## Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- This is the 90th meeting between Auburn and Alabama in women's basketball
- Auburn leads the all-time series $51-38$, including a $30-10$ advantage in games played at Auburn
- The Tigers won the season's previous meeting on Jan. 10 in Tuscaloosa 66-56
- Auburn leads the SEC and ranks 5th in the NCAA in steals per game (12.4)
- Auburn has forced 20 or more turnovers in 18 of 25 games this season
- The Tigers are averaging 23.7 points per game off opponent turnovers
- With 18 wins already, Auburn has matched the best total of regular-season wins under Terri Williams-Flournoy (also won 18 regular-season games in 2015-16)
- Auburn has played more road + neutral games than anyone else in the SEC; the Tigers are 9-3 in true road games and 11-3 in all games away from Auburn Arena
- Auburn's 5 SEC road wins are tied for the most in program history - Auburn was 5-0 on the road in 1988-89 and 5-2 in 2008-09
- Sophomore Unique Thompson has recorded 11 double-doubles in 25 games, including each of the last two games at Arkansas and Tennessee; she now has 18 in her career, 8th-most in Auburn history
- Thompson was named SEC Player of the Week after averaging 17.0 points and 10.5 rebounds in wins over Ole Miss and Ceorgia
- Senior Janiah McKay became Auburn's 12th all-time player to reach the 1,500-point plateau; she is now 11th in scoring in Auburn history with 1,555 points after passing Tyrese Tanner ( 1,515 ) vs. Georgia
- McKay is the first player in Auburn history with 1,500 points, 400 assists and 200 steals
- Auburn rallied from a 13 -point, fourth-quarter deficit to defeat Georgia $59-58$ in overtime on Feb. 3; the Tigers forced

28 turnovers - one shy of a season high - and tied the Auburn record for steals against an SEC opponent with 21

- Auburn is 2-0 in overtime games this season and now 21-20 all-time
- Junior Crystal Primm had a career-high 7 steals vs. Mississippi State, tied for the most by an SEC player this season and the most in a conference game so far in 2019
- Primm also had a career-high 9 rebounds, along with the game-tying layup and game-winning free throws, in Auburn's comeback win over Georgia on Feb. 3
- Six of Auburn's seven losses this season have come to teams ranked in the AP Top 25 - either currently ranked (lowa State) or ranked at the time of the game (Tennessee, Mississippi State, Texas A\&M, Missouri, Kentucky)
- Auburn rallied from a 20-point, third-quarter deficit at Vanderbilt on Jan. 17 to win $72-70$; it's the largest comeback in an SEC game since 2003 and believed to be the biggest in Auburn history
- Freshman Robyn Benton hit the game-winning shot + free throw at Vanderbilt and was named SEC Freshman of the Week
- Auburn shot $63.3 \%$ ( 38 -of- 60 ) from the field in a $96-44$ win at Elon on Dec. 22 ; it was Auburn's best shooting day since hitting $64.2 \%$ (34-of-53) in a $91-62$ win at UAB on Nov. 26, 2008
- Auburn broke the school record for 3 -pointers for the second time in 20 days on Dec. 22 , hitting 14 treys in a $96-44$ win at Elon; 11 of the 14 Auburn 3 -pointers were made by freshmen
- Auburn's 96 points at Elon on Dec. 22 were its most in a true road game since a $96-71$ win at UAB on Dec. 14, 1999

## OPENING TIP

" The Auburn Tigers begin a three-game home stand Sunday afternoon as the Alabama Crimson Tide visits Auburn Arena for a 3 p.m. tip.
" Auburn is 18-7 (6-6 SEC) on the season; the Tigers dropped a 73-62 decision at Tennessee Thursday night.
" Alabama enters Sunday's game at 11-13 overall, 3-8 in SEC play. The Tide fell to Kentucky 68-53 on Monday in their last outing.

## LAST TIME OUT

" Daisa Alexander matched a season-high with 22 points, but Auburn could not hold onto a halftime lead as Tennessee earned a 73-62 win Thursday night in Knoxville.
" The Tigers (18-7, 6-6 SEC) hit an equal number of shots to Tennessee and out-shot the Lady Vols from long range, but Tennessee out-rebounded Auburn 25-11 in the second half, scored 16 second-chance points and took advantage of multiple free-throw opportunities to secure the win.
" Alexander's 22 marked her third time in SEC play to score that total, matching her output from the wins at Florida and Alabama. She also hit a season-high four 3-pointers and led the Tigers with three assists. Unique Thompson picked up her 11th double-double of the season and second in a row with 12 points and 13 rebounds, and Janiah McKay added 12 points.
" For the game, Auburn hit 27-of-65 attempts (42\%) and Tennessee made 27-of-63 (43\%). But Tennessee was 14-of-16 at the free-throw line; meanwhile, Auburn did not get to the line until late in the third quarter and made just 2-of-5. The Tigers also forced a season-low 12 turnovers while Tennessee had 10 steals to Auburn's eight.

## UP NEXT

After an off-day this Thursday, the Tigers are back at Auburn Arena next Sunday afternoon, Feb. 24, to host Missouri. Game time is 2 p.m. CT.

## AN AUBURN WIN WOULD...

" Be Auburn's 19th win of the year, the highest regular-season total since 2008-09 (27).
" Give Auburn a season sweep over Alabama for the third time in the last six years.

## AUBURN VS. ALABAMA

" This is the 90th meeting between Auburn and Alabama in women's basketball. It is the second-most played women's basketball series in the SEC, behind only Ole Miss-Mississippi State.

Auburn is 51-38 all-time against Alabama,
including a 30-10 edge in Auburn and a 6-2 advantage at Auburn Arena.
" Auburn has won 6 of the last 8 and 9 of the last 12 meetings between the teams, dating back to 2013. Auburn has won 6 of the last 7 meetings at home.

## LAST MEETING (Jan. 10, 2019 in Tuscaloosa): <br> Auburn 66, Alabama 56

" Daisa Alexander scored 22 points and had four steals as Auburn used a strong defensive effort to earn a 66-56 win over Alabama Thursday night at Coleman Coliseum.
" The Tigers (14-2, 2-1 SEC) scored 42 of their 66 points in the paint, hitting 25-of-38 two-point shots (65.7\%). Auburn also forced Alabama (9-6, 1-2) into 25 turnovers that turned into 28 Auburn points.
" Alexander scored 22 points for the second straight game, matching her season-high and coming within three points of a career high. Unique Thompson added 12 points along with a game-high nine rebounds, and Crystal Primm scored 10 . Nine of the 10 Auburn players
that saw playing time had at least one steal; Alexander's four swipes led the way while freshman Erin Howard had three steals along with a team-best five assists. Janiah McKay added eight points, five rebounds, three assists and two steals, and senior Erica Sanders hit all three shots she took for a six-point night along with a pair of steals.
" For the game, Auburn shot 55.8 percent from the
floor, their second-best shooting night of the season. The Tigers got to the rim repeatedly in the fourth quarter, scoring 16 of their 17 fourth-quarter points in the paint as the high-low play worked well for Auburn.

## SCOUTING ALABAMA

" Alabama is 11-13 on the season and 3-8 in SEC play. The Tide have wins over Georgia and Tennessee in league play, as well as non-conference victories over Clemson and Virginia.
" Alabama averages 65.2 points per game overall, 59.1 ppg in league play. The Tide are the fourth-best rebounding team in the league with 40.2/game.
" Cierra Johnson leads Alabama with 14.1 ppg, and Jasmine Walker adds 13.2 ppg . Walker is also the team's top rebounder with 7.6/game.

