- The Tigers are 12-4 in their last 16 games after starting the season 1-4
- This will be the 39th meeting between Auburn and Kentucky with Auburn leading 25-13; 10-5 when in Lexington
- Auburn is coming off a 54-47 win over South Carolina; Kentucky is coming off am 82-69 win at Alabama
- Kentucky won the last meeting, 65-54, in Duluth, Ga., in the SEC Tournament quarterfinals on March 5, 2010
- The Wildcats also won the last meeting in Lexington, downing the Tigers, 68-50, on Jan. 24, 2010
- Kentucky enters the game ranked 16th in the AP poll, 18th in the coaches' poll
- Auburn is 91-155 all-time vs. ranked teams, Nell Fortner is 10-38 (0-3 this season)
- The Tigers are 3-2 all-time vs. teams ranked 16th in the AP poll and 3-2 vs. ranked Kentucky teams
- This will be the sixth meeting between Fortner and UK's Matthew Mitchell with Mitchell leading the series 3-2
- The Tigers have a 185-152 all-time record in the SEC
- Auburn is 9-2 all-time when playing on Feb. 3, Nell Fortner is 2-0; AU is also 1-0 on Feb. 3 when playing Kentucky
- The Tigers are 146-84 all-time in the month of February, 22-23 under Fortner
- Auburn is 31-14 all-time against teams from the state of Kentucky and is 12-7 all-time when playing in Kentucky
- Pam Stackhouse, UK's Asst. AD for Women's Basketball, served as an assistant coach under Nell Fortner at Purdue
- AU Associate Head Coach Kerry Cremeans got her coaching start as a graduate assistant at Kentucky
- Six different Tigers have led the team in scoring this season
- Auburn is 85-2 under Fortner when scoring 70 or more points
- The Tigers are averaging 19.8 points per game scored on turnovers and have scored 20 or more points off turnovers on eight occasions this season
- Auburn is playing its first season in the new \$86 million Auburn Arena
- The season-opening win over Mercer was the first regular-season Auburn win, men or women, in the new facility
- Alli Smalley broke the Auburn career 3-point record against Temple, she now has 204 on her career
- Alli Smalley and Tyrese Tanner were named to the Junkanoo Jam All-Tournament Team on Nov. 27
- Auburn was picked sixth in the SEC Preseason Media and Coaches' polls, Tennessee was picked to win the league
- Alli Smalley was picked the the Coaches' Preseason All-SEC First Team and to the media's Second Team
- · Nell Fortner is beginning her seventh season at Auburn, marking her longest tenure at any job
- The Chicago State game was Nell Fortner's 200th as Auburn's head coach, she was 121-79 in her first 200 games
- The Tigers welcome five newcomers: Peyton Davis, Camille Glymph, Courtney Strain, Tyrese Tanner, Jassany Williams
- Carla McGhee returns to Auburn for her second stint as an assistant coach
- Auburn will be a first- and second-round host of the 2011 NCAA Tournament in the new Auburn Arena

#### **SCOUTING AUBURN**

After a difficult 1-4 start to the season, Auburn has rallied to go 12-4 in its last 16 games, including a five-game winning streak. The streak was the longest since the Tigers won six in a row from Nov. 28 - Dec. 28, 2009.

The Tigers have lived off their defense this season, averaging 9.8 steals and 4.0 blocks per game. Auburn opponents average 19.4 turnovers per game with the Tigers scoring an average of 19.8 points per game off of turnovers.

Senior Alli Smalley leads the team with 11.8 points per game, followed by sophomore Blanche Alverson with 11.5 per game.

Smalley and Alverson have combined to average 3.4 3-pointers made per game.

Jordan Greenleaf pulls down a team-high 7.7 rebounds per game, along with her 9.5 points. Sophomore Morgan Toles averages 9.0 points and 5.5 assists per game, good enough for first in the SEC.

#### **SCOUTING KENTUCKY**

Kentucky returns three starters from last season's team that went 28-8 (11-5 SEC) and took runner-up honors in the SEC. The Wildcats also advanced to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament.

UK went 11-2 in non-conference games, falling only to Louisville (78-52) and Duke (54-48). The Duke loss was the first of three in a row for the Wildcats as Kentucky went on to lose to Arkansas (78-67) and Georgia (61-59). Since then, however, Kentucky has gone on to win its last six games, including a pair of comeback victories on the road at Ole Miss and Alabama.

Victoria Dunlap, last season's SEC Player of the Year, leads the Wildcats and the conference in scoring with 17.8 points per game. She also ranks fourth in the league in rebounding (9.3), first in steals (3.4) and fifth in blocked shots (1.6).

