- Alli Smalley is 12 points away from breaking into Auburn's top-10 career scoring list
- Sunday's game at Vanderbilt was the 100th consecutive start of senior Alli Smalley's career
- · Sophomore point guard Morgan Toles leads the SEC in assists and assist-to-turnover ratio
- Auburn had four players score in double figures in five games this season, including last Thursday's vs. Florida
- The Tigers are 8-3 in their last 11 games after starting the season 1-4
- This will be the 50th meeting between Auburn and Ole Miss with the Tigers leading 27-22; 13-7 when in Auburn
- Auburn is coming off a 59-67 loss at Vanderbilt; Ole Miss is coming off a 46-86 loss at Tennessee
- UM won the last meeting, 65-61, in Oxford on Feb. 25, 2010; AU won the last meeting in Auburn, 72-65, on Feb. 5, 2009
- · Auburn has a 181-151 record all-time SEC record
- This will be the fifth meeting between Fortner and Ole Miss' Renee Ladner with the series tied 2-2
- Ole Miss assistant Jocelyn McGilberry played at Auburn from 1986-89, going to the NCAA Final Four twice
- Auburn is 5-1 all-time when playing on Jan. 13, Nell Fortner is 1-1
- The Tigers are 182-97 all-time in the month of January, 19-25 under Fortner
- Auburn is 66-46 all-time against teams from the state of Mississippi
- Junior Chantel Hilliard (Biloxi) and head coach Nell Fortner (Jackson) are both natives of Mississippi
- Six different Tigers have led the team in scoring this season
- . Auburn is 84-2 under Fortner when scoring 70 or more points
- The Tigers are averaging 21.0 points per game scored on turnovers and have scored 20 or more points off turnovers on eight occasions this season
- Auburn is playing its first season in the new \$86 million Auburn Arena
- The season-opening win over Mercer was the first regular-season Auburn win, men or women, in the new facility
- Alli Smalley broke the Auburn career 3-point record against Temple, she now has 199 on her career
- Alli Smalley and Tyrese Tanner were named to the Junkanoo Jam All-Tournament Team on Nov. 27
- Auburn was picked sixth in the SEC Preseason Media and Coaches' polls, Tennessee was picked to win the league
- Alli Smalley was picked the the Coaches' Preseason All-SEC First Team and to the media's Second Team
- Nell Fortner is beginning her seventh season at Auburn, marking her longest tenure at any job
- The Chicago State game was Nell Fortner's 200th as Auburn's head coach, she was 121-79 in her first 200 games The Tigers welcome five newcomers: Peyton Davis, Camille Glymph, Courtney Strain, Tyrese Tanner, Jassany Williams
- Carla McGhee returns to Auburn for her second stint as an assistant coach
- Auburn will be a first- and second-round host of the 2011 NCAA Tournament in the new Auburn Arena

SCOUTING AUBURN

After a difficult 1-4 start to the season, Auburn has rallied to go 8-3 in its last 11 games, including a five-game winning streak. The streak was the longest since the Tigers won six in a row from Nov. 28 - Dec. 28, 2009.

The Tigers have lived off their defense this season, averaging 9.8 steals and 4.2 blocks per game. Auburn opponents average 19.6 turnovers per game with the Tigers scoring an average of 21.0 points per game off of turnovers.

Senior Alli Smalley leads the team with 12.3 points per game, followed by Blanche Alverson with 11.1 per game. Smalley and Alverson have combined to average 3.4 3-pointers made per game.

Jordan Greenleaf pulls down a team-high 7.8 rebounds per game, along with her 9.6 points. Sophomore Morgan Toles averages 7.8 points and 5.5 assists per game, good enough for first in the SEC.

SCOUTING OLE MISS

Ole Miss enters the game with an 8-6 record and a 1-1 mark in SEC play. The Rebels started the season off at 7-3, but have struggled with a 1-3 mark in their last four games. All six Rebel wins have come at home this season with Ole Miss posting a 0-4 road record.

Auburn and Ole Miss have two opponents in common so far. The Rebels lost at South Alabama, 67-60, while Auburn was able to down the Jaguars, 75-70, at home. Ole Miss also posted a comefrom-behind win over Vanderbilt, 72-67, in its SEC opener while the Tigers fell to the Commodores, 67-59.