## SCOUTING AUBURN

Auburn is 18-7 on the season and 6-5 in the SEC. Six of the seven Auburn losses have come to teams that are currently or were at the time of the game ranked in the AP Top 25.
" The Tigers average 74.2 points/game, fifth-best in the SEC. Auburn also forces an average of 21.0 opponent turnovers, which also ranks second in the SEC and 25th nationally.
" Senior point guard Janiah McKay averages a teamleading 14.2 points/game and has topped 20 points five times, including a season-high 23 at Missouri. She is also tied for second in the SEC with 2.4 steals/game.
" Sophomore forward Unique Thompson can be a force under the basket and has been key to Auburn's success this year. She has 11 double-doubles in 25 games and averages 12.9 points and 10.4 rebounds (3rd in SEC). She has 18 career double-doubles, 8th-most in Auburn history and 5th among active SEC players.
" Redshirt junior Crystal Primm has given Auburn consistent minutes in her first season on The Plains, averaging 11.2 points and 4.0 rebounds. A transfer from Duke after the 2016-17 season, Primm scored a careerhigh 18 points against her former school's archrival, North Carolina, on Dec. 20. She also had a career-high 7 steals vs. Mississippi State, and she had a career-high 9 rebounds and made the game-tying and game-winning shots in an OT win over Georgia.
" Junior Daisa Alexander is averaging 12.4 points/ game and has been Auburn's leading scorer in five SEC games (22 vs. Florida, Alabama, Tennessee; 18 vs. Mississippi State \& Arkansas). She is tied for second in the SEC in steals with 2.4/game.

The Tigers' incoming freshman class was ranked No. 13 by ESPN HoopGurlz and included two top-50 prospects in Robyn Benton (\#17 overall; \#6 guard) and Brooke Moore (\#42 overall; \#11 guard). Benton and Moore have both been named SEC Freshman of the Week this year. In addition, freshman Erin Howard has moved into the starting lineup in SEC play, replacing injured senior Emari Jones.

## TURNING UP THE PRESSURE

" Auburn has forced at least 20 turnovers in 18 of 25 games this season. The Tigers are averaging 23.7 points off opponent turnovers.
" The Tigers are 6-0 this season and 50-8 under Coach Flo when forcing at least 25 turnovers.
" Auburn forced 28 turnovers, converting those into

" The Tigers scored 38 points off 27 North Carolina turnovers in an 86-81 0T win on Dec. 20 in Myrtle Beach, the most points off turnovers since scoring 41 vs. George Mason on Dec. 23, 2015.
" Auburn forced a season-high of 29 turnovers against Samford on Dec. 16, turning those into 30 points. The Tigers then forced 23 turnovers by Coastal Carolina two days later, scoring another 30 points " As of Feb. 15, Auburn ranks No. 6 in the nation in turnover margin ( +7.3 ), No. 5 in steals per game (12.4) and No. 25 in turnovers forced (20.8).
" Last season, the Tigers forced at least 20 turnovers in 23 of 29 games, including 10 games with at least 25 opponent turnovers. Auburn was $8-2$ last year when forcing at least 25 turnovers. Auburn ranked No. 2 in the nation in steals (13.2/game) and No. 3 in turnovers forced (22.9) for the 2017-18 season.

## COMEBACK KIDS

" Auburn completed what is believed to be the biggest comeback in program history on Jan. 17 when the Tigers overcame a 20 -point, third-quarter deficit to pull off a 72-70 win at Vanderbilt. Auburn trailed 49-29 with less than 8 minutes to play in the third quarter and outscored the Commodores 43 -21 the rest of the way.
" The previous biggest comeback (with records dating to the mid-1990s) came Feb. 8, 1995, when Auburn overcame a 19 -point deficit to earn a 66-64 win at Western Kentucky.
" Auburn also fought back from a 13-point deficit in the fourth quarter to earn a 59-58 OT win over Ceorgia on Feb. 3.
" Under Coach Flo, the Tigers have overcome deficits of 15 points or more on nine occasions, including five deficits of exactly 17 points.

## BALANCED SCORING RETURNS

" Auburn has four players averaging double-digit scoring. Janiah McKay, Unique Thompson, Daisa Alexander, and Crystal Primm - four of Auburn's starting five - all average at least 11 points per game.
" For the first time since 2008, Auburn had six players finish in double-figures in the Tigers' 97-48 win over Grambling on Nov. 6.
" Junior Janiah McKay and freshman Robyn Benton led the way with 16 points, followed by junior Crystal Primm (15), sophomore Unique Thompson (14), and junior Daisa Alexander and senior Emari Jones (13).
" The last time Auburn had at least six players score 10+ points, seven players did it against Sam Houston

State on Dec. 5, 2008, when the Tigers set a school record with 119 points. That night, it was KeKe Carrier (19), DeWanna Bonner (18), Alli Smalley (16), Whitney Boddie (13), Reneisha Hobbs (13), Chantel Hilliard (13) and Sherell Hobbs (13).
" The Tigers have had at least five players score in double figures in five games this season.

## SEEING DOUBLE

" Auburn players have recorded 12 double-doubles through 25 games with 11 coming from sophomore Unique Thompson.
" Thompson recorded back-to-back double-doubles at Arkansas (2/10) and Tennessee (2/14) with $13 / 12$ at Arkansas and 12/13 at Tennessee.
" Thompson had 12 first-quarter points en route to a 20-point, 12 -rebound night in a 64-51 win over Ole Miss on Jan. 31 for her ninth double-double of the year. " Thompson picked up her first SEC double-double of the year with 19 points and 12 rebounds against No. 10 Tennessee on Jan. 3. She added a second conference double-double with 16 points and 13 rebounds at Vanderbilt on Jan. 17.
" Thompson played a career-high 43 minutes and scored 21 points with 18 rebounds in an 86-81 OT win over North Carolina on Dec. 20.
" Thompson earned her fifth double-double with 14 points and 17 rebounds in a 95-79 win over Oklahoma on Dec. 2.
" Thompson had 16 points and 13 rebounds for her third straight double-double and fifth of the season vs. Louisiana-Lafayette ( $11 / 25$ ). She has now had 3 straight double-doubles in back-to-back seasons.
" With her 19-point, 14-rebound effort at lowa State, Thompson recorded her 10th career double-double. She had reached the milestone by halftime with 16 points and 10 rebounds in the opening 20 minutes; it was the second time in her career she had a double-double by halftime.
" Thompson's 19-point, 19-rebound double-double at New Mexico was her second of the season and marked a career-high in rebounding for the Auburn sophomore.
" Thompson picked up where she left off in 2017-18 with her eighth career double-double, notching 14 points and 13 rebounds in the season-opener against Grambling. And Janiah McKay earned the second of her career with 16 points and 10 assists.
" The last time two Auburn players had a doubledouble in the same game was Dec. 13, 2015, at Marquette, when Tra'Cee Tanner ( $13 \mathrm{pts} / 12$ rebs) and Brandy Montgomery ( 24 pts/12 rebs) did so.