She is also one of three Wildcats averaging double figures in scoring, leading A'dia Mathies with 13.3 points per game and Keyla Snowden with 10.8.

As a team, Kentucky shoots 40.2 percent from the field and 32.8 percent from 3-point range. The Wildcats average 74.8 points per game and 39.7 rebounds per game.

#### LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN

Auburn sophomore Morgan Toles scored a career-high 21 points as the Auburn women's basketball team claimed a 54-47 win over the South Carolina Gamecocks Jan. 30 at the Auburn Arena.

Senior Alli Smalley added 11 points while sophomore Blanche Alverson pulled down a career-high nine rebounds along with seven points.

Auburn led from the start and went on to lead by as many as 11 points before South Carolina mounted its comeback. The Gamecocks

responded with a 12-1 run that tied the game at 39-39.

The Tigers did not trail until South Carolina took a 42-41 lead on an lesia Walker 3-pointer. The teams would exchange the lead twice more before Toles hit a pair of free throws with 5:30 left in the game to tie it up. 47-47.

Toles scored all nine of Auburn's points in the last 5:30, taking the Tigers from down two to up seven for the 54-47 win.

Ashley Bruner came off the bench to lead the Gamecocks with 15 points and eight rebounds. Walker scored 12 points with six rebounds while La'Keisha Sutton dished out a game-high four assists.

Auburn held the Gamecocks to just 32.2 percent from the field. South Carolina finished 4-of-15 from beyond the arc and 5-of-13 from the free throw line. The Tigers also forced 18 USC turnovers, led by four steals from Smalley. Auburn went on to score 17 points off turnovers in the game.

#### LAST TIME OUT FOR KENTUCKY

Victoria Dunlap had 25 points and 15 rebounds to lead No. 17 Kentucky to an 82-69 win over Alabama on Sunday. Keyla Snowden added 13 points and A'dia Mathies had 12 for the Wildcats.

With the game tied at 56 midway through the second half, Kentucky went on a 17-5 run to take control of the game. Alabama could only get within eight the rest of the game. Tierney Jenkins had 27 points and 11 rebounds to lead Alabama.

The game saw 12 ties and 20 lead changes before Kentucky took control late in the game. The Wildcats forced 23 Alabama turnovers, scoring 28 points from them. UK also scored 18 second-chance points by way of 21 offensive rebounds.

#### **FORTNER VS. MITCHELL**

This will be the sixth meeting between Nell Fortner and Kentucky's Matthew Mitchell with Mitchell leading the series, 3-2.

Fortner is in her seventh season at Auburn and eighth overall as a collegiate head coach, holding a 146-92 career record. Mitchell is in his third season at Kentucky, sixth as a head coach, and owns a 108-73 career mark.

#### **AGAINST THE SEC**

Auburn has a 185-152 all-time record in the Southeastern Conference. The Tigers have won five SEC titles and four SEC Tournament titles, most recently winning the regular-season title in 2009 after 14-2 league mark.

#### LAST TIME VS. KENTUCKY (March 5, 2010)

Freshman point guard Morgan Toles scored a team-high 13 points for No. 10 seed Auburn in the Southeastern Conference Tournament quarterfinals on March 5, but second-seeded Kentucky's defense scored 22 points off Auburn turnovers as the Wildcats went on to a 65-54 win.

Auburn stayed with Kentucky through most of the first half, leading by as many as five points with 8:45 left in the period. But, Kentucky closed strong, finishing the half on an 18-6 run to take a 32-25 halftime lead into the lockerroom. Kentucky junior Victoria Dunlap scored 18 of her game-high 24 points in the first half to put the Wildcats ahead.

In the second half, the Tigers went on an 11-0 run, fueled by five points from senior KeKe Carrier and four from Smalley, to cut the lead to three at 39-36 with 13:53 left in the game. Auburn could not maintain the pressure on Kentucky as the Wildcats scored eight of the next 10 points to re-establish their lead. UK would go on to twice lead by as many as 15 points with Auburn getting no closer than nine in the final minutes.

Dunlap led the Wildcats with 24 points, along with six rebounds, three steals and four blocked shots. A'dia Mathies scored 15 points along with seven rebounds, three assists and two steals. Auburn shot 41.1 percent from the field, connecting on 23 of 56 attempts, but could only find the goal on two of its 11 3-point attempts for 18.2 percent. The Tigers also struggled from the line, going 6-of-12.