Senior Kayla Melson leads the Rebels with 15.2 points and 4.9 assists per game. She is followed by a pair of freshmen in Valencia McFarland and Pa'Sonna Hope. McFarland is second on the team in scoring with 12.2 points and 3.9 assists per game while Hope leads the team in rebounding with 6.6 boards along with her 9.0 points

As a team, Ole Miss shoots 37.8 percent from the field and 25.4 percent from 3-point range.

LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN

Auburn battled from behind to tie Vanderbilt, 33-33, early in the second half, but a 17-4 Commodore run stifled a Tiger comeback as Vanderbilt went on to take the 67-59 victory on Sunday.

Sophomore Blanche Alverson led Auburn with 12 points, including six-straight to tie the game in the first five minutes of the second half. Senior Alli Smalley followed with 10 while freshman Peyton Davis led the Tigers in rebounding with seven boards along with her six points.

Vanderbilt took an early 10-2 lead in the game, but Auburn bounced back and trailed by just two points, 24-22, with a minute

left in the first half. The Commodores didn't slow down in the final minute, scoring seven points on a Gabby Smith 3-pointer and a Hannah Tuomi jumper to take a 29-22 lead into the lockerroom.

Down seven to start the second half, it was Alverson that led the Auburn charge as she scored six points in an 11-4 Tiger run that tied the game at 33-33. Vanderbilt came back, though, with a 17-4 run that made use of six Tiger turnovers to build its lead to 13 at 50-37.

Vanderbilt would go on to lead by as many as 17 points before Auburn mounted its final push. After the Commodores took a 57-40, Auburn answered by out-scoring VU 22-17 in the final 9:07, cutting the lead to as few as five points with a minute left in the game.

LAST TIME OUT FOR OLE MISS

The Ole Miss women's basketball team fell to No. 5/6 Tennessee 86-46 Sunday at Thompson Boling Arena in Knoxville, Tenn.

Valencia McFarland gave Ole Miss an early 3-0 lead on three free throws, but the Rebels opened the game 0-of-8 from the field until Shae Nelson's jumper with 14:23 remaining brought Ole Miss to within three, 8-5.

The Lady Vols used a 15-2 run to go ahead 31-14 with 4:11 left in the first half. Tennessee led Ole Miss 42-22 at the half.

Tennessee continued to roll in the second half, out-scoring Ole Miss, 44-24, to pull away for the 40-point win. McFarland ended the game with 16 points and tied her career-high with six made free throws. Kayla Melson ended the game with 11 points, all in the second half, while Nelson added 10. The Lady Vols outrebounded the Rebels 53-31.

FORTNER VS. LADNER

This will be the fifth meeting between Auburn head coach Nell Fortner and Ole Miss' Renee Ladner with the series tied, 2-2.

Fortner is in her seventh season at Auburn and eighth overall as a collegiate head coach, holding a 142-91 career record. Ladner is in her fourth season at Ole Miss and has a 56-52 record.

AGAINST THE SEC

Auburn has a 181-151 all-time record in the Southeastern Conference. The Tigers have won five SEC titles and four SEC Tournament titles, most recently winning the regular-season title in 2009 after 14-2 league mark.

LAST TIME VS. OLE MISS (Feb. 25, 2010)

Ole Miss went to the free throw line 21 times, connecting on 19 of them as the Rebels squeaked out a 65-61 Senior Night win over Auburn. The Tigers tried to play Senior Night spoilers for the second game in a row, but fell short in the final road game of the season.

Alli Smalley and Jordan Greenleaf scored 16 points each to lead Auburn in the game.

Taking on one of the best offenses in the Southeastern Conference, along with the league's leading scorer in Bianca Thomas,
Auburn had to rely on its defensive pressure to stay in the game.

The Tigers tallied seven steals and six blocks, forcing 12 Rebel turnovers. Auburn turned the turnovers into 11 points on the other end of the floor.

Thomas scored a game-high 22 points on 7-of-16 shooting. She was held to just 1-of-6 from 3-point range but connected on seven of her eight free throw attempts. Elizabeth Robertson finished with 11 points on 3-of-6 shooting from 3-point range while Shantell Black scored 10 points.

Following Smalley and Greenleaf was freshman point guard Morgan Toles with 10 points along with her five assists. Fellow freshman Blanche Alverson followed with nine while KeKe Carrier pulled down a team-high seven rebounds.