The most recent setting of the record game Dec. 22 at Elon when Auburn made 143 -pointers; 11 of those came from freshmen - 5 from Robyn Benton, 4 from Brooke Moore, 2 from Erin Howard. Daisa Alexander, Emari Jones and Janiah McKay

## had one apiece.

" 20 days earlier, Auburn set a new school record with 13 made 3-pointers in a 95-79 win over Oklahoma on Dec. 2. The Tigers got four apiece from Jones and Benton, three from Alexander and two from Moore.
" The previous record for a single game had been 12, set on Dec. 5, 2007, in a 99-47 win over Colgate. Since 2000, the Tigers have made at least 10 treys in a game 10 times; the most recent was an 82-75 win at Florida on New Year's Day in 2017 when Auburn hit 11 from long range.
" Auburn is averaging 6.4 made 3-pointers per game this season with 159 makes through 25 games, which already ranks as the third-most in a season in Auburn history. The program record for 3-pointers in a season is 181 (5.7/game), set during the 2016-17 season.

## OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

" With 97 points in the season-opening win over Grambling, Auburn hit the 90-point plateau for the fourth time in the Coach Flo era and the first since scoring 92 on Nov. 17, 2014 - also against Grambling. " Auburn's 95-point effort against Oklahoma on Dec. 2 gave the Tigers two 90-point games in the same season for the first time since the 2008-09 season, when Auburn topped the 90 -point mark six times.
" The Tigers' 95 points against Oklahoma were the most scored by Auburn against a Power-5 conference opponent (SEC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12) since 1990, when the Tigers beat Vanderbilt 96-93 in 20 T.
" Auburn scored 96 points in a 52-point victory at Elon on Dec. 22. It marked Auburn's highest point total in a true road game since a 96-71 win at UAB on Dec. 14, 1999.
" The Tigers have scored at least 80 points in eight games this season; Auburn scored $80+$ in six games combined over the previous two seasons.
" Under Coach Flo, Auburn is 6-0 when scoring at least 90 points and 31-1 when scoring at least 80 points.

## WORIKING OVERTIME

" Auburn played its first overtime game since 2017 on Dec. 20, defeating North Carolina 86-81 in the Carolinas Challenge in Myrtle Beach, S.C. It was Auburn's first OT win since defeating Arkansas 71-60 on Jan. 24, 2016.
" The Tigers rallied from a 13-point fourth-quarter deficit on Feb. 3 to force overtime at home vs. Georgia, then made free throws in the closing seconds to earn a 59-58 win. Auburn has now played multiple overtime games in the same season three of the last four years.

AUBURN --Janiah McKay and Unique Thompson both recorded double-doubles as the Auburn women's basketball team posted its highest scoring output of the Terri Williams-Flournoy era with a 97-48 victory over Grambling State Tuesday at Auburn Arena.

Led by 16 points from McKay and freshman Robyn Benton, Auburn (1-0) had six players in double figures, the first time for the Tigers to hit that mark since the 2008-09 season.

Along with the 16 points from McKay and Benton, the Tigers got 15 points from redshirt junior Crystal Primm in her Auburn debut, 14 points from Thompson, and 13 each from Daisa Alexander and Emari Jones.

Thompson posted her eighth career double-double with a team-high 13 rebounds to go with her 14 points. It was the first time for Auburn to have two players with a double-double in the same game since the 2015-16 season when Tra'Cee Tanner and Brandy Montgomery pulled off the feat.

Auburn shot 53.5 percent from the field, scored 97 points and had 53 rebounds - all higher totals than in any game last season. The Tigers' 97 points were the most of the Coach Flo era and the highest output since scoring 119 against Sam Houston State in 2008 - also the last time the Tigers had at least six players in double-figures.

Every player that dressed for Auburn scored. Sophomore Abigayle Jackson had four points along with five rebounds, and freshmen Kiyae' White (3 points, 4 rebounds), Erin Howard (2 points, 3 rebounds) and Natalie Kelly ( 1 point, 1 rebound) found the stat sheet in their Auburn debuts.

After Grambling scored the first four points of the game and took a 6-3 lead, Auburn went on a 16-1 run over the next four-plus minutes to take a 19-9 lead. Grambling would get no closer than 9 points the rest of the way. Auburn ended the first half on a 12-0 run to take a 44-20 lead to the break.

## Game 2: Nov. 9, 2018 Auburn 80, Nicholls State 59 Auburn Arena Auburn, Ala. Preseason WNIT - Round 1



AUBURN -- Auburn jumped out to a big early lead and had another strong offensive performance Friday night in an $80-59$ win over Nicholls State in the first round of the Preseason Women's NIT.
It was Auburn's second-straight game scoring at least 80 points; the Tigers scored 80 or more just twice all of last season. Despite a cold fourth quarter, Auburn shot $45.1 \%$ from the field and made 12 -of- 13 free throws.

Daisa Alexander led Auburn with 20 points while also racking up five rebounds and two steals. Emari Jones added 15 points and pulled down 8 rebounds for the second straight game along with three assists and two steals. Janiah McKay finished with 14 points and seven assists. And Unique Thompson scored six points and pulled down a game-high 10 rebounds to go along with four steals and two blocks while playing just 24 minutes.
Auburn jumped out to a 9 -0 lead in the first two minutes and had another $9-0$ run in the first quarter to take a 23-10 lead after 10 minutes. Nicholls took advantage of an Auburn cold stretch in the second to cut the lead to as few as seven points, but the Tigers took a 37-26 lead to the break.
The Tigers pulled away in the third quarter and increased their lead to as many as 29 in the fourth before a cold stretch late saw the final margin trimmed to 21.

The Tigers took full advantage of being several inches taller at most every position, out-rebounding the Colonels 42-28 and racking up five blocked shots. Auburn also had 18 steals in forcing 24 Nicholls turnovers, turning those into 29 points.

Nicholls' Cassidy Barrios, the defending Southland Conference Player of the Year, shared the game lead in scoring with 20 points and pulled down 11 rebounds for her first double-double of the year.

Game 3: Nov. 11, 2018
Auburn 79, New Mexico 76 The Pit Albuquerque, N.M. Preseason WNIT - Ouarterfinal


ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. -- Sophomore Unique Thompson had 19 points and a career-high 19 rebounds as Auburn won a thriller at New Mexico, 79-76, to advance to the semifinals of the Preseason Women's NIT.

With 17 seconds to play and the score tied 76-all, junior Daisa Alexander hit a baseline jumper, got fouled, and made the free throw to give the Tigers (3-0) a three-point lead. New Mexico (1-1), who had hit 123 -pointers in the game, had two looks at a tying trey in the final three seconds but missed both as the clock expired.

Thompson's 19-point, 19 -rebound effort marked her second double-double in three games and the ninth of her career. The 19 rebounds were the most by an Auburn player since Tra'Cee Tanner also had 19 at Florida Gulf Coast during the 2015-16 season.
Auburn took advantage of early New Mexico fouls, hitting 8-of-12 free throws in the first quarter and 15-of-20 in the first half. Those points were sorely needed because the Tigers managed just 30.3 percent from the field in the opening half. Despite that, Auburn finished the second quarter on a 7-0 run - a 3-pointer from Emari Jones and four points from Janiah McKay - to take a $36-33$ lead to the break.

The foul count went down and the shooting percentages went up in the second half as the Tigers shot 52.9 percent in the final 20 minutes. The lead changed hands 10 different times during the second half alone including the closing seconds of the third quarter. The Lobos took a $56-54$ lead with five seconds to play on a pair of free throws, but freshman Erin Howard drained a buzzer-beating 3 -pointer to give the Tigers a $57-56$ lead through three periods.

Auburn then moved ahead by as many as five points with $4: 40$ to play, taking a $70-65$ lead out of the final media timeout on a pair of Thompson free throws. But in a span of two New Mexico possessions, the Lobos were back ahead 71-70 on a pair of 3-pointers.