## LAST TIME VS. KENTUCKY IN LEXINGTON (Jan. 24, 2010)

Kentucky's defense proved to be too much for Auburn on Jan. 24 as the Tigers dropped a 68-50 decision to the 25th-ranked Wildcats at Memorial Coliseum in Lexington, Ky. KeKe Carrier came off the bench to lead the Tigers with 11 points, six rebounds and three blocked shots.

The Wildcats forced 25 Auburn turnovers in the game, turning them into 30 points and pulled down 15 offensive rebounds for 13 second-chance points in the win.

Kentucky took a 5-0 start from the opening tip and never looked back, leading by as many as 20 points in the game.

The Wildcats led by 20 with 4:11 left to play in the first half, but Auburn capped off the period on an 8-2 run to close the gap to 14 by halftime. Carrier scored all eight points in the stretch as The Tigers went into the locker room down 38-24 at the half.

Auburn kept the momentum going in the second half, cutting the lead to 10 with 12:59 left to play, but turnovers stung the Tigers as UK forced four in a two minute time span to build the lead back up to 19, 54-35, with 8:19 left in the game. The Tigers would come no closer than 15 points in the final minutes as Kentucky held on for the 68-50 victory.

Blanche Alverson, Jordan Greenleaf and Alli Smalley all followed Carrier with nine points each. Parrisha Simmons pulled down a game-high eight rebounds in the loss along with her six points.

#### ON THIS DATE...

Auburn is 9-2 all-time when playing on Feb. 3, and is 2-0 under Nell Fortner. Auburn is also 1-0 when playing Kentucky on Feb. 3, defeating the Wildcats, 72-53, in 1987. The Tigers won their last game on Feb. 3, downing Mississippi State, 68-42, in 2008.

#### **IN FEBRUARY**

Auburn is 146-84 all-time in the month of February, including a 22-23 mark under Nell Fortner (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that season).

#### IN JANUARY

Auburn is 186-98 all-time in the month of January, including a 23-26 mark under Nell Fortner (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that season).

#### **AGAINST THE BLUE GRASS STATE**

Auburn holds a 34-14 record against teams from the state of Kentucky. Records against Kentucky teams: Louisville (2-1), Murray State (1-0), Eastern Kentucky (2-0), Kentucky (25-13) and Western Kentucky (4-0).

When playing in the state of Kentucky, Auburn holds a 12-7 record and an 11-7 record when playing in Lexington. Records against teams when playing in Kentucky: Dayton [Lexington] (0-1), Florida [Lexington] (1-0), Georgia [Lexington] (0-1), Kentucky [Lexington] (10-5) and Western Kentucky [Bowling Green] (1-0).

#### **AGAINST THE RANKED**

Auburn holds an 91-155 all-time record against teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 poll. Head Coach Nell Fortner is 10-38 against ranked teams at Auburn.

The Tigers are 3-2 all-time against teams ranked 16th in the country, Fortner is 1-0 against teams ranked 16th with the win coming against the Wildcats last season, 65-53.

Auburn is also 3-2 all-time when facing a ranked Kentucky team. Two of those meetings came last season with the Tigers aging 1-1.

Auburn is 0-3 against teams ranked in the AP poll this season after losses to No. 16 Florida State (67-61), No. 6 Duke (75-62) and No. 5 Tennessee (73-53).

#### **NELL'S COACHING TREE**

Auburn head coach Nell Fortner should be familiar with Kentucky Assistant Athletics Director for Women's Basketball Pam Stackhouse, after all, she hired Stackhouse in 1996 as a member of her Purdue coaching staff.

Stackhouse coached alongside Fortner, current Auburn assistant Kerry Cremeans and Carolyn Peck, who led Purdue to a national title as head coach in 1999.

Fortner's Boilermakers posted a 17-11 record in 2007, winning the Big Ten title and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

The Auburn women's basketball teamis counting down to 800 victories in the program's history, currently sitting at 792. With eight regular-season games remaining, along with potential postseason play, Auburn could reach the 800 plateau this season.

#### **DEADLY TANDEM**

Alli Smalley and Blanche Alverson have hit 284 combined 3-pointers in their career, making them the second-most dangerous long-range duo in Auburn's history.

Samantha Williams and Kristen Mulligan hold the honor as Auburn's most prolific 3-point duo, connecting on 310 from 1992-96.

# ALVERSON NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (Jan. 17)

For the first time in her career, Auburn sophomore Blanche Alverson was named the Southeastern Conference Player of the Week, the league announced Jan. 17. Alverson earned the award after leading the Tigers to a 2-0 record during the previous week, averaging 18.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 3.5 steals per game.

Included in the week was a career-high 27 points and five 3-pointers vs. Ole Miss. She also tallied a career-high four steals vs. LSU along with two blocked shots.

