#### **Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters**

- Junior Blanche Alverson was named to the Capital One Academic All-District Team on Thursday
- Sunday's game will air live on the SEC Network, Auburn's sixth televised game of the season
- Freshman Hasina Muhammad is the lone Tennessee native on Auburn's roster
- Auburn assistant Carla McGhee played for Tennessee and graduated in 1990
- Tennessee assistant Mickie DeMoss was an assistant under Joe Ciampi at Auburn from 1983-85; UT Director of Character Development Daedra Charles-Furlow was an assistant at Auburn under Nell Fortner from 2006-08
- Tennessee is ranked No. 8 in both major polls this week
- Auburn is 92-163 all-time against ranked teams, 9-7 against teams ranked No. 8 in the country
- Najat Ouardad had 7 steals at Vanderbilt on Jan. 12, a mark that ties for 6th all-time at AU in single-game steals
- Sophomore Jassany Williams ranks fourth in the SEC and 50th in the nation in blocks per game (2.0)
- Sophomore Tyrese Tanner leads Auburn in scoring and ranks 21st in the SEC with 10.7 points per game
- Auburn picked up its 800th win in program history on Nov. 15 against Belmont, 80-53
- Blanche Alverson moved into sixth all-time at Auburn in career 3-pointers in the Purdue game
- Auburn is coming off an 66-61 loss to Vanderbilt; Tennessee is coming off a 64-60 loss to South Carolina
- The Tigers used their eighth different starting lineup vs. Vanderbilt, nine different Tigers have started this season
- This will be the 46th meeting between Auburn and Tennessee with the Lady Vols holding a 25-10 series lead
- When playing in Knoxville, Tennessee leads the series, 16-2
- Tennessee won the last meeting, a 73-52 decision on Jan. 1, 2012 in Auburn, Ala.
- The Lady Vols won the last meeting in Knoxville, an 85-56 Auburn loss on Jan. 28, 2010
- Auburn is 190-165 all-time in Southeastern Conference games
- This will be the 12th meeting between Nell Fortner and UT's Pat Summitt with Summitt holding a 9-2 lead
- Fortner and Summitt are both former United States Olympic Team head coaches
- 12 Tigers have faced Tennessee before; Camille Glymph averages 10.5 points vs. UT, including 21 earlier this season
- Auburn is 8-1 all-time on Feb. 5 and 148-91 all-time in the month of February (24-30 under Fortner)
- The Tigers are 52-64 all-time when playing a team from the State of Tennessee; 31-43 when playing in Tennessee
- Auburn is 89-2 under Nell Fortner when scoring 70 or more points in a game
- Auburn's bench has out-scored the opponent in two games this season
- Auburn's defenese has averaged scoring 18.1 points off turnovers, forcing 18.6 turnovers per game
- The Tiger bench has stepped up, averaging 23.4 points per game this season, accounting for 39.5% of AU's offense
- Hasina Muhammad was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Dec. 26
- Senior Chantel Hilliard earned her degree in political science from Auburn on Dec. 12
   Auburn was picked ninth in the SEC Preseason Media and Coaches polls. Tennessee was picked to win the legaue
- Nell Fortner is in her eighth season at Auburn, marking her longest tenure at any job
- The Tigers welcome two newcomers: junior college transfer Najat Ouardad and freshman Hasina Muhammad
- Auburn is coming off a 16-16 season in 2010-11, one that ended with a berth in the WNIT
- The Tigers have advanced to the post-season in four of the last five seasons
- Auburn signed four players during the Early Signing Period: Cabriana Capers (6-1, F, Bolingbrook, Ill.), Chadarryl Clay (5-7, G, Chattanooga, Tenn.), Nicole Tanner (6-3, F, Hoover, Ala.) and Nariah Taylor (6-5, P, Indianapolis, Ind.)

#### ON THE TUBE

This will be Auburn's sixth televised game this season as it airs live on the SEC Network. Cara Capuano will call the action with former Duke Blue Devil Abby Waner adding analysis. Auburn is 1-4 in its previous televised games.

#### **SCOUTING TENNESSEE**

Tennessee is 16-6 on the season and 7-2 in SEC play after dropping a 64-60 decision to South Carolina on Thursday. With the loss, the Lady Vols have a 9-2 record in Thompson-Boling Arena with the other loss coming to No. 1-ranked Baylor, 76-67.

Auburn opened SEC play against Tennessee on New Year's Day and the Lady Vols have gone 8-3 since. Along with the loss to USC, Tennessee has also fallen at No. 9/8 Kentucky (61-60) and at No. 2 Notre Dame (72-44).