McKay hit a jumper to give the Tigers a $76-73$ lead with exactly a minute to play, but the Lobos answered with their 12th 3-pointer of the game to knot the score at 7676 , setting up Alexander's game-winner.

## Game 4: Nov. 13, 2018 lowa State 67, Auburn 64 Hilton Coliseum Ames, Iowa Preseason WNIT - Semifinal



AMES, Iowa -- A furious comeback by the Auburn women's basketball team fell just short Tuesday night as the Tigers dropped a 67-64 battle at lowa State in the Preseason WNIT semifinal.

Trailing by 10 with less than two minutes to play, senior Janiah McKay made three straight 3-pointers in less than a minute - the last coming with 41 seconds left - to tie the game at 64 -all. But the Tigers were unable to get a shot away in their final two possessions, and a Cyclone layup with 9 seconds to play was the difference.

Sophomore Unique Thompson had her second straight double-double and third of the season with 19 points and 14 rebounds. Emari Jones matched a season-high with 15 points, and McKay's late flurry gave her a 14-point night.

Auburn was playing its third game in five days in three different states and will have traveled over 3,700 miles since Saturday by the time the team returns home Wednesday.

Thompson dominated both ends of the floor in the first half, racking up 16 points and 10 rebounds by halftime. Meanwhile, lowa State started cold, shooting 18 percent in the first quarter and 28 percent in the first half as the Tigers were able to build an early lead. Auburn led by as many as 15 late in the second quarter before the Cyclones cut the lead to nine at the break, 38-29.

A 3-pointer from Jones to start the second half pushed the Tigers' lead to 12. But from there, the Cyclones caught fire. A 10-O ISU run cut the lead to two with 6:34 left in the quarter, and a buzzer-beating 3 -pointer tied the game at 45-45.

The Cyclones took their first lead nine seconds into the fourth quarter and never trailed again, going on an $8-0$ run to push the advantage to 10 points at $64-54$ with 2:21 to play. But after a Jones free throw cut the deficit to nine, McKay, who had been quiet most of the night, hit three 3 -pointers in a span of 47 seconds to tie the game.

Auburn shot $41.1 \%$ for the game, but just $31 \%$ in the second half. Meanwhile, Iowa State shot $47 \%$ in the second half, including $40 \%$ on 3 -pointers. The Cyclones won the rebounding battle 42-36, including 16 offensive rebounds which turned into 14 second-chance points.

The win was the 10th straight home non-conference victory for Auburn (4-1), dating back to the 2016-17 season.

Sophomore Unique Thompson recorded her third straight double-double and fourth of the season grabbing 13 rebounds while dropping 16 points; she also led the team with four steals.

Freshman Robyn Benton added 15 points going 2-for-3 from beyond the 3-point line. Senior Janiah McKay finished with 13 points and six assists. Emari Jones had eight points and a career-high 10 rebounds, and Daisa Alexander finished with a career-high eight assists.

Auburn jumped out to a quick 15-5 lead behind five points apiece from Thompson and Benton in the opening five minutes. Louisiana (2-3) answered back to cut the Tigers' lead to four at 17-13 after the first quarter. Auburn again pushed ahead by as many as 12 following a Benton jumper with 59 seconds remaining in the half. Louisiana hit a late pair of free throws to cut the Auburn advantage to eight at the half, 34-26.

After the two teams exchanged buckets for much of the 3rd period, the Tigers began to pull away in the fourth quarter opening on an 11-3 run to increase their lead to as much as 16 points at 61-45 with just over five minutes to play. But the Cajuns answered back with a 16-5 run of their own to cut the Auburn lead to as little as five points with 1:25 to play. Auburn would force five turnovers in the last 85 seconds and took advantage of free-throw opportunities to seal the win.

The Tigers forced a season-best 26 turnovers, scoring 27 points on those takeaways. Auburn shot 44.3 percent from the floor and held the Cajuns to 33.3 percent.

Louisiana was paced by Ty'Reona Doucet, who finished with 13 points along with 13 rebounds. Brandi Williams finished with 15 points for the Ragin' Cajuns.

Game 6: Nov. 28, 2018 Auburn 77, Xavier (La.) 58 Convocation Center New Orleans, La.


NEW ORLEANS -- Senior Emari Jones scored 16 points to lead three Tigers in double-figures as Auburn women's basketball defeated Xavier (La.) 77-58 Wednesday night.

It was the 250th career head coaching victory for Auburn's Terri Williams-Flournoy, now in her seventh season at Auburn and 15th as a collegiate head coach.

Auburn (5-1) took advantage of 25 turnovers by the Gold Nuggets, turning those into 24 points. The Tigers also used a big early run in the third quarter to break open what had been a nine-point game at the half.

Jones' 16 points led all scorers; she also added four rebounds and a pair of assists. Unique Thompson finished with 15 points and a game-high eight rebounds, and Daisa Alexander used a 10-point third quarter to finish with 13 along with six rebounds and five assists. Janiah McKay had a team-leading seven assists along with nine points and five rebounds.

The Tigers shot 43.9 percent from the floor and hit a season-high 10 3-pointers - four from Jones - and had 22 assists on their 29 field goals. Auburn also recorded 14 steals; Thompson and Alexander had three apiece.

Auburn opened the third quarter on a $7-0$ run to push a nine-point halftime lead to 16 at 46-30. The Gold Nuggets would cut the lead to as few as nine late in the period, but a 3-pointer at the buzzer from Alexander gave Auburn a 59-44 lead headed to the fourth.

Auburn saw balanced scoring through a well-played first half on both sides that saw the Tigers take a 39-30 lead to the break. Jones had 10 first-half points and 10 of 11 Auburn players scored as the Tigers shot 46.9 percent from the floor. But Xavier was hot from outside, hitting four 3-pointers to keep things within single-digits.

All 11 players in uniform saw extended playing time, including 14 minutes from freshman Brooke Moore, who had three points in her Auburn debut.

Jas Hill led Xavier with 13 points and Nahrie Pierce added 10. The Cold Nuggets played the game as an exhibition, but the records and statistics count for Auburn.

Game 7: Dec. 2, 2018 Auburn 95, Oklahoma 79 Auburn Arena
Auburn, Ala. SEC/Big 12 Challenge


AUBURN-- Auburn hit 13 3-pointers to set a new school record Sunday afternoon as the Tigers defeated Oklahoma 95-79 at Auburn Arena in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge.

Led by a double-double from sophomore Unique Thompson, five players scored in double-figures for the Tigers (6-1), who snapped an eight-game losing streak against Big 12 opponents and earned their 11th straight home non-conference win.

The Tigers made 133 -pointers on the night, breaking the previous record of 12 that was set Dec. 5, 2007 nearly 11 years ago to the day - against Colgate. Daisa Alexander's third triple of the night with 3:48 to play gave the Tigers an 83-65 lead and set the new program mark.

Thompson finished with 17 points and 14 rebounds for her fifth double-double of the year. She now has 12 dou-ble-doubles for her career, tied for 12th in Auburn history. Alexander led the Auburn attack with 19 points and also had a game-high five assists along with five rebounds.

Emari Jones hit four of Auburn's 13 treys and finished with 16 points, and Crystal Primm and Robyn Benton added 14 points apiece; Primm had a team-leading three steals, and Benton also knocked down four 3-pointers.