#### **BOUNCING BACK**

After winning the season-opener, Auburn went on to lose the next four games, including two to ranked teams. Since then, the Tigers have notched an 12-4 record to move above .500 for the first time since the season-opener.

#### **TURNING ON THE DEFENSE**

Senior Alli Smalley has turned up the defensive pressure lately. The senior has 40 steals on the season, but 24 of them have come in the last nine games. Since the Dec. 30 game vs. Jacksonville State, Smalley is averaging 2.7 steals per game. Her 1.9 steals per game on the season ranks her seventh in the SEC.

#### **CALLING NO. 100**

With her start in the Jan. 9 game at Vanderbilt, senior Alli Smalley earned the 100th consecutive start of her Auburn career.

She earned her first collegiate start on Dec. 29, 2007 at Saint Joseph's, the 14th game of her collegiate career, and has not left. Since then, Smalley has started in 105 consecutive games.

#### **BREAKING INTO THE TOP 10**

With her layup at the 3:42 mark of the first half of the Jan. 16 game vs. LSU, senior Alli Smalley tied former Tiger Lori Monroe (1979-83) for

10th all-time in career scoring at Auburn with 1,409 points.

Smalley went on to score 10 points in the game, giving her sole posession of 10th. She currently ranks 10th with 1.454 career points.

#### **BOMBS AWAY**

With her two 3-pointers on Jan. 20 at Mississippi State, sophomore Blanche Alverson moved into Auburn's top-10 career 3-point list. The pair gave her 75 on her career, moving her past DeWanna Bonner for sole posession of 10th all-time.

#### **CLEARING 20**

Senior Alli Smalley became the first Tiger to clear the 20-point plateau this season, scoring 22 in Auburn's loss to Temple on Dec. 4. It marked the 14th time in her career to clear 20 points.

Sophomore Blanche Alverson followed with her first career 20-point game against Ole Miss on Jan. 13 with a career-high 27 points. Fellow Sophomore Morgan Toles notched one of her own on Jan. 30 against South Carolina, scoring a career-high 21 points in the win.

#### **OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION**

Auburn tied its season-high with 85 points scored against Ole Miss on Jan. 13. It ties the mark the Tigers set earlier in the season against Seton Hall. The 85 points is also the most for the Tigers against an SEC opponent since Auburn racked up 94 points against Arkansas on March 1, 2009.

#### **DOUBLE DOWN**

Senior Jordan Greenleaf pulled down 12 rebounds with 16 points in the season-opener against Florida State, earning her first double-double of the season and fourth of her career. She came back with another at South Florida, scoring 13 points with 10 rebounds.

Against Jacksonville State, sophomore point guard Morgan Toles notched her first career double-double with 10 points and 10 assists. She became the first Auburn player to record a points-assists double-double since Whitney Boddie accomplished the feat against Ole Miss on March 6, 2009 in the SEC Tournament.

#### **LEAGUE BEST**

Sophomore Morgan Toles has proven herself to be among the best point guards in the SEC this season. She currently leads the conference in both assists and assist-to-turnover ratio. Toles has a league-best 5.5 assists per game, edging Vanderbilt's Jence Rhoads' 4.7 per game. She also has a commanding 2.9 assist-to-turnover ratio, leading Rhoads and her 2.0 ratio.

#### **DEFENSE MAKES OFFENSE**

Auburn has used its defense to create its offense this season. So far, the Tigers have scored a total of 415 points off of turnovers (more than 30 percent of Auburn's total points scored), including a season-high mark of 39 against Alabama A&M. AU has scored 20 or more points off turnovers in eight games this season.

While averaging 9.8 steals, 4.0 blocks and 19.4 opponent turnovers per game this season, Auburn has turned the efforts into an average of 19.8 points off turnovers per game.

- The league also had the distinction of providing both national finalists twice in its history in 1996 (Tennessee 83, Georgia 65) and in 1989 (Tennessee 76, Auburn 60).
  - SEC teams have won 329 NCAA Tournament games against 168 losses (.662) for an average of 11.4 NCAA wins per year.
- In addition, all 12 current members have appeared in the NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC has paced the pack in NCAA tournament bids 21 times in its 29-year history.
- The SEC was the first league to ever have eight teams invited to the NCAA
   Tournament, doing so in 1999 and 2002.
- The SEC was also the first league to ever have seven teams invited to the NCAA Tournament and earned this honor a leading seven times (1986, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2004).
- The SEC is one of a handful of leagues to have won three national tournament titles with eight NCAA, two WNIT and three NWIT. Along with the eight NCAA championships won by Tennessee, Arkansas (1999) and Auburn (2003) captured the current Women's NIT titles. But the first-ever SEC national title belongs to Georgia, winners of the 1981 NWIT which predates the current NCAA tournament. LSU (1985) and Kentucky (1990) each won NWIT titles. Both Arkansas (1987) and South Carolina (1979) won the WNIT as members of their previous conferences.
- In 2003, Auburn won the WNIT title with wins over South Alabama, Florida State, Richmond, Creighton and Baylor. In 1999, the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks defeated Wisconsin 76-64 to claim the SEC's first WNIT championship.
- In 1981, Georgia defeated Pittsburg, California and Arizona State (in OT) to capture the NWIT Championship, the first-ever national championship of any kind for the SEC in women's basketball.