Tennessee currently has three players averaging double figures in conference play. Shekinna Stricklen leads the Lady Vols with 15.6 points per game, shooting 43 percent from the floor. At 59 percent shooting, Glory Johnson is averaging 13.9 ppg and leads the team with 10.1 rebounds per game. She also has team-highs with 21 steals and 13 blocks on the season. Meighan Simmons has added 10.1 ppg.

Tennessee's key to success this season has been rebounding and taking care of the ball. The Lady Vols average 44.5 boards per game, 9.1 more than their opponents. Tennessee also has a league-best 1.0 assist-to-turnover ratio.

#### **SCOUTING AUBURN**

Auburn is 11-12 on the season and 3-7 in SEC play after a 66-61 loss to Vanderbilt on Thursday.

Depth and Defense have been the key words for Auburn this season. Nine different Tigers have started in eight different starting lineups while five different players have led the team in scoring. Nine players are averaging at least 16.0 minutes per game this season.

Leading the way is sophomore Tyrese Tanner with 10.7 points per game, good enough to rank 21st in the SEC. Mostly coming off the bench, Tanner has led the Tigers in scoring in five of the last nine games. Right behind her is the long-range duo of Camille Glymph and Blanche Alverson, who are averaging 9.4 and 9.1 points per game, respectively. The pair is averaging 3.7 treys per game, shooting at a 37.0 percent clip.

Also nearing double figures is Hasina Muhammad with 9.0 points per game, good enough for second in the SEC among freshmen. Senior Parrisha Simmons leads the team in rebounding with 5.5 boards per game, including four double-digit rebound games this season.

#### **AGAINST THE RANKED**

Auburn is 92-163 all-time against teams ranked in the Associated Press Top-25. Auburn is 11-46 against ranked teams under Head Coach Nell Forter. Auburn holds a 9-7 all-time record against

8th-ranked teams. The Tigers are 2-3 against the Lady Vols when they have been ranked No. 8, with the last meeting resulting in a 77-45 Tennessee victory in 2006. The last time Auburn defeated an 8th-ranked Tennessee team came in 1997 with a 61-59 final score.

Tennessee is the seventh ranked team of the season for Auburn after the Tigers' 73-50 loss at No.8 Duke, 62-54 loss to No. 22 Purdue, 73-52 loss to No. 7 Tennessee, 70-45 loss to No. 16/15 Georgia, 66-58 loss at No. 24/25 Vanderbilt and 66-48 loss to No. 6/6 Kentucky.

Auburn's last win over a ranked team was a 63-58 win over No. 22 Georgia on Feb. 24, 2011.

#### LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN

The Auburn women's basketball team could not overcome a second-half deficit to Vanderbilt as the Tigers fell 66-61 Feb. 2 in Auburn Arena.

Auburn had three players in double figures in the game led by senior Chantel Hilliard with 13 points. Camille Glymph added 12 while Morgan Jennings tallied 11 points and tied her career high with seven rebounds.

The Tigers outrebounded Vanderbilt 34-27, including 19-8 on the offensive boards. The bench once again put up an impressive showing with 23 points, including 14 in the first half.

Despite Vanderbilt holding the lead for the first 10 minutes of the game, the Tigers tied it up, 18-18, after a steal from Parrisha Simmons that resulted in a 3-pointer from Glymph. Jennings took the lead on the next possession with a jumper in the lane.

The Commodores regained the lead with 4.13 to play, and the lead changed three more times before the teams went into the half tied at 33 as another 3-pointer from Glymph just missed as time expired.

Coming out of the locker room, Vanderbilt went on a 7-0 run, but Auburn countered and never let the margin reach double digits. Despite repeated efforts to regain the lead in the second half, the Tigers would be within a point of the Commodores three times with less than three minutes to play to no avail.

#### LAST TIME OUT FOR TENNESSEE

The Lady Vols are coming off a 64-60 loss at home to South Carolina. It was just Tennessee's second conference loss and sixth overall loss this season.

Tennessee led by nine, 60-55, late in the game, but South Carolina closed the game with a 9-0 run to take the lead and the win.

South Carolina had just four turnovers in the win, and Markeshia Grant would be the difference maker in a close game as she led the Gamecocks in scoring with 27 points, 21 coming from beyond the arc.

South Carolina had two more players in double figures as La'Keisha Sutton added 12 and leasia Walker tallied 11. The Lady Vols were led by Glory Johnson with 13 points and Ariel Massengale with 12, while Shekinna Stricklen added eight points and 10 rebounds.