Auburn got off to a slow start as the Sooners opened up with a flurry of 3-pointers, taking a 24-17 lead after one quarter. But the Tigers started the second period on an 11-0 run to take a lead they would never relinquish. Auburn shot 52.6 percent in the second quarter and held the Sooners to just 2-of-11 from the field, outscoring Oklahoma 27-6 in the period to take a 44-30 halftime lead.

The Tigers' lead ballooned to as much as 22 points early in the third quarter at 52-30, but the Sooners mounted a charge with a 19-2 run over the next five minutes to cut the deficit to as few as five points.

Auburn let loose in the fourth, shooting 64.7 percent in the final 10 minutes to put the game away. The Tigers hit three straight 3-pointers in a stretch of less than three minutes, pushing the lead to 18 on Alexander's record-setting shot with 3:48 to play.

# Game 8: Dec. 6, 2018 <br> Auburn 81, St. Joseph's 70 <br> Hagan Arena Philadelphia, Pa. 



PHILADELPHIA -- Janiah McKay scored a season-high 21 points, and the Auburn women's basketball team held off a furious late rally by St. Joseph's to pick up an 81-70 win on the road Thursday night.

At 7-1, the Tigers are off to their best start of the Terri Williams-Flournoy era and their best since the 2008-09 SEC Championship team won their first 20 games. But the victory was not without its tense moments as St.
Joseph's (3-6) went on a tear in the second half to nearly erase a 15-point Auburn lead.

McKay's 21 points led all scorers and she was key in the fourth quarter when she scored nine points and hit 6-of-8 free throws in the closing minutes.

Auburn had five total players in double-figures for the second straight game. Daisa Alexander finished with 16 after an 11-point first quarter, Crystal Primm scored 14, Unique Thompson had 12 and Brooke Moore added a sea-son-high 10. Thompson was Auburn's leading rebounder with six.

The Tigers led by as many as 15 in the third quarter at 49-34 but saw St. Joseph's go on a furious tear, hitting eight shots in a row and 12-of-14 over a stretch that spanned the third and fourth quarters, to cut the lead to just one at 65-64 with just over six minutes to play.

But Auburn would finally get some defensive stops and put some distance between themselves and the Hawks, going on a 9-0 run to take a 74-64 lead with 2:52 left. The run was punctuated by a steal and fast-break basket by redshirt freshman Kiyae' White, drawing a huge cheer from a group of friends and family from her nearby hometown of Macungie, Pa .

St. Joe's cut it to four points again at 74-70 after a pair of treys, but Auburn took care of business at the freethrow line in the final minute to put the game away.

# Game 9: Dec. 16, 2018 Auburn 73, Samford 46 Auburn Arena Auburn, Ala. 



AUBURN -- The Auburn women's basketball team forced a season-high 29 turnovers and turned in their best defensive performance of the season in a 73-46 win over Samford Sunday afternoon at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (8-1) improved to 5-0 at home and won their 12th straight home non-conference game, and did so in convincing fashion despite shooting below 40 percent for the first time this season.

Senior Janiah McKay scored a game-high 20 points, her second straight game with at least 20 in the scoring column. She also had a team-leading four steals and four assists. Daisa Alexander added 16 points, and Robyn Benton scored 10 off the bench. Unique Thompson was Auburn's leading rebounder with six.

The Tigers shot 39.1 percent, their lowest of the season, but limited Samford (3-8) to a 37-percent day and fewer scoring opportunities. Auburn also took advantage of several opportunities at the free-throw line, hitting 17-of-20 (85\%) on the day. Auburn turned those 29 Samford turnovers into 30 points. Samford's 46 points were also the fewest allowed by Auburn this season; the Tigers held the Bulldogs to single-digit scoring in each of the first three quarters before a 22-point outburst by Samford in the fourth.

Auburn jumped out to a 9-0 lead, and Samford would pull no closer the rest of the game. The Tigers led 20-8 after one period and 36-17 at halftime after holding the Bulldogs, who rely heavily on the 3-point shot, to just one trey in the first half.

The Tigers led by as many as 32 in the third quarter and took a 56-24 lead to the final period. Samford found its shooting touch in the final 10 minutes, hitting five 3 -pointers to cut the final margin to 27.

Natalie Armstrong had a double-double for Samford with 10 points and 16 rebounds. Shauntai Battle was the Bulldogs' leading scorer with 11.


MYRTLE BEACH, S.C. -- The Auburn women's basketball team overcame foul trouble and a hot-shooting Coastal Carolina team to earn an 84-78 win Tuesday night in the Carolinas Challenge at the Myrtle Beach Convention Center.

The Tigers (9-1) extended their winning streak to six games, but it was not without anxious moments as Auburn lost two post players to fouls in the fourth quarter and had to overcome the Chanticleers (7-2), who hovered near 50-percent shooting most of the night and had two players score 25-plus.

Janiah McKay led Auburn for the third straight game with 21 points, scoring 15 in the first half and salting the game away in the fourth quarter at the free-throw line. Emari Jones had 16 points, knocking down four 3-pointers, and Crystal Primm had a 14-point night, all coming in the second half.

The Tigers trailed at the half for the first time this season as CCU took a 39-38 lead to the break. The lead changed hands 10 times in a first half that saw Auburn attempt 17 3-pointers while Coastal drove to the basket, drew fouls, and made a living at the free-throw line (13-of-16). McKay and Jones combined for 26 of Auburn's 38 points in the half while Thompson, Primm, Jackson and Benton dealt with foul trouble.

The lead changed hands seven more times in the second half with Coastal extending its lead to as many as seven points at 46-39 with 7:51 to play in the third quarter. But the Tigers kept chipping away, and a steal and fast-break layup by Emari Jones just before the buzzer gave Auburn a 62-61 lead after three periods.

Coastal hit a 3-pointer to move back ahead with 8:00 to play, but a layup from Primm and a pair of free throws from Robyn Benton gave the Tigers a 66-64 lead; Auburn would never trail again. With both teams in the bonus and multiple players dealing with foul trouble - Auburn had two players foul out, and Coastal had five players with four fouls when the game ended - free throws were at a premium. Auburn made 10-of-13 attempts in the final period while Coastal was just 4-of-8.

## Game 11: Dec. 20, 2018 Auburn 86, North Carolina 81 (OT) Myrtle Beach Convention Center Myrtle Beach, S.C. Carolinas Challenge



MYRTLE BEACH, S.C. -- Janiah McKay and Unique Thompson both scored 21 points, and the Auburn women's basketball team fought back from a late deficit to earn an 86-81 overtime victory over North Carolina Thursday night in the Carolinas Challenge.

Trailing for most of the fourth quarter, Auburn hit their final four shots of the half and forced the extra period when McKay found Robyn Benton for a layup with 10 seconds to play to tie the score at 69-69. The Tigers (10-1) never trailed in overtime, getting nine points and a huge late steal from McKay to win their seventh in a row.

Auburn led by as many as 11 points in the third quarter, but the Tar Heels (8-5) chipped away, including a 7-0 run to end the quarter, to bring the deficit down to one point headed to the fourth. UNC took its first lead of the half with 5:26 to play on a 3-pointer to make it 56-54.

Auburn never led again in regulation, but after a missed UNC free throw led to Benton's layup with 10 seconds left, the Tigers never trailed in overtime. UNC threatened late, hitting a pair of 3-pointers in the final minute, but McKay sank five free throws over the final 44 seconds to salt away the win.

Thompson had 18 rebounds to go along with her 21 points, picking up her sixth double-double of the season. Crystal Primm - the Duke transfer playing against her former team's archrival - scored a career-high 18 points on 9-of-12 shooting while adding six rebounds and four steals.