#### **BALANCED SCORING**

Auburn had five players score in double figures in its last two non-conference games. Against Alabama A&M, it was Greenleaf (15), Alverson (14), Smalley (12), Hilliard (12) and Toles (11). Against Jacksonville State, it was Alverson (17), Greenleaf (15), Smalley (11), Tanner (11) and Toles (10).

Against Florida in the SEC home opener, the Tigers had four players score in double figures: Hilliard (17), Alverson (15), Greenleaf (11) and Smalley (10). It marked the fifth time this season for Auburn to have four players in double figures. The other times were against South Alabama with Smalley (15), Williams (13), Greenleaf (11) and Toles (10) scoring in double figures; and against Seton Hall with Smalley (15), Jennings (14), Toles (12) and Alverson (12).

#### DOMINATING THE PAINT

Auburn has out-scored its opponents in the paint 11 times this season, but against Alabama A&M it was a dominating effort with 44 points scored in the pait. It marked the most points scored by the Tigers in the paint in almost two years as it was the most since Auburn tallied 56 against Arkansas on March 1, 2009.

#### **SPREADING THE WEALTH**

After freshman Tyrese Tanner led Auburn with 15 points at Chicago State, she became the sixth Tiger this season to lead Auburn in scoring. Others are Alli Smalley, Blanche Alverson, Chantel Hilliard, Morgan Toles and Jordan Greenleaf.

#### LONG DISTANCE RECORD BREAKER

With her 3-pointer with 1:22 left in the Temple game on Dec. 4, Auburn senior Alli Smalley recorded the 185th 3-pointer of her Auburn career, giving her sole possession of the AU 3-point record.

#### NO. 200 FOR NELL

The Dec. 21 game at Chicago State marked the 200th for Nell Fortner as Auburn's head coach. She picked up the win and had a 121-79 record through her first 200 games.

#### STARTING OFF WITH A WIN

Auburn opened SEC play at Alabama on Jan. 3 with a 66-55 victory, marking the third time under Nell Fortner for the Tigers to win their SEC opener and just the second time for Auburn to win its SEC road opener. All-time, the Tigers are now 12-20 in SEC road openers.

The Tigers came out in their next game to defeat Florida, 73-56, in Auburn's first SEC game in the new Auburn Arena. AU is now 18-14 in SEC home openers and 3-4 under Nell Fortner.

#### **TOUGH START**

Auburn is coming off its most difficult start to a season in the program's history. After opening against Mercer, Auburn played 16th-ranked Florida State and sixth-ranked Duke, giving the Tigers two ranked opponents in the first three games for the frist time in school history.

#### **BREAKING THE STREAK**

Auburn's 85-51 win over Seton Hall broke a four-game losing streak for the Tigers - a streak that tied for the longest losing streak since the 2004-05 season. Auburn has not lost more than four consecutive games since it lost six in a row from Dec. 31, 2004 - Jan. 20, 2005.

#### **TURN IT IN TO POINTS**

The Tigers have notched a pair of impressive defensive performances this season. In the first, Auburn forced 31 Seton Hall turnovers on Nov. 27, turning them in to 36 points on the other end of the floor.

The Tigers were at it again against Alabama A&M, forcing 29 turnovers on 18 steals, turning them into 39 points on the other end. It marked the most points scored by the Tigers off turnovers since Auburn scored 39 against Sam Houston State on Dec. 5, 2008. The 18 steals were also the most since AU picked up 22 against Alabama A&M on Nov. 14, 2008.

#### **DISHING IT OUT**

By playing in her 30th career game against Mercer, Auburn sophomore became eligible for the career assist rankings. With 240 on her career, she ranks fifth all-time at Auburn with 4.9 per aame.

#### I'M FIRST!

While it was Mercer's Sharnea Boykin who scored the first field goal in Auburn Arena, sophomore Blanche Alverson came down on the very next posession to pick up Auburn's first field goal and the first 3-pointer in the facility.