#### LAST TIME VS. TENNESSEE (Jan. 1, 2012)

Auburn committed 25 turnovers and sent No. 7/8 Tennessee to the free throw line 31 times in 73-52 Southeastern Conference-opening loss to the Lady Vols. Sophomore Camille Glymph came off the bench to lead the Tigers with 21 points.

The 21 points marked the seventh game for Glymph to score in double figures and her second 20-point game of the season. Tyrese Tanner had eight points and three steals for Auburn.

Auburn held a four-point lead midway through the first half and was down by just two, 31-29, at halftime. But, the Lady Vols opened the second half on a 9-0 run to take a double-digit lead and keep the Tigers from threatening for most of the remainder of the game.

Tennessee led by 14, its largest lead of the game at the time, with 10:20 left in the game, but Auburn came back with a 9-2 run, fueled by a pair of Glymph 3-pointers, to cut it to seven with 7:59 to ao.

But, the fouls started to rain down on Auburn from that point on as the Tigers committed 10 in the final 7:27 of the game. Tennessee out-scored Auburn 20-6 from that point on with 14 of the points coming at the free throw line.

Meighan Simmons went 7-of-8 from the free-throw line to lead Tennessee with 20 points. She was one of four Lady Vols to finish in double figures, coming in ahead of Shekinna Stricklen (17), Glory Johnson (14) and Alicia Manning (10). Johnson also netted a double-double with 13 points.

## LAST TIME VS. TENNESSEE IN KNOXVILLE (Jan. 28, 2010)

Alli Smalley led the Tigers with 21 points, including three 3-pointers, in Auburn's 85-56 loss at Thompson-Boling Arena on Jan. 28, 2010. Blanche Alverson, KeKe Carrier and Morgan Toles added eight points each while Carrier also had a team-high six rebounds.

Auburn took a quick 5-0 lead from the start and led through the first five minutes of the game. A Kelley Cain layup at the 14:42 mark gave Tennessee its first lead, one it would not give up. The Lady Vols slowly built their lead, taking a 43-25 lead at halftime.

Tennessee would go on to lead by as many as 33 points in the second half before taking the eventual 85-56 win.

Tennessee's Angie Bjorklund led the team with 20 points while Glory Johnson finished with a double-double, scoring 15 points along with 13 rebounds.

#### **CAREER VS. TENNESSEE**

All 12 Tigers have seen action against the Lady Vols during their careers. The Tigers' three seniors (Hilliard, Jennings and Simmons) were freshmen during the 2008-09 season when Auburn picked up two wins, including one during the SEC Tournament, over Tennessee.

Coming off a 21-point effort earlier this season, Camille Glymph is averaging 10.5 points per game against Tennessee. Blanche Alverson has faced the Lady Vols in each of her previous two seasons with some success. Alverson has combined for 23 points over three games, averaging 7.7 points and 4.0 rebounds

per game.

#### **FORTNER VS. SUMMITT**

This will be the 12th meeting between Nell Fortner and Tennessee's Pat Summitt with Summitt owning an 9-2 record. Eight of the nine wins against Fortner have come during her time at Auburn while the eighth came during the 1996-97 season while Fortner was coaching at Purdue.

Fortner is in her eighth season at Auburn and holds a 143-101 record on The Plains. Summitt is in her 38th season as Tennessee's head coach and holds a 1,087-205 record.

#### **TENNESSEE TIGER**

Auburn freshman Hasina Muhammad (Memphis) is the lone Tiger on the roster from the state of Tennessee. She is just the ninth Auburn player ever from the Volunteer State.

#### AN OLYMPIC RING TO IT

Sunday's game at Tennessee will mark the third time this season that Auburn head coach Nell Fortner, who was head coach of the U.S. National Team at the 2000 Sydney Olympics, will face another Olympic coach. Tennessee head coach Pat Summitt was head coach of the 1984 U.S. Olympic Team and was named an assistant in 1980.

Fortner has also faced South Carolina's Dawn Staley this season. Staley was an assistant coach on the 2008 U.S. Olympic Team.

#### **NELL'S COACHING TREE**

Head Coach Nell Fortner will see a familiar face on the Tennessee sideline in Lady Vol Director of Character Development Daedra Charles-Furlow. Fortner hired Charles-Furlow as an assistant coach prior to the 2006-07 season. During her two seasons at Auburn, the Tigers posted a combined 41-25 record.

Charles-Furlow is in her third season back at her alma mater, under Pat Summitt, who was her coach at UT from 1988-91.