LAST TIME VS. OLE MISS IN AUBURN (Feb. 5, 2009)

The No. 6 Auburn women's basketball team rebounded from a close first half to claim a 72-65 win over conference rival Ole Miss on Feb. 5, 2009.

With a single-point lead going into the half, the Tigers fought through a close second half that saw three ties and six lead changes. The second-half effort brought 42 points for the Tigers, after only collecting 30 points in the first half.

Auburn was led by senior DeWanna Bonner, who accounted for 23 points, seven rebounds and three assists in the win. Following Bonner was Alli Smalley with 15 points and Sherell Hobbs with 11 points and four rebounds.

Ole Miss' Bianca Thomas led all scorers in the game with 28 points, knocking down five of her nine 3-point attempts. Shawn Goff finished with nine rebounds and 14 points for the Rebels.

Ole Miss would tie the game twice in the final minutes, but Auburn finally was able to pull away, fueled by Whitney Boddie, who posted all eight of her points in the last five minutes of the game.

ON THIS DATE...

Auburn is 5-1 all-time when playing on Jan. 13, but is 1-1 under Nell Fortner. The Tigers won their last game on Jan. 13, downing Georgia 82-52 in Auburn in 2008.

IN JANUARY

Auburn is 182-97 all-time in the month of January, including a 19-25 mark under Nell Fortner (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that season).

AGAINST THE MAGNOLIA STATE

Auburn holds a 66-46 record against teams from the state of Mississippi. Records against Mississippi teams: Delta State (1-2), Jackson State (3-2), Ole Miss (27-22), Mississippi College (0-1), Mississippi State (30-13), Mississippi University for Women (1-4) and Southern Mississippi (4-2).

COACHING CONNECTION

A familiar face will be on the bench Thursday as former Tiger Jocelyn McGilberry, who is an assistant coach for Ole Miss, will coach against her former team. She played under Joe Ciampi at Auburn from 1986-89, going to the Final Four in 1988 and 1989.

McGilberry scored 462 points in her Auburn career and pulled down 350 rebounds. She was one of the team captains during her senior season and started all 34 games as Auburn made it to the NCAA Championship game.

MISSISSIPPI TIGERS

Auburn junior Chantel Hilliard, a native of Biloxi, Miss., will play against her home state for the first time this season as Auburn takes on Ole Miss.

Head Coach Nell Fortner is also a Mississippi native, hailing from Laurel, Miss. She was born in Jackson, Miss.

STARTING OFF WITH A WIN

Auburn opened SEC play at Alabama on Jan. 3 with a 66-55 victory, marking the third time under Nell Fortner for the Tigers to win their SEC opener and just the second time for Auburn to win its SEC road opener. All-time, the Tigers are now 12-20 in SEC road openers.

The Tigers came out in their next game to defeat Florida, 73-56, in Auburn's first SEC game in the new Auburn Arena. AU is now 18-14 in SEC home openers and 3-4 under Nell Fortner.

BOUNCING BACK

After winning the season-opener, Auburn went on to lose the next four games, including two to ranked teams. Since then, the Tigers have notched an 8-3 record to move above .500 for the first time since the season-opener.

CALLING NO. 100

With her start in Sunday's game at Vanderbilt, senior Alli Smalley earned the 100th consecutive start of her Auburn career.

She earned her first collegiate start on Dec. 29, 2007 at Saint Joseph's, the 14th game of her collegiate career, and has not left. Since then, Smalley has started in 100 consecutive games.

CLOSING IN ON TOP 10

Senior Alli Smalley enters Thursday's game vs. Ole Miss just 12 points away from entering Auburn's top-10 career scoring list. She currently has 1,403 career points, ranking 11th all-time.

She is 12 points from tying former Tiger Lori Monroe (1979-83) for 10th.

DOUBLE DOWN

Senior Jordan Greenleaf pulled down 12 rebounds with 16 points in the season-opener against Florida State, earning her first double-double of the season and fourth of her career. She came back with another at South Florida, scoring 13 points with 10 rebounds.

Against Jacksonville State, sophomore point guard Morgan Toles notched her first career double-double with 10 points and 10 assists. She became the first Auburn player to record a points-assists double-double since Whitney Boddie accomplished the feat against Ole Miss on March 6, 2009 in the SEC Tournament.