#### **OFFENSE WINS GAMES**

Auburn is 85-2 when scoring 70 or more points in the Nell Fortner era. The only times Auburn has lost when scoring at least 70 points was on Jan. 20, 2005 vs. No. 7 Tennessee, 71-81 and Feb. 19, 2009 at No. 18 Vanderbilt, 73-70. When scoring less than 70 points, Auburn is 44-79 during the Fortner era.

#### **HOME COOKIN'**

Since a 77-70 loss to Virginia on Jan. 5, 1992, the Auburn Tigers have compiled a 129-10 record against non-conference opponents when playing at home.

#### **OUTSIDE THE LEAGUE**

Nell Fortner has guided the Tigers to a 78-33 ledger in non-conference play. When playing at home, Fortner's teams have posted a 33-7 mark. The only seven non-conference losses at home came from Xavier on Dec. 2, 2005 (58-60), No. 2 Duke on Dec. 31, 2004 (61-80), No. 20 George Washington on Jan. 3, 2008 (66-68), No. 15 Texas A&M on Nov. 22, 2009 (59-79), No. 16 Florida State on Nov. 15, 2010 (61-67), No. 6 Duke on Nov. 18, 2010 (62-75) and Temple on Dec. 4, 2010 (62-61).

#### **BUILDING WITH EXPERIENCE**

Auburn enters the 2010-11 season with a mix of youth and experience. Nine of the 14 players on the roster are either freshmen or sophomores, but among the nine returning players, Auburn brings back 250 games of experience as a starter.

## SMALLEY AND TANNER NAMED TO JUNKANOO JAM ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

For their play at the Junkanoo Jam, senior Alli Smalley and freshman Tyrese Tanner were named to the Junkanoo Jam All-Tournament Team.

Smalley averaged 13.5 points, 2.5 assists and 2.5 rebounds per game in the two games, scoring a team-high 15 points in Auburn's win over Seton Hall. Tanner averaged 6.0 points and 3.5 rebounds, along with a team-high 2.5 steals per game on the week.

Also on the all-tournament team were Boston College's Stafanie Murphy and Sacred Heart's Callan Taylor. BC's Carolyn Swords was named the tournament MVP.

#### **SMALLEY NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC**

Auburn senior Alli Smalley was named to the Preseason All-SEC team by both the coaches and the media. The Coaches selected Smalley to the Preseason All-SEC First Team while the media voted her to the Second Team.

Smalley averaged 15.7 points per game last season, chipping in 4.4 rebounds and 2.3 assists per outing.

# AUBURN PICKED SIXTH IN SEC PRESEASON MEDIA AND COACHES POLLS

Coming off a 15-16 season, the Auburn women's basketball team was picked sixth in the preseason SEC media and coaches polls. Tennessee was the preseason favorite in both polls.

#### **MAKING IT HOME**

Nell Fortner enters her seventh season as Auburn's head coach, marking her longest tenure at any position in her career. The longest Fortner had stayed at a job prior to Auburn came from 1990-95 while she was an assistant coach at Louisiana Tech under legendary head coach Leon Barmore.

#### **NEW FACES**

Auburn welcomes five new faces to its lineup this season in freshmen Peyton Davis (Birmingham, Ala.), Camille Glymph (Greenville, S.C.), Courtney Strain (Woodland, Ala.), Tyrese Tanner (Birmingham, Ala.) and Jassany Williams (Davie, Fla.). The recruiting class was ranked 18th in the country by ESPN.com's HoopGurlz.

#### FIRST GAME IN AUBURN ARENA

Auburn won its inaugural game in the new \$86 million Auburn Arena. The Tigers defeated Mercer, 79-61, for the first regular-season Auburn win, men or women, in the new facility.

The Tigers move across the street this season from its former home, Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum - the team's home since 1974. Auburn played its first game in BEMC on Jan. 11, 1974, defeating in-state rival Alabama, 69-31.

#### **TIGERS SIGN HASINA MUHAMMAD FOR 2011-12**

The Auburn women's basketball signed 6-1 guard/forward Hasina Muhammad (Ridgeway HS, Memphis, Tenn.) to a National Letter of Intent, head coach Nell Fortner announced on Nov. 10.

Muhammad is ranked as the No. 66 overall player in the country by ESPN's HoopGurlz. She is also ranked as the 17th-best guard in the country and No. 2 prospect in Tennessee by HoopGurlz.

Muhammad was also ranked by two other recruiting services. She is the No. 50 overall prospect according to the All-Star Girls Report and No. 47 in the Girls Basketball Report.

