The Field

Fourth-ranked Auburn joins the top teams in the country as 20 of the top 25 teams according to the latest *Golfweek* rankings will be headed to Columbus, Ohio. The Tigers will tee off with No. 12 Texas A&M and No. 14 UNLV in the first day of competition. Winning their respective regions are No. 9 Tennessee from the East, No. 5 Southern California from the Central and No. 7 Purdue from the West Region. The Course

The Scarlet Course at The Ohio State University Golf Club is a par 72, 6,203-yard course. The course was closed until recently due to renovations in order to be ready for the NCAA Championship.

Auburn at the NCAA Championship

Auburn has now advanced to the NCAA Championship 10 of the last 11 years and 12 total years. Last season, the Tigers finished third behind Duke and UCLA. Auburn's highest finish in the NCAA Championship was a tie for second in 2002. Auburn's best individual finish is also a tie for second as Danielle Downey set the mark in 2002 as well.

Quoting Head Coach Kim Evans

"We are really just happy to be at this tournament. We didn't play as well as we had hoped at the Regional, but the pressure is off now. It is time to get out there and play golf. We have a very experienced team, but there are a lot of great teams in the tournament, as you would expect, so at this point, everyone is experienced and everyone is at the top of their game. We just have to concentrate on playing Auburn golf the way we know how to do it."

Looking Back

Auburn's sixth-place finish in the NCAA East Region was enough to send the Tigers to their 10th NCAA Championship in the past 11 years. Auburn jumped up four spots on the final day of competition to advance as one of the top eight teams from the East.

Luck In The Buckeye State

Auburn crushed the competition at the Lady Buckeye Invitational April 22-23, defeating the field by 27 strokes. Maria Martinez also earned medalist honors at the tournament, finishing with a 9-under in three rounds. Junior Nicole Hage finished right behind Martinez in second with an 8-under. Auburn's three-round total of 849 demolished the school record of 864, previously set at the 2002 SEC Championship. The tournament win for Auburn was the fifth of the season, tying the 2000 and 2001 seasons for most tournament wins in a year.

Tigers in the Polls

In the latest *Golfweek* rankings, the Tigers are ranked No. 4 as a team. Also ranked by the magazine is Senior Maria Martinez, who is currently sitting as the No. 3 golfer in the NCAA behind Duke's Amanda Blumenherst and USC's Irene Cho. Martinez is followed by Nicole Hage, ranked No. 31, Margaret Shirley in 55th, Jessica Lovell in 87th and Abigale Schepperle sits in 100th.

Defending The Title

Auburn successfully defended its SEC title April 16 at the Vanderbilt Legends Club by defeating Tennessee by one stroke. The Tigers defeated Georgia in a playoff in 2005 for the title, giving Auburn the four closest SEC Championship titles in league history. Senior Maria Martinez also won medalist honors for Auburn, finishing at 5-under for the tournament.



Martinez Best In The SEC

Senior Maria Martinez not only claimed SEC Golfer of the Year honors, but the individual title at the SEC Championship as well. Martinez shot a 5-under 211, which was the lowest SEC Championship score for an Auburn player in the school's history. Martinez became the fifth Auburn player to win medalist honors and the first since Danielle Downey in 2000.

Clutch Player

When the tournament is on the line, Auburn is happy to have Maria Martinez on its side. The senior has now won three SEC Championships and has sunk a putt to win all three for the team. In 2003, 2005 and 2006, Martinez's birdie putt won the SEC title for the Tigers including a playoff vs. Georgia in 2005 and a 12-foot birdie putt on the 18th hole in the 2006 Championship to defeat Tennessee by one stroke.

SEC Golfer of the Week

Senior Maria Martinez was named the SEC Golfer of the Week on March 15 for her win at the Lady Gamecock Classic March 10-12 in Blythewood, S.C. Martinez shot a 5-under for the three days and claimed the title by five strokes. Martinez also helped lead Auburn to an 18-stroke win at the tournament.

Junior Nicole Hage was named the SEC Golfer of the Week by the league office on March 9. Hage helped lead the Tigers to their second tournament victory of the season at the LSU Cleveland Classic while finishing third individually. She made a dramatic jump from 26th to fourth from round one to two and recorded her lowest round of the season with a 68 in round three.

In The Top Five

Auburn's 13-tournament streak of top-five finishes has ended with a sixth-place finish at the NCAA East Region. The streak included all of this season and the SEC Championship (1st),

the NCAA Regional (1st) and the NCAA Championship (3rd) from last season. In two of the last 22 tournaments the Tigers have participated in, they have finished out of the top five -- a seventh place finish in the Bryan National Collegiate April 1-3, 2005 and the 2006 NCAA East Regional tournament, both held at the Bryan Park Golf Club.