LEAGUE BEST

Sophomore Morgan Toles has proven herself to be among the best point guards in the SEC this season. She currently leads the conference in both assists and assist-to-turnover ratio. Toles has a league-best 5.5 assists per game, edging Ole Miss' Kayla Melson's 4.9 per game. She also has a commanding 3.1 assist-to-turnover ratio, leading Arkansas' C'eira Ricketts and her 2.2 ratio.

BALANCED SCORING

Auburn had five players score in double figures in its last two non-conference games. Against Alabama A&M, it was Greenleaf (15), Alverson (14), Smalley (12), Hilliard (12) and Toles (11). Against Jacksonville State, it was Alverson (17), Greenleaf (15), Smalley (11), Tanner (11) and Toles (10).

Against Florida in the SEC home opener, the Tigers had four players score in double figures: Hilliard (17), Alverson (15), Greenleaf (11) and Smalley (10). It marked the fifth time this season for Auburn to have four players in double figures. The other times were against South Alabama with Smalley (15), Williams (13), Greenleaf (11) and Toles (10) scoring in double figures; and against Seton Hall with Smalley (15), Jennings (14), Toles (12) and Alverson (12).

DOMINATING THE PAINT

Auburn has out-scored its opponents in the paint nine times this season, but against Alabama A&M it was a dominating effort with 44 points scored in the pait. It marked the most points scored by the Tigers in the paint in almost two years as it was the most since Auburn tallied 56 against Arkansas on March 1, 2009.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

After freshman Tyrese Tanner led Auburn with 15 points at Chicago State, she became the sixth Tiger this season to lead Auburn in scoring. Others are Alli Smalley, Blanche Alverson, Chantel Hilliard, Morgan Toles and Jordan Greenleaf.

LONG DISTANCE RECORD BREAKER

With her 3-pointer with 1:22 left in the Temple game on Dec. 4, Auburn senior Alli Smalley recorded the 185th 3-pointer of her Auburn career, giving her sole possession of the AU 3-point record.

NO. 200 FOR NELL

The Dec. 21 game at Chicago State marked the 200th for Nell Fortner as Auburn's head coach. She picked up the win and had a 121-79 record through her first 200 games.

TOUGH START

Auburn is coming off its most difficult start to a season in the program's history. After opening against Mercer, Auburn played 16th-ranked Florida State and sixth-ranked Duke, giving the Tigers two ranked opponents in the first three games for the frist time in school history.

BREAKING THE STREAK

Auburn's 85-51 win over Seton Hall broke a four-game losing streak for the Tigers - a streak that tied for the longest losing streak since the 2004-05 season. Auburn has not lost more than four consecutive games since it lost six in a row from Dec. 31, 2004 - Jan. 20, 2005.

DEFENSE MAKES OFFENSE

Auburn has used its defense to create its offense this season. So far, the Tigers have scored a total of 336 points off of turnovers, including a season-high mark of 39 against Alabama A&M. AU has scored 20 or more points off turnovers in eight games this season.

While averaging 9.8 steals, 4.2 blocks and 19.6 opponent turnovers per game this season, Auburn has turned the efforts into an average of 21.0 points off turnovers per game.

CLEARING 20

Senior Alli Smalley became the first Tiger to clear the 20-point plateau this season, scoring 22 in Auburn's loss to Temple on Dec. 4. It marked the 14th time in her career to clear 20 points.

TURN IT IN TO POINTS

The Tigers have notched a pair of impressive defensive performances this season. In the first, Auburn forced 31 Seton Hall turnovers on Nov. 27, turning them in to 36 points on the other end of the floor.

The Tigers were at it again against Alabama A&M, forcing 29 turnovers on 18 steals, turning them into 39 points on the other end. It marked the most points scored by the Tigers off turnovers since Auburn scored 39 against Sam Houston State on Dec. 5, 2008. The 18 steals were also the most since AU picked up 22 against Alabama A&M on Nov. 14, 2008.

DISHING IT OUT

By playing in her 30th career game against Mercer, Auburn sophomore became eligible for the career assist rankings. With 209 on her career, she ranks sixth all-time at Auburn with 4.8 per game.

I'M FIRST!

While it was Mercer's Sharnea Boykin who scored the first field goal in Auburn Arena, sophomore Blanche Alverson came down on the very next posession to pick up Auburn's first field goal and the first 3-pointer in the facility.