Senior Erica Sanders also scored her first two points of the season on a pair of free throws in overtime. She missed the first nine games with an injury but made her presence felt on the defensive end in this game with three rebounds in 11 minutes of action.

Auburn saw its trademark high-intensity defense pay dividends as the Tigers turned 27 North Carolina turnovers into 38 points. None was bigger than a steal by McKay with 47 seconds left that turned into a fast-break layup, plus a foul, to give the Tigers an 80-75 lead.

ELON, N.C.-- For the second time this month, Auburn set a school record for 3-pointers, cruising to its eighth straight win with a 96-44 victory over Elon Saturday afternoon.

The Tigers (11-1) hit 143 -pointers, breaking a 20-dayold Auburn record of 13 that was set Dec. 2 vs. Oklahoma. But it wasn't just the longball for Auburn Saturday Auburn shot a season-best 63.3 percent from the field, including 70 percent in the second half, to pull away early and sprint to a 52-point victory.

Five players finished in double-figures for the Tigers, led by junior Crystal Primm with 17 points, who shared the team lead with seven rebounds. Freshman Robyn Benton hit five 3-pointers to finish with 15 points, while Unique Thompson and Brooke Moore added 14 and Janiah McKay had 13. Freshman Erin Howard also had a career-high seven rebounds to share the team lead.

Eleven of the Tigers' record-setting 14 treys were made by freshmen - five for Benton, four by Moore and two from Howard. The record-breaker was hit by Howard with 20 seconds to play.

The Tigers completely dominated the first half, taking a 51-19 halftime lead, their largest of the season. Auburn shot 58 percent from the field in the opening 20 minutes, including a 63-percent clip in the first quarter. A 16-6 run over the first 4:42 gave the Tigers an early double-digit lead, and Elon would get no closer the rest of the way. Auburn's defense carried the day in the early-going as the Tigers forced seven first-quarter turnovers, turning those into 15 points.

A comparatively slow third quarter saw the Tigers only increase their lead by two as Elon shot 70 percent in the period, giving Auburn a 69-35 lead. But Auburn hit 11-of-15 shots in the fourth - 5-of-7 on 3-pointers - and outscored the Phoenix 27-9 to finish off the 52-point win, Auburn's largest margin of victory of the Coach Flo era.

The Tigers out-rebounded Elon 37-21 and scored 27 points off 20 Phoenix turnovers. Auburn also got a sea-son-high 41 points off its bench, which played the majority of the fourth quarter. In addition to the 14 3-pointers, Auburn scored 40 points in the paint.


AUBURN -- Freshman Brooke Moore scored a ca-reer-high 23 points, and the Auburn women's basketball team pulled away early and cruised to an 83-50 victory over Alabama State to close out non-conference play Saturday at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (12-1), who entered Saturday's game at No. 20 in the latest NCAA RPI with a pair of top-50 wins, will enter SEC play on a nine-game winning streak, their longest since 2012-13. Auburn also finished off a perfect month of December for the second straight season.

Despite shooting a season-low 31.4 percent from the field, the Tigers hit 10 3-pointers and found other ways to score, going 29-of-36 (80.6\%) at the free-throw line. It marked the most free throws made in a game by Auburn since 2008.

Moore's 23 points - the most by an Auburn player this season - came on five 3-point field goals, one two-pointer and six free throws. Crystal Primm added 12 points, and Robyn Benton scored 11 off the bench. Unique Thompson pulled down a team-leading eight rebounds despite playing just 20 minutes. Freshman Erin Howard tied a career-high with seven rebounds for the second straight game.

Auburn scored 34 points off 24 Alabama State turnovers and got 49 points from the bench, which played its most minutes of the season. The Tigers out-rebounded ASU 42-38 and had 17 steals - three apiece from Thompson, Primm and Erica Sanders.

For the second straight game, Auburn never trailed. The Tigers jumped out to a quick 8-0 lead and led 13-5 at the end of one quarter. That turned into a 37-20 halftime lead after a half-court heave from Moore beat the buzzer.

Auburn would outscore the Hornets 22-9 in the third quarter to take a 59-29 lead to the final period. The Tigers would then empty the bench in the fourth, getting dou-ble-digit minutes from six of seven bench players.

The Tigers (12-2, 0-1 SEC) had trouble getting shots to fall, despite having 20 more attempts from the floor than the Lady Vols (12-1, 1-0). Meanwhile, Tennessee shot 54 percent from the field and pulled away late to secure the win.

Thompson finished with 19 points and 12 rebounds along with two assists, two steals and a block in 36 minutes of action. All five Auburn starters scored in double figures. Crystal Primm had 16 points, Daisa Alexander added 13, and Janiah McKay had 10.

Freshman Erin Howard, making her first career start in place of injured senior Emari Jones, scored a career-high 11 points, including three 3-pointers, to go along with four rebounds.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. -- Auburn sophomore Unique Thompson picked up her seventh double-double of the season, but the Tigers came up short in a 78-69 loss to No. 10 Tennessee Thursday night in the SEC opener for both teams at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (12-2, 0-1 SEC) had trouble getting shots to fall, despite having 20 more attempts from the floor than the Lady Vols (12-1, 1-0). Meanwhile, Tennessee shot 54 percent from the field and pulled away late to secure the win.

Thompson finished with 19 points and 12 rebounds along with two assists, two steals and a block in 36 minutes of action. All five Auburn starters scored in double figures. Crystal Primm had 16 points, Daisa Alexander added 13, and Janiah McKay had 10.

Freshman Erin Howard, making her first career start in place of injured senior Emari Jones, scored a career-high 11 points, including three 3-pointers, to go along with four rebounds.

Auburn 66, Alabama 56 Coleman Coliseum Tuscaloosa, Ala.


TUSCALOOSA -- Daisa Alexander scored 22 points and had four steals as Auburn used a strong defensive effort to earn a 66-56 win over Alabama Thursday night at Coleman Coliseum.

The Tigers (14-2, 2-1 SEC) scored 42 of their 66 points in the paint, hitting 25-of-38 two-point shots (65.7\%). Auburn also forced Alabama (9-6, 1-2) into 25 turnovers that turned into 28 Auburn points.

Alexander scored 22 points for the second straight game, matching her season-high and coming within three points of a career high. Unique Thompson added 12 points along with a game-high nine rebounds, and Crystal Primm scored 10 . Nine of the 10 Auburn players that saw playing time had at least one steal; Alexander's four swipes led the way while freshman Erin Howard had three steals along with a team-best five assists.

Janiah McKay added eight points, five rebounds, three assists and two steals, and senior Erica Sanders hit all three shots she took for a six-point night along with a pair of steals.

For the game, Auburn shot 55.8 percent from the floor, their second-best shooting night of the season. The Tigers got to the rim repeatedly in the fourth quarter, scoring 16 of their 17 fourth-quarter points in the paint as the high-low play worked well for Auburn.

The Tigers led 17-13 at the end of the first period. But Auburn turned up its defensive pressure in the second, going on an 11-3 run over the first four minutes to extend their advantage to as much as 15 points before Alabama cut it to a 13-point game at halftime, 36-23.

Auburn dealt with turnover troubles and a scoring drought in the third quarter, turning the ball over seven times in the period as Alabama cut the deficit to as few as five points. But Auburn's defensive pressure came alive in the fourth quarter as a pair of fast-break baskets off steals - one from Alexander and one from Primm pushed Auburn's lead back to double-digits at 57-46 with 5:07 to play. The rest of the way, Auburn had just one possession without a basket as Alabama was unable to cut any further into the lead.