#### **FACING HER ALMA MATER**

Auburn assistant coach Carla McGhee should be familiar with Tennessee women's basketball as she played for the Lady Vols from 1986-90. She played three of those seasons, helping Tennessee compile a 90-14 record and two NCAA titles.

#### NO STRANGER TO AUBURN

Tennessee assistant coach Mickie DeMoss is no stranger to Auburn as she served as an assistant coach under Joe Ciampi on The Plains from 1983-85. During her two seasons at Auburn, she helped the Tigers to a 44-16 record and an appearance in the NCAA Midwest Regional.

#### **AGAINST THE SEC**

Auburn has a 190-165 all-time record in the Southeastern Conference. The Tigers have won five SEC titles and four SEC Tournament titles, most recently winning the regular-season title in 2009 after 14-2 league mark.

#### ON THIS DATE...

Auburn is 8-1 all-time when playing on Feb. 5, with its only loss being to Vanderbilt in 2006. Nell Fortner is 1-1 on Feb. 5 after defeating Ole Miss in 2009. The Tigers are 2-0 when playing away on Feb. 5 with the last time being a 71-54 victory against Kentucky in 2004.

#### IN FEBRUARY

Auburn is 148-91 all-time in the month of February, including a 24-30 mark under Nell Fortner (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that season).

#### **AGAINST THE VOLUNTEER STATE**

Auburn holds a 52-64 record against teams from the state of Tennessee. #### ALVERSON NAMED TO ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

Auburn junior Blanche Alverson was named to the Capital One Academic All-District IV First Team, it was announced Feb. 2.

Alverson, a native of Andalusia, Ala., earns the honor for the second year in a row, making the Capital One Academic All-District Second Team a year ago. A biomedical sciences (pre-med) major, she currently holds a 3.68 cumulative grade-point average.

By virtue of making the first team, her named will be added to the ballot for the Capital One Academic All-America Team.

#### **TOUGH START**

The Tigers had a difficult road to start the SEC season. Of Auburn's first four league opponents, three were ranked in the top 25 in the nation.

#### **STINGY TIGERS**

A pair of Tigers have had big defensive performances this season. Junior point guard Najat Ouardad collected five steals against Troy on Nov. 30, the most steals for an Auburn player since DeWanna Bonner picked up six against Tennessee on Jan. 25, 2009. She topped that at Vanderbilt tallying seven steals, a mark that ties her for sixth all-time at Auburn in single-game steals.

Fellow junior Blanche Alverson picked up six steals against Central Connecticut State on Dec. 22. Her six steals rank in a tie for 10th all-time at Auburn in sinale-aame steals.

#### **SEC LEADERS**

A group of Tigers are among the leaders in the most recent SEC rankings. Sophomore Jassany Williams is fourth in blocked shots with 2.0 per game. Freshman Hasina Muhammad second in the league among freshmen in scoring with 9.0 points per game. Sophomore Tyrese Tanner is in 21st in the SEC with 10.7 points per game while Camille Glymph is 28th with 9.4 points per game.

Two of the league's top 3-point shooters are on Auburn's roster. Glymph (1.9) and Blanche Alverson (1.8) are fifth and sixth, respectively, in 3-pointers per game. Glymph is 12th in the SEC in 3-point percentage while Alverson is third.

Najat Ouardad ranks eighth in the league in overall games in steals with  $2.0 \, \text{per}$  game.

#### **BLOCK PARTY**

Auburn has ranked among the leaders in the nation this year in blocked shots. The Tigers average 6.4 per game, good enough to lead the SEC and rank fifth in the nation.

Individually, sophomore Jassany Williams is 50th in the nation with 2.0 blocks per game.

#### **SWATTING AWAY**

Auburn blocked 13 shots against Troy on Nov. 30, marking the most blocked shots for the Tigers since swatting a school-record 17 against Alabama A&M on Nov. 19, 2009. It also set a new Auburn Arena record for blocked shots and was the second time this season for the Tigers to block more than 10 shots in a game. The Tigers have now blocked 10 or more shots in five different games, most recently doing so at Ole Miss on Jan. 29.

#### MUHAMMAD NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Auburn freshman Hasina Muhammad was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Dec. 26, becoming the first Tiger to earn such an honor in nearly four years.

Muhammad, a native of Memphis, Tenn., earned the honor after her performance Dec. 21-22 at the New York Life Holiday Tournament hosted by Hofstra. She averaged 12.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 1.0 blocks and 1.5 steals per game in the two tournament games, helping the Tigers to a third-place finish.

#### **Quoting Head Coach Nell Fortner**

On Vanderbilt game...