OFFENSE WINS GAMES

Auburn is 84-2 when scoring 70 or more points in the Nell Fortner era. The only times Auburn has lost when scoring at least 70 points was on Jan. 20, 2005 vs. No. 7 Tennessee, 71-81 and Feb. 19, 2009 at No. 18 Vanderbilt, 73-70. When scoring less than 70 points, Auburn is 41-78 during the Fortner era.

SEC Women's Basketball Notes

- The SEC has posted impressive non-conference records in the last decade.
 The SEC compiled a 121-45 (.729) non-conference record during the 2009-10 season.
- Since the 1990 season, the SEC has compiled a 2,774-844 (.767) record against other conferences. The league has recorded 150 + wins during eight seasons and has never recorded a non-conference winning percentage below .723.
- SEC teams have earned appearances in 25 of 29 NCAA Final Fours, an accomplishment unmatched by any other league.
- Overall, SEC squads have filled 34 of the 116 Final Four berths, including having two Final Four teams in 1988 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1989 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1995 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1996 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1998 (Arkansas, Tennessee), 2004 (LSU, Tennessee), 2005 (LSU, Tennessee), 2007 (LSU, Tennessee) and 2008 (LSU, Tennessee).
- SEC teams have made 18 appearances in a nation-high 16 NCAA Championship games, winning eight NCAA Championships (Tennessee: 1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).
- The league also had the distinction of providing both national finalists twice in its history in 1996 (Tennessee 83, Georgia 65) and in 1989 (Tennessee 76, Auburn 60).
 - SEC teams have won 329 NCAA Tournament games against 168 losses (.662) for an average of 11.4 NCAA wins per year.
- In addition, all 12 current members have appeared in the NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC has paced the pack in NCAA tournament bids 21 times in its 29-year history.
- The SEC was the first league to ever have eight teams invited to the NCAA
 Tournament, doing so in 1999 and 2002.
- The SEC was also the first league to ever have seven teams invited to the NCAA Tournament and earned this honor a leading seven times (1986, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2004).
- The SEC is one of a handful of leagues to have won three national tournament titles with eight NCAA, two WNIT and three NWIT. Along with the eight NCAA championships won by Tennessee, Arkansas (1999) and Auburn (2003) captured the current Women's NIT titles. But the first-ever SEC national title belongs to Georgia, winners of the 1981 NWIT which predates the current NCAA tournament. LSU (1985) and Kentucky (1990) each won NWIT titles. Both Arkansas (1987) and South Carolina (1979) won the WNIT as members of their previous conferences.
- In 2003, Auburn won the WNIT title with wins over South Alabama, Florida State, Richmond, Creighton and Baylor. In 1999, the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks defeated Wisconsin 76-64 to claim the SEC's first WNIT championship.
- In 1981, Georgia defeated Pittsburg, California and Arizona State (in OT) to capture the NWIT Championship, the first-ever national championship of any kind for the SEC in women's basketball.

HOME COOKIN'

Since a 77-70 loss to Virginia on Jan. 5, 1992, the Auburn Tigers have compiled a 129-10 record against non-conference opponents when playing at home.

OUTSIDE THE LEAGUE

Nell Fortner has guided the Tigers to a 78-33 ledger in non-conference play. When playing at home, Fortner's teams have posted a 33-7 mark. The only seven non-conference losses at home came from Xavier on Dec. 2, 2005 (58-60), No. 2 Duke on Dec. 31, 2004 (61-80), No. 20 George Washington on Jan. 3, 2008 (66-68), No. 15 Texas A&M on Nov. 22, 2009 (59-79), No. 16 Florida State on Nov. 15, 2010 (61-67), No. 6 Duke on Nov. 18, 2010 (62-75) and Temple on Dec. 4, 2010 (62-61).

BUILDING WITH EXPERIENCE

Auburn enters the 2010-11 season with a mix of youth and experience. Nine of the 14 players on the roster are either freshmen or sophomores, but among the nine returning players, Auburn brings back 250 games of experience as a starter.

EVERYONE PLAYS

All 12 active Tigers have played at least one minute in seven of the first 16 games of the season.

SMALLEY AND TANNER NAMED TO JUNKANOO JAM ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

For their play at the Junkanoo Jam, senior Alli Smalley and freshman Tyrese Tanner were named to the Junkanoo Jam All-Tournament Team.