AUBURN -- Three Auburn players scored in double-figures, but No. 7/6 Mississippi State was too much for the Tigers in an 85-59 Bulldog win Monday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (14-3, 2-2 SEC) kept alive their streak of forcing at least 20 opponent turnovers and posted 15 steals, but Mississippi State (16-1, 4-0) took advantage of both size and transition opportunities to pull away in the second half.

Daisa Alexander led Auburn with 18 points and five rebounds; it was her third straight game as Auburn's leading scorer. Brooke Moore hit four 3-pointers and added 16 points off the bench, and Crystal Primm had 14 points and a career-high seven steals. Janiah McKay and Erica Sanders had three assists apiece.

Mississippi State shot 52.7 percent from the field with a combined 67 of their 85 points coming in the paint (44) or at the free-throw line (23). Auburn was 39 percent from the floor for the night and struggled at the charity stripe, hitting just 8-of-18 attempts.

Auburn scored 20 points off 20 MSU turnovers; the Tigers have forced at least 20 turnovers in nine straight games. Primm's seven steals were the most by an Auburn player since Alexander had seven at LSU last year.

The Tigers' defense kept things close for most of the first half as a 12-point Bulldog lead was whittled down to just four points after a steal and 3-pointer from Moore made it 28-24 with 4:37 left in the half. But a pair of late Bulldog 3-pointers and missed opportunities for Auburn at the free-throw line gave State a 38-28 halftime lead.

Auburn cut it to eight early in the third quarter, but State went on a 16-4 run, paced by transition baskets, to take a 54-36 lead. That would become a 64-45 lead at the end of the period, and Auburn would get no closer the rest of the way.

Teaira McCowan led Mississippi State with 22 points and 10 rebounds. Jessika Carter added 14 points off the bench.


NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- Auburn completed one of the biggest comebacks in school history Thursday night, rallying from a 20-point third-quarter deficit to earn a 72-70 win over Vanderbilt at Memorial Gym.

Freshman Robyn Benton hit a jumper in the paint and drew a foul with 8.6 seconds to play to give Auburn the lead for just the second time in the game at 71-70. She sank the free throw to push the lead to two points, and Vandy's baseline jumper at the buzzer fell short.

Auburn (15-3, 3-2 SEC) fought back from a huge deficit for the second straight trip to Memorial Gym. In 2017, the Tigers trailed by 17 midway through the third quarter before rallying for a 64-59 win.

Janiah McKay led the Tigers with 19 points and six assists. Unique Thompson picked up her eighth dou-ble-double of the season with 16 points and 13 rebounds, and Daisa Alexander overcame a slow start to post a 14-point night; 12 of those came in the second half.

The Tigers overcame Vanderbilt shooting 61.0 percent from the floor, including a 69.2-percent clip on 3-pointers. The Commodores had made six total 3-pointers in SEC play before knocking down nine tonight; eight of those came from Cierra Walker, who scored a game-high 25 points.

Vanderbilt led 42-29 at halftime as the Tigers had no answer for Walker's outside shooting; she made six treys in the first half. Her seventh pushed the Vandy advantage to 18 points early in the third quarter, and the Commodores went up 49-29 with 7:53 to play.

A three-point play by Primm with 3:21 to play tied the game for the first time all night. The teams traded buckets on the next three possessions before a missed Vandy free throw gave Auburn its first opportunity to take the lead. McKay hit an 18-foot jumper with just over a minute to play to give the Tigers a 69-68 lead, its first of the night. After a Vanderbilt timeout, the Commodores went back up 70-69 on an Autumn Newby layup with 22 seconds left. But Benton drove into the paint, drew contact, and saw her shot fall after hitting the rim three times to give the Tigers their final lead.


AUBURN -- Auburn fought back from an 11-point fourth-quarter deficit to tie the game in the closing seconds, but No. 24 Texas A\&M scored with four seconds to play to give the Aggies a 69-67 win Thursday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (15-4, 3-3 SEC) tied the game 67-67 on a runner by Janiah McKay with 17 seconds left, but the Aggies' Chennedy Carter scored the final two of her game-high 28 points on a jumper in the paint that proved to be the game-winner with four seconds left.

McKay led Auburn with 17 points while Daisa Alexander added 12. Robyn Benton scored 11 points, and Crystal Primm finished with 10 points and four steals. Unique Thompson led the Tigers with 10 rebounds.

The key stat in the second half was rebounding - the Aggies had 11 offensive rebounds in the second half that turned into 13 second-chance points. For the game, A\&M out-rebounded Auburn 39-30.

Auburn shot 40.3 percent from the field and was 9 -of11 ( $81.8 \%$ ) at the free-throw line. Texas A\&M got to the line 28 times in the game, making 17 ( $60.7 \%$ ); the Aggies shot 47.9 percent from the field.

The Tigers forced 21 turnovers - matching a sea-son-high by Texas A\&M - and converted those into 26 points. It was the 11th straight game for Auburn to force at least 20 opponent turnovers.

A\&M extended their lead to as many as 11 points and led 63-52 with under four minutes to play. But the Tigers chipped away, cutting it to six and then to three on a pair of 3-pointers by Alexander. After her second triple, McKay stole the inbound pass and was fouled, making both free throws to cut the deficit to one point at 65-64.
A second straight turnover led to a game-tying free throw by Primm.

Auburn missed a pair of scoring opportunities, but the Aggies missed the front end of two straight free-throw opportunities, giving McKay the chance to tie the game late. But with no timeouts left, Auburn was unable to stop Carter's game-winner, and Alexander's attempt at the buzzer fell short.

## Game 20: Jan. 27, 2019 \#25 Missouri 74, Auburn 65 Mizzou Arena Columbia, Mo.



COLUMBIA, Mo. -- Janiah McKay scored a season-high 23 points, but Auburn was unable to overcome a big early deficit in a 74-65 loss at No. 25 Missouri Sunday afternoon.

Auburn (15-6, 3-4 SEC) cut what had been a 29-point Missouri lead to as few as eight points in the fourth quarter and outscored the host Tigers by 20 points over the final 14 minutes, but a difficult first quarter was too much for Auburn to overcome.

McKay's 23 led four Tigers in double figures. Crystal Primm added 12 points, Daisa Alexander had 11 and Brooke Moore scored 10.

After missing its first 11 shots, Auburn finished at 42\% for the game. Missouri hit 113 -pointers in the first half but was held to just one in the second half and finished at 49\% from the field for the game. Auburn scored 20 points off 17 Missouri turnovers.

Mizzou led 23-2 after one quarter when Auburn went 1-of-14 from the field while Mizzou shot 50\% (5-10) on 3-pointers alone. Auburn cut the deficit to as few as 16 late in the second quarter, but Mizzou kept hitting 3 -pointers - 11 of them in the first half alone - and took a 43-23 lead at the break.

Missouri had its largest lead at 58-29 with 4:33 to play in the third quarter, but Auburn cut that to a 19-point deficit at the end of the quarter at 62-43. Auburn then outscored Mizzou 22-12 in the fourth, getting as close as eight points when a McKay 3-pointer made it 66-58 with 3:19 to play. But Missouri took care of business at the free-throw line down the stretch and Auburn could get no closer.

Sophie Cunningham led Missouri with 30 points.

## Game 21: Jan. 31, 2019 <br> Auburn 64, Ole Miss 51 The Pavilion at Ole Miss Oxford, Miss.



OXFORD, Miss. -- Auburn sophomore Unique Thompson picked up her ninth double-double of the year to lead the Tigers to a 64-51 victory over Ole Miss Thursday night at The Pavilion at Ole Miss.