Point Shaving

Despite the fact the 2005-06 Auburn team did not have high expectations placed on it, the Tigers have shown improvement from last season including shaving three strokes from its average score. This season, Auburn is averaging a team score of 293.36, down from 296.44 in 2004-05. Also, the Tigers will need to maintain their pace down the stretch to make Auburn history as the record sits at 294.40, from the 2001-02 season.

Bright Future

Senior Maria Martinez received a sponsor's exemption for the Kraft Nabisco Championship March 30-April 2 in Rancho Mirage, Calif. Martinez made the cut for the event and finished in a tie for 62nd, carding a 16-over 74-73-77-80--304 in the four-day LPGA tournament as an amateur.

Down the Stretch

The Tigers struggled with consistency in their first tournament of the season, but improved at the Mason Rudolph Championship. From the first round (307) of the Cougar Classic to the second round (285), Auburn shaved off 22 strokes and then added seven from the second round to the third round (292). In the Mason Rudolph, however, Auburn shot a 291 in the first round, a 298 in the second and a 300 in the third for a difference of just nine strokes.

Way To Rebound!

After a dismal start to the Cougar Classic, where the Tigers shot a 19-over first round, they rebounded in a big way. On the same day of competition, but in the

second round, Auburn fought back to a 3-under performance for a 22-shot difference. Margaret Shirley had the largest individual improvement as she shot an 11-over 83 in the first round and came back to card a 1-under 71 in the second 18 holes, just hours later.

Maria's "Summer Vacation"

Senior Maria Martinez had an exciting summer as she advanced to the finals of the U.S. Amateur tournament the first week in August. Her father caddied for her and her brother and mother all came in from Venezuela to show their support. Martinez dominated the field up until the finals, where she fell 9-and-8 in the 36-hole final to winner Morgan Pressel in Roswell, Ga.

New on the Plains

Auburn welcomes two newcomers to the program including Mariana Macias, a freshman from Madrid, Spain, and Marisa Milligan, a freshman from Normal, Ill.

No. 1 rankings, top 10 finishes in the NCAA Championship, Auburn and Kim Evans all go hand in hand. Evans, who has led the Tigers to five SEC Championships, including the 2005 and 2006 titles, was the 2002 NGCA National Coach of the Year as the Tigers amassed an incredible record of 162-7-3 (.951). In the fall of 2005, *Golfweek* named the Auburn women's program the third most successful program in the past five years.

Evans, who is in her 12th year at Auburn, led the Tigers to eight consecutive NCAA Championship appearances, including five top-10 finishes with a tie for second in the nation in 2002, third in 2005, fourth in 2001, sixth in 2000 and ninth in 2003. Auburn's five SEC titles under Evans came in 1996, 2000, 2003, 2005 and 2006.

In 2006, not only was senior Maria Martinez named the SEC Golfer of the Year, but she sunk a birdie putt on the final hole of the tournament to give Auburn a one-stroke victory and earn individual medalist honors.

The 2006 team has also won five tournaments, which ties a school record set in 2000 and again in 2001. The 2006 Tigers are also well on their way to setting a school record for lowest stroke average for a season.

In 2005 Evans led the Tigers to the NCAA Central Region title and senior Diana Ramage earned medalist honors in the tournament. Three players were named All-Americans, as well as All-SEC team members in 2005.

The Tigers finished the 2002 season ranked No. 1 nationally in *Golfweek* and were No. 1 in the nation in *Golfweek's* 2002-03 preseason poll.

Evans has coached and helped with the development of six All-Americans, four SEC Players of the Year and four consecutive SEC Freshmen of the Year. Auburn's streak of eight-straight NCAA appearances was the fourth longest stint of any school in the nation at that time. Since 2000, the Tigers have won 17 tournament championships.

The 1981 Auburn graduate has turned a once mediocre program into a consistent National Championship contender.

In 2004, freshman Nicole Hage won SEC Freshman of the Year honors and was named as the Co-SEC Player of the Year. Along with Hage, Maria Martinez earned first team

All-SEC honors.

Auburn won three tournaments in 2003 with the SEC Championship, the ACC/SEC Challenge and the Mercedes-Benz Collegiate. Senior Celeste Troche became the first four-time All-American in Tiger history while Danielle Downey was an honorable mention All-American. Troche, Downey and Diana Ramage were all All-SEC first-team selections and Maria Martinez was a second-teamer.

Evans led the Tigers to a school-best tie for second in the 2002 NCAA Championship. The Tigers finished the season ranked No. 1 nationally in *Golfweek*. Courtney Swaim,

Troche and Downey each earned All-American honors as Swaim and Troche were first-team selections with Downey on the second team.