#### WNBA CHAMPION... AGAIN

After winning a WNBA title in 2009 with the Phoenix Mercury, former Tiger Le'Coe Willingham put herself in select company when she turned around and won it again in 2010, this time with the Seattle Storm.

Willingham, a native of Augusta, Ga., averaged 5.5 points and 4.1 rebounds per game as she helped the Storm to a league-best 28-6 record

The Storm swept Los Angeles in the first round of the playoffs, setting up a meeting of Willingham and her former team, the Mercury, in the conference finals. She defeated her old team, and former Tiger DeWanna Bonner, in a sweep for a trip to the WNBA finals.

Seattle made it a perfect run through the playoffs, sweeping the Atlanta Dream in three games for the title.

#### **TIGERS ON THE TUBE**

As part of the SEC's television agreement with ESPN, the Auburn women's basketball team will be televised six times this season on Fox Sports Net, CSS, the SEC Network and ESPN2. The SEC Tournament will be televised on Fox Sports Net, ESPNU and ESPN2. In all, the SEC will be televised in more than 70 games this season.

Auburn will be televised three times at home at the new Auburn Arena and three times on the road. The first will be the SEC-opener on Jan. 2 at Alabama on CSS, followed by a Jan. 16 home meeting with LSU on CSS. The Tigers will appear on CSS again a week later, on Jan. 23. as Tennessee comes to town.

Auburn will then make an ESPN2 appearance on Feb. 13 at Arkansas before traveling to South Carolina for a Feb. 20 game on the Fox Sports Net

The Tigers will close out the regular season with a Feb. 27 home game against Kentucky on the SEC Network.

#### **Quoting Head Coach Nell Fortner**

On Kentucky...

"Kentucky is a very good team. They have great quickness and they have the returning SEC Player of the Year in Victoria Dunlap, a very nice inside player for them. Kentucky has great quickness, speed, they have great depth and they are playing very well right now, so it is going to be a tough battle."

On reaching the mid-point of the SEC season...

"We all feel good about coming out of the month of
January 6-2. We have three home games left, five on
the road, so we have a tough schedule ahead of us.

We are playing pretty well right now, but we have to
continue competing hard and winning games."

On the battle for second-place with Kentucky...

"All the games are big. To be able to go on the road and grab a win or two is very important, so we will do all we can to go on the road this time and win the ballgame. The SEC is a tough conference and every game is tough, but I like where we sit right now. We just have continue taking care of business."

On four Tigers averaging double figure scoring in SEC games this season...

"It is nice to get balanced scoring, there is no question about that. We need everybody to score, but to be able to spread the ball out and for teams to not be able to focus just on one player is important. Also, it does not allow them to key on one player and shut one thing down and then you do not have other options. It is nice to have a lot of options."

## AUBURN TO HOST 2011 NCAA TOURNAMENT FIRST AND SECOND ROUNDS

The new Auburn Arena will close out its first season of operation, March 19-22, as a host site for the first and second rounds of the 2011 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament. Auburn's bid to host the opening rounds was selected by the NCAA and announced on Oct. 29, 2009.

The 2011 event will mark the first time for Auburn to host the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament under its current bid format. The Tigers hosted NCAA Tournament games on nine occasions between 1983 and 1993, posting an 11-0 record over that time. Auburn last hosted on March 21, 1993 when the Tigers downed Louisville, 66-61.

Auburn will be one of 16 first- and second-round sites in 2011. The complete list of host sites includes Albuquerque, N.M. (University of New Mexico. The Pit/Bob King Court): Auburn, Ala. (Auburn University, Auburn Arena); Charlottesville, Va. (University of Virginia, John Paul Jones Arena); Cincinnati, Ohio (Xavier University, Cintas Center); College Park, Md. (University of Maryland, Comcast Center); Columbus, Ohio (Ohio State University, St. John Arena); Durham, N.C. (Duke University, Cameron Indoor Stadium); Knoxville, Tenn. (University of Tennessee, Thompson-Boling Arena); Salt Lake City, Utah (University of Utah, John M. Huntsman Center); Spokane, Wash. (Gonzaga University, McCarthey Athletic Center); Shreveport, La. (Louisiana Tech University, CenturyTel Center); Stanford, Calif. (Stanford University, Maples Pavilion); Storrs, Conn. (University of Connecticut, Harry A. Gampel Pavilion); University Park, Penn. (Pennsylvania State University, Bryce Jordan Center); Waco, Texas (Baylor University, Ferrell Center); and Wichita, Kan. (Wichita State University, INTRUST Bank Arena).