Smalley averaged 13.5 points, 2.5 assists and 2.5 rebounds per game in the two games, scoring a team-high 15 points in Auburn's win over Seton Hall. Tanner averaged 6.0 points and 3.5 rebounds, along with a team-high 2.5 steals per game on the week.

Also on the all-tournament team were Boston College's Stafanie Murphy and Sacred Heart's Callan Taylor. BC's Carolyn Swords was named the tournament MVP.

SMALLEY NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Auburn senior Alli Smalley was named to the Preseason All-SEC team by both the coaches and the media. The Coaches selected Smalley to the Preseason All-SEC First Team while the media voted her to the Second Team.

Smalley averaged 15.7 points per game last season, chipping in 4.4 rebounds and 2.3 assists per outing.

AUBURN PICKED SIXTH IN SEC PRESEASON MEDIA AND COACHES POLLS

Coming off a 15-16 season, the Auburn women's basketball team was picked sixth in the preseason SEC media and coaches polls. Tennessee was the preseason favorite in both polls.

MAKING IT HOME

Nell Fortner enters her seventh season as Auburn's head coach, marking her longest tenure at any position in her career. The longest Fortner had stayed at a job prior to Auburn came from 1990-95 while she was an assistant coach at Louisiana Tech under legendary head coach Leon Barmore.

NEW FACES

Auburn welcomes five new faces to its lineup this season in freshmen Peyton Davis (Birmingham, Ala.), Camille Glymph (Greenville, S.C.), Courtney Strain (Woodland, Ala.), Tyrese Tanner (Birmingham, Ala.) and Jassany Williams (Davie, Fla.). The recruiting class was ranked 18th in the country by ESPN.com's HoopGurlz.

FIRST GAME IN AUBURN ARENA

Auburn won its inaugural game in the new \$86 million Auburn Arena. The Tigers defeated Mercer, 79-61, for the first regular-season Auburn win, men or women, in the new facility.

The Tigers move across the street this season from its former home, Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum - the team's home since 1974. Auburn played its first game in BEMC on Jan. 11, 1974, defeating in-state rival Alabama, 69-31.

TIGERS SIGN HASINA MUHAMMAD FOR 2011-12

The Auburn women's basketball signed 6-1 guard/forward Hasina Muhammad (Ridgeway HS, Memphis, Tenn.) to a National Letter of Intent, head coach Nell Fortner announced on Nov. 10.

Muhammad is ranked as the No. 66 overall player in the country by ESPN's HoopGurlz. She is also ranked as the 17th-best guard in the country and No. 2 prospect in Tennessee by HoopGurlz.

Muhammad was also ranked by two other recruiting services. She is the No. 50 overall prospect according to the All-Star Girls Report and No. 47 in the Girls Basketball Report.

WNBA CHAMPION... AGAIN

After winning a WNBA title in 2009 with the Phoenix Mercury, former Tiger Le'Coe Willingham put herself in select company when she turned around and won it again in 2010, this time with the Seattle Storm.

Willingham, a native of Augusta, Ga., averaged 5.5 points and 4.1 rebounds per game as she helped the Storm to a league-best 28-6 record.

The Storm swept Los Angeles in the first round of the playoffs, setting up a meeting of Willingham and her former team, the Mercury, in the conference finals. She defeated her old team, and former Tiger DeWanna Bonner, in a sweep for a trip to the WNBA finals.

Seattle made it a perfect run through the playoffs, sweeping the Atlanta Dream in three games for the title.

TIGERS ON THE TUBE

As part of the SEC's television agreement with ESPN, the Auburn women's basketball team will be televised six times this season on Fox Sports Net, CSS, the SEC Network and ESPN2. The SEC Tournament will be televised on Fox Sports Net, ESPNU and ESPN2. In all, the SEC will be televised in more than 70 games this season.

Auburn will be televised three times at home at the new Auburn Arena and three times on the road. The first will be the SEC-opener on Jan. 2 at Alabama on CSS, followed by a Jan. 16 home meeting with LSU on CSS. The Tigers will appear on CSS again a week later, on Jan. 23, as Tennessee comes to town.

Auburn will then make an ESPN2 appearance on Feb. 13 at Arkansas before traveling to South Carolina for a Feb. 20 game on the Fox Sports Net.