Evans was named SEC Coach of the Year for the third time in seven seasons while Kingsley Barrett became the third-straight Tiger to claim SEC Freshman of the Year honors. Downey, Swaim and Troche were first-team All-SEC selections while Troche was also selected to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

The Tigers had a then school-best fourth-place finish in the 2001 NCAA Championship. Celeste Troche earned first-team All-America honors and was an Academic All-American and SEC Player of the Year, and Ramage won the Tigers' second consecutive SEC Freshman of the Year award. The Tigers won a school record five tournaments.

The Tigers finished sixth in the 2000 NCAA Championship

and won the 2000 SEC Championship for the second time in five years. Freshmen Danielle Downey, who won three individual tournaments including the SEC Championship, and Celeste Troche, who was the SEC Freshman of the Year, were both named second-team All-Americans. Both were first-team All-SEC selections and a quartet of Tigers, Kami Smith, Crystal Ferrier, Kimberly Strong and Audrey Fisher, were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

The Tigers finished 15th in the 1999 NCAA Championship while Robin Cook was named a second-team All-American for the second straight year. Kami Smith earned Academic All-America honors. Six Tigers were named All-SEC with Cook earning SEC Player of the Year honors.

In 1998, the Tigers finished 19th at the NCAA Championship. Cook was named second-team All-American and three Tigers garnered All-SEC honors along with three being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

The Tigers finished 13th in the nation in 1997 as the team advanced to the NCAA Championship at the Scarlet Course in Columbus, Ohio. Katie Gallina was named an All-American and the Tigers had four All-SEC selections and two SEC Academic Honor Roll picks. Evans led the Tigers to a 143-36 (.799) record during the 1996-97 season. In 1996, Evans became only the second women's golf coach in Auburn history to be named SEC Coach of the Year and District South Coach of the Year, along with the legendary Bud Marsee.

Auburn's 1996 SEC Championship was the school's second ever, the first coming in 1989. Evans also led the Tigers to their first trip to the NCAA Championship in six years in 1996 as the Tigers finished 18th in the country. Marci Clemons was an All-American and won the prestigious Dinah Shore Award and Edith Munson Award. Three Tigers were selected All-SEC and one to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

Evans was formerly an assistant coach for the men's golf team at Georgia Tech from 1988-1994 and the assistant executive director of the Atlanta Junior Golf Association for six years.

In 1981, she graduated from Auburn with a Bachelor of Science degree while also lettering for the Tigers from 1978-81.

Upon her graduation from Auburn, Evans worked as a golf activity coordinator and golf professional at Sandestin Resort in Destin, Fla., where she obtained her PGA Class A status.

Evans has a long list of golf achievements including being on the Board of Directors for "The Alabama First Tee Chapter" in 1999 and is the 3rd Vice-President of the National Golf Coaches Association for 1999-2000. She was awarded the Georgia PGA Junior Golf Leader Award in 1992; was a member of the PGA National Junior Golf Steering Committee from 1992-93; Georgia State Golf Association Advisory Committee, 1992-1994; Georgia Junior Golf Foundation Board of Directors, 1992-1994; Special Olympics Committee for Golf in 1994; and Instructor for the LPGA Mazda Executive Women's Clinic in 1993. She was the guest speaker for the 1990 USGA Women's Regional Workshop and at the AAHPERD Regional Convention in 1993.

She spearheaded and directed the "See Jane Build Golf Day" in September 1995 to benefit Habitat for Humanity in Lee County and was selected to the South District Selection Committee for 1995-96.

While at Georgia Tech, she was involved in several campus activities such as directing the Georgia Tech Annual Gift Giving, The United Way for four years, the Tournament Coordinator of the Local Contributors Golf Tournament for the NCAA Women's Final Four in 1993 and the Mandy Miller Golf Classic (Women's Basketball Scholarship Endowment Program) for three years. Evans was a co-Director for the "Go For the Gold Twilight Run" (fund raising for women's athletics) in 1991.

Evans spends time with many charities and is a member of the Professional Golf Association of America. Among Evans' achievements from the recent past include the creation of the Auburn Tiger Invitational (now named the Auburn Tiger-Derby Invitational after former Auburn golfer and Curtis Cup Champion Virginia-Derby Grimes). She was also instrumental in landing the 1996 NCAA East Regional and 2003 NCAA Championship at Grand National.

"The individuals are the best part of coaching," said Evans of her players. "Of course everybody likes to win. But, when you're dealing with individuals, and they accomplish their goals, we all come together and accomplish our team goals.

"When you have quality student-athletes and mix them with the game of golf, I can't see a better combination."