The 16 advancing teams will continue play at four regional sites: Dayton, Ohio (University of Dayton Arena), Spokane, Wash. (Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena), Dallas, Texas (American Airlines Center) and Philadelphia, Pa. (Liacouras Center). The 2011 NCAA Women's Final Four will be held at Conseco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, Ind. on April 3 and 5.

AUBURN - Temple's Brittany Lewis hit her only shot of the game, a 3-pointer from the right side with 1:22 left in the game, giving the Owls a lead it would not give up as Temple pulled out the 62-61 win against Auburn on Dec. 4. Senior Alli Smalley passed the 20-point mark for the first time this season, leading the Tigers with 22 points in the loss.

Auburn trailed during most of the first half, but came back to tie the game at 33 going into halftime. Back-to-back 3-pointers from Smalley and sophomore Blanche Alverson in the final three minutes tied the game up going into the locker room.

One of the bright spots of the game for Auburn was a Smalley 3-pointerwith 8:37 left in the game. Not only did the trey give the Tigers a six-point lead, but was also 185th of Smalley's career, giving her the Auburn record for career 3-pointers.

Auburn eventually led by as many as seven points after a Hilliard layup with 6:27 to go, giving the Tigers a 54-47 lead. But Temple used its outside shooting, hitting four 3-pointers in the final five minutes, to out-score Auburn 15-7 down the stretch for the win.

Three Tigers scored in double figures, led by Smalley's 22 points. Alverson and Hilliard scored 10 points each while senior Jordan Greenleaf scored nine points along with her game-high 12 rebounds.

Temple was led by Shey Peddy, who was 3-of-4 from beyond the arc, with 17 points and nine rebounds. Kristen McCarthy and Qwedia Wallace each added 15 for the Owls.

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Sophomore Blanche Alverson scored a gamehigh 16 points as the Auburn women's basketball team was able to hold off a late George Washington surge to pull out the 52-45 win at the Charles E. Smith Center in Washington, D.C. on Dec. 15.

Alverson and senior Alli Smalley combined for 30 of Auburn's 52 points, knocking down a combined six 3-pointers in the process. Senior Jordan Greenleaf anchored down the defensive end, pulling down a game-high 11 rebounds while blocking four shots.

Both teams struggled from the field with the Tigers hitting just 29.7 percent (19-of-64) of their shots. George Washington did not fare better, hitting just 33.3 percent (18-of-54).

The loss was the first for the Colonials at home as GW held a 5-0 record in the Smith Center coming into the game. Auburn led by 16 at one point in the second half, George Washington's largest home deficit this season.

Auburn out-rebounded the Colonials 49-36, including 27 Tiger offensive rebounds that were turned in to 17 second-chance points. Auburn flexed its defensive power, using nine steals to force 15 GW turnovers and then scoring 15 points off the turnovers. The Tigers also blocked a season-high seven shots.

Morgan Toles tied her season high with seven assists while Morgan Jennings came off the bench to tie her career high with six assists. Jennings also led the Tigers with three steals, followed by Alverson and Toles with two each.

Boilermaker Blockbuste

Senior Alli Smalley led the Tigers with 18 points, followed by Blanche Alverson with 10. Freshman Jassany Williams led the team in rebounding with five while also collecting a blocked shot and a pair of steals.

Auburn finished the game 21-of-32 from the free throw and was 11-of-13 in the final 52 seconds of the game.

Morgan Toles scored 14 points followed by Blanche Alverson with 13. Jordan Greenleaf led Auburn on the boards with 12.

The Tigers started out slow in the opening half as Ole Miss capitalized off of eight Auburn turnovers , leading to 12 of the Rebels 33 first-half points. Down one with 3:18 to play, an Alverson jumper gave the Tigers momentum and Auburn outscored Ole Miss 6-2 in the remainder of the half to take a three-point lead going into the locker room.

After trailing by as many as seven points in the first half, the Tigers closed out the period on a 21-11 run. Alverson's hot hand carried the Tigers through the first 20 minutes, as she went 7-for-11 from the floor with two 3-pointers and 16 total points.

Ole Miss would never lead again as Auburn opened the second half on a 13-3 run to take a 13-point lead less than four minutes into the half. The Tigers would go on to lead by as many as 15 points, but was never able to pull away as Ole Miss' Kayla Melson scored 21 of her game-high 29 points in the second half to keep the Rebels around.

Morgan Toles had eight assists and went 5-for-9 from the floor for 12 points, adding five rebounds. Jordan Greenleaf added 15 points with three assists and four steals. Junior Parrisha Simmons led the Tigers in rebounding with a game-high seven.