The Tigers (16-5, 4-4 SEC) struggled from the field early in the game, but outscored the Rebels (8-14, 2-6) 25-10 in the third quarter to break open what had been a three-point game at the half.

Thompson finished with 20 points and 12 rebounds and was a career-best 10-of-12 at the free-throw line. Daisa Alexander scored 10 points, all coming in that pivotal third quarter, and Crystal Primm finished with 11 points and six rebounds.

Freshman Erin Howard moved back into the starting lineup and filled the stat sheet with eight points, five rebounds, three steals and two assists. Janiah McKay finished with six points and six assists.

Both teams shot 35 percent from the field, but Auburn made up for a tough shooting night by hitting 18-of-24 free throws. The Tigers also out-rebounded the Rebels 40-38, snapping a string of five straight games losing the rebounding battle.

Auburn also forced Ole Miss into 20 turnovers with nine of those coming in the third quarter; the Tigers scored 15 points off those 20 turnovers.

Auburn worked the ball inside repeatedly in the opening few minutes as Thompson had 12 of Auburn's first 15 points. And despite Auburn struggling from outside the paint, the Tigers took a 27-24 lead to halftime, thanks in large part to hitting 10-of-14 free throws in the opening 20 minutes.

The Tigers opened the third quarter on a 9-0 run and held Ole Miss without a field goal for nearly nine minutes of the third quarter, extending the lead to as many as 20 points before taking a 52-34 lead to the final period. Meanwhile, the Tigers forced nine third-quarter turnovers, limiting Ole Miss to just eight shot attempts. Auburn led by as many as 22 midway through the fourth quarter before a few late Ole Miss baskets cut the final margin to 13.


AUBURN -- A furious rally to force overtime led and clutch free throws in the extra period led the Auburn women's basketball team to a 59-58 win over Georgia Sunday afternoon at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (17-5, 5-4 SEC) snapped a four-game skid against Ceorgia that dated to 2016 and rallied from a double-digit deficit for the second time in SEC play.

After Auburn trailed by as many as 13 points in the fourth quarter, junior Crystal Primm hit a game-tying layup with 13 seconds left to send it to overtime at 49-49. The Tigers then went 6-for-6 at the free-throw line in overtime - including 4-for-4 from Primm in the final 34 seconds - and held off a last-second shot from Georgia to secure their first home SEC win of the season.

With 15.6 seconds left in overtime and Auburn trailing 58-57 with the ball in the frontcourt, Janiah McKay drove for what would have been the go-ahead layup. After she missed, Primm grabbed the rebound and was fouled on the put-back attempt. Both free throws were good, and after Georgia called timeout to advance, the Bulldogs' 3-point attempt missed and time expired to give the Tigers a stirring victory.

Auburn overcame its worst shooting game of the season ( $30.4 \%$ ) by forcing 28 Georgia turnovers - 11 in the fourth quarter alone - converting those into 22 points. The Tigers had a season-high 21 steals and out-rebounded Ceorgia 37-36.

Janiah McKay led the Tigers with 18 points and scored her 1,500th career point in the first quarter. She also had a season-high five steals and was 8-of-10 at the freethrow line. Unique Thompson added 14 points and nine rebounds along with four steals, and Primm finished with 13 points and a career-high nine rebounds.

Four Auburn players had at least four steals - McKay led with five while Thompson, Alexander and Erica Sanders had four apiece. Erin Howard added three steals along with seven points and four rebounds.


AUBURN -- Auburn's Unique Thompson scored a game-high 20 points, but a 3-point barrage in the first half by No. 19 Kentucky was the difference in a 75-65 loss Thursday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (17-6, 5-5 SEC) led in most statistical categories and were able to control the paint most of the night, but the Wildcats (19-5, 6-4) hit their first eight 3-point attempts and used a 14-0 run in the second quarter to build a lead Auburn could not overcome.

Auburn shot 42.3 percent from the field and out-rebounded Kentucky 29-27. It was the first time this season that Auburn fell when out-rebounding its opponent. The Tigers also scored 22 points off 17 Kentucky turnovers and controlled the inside game, scoring 36 points in the paint. Auburn also took advantage of free-throw opportunities, hitting 22-of-29 attempts at the line.

Kentucky, meanwhile, shot 51.9 percent for the game, including a 55 -percent night (11-for-20) from beyond the arc. The Wildcats were 9-of-12 from 3-point range in the first half before Auburn was able to hold them to just 2-of-8 after halftime.

Thompson's 20 points led all scorers; she also led Auburn with six rebounds. Janiah McKay added 14 points, and Crystal Primm scored 11 and led the Tigers with six steals and five assists. Robyn Benton added eight points off the bench.

After a mostly even first quarter that saw Kentucky take a 22-18 lead, Auburn scored first in the second quarter to cut the lead to two with 8:44 left. But over the next three-plus minutes, the Wildcats forced three Auburn turnovers and hit a pair of 3 s as part of a 14-0 run to give Kentucky a 36-20 lead. The Wildcats would finally miss on their ninth 3-point attempt of the night but took a 42-28 lead to the half.

Kentucky extended its lead to as much as 16 at 66-50 with 8:39 to play. Auburn would get as close as nine points midway through the quarter but could pull no closer.

## Game 24: Feb. 10, 2019 Auburn 75, Arkansas 72 Bud Walton Arena Fayetteville, Ark.



FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. -- Four Tigers scored in dou-ble-figures, and the Auburn women's basketball team held off a late Arkansas rally to earn a thrilling 75-72 win Sunday afternoon at Bud Walton Arena.

The Tigers (18-6, 6-5 SEC) saw a 17-point third-quarter lead evaporate as Arkansas' Chelsea Dungee scored 41 points - 32 of them in the second half - but got two late defensive stops and made clutch free throws to hold on for their fifth SEC road win of the year.

Arkansas took a 71-70 lead with 1:39 to play after Dungee hit four straight free throws. But a steal by Unique Thompson, a subsequent Arkansas foul and two free throws gave the Tigers the lead back at 72-71. Thompson then blocked a Dungee jumper at the other end, Daisa Alexander got the rebound, then hit two more free throws with 4.2 left to make it 74-71.

Auburn would foul Dungee before she could attempt a tying 3-pointer, and she missed the first and made the second to give Auburn the ball back with a 2-point lead. Robyn Benton was fouled before the clock started, made one of two, and Arkansas could not get a shot off before the buzzer.

Thompson picked up her 10th double-double of the season with 13 points and 12 rebounds, including the two clutch free throws in the final seconds. Alexander led the Tigers with 18 points, Janiah McKay added 13 along with six assists, and Benton scored 11. Erin Howard had one of her best all-around games of the season with 7 points, a career-high 8 rebounds, 3 assists, 3 blocks and 2 steals.

Auburn shot 45.9 percent from the field and held Arkansas to a 36.8 -percent day. The Tigers forced just 12 turnovers, tied for the fewest this season, but took advantage of the few with 20 points off the Razorbacks' giveaways. Auburn also controlled the inside game, scoring 42 points in the paint to Arkansas' 16. The Tigers also won the rebounding battle 37-32.

The Tigers extended a 14-point halftime lead to as many as 17 early in the third quarter. But from that point, Dungee caught fire and took advantage of numerous free-throw opportunities - she was 17-of-19 for the game - but Auburn still led 60-47 at the end of three.
