Princeton on Dec. 5, Bond set a season-high and a team season high with five steals. That was part of a solid all-around game in which the senior scored nine points, grabbed six rebounds, tallied an assist and blocked a shot against a Tigers squad that was picked to win the Ivy League in the preseason.

Century Mark: Hofstra reached the 100-point plateau for the first time as a Division I program (since 1982-83) in its 100-97 win over William & Mary on Jan. 8, 2012. Hofstra last scored 100 points in a 100-51 victory over Cortland State on January 24, 1981.

Nice Streak: With just nine points against Drexel on January 29, Shante Evans saw her streak of 31 straight games in double figures come to an end. It was the fifth-longest streak in the nation at the time.