The Tigers will close out the regular season with a Feb. 27 home game against Kentucky on the SEC Network.

AUBURN TO HOST 2011 NCAA TOURNAMENT FIRST AND SECOND ROUNDS

The new Auburn Arena will close out its first season of operation, March 19-22, as a host site for the first and second rounds of the 2011 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament. Auburn's bid to host the opening rounds was selected by the NCAA and announced on Oct. 29, 2009.

The 2011 event will mark the first time for Auburn to host the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament under its current bid format. The Tigers hosted NCAA Tournament games on nine occasions between 1983 and 1993, posting an 11-0 record over that time. Auburn last hosted on March 21, 1993 when the Tigers downed Louisville, 66-61.

Auburn will be one of 16 first- and second-round sites in 2011. The complete list of host sites includes Albuquerque, N.M. (University of New Mexico, The Pit/Bob King Court); Auburn, Ala. (Auburn University, Auburn Arena); Charlottesville, Va. (University of Virginia, John Paul Jones Arena); Cincinnati, Ohio (Xavier University, Cintas Center); College Park, Md. (University of Maryland, Comcast Center); Columbus, Ohio (Ohio State University, St. John Arena); Durham, N.C. (Duke University, Cameron Indoor Stadium); Knoxville, Tenn. (University of Tennessee, Thompson-Boling Arena); Salt Lake City, Utah (University of Utah, John M. Huntsman Center); Spokane, Wash. (Gonzaga University, McCarthey Athletic Center); Shreveport, La. (Louisiana Tech University, CenturyTel Center); Stanford, Calif. (Stanford University, Maples Pavilion); Storrs, Conn. (University of Connecticut, Harry A. Gampel Pavilion); University Park, Penn. (Pennsylvania State University, Bryce Jordan Center); Waco, Texas (Baylor University, Ferrell Center); and Wichita, Kan. (Wichita State University, INTRUST Bank Arena).

The 16 advancing teams will continue play at four regional sites: Dayton, Ohio (University of Dayton Arena), Spokane, Wash. (Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena), Dallas, Texas (American Airlines Center) and Philadelphia, Pa. (Liacouras Center). The 2011 NCAA Women's Final Four will be held at Conseco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, Ind. on April 3 and 5.

Quoting Head Coach Nell Fortner

On Ole Miss...

"They have excellent guard play. Kayla Melson, a senior, who is having a really good senior year. She's a Montgomery native who really jump-starts that team and really is their leader. Valencia McFarland is a freshman guard that adds a lot of quickness to them with a 3-point shooting range, so those two are really the two engines that make that team go. They have good bench play, they are big in size and they've got Nikki Bryd, a big post player that gives them really good size inside. There is a lot to deal with with them."

On the keys to an Auburn win...

"We need to push the ball and be able to handle that guard play and not allow them to have their way with us because they are quick and can penetrate. We have know where they are at all times. We need to continue to do what we do; to push the ball and play solid defense and keep them off the boards. They are very good rebounders."

On positives from Vanderbilt game...

"I thought we really fought hard against Vanderbilt.

We got down by quite a few points and we came back and tied it up but we just could never get over the hump. I thought our fight was good and our desire was good but we just didn't have quit enough that day. We kept coming at the them and kept coming at them and it is hard to win on the road. You have to keep up your confidence and continue to believe that you can get it done. I think we are right there, we just have to keep fighting away in this conference."

Sophomore Blanche Alverson led the Tigers in scoring with 16, shooting 7-of-12 from the field and connecting on 2-of-3 from beyond the arc. Senior Jordan Greenleaf and sophomore Morgan Toles each knocked down 15. Greenleaf led the team with nine rebounds.

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Sophomore Blanche Alverson scored a gamehigh 16 points as the Auburn women's basketball team was able to hold off a late George Washington surge to pull out the 52-45 win at the Charles E. Smith Center in Washington, D.C. on Dec. 15.

Alverson and senior Alli Smalley combined for 30 of Auburn's 52 points, knocking down a combined six 3-pointers in the process. Senior Jordan Greenleaf anchored down the defensive end, pulling down a game-high 11 rebounds while blocking four shots.

Both teams struggled from the field with the Tigers hitting just 29.7 percent (19-of-64) of their shots. George Washington did not fare better, hitting just 33.3 percent (18-of-54).