"I thought that was one of our best efforts of the season. I thought we played fairly well on both ends of the floor and gave ourselves a great opportunity to win the game. A couple of things just did not go our way and we took the loss."

On seniors Chantel Hilliard and Morgan Jennings...
"They are playing with a lot of passion and a lot of heart, working as hard as they can to get a win. I'm sorry we could not get that for them Thursday because they are working really hard. It just was not meant to be."

On playing in Thompson-Boling Arena...

"It is a tough environment, they have great crowd support. Tennessee will have 14,000 or 15,000 at that game. It gets loud in there. The history and respect you have for that program, not just as a coaching staff, but your kids do too. Your players have probably grown up going to their camp or have been there at one point. It is an interesting place to play, a tough place to play."

On Tennessee coming off a home loss...

"I'm sure they will be hungry to not give up another home loss. I tell you, we are playing well right now and we are going to go in there and battle as hard as we can."

On Tennessee...

"Tennessee has some good depth, they have some really nice players. There is no question about the quality of their players, they have some really good senior leadership on that team in Shekinna Stricklen and Glory Johnson. They also have a really good point guard in Ariel Massengale, who I think has made them a different team from the past three years. She is a true point guard. They you have Stricklen and Johnson, who just really battle you hard."

#### SEC Women's Basketball Notes

- The SEC has posted impressive non-conference records in the last decade. The SEC compiled a 131-49 (.728) non-conference record for the 2009-10 season.
- Since the 1990 season, the SEC has compiled a 2914-894 (.765) record against other conferences. The league has recorded 150+ wins during eight seasons and has never recorded a non-conference winning percentage below 723
- SEC teams have earned appearances in 25 of 30 NCAA Final Fours, an accomplishment unmatched by any other league.
- Overall, SEC squads have filled 34 of the 120 Final Four berths, including having two Final Four teams in 1988 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1989 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1995 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1996 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1998 (Arkansas, Tennessee), 2004 (LSU, Tennessee), 2005 (LSU, Tennessee), 2007 (LSU, Tennessee) and 2008 (LSU, Tennessee).
- SEC teams have made 18 appearances in a nation-high 16 NCAA Championship games, winning eight NCAA Championships (Tennessee: 1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).
- · The league also had the distinction of providing both national finalists twice in its history in 1996 (Tennessee 83, Georgia 65) and in 1989 (Tennessee 76, Auburn 60).
  - SEC teams have won 335 NCAA Tournament games against 172 losses (.661) for an average of 11.2 NCAA wins per year.
- In addition, all 12 current members have appeared in the NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC has paced the pack in NCAA tournament bids 21 times in its 30-year
- The SEC was the first league to ever have eight teams invited to the NCAA Tournament, doing so in 1999 and 2002.
- The SEC was also the first league to ever have seven teams invited to the NCAA Tournament and earned this honor a leading seven times (1986, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2004).
- The SEC is one of a handful of leagues to have won three national tournament titles with eight NCAA, two WNIT and three NWIT. Along with the eight NCAA championships won by Tennessee, Arkansas (1999) and Auburn (2003) captured the current Women's NIT titles. But the first-ever SEC national title belongs to Georgia, winners of the 1981 NWIT which predates the current NCAA tournament, LSU (1985) and Kentucky (1990) each won NWIT titles. Both Arkansas (1987) and South Carolina (1979) won the WNIT as members of their previous conferences.
- In 2003, Auburn won the WNIT title with wins over South Alabama, Florida State, Richmond, Creighton and Baylor. In 1999, the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks defeated Wisconsin 76-64 to claim the SEC's first WNIT championship.
- In 1981, Georgia defeated Pittsburg, California and Arizona State (in OT) to capture the NWIT Championship, the first-ever national championship of any kind for the SEC in women's basketball.

#### MUHAMMAD AND TANNER NAMED TO SUN & FUN **CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM**

Auburn freshman Hasina Muhammad and sophomore Tyrese Tanner were both named to the Flu Sun & Fun Classic All-Tournament Team.

Tanner led the Tigers with 17 points off the bench vs. FIU. Fifteen of her 17 points came in the second half, fueling the Tiger comeback. She was the only Tiger to score in double figures in both tournament games, averaging 14.0 points per game for the two

Muhammad scored 12 points against Charlotte and eight against FIU. She averaged 10.0 points and 3.0 steals per game in the two games.

#### **ALVERSON NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM**

Junior Blanche Alverson was named to the New York Life Holiday Invitational All-Tournament Team for her efforts in the two tournament games. She averaged 13.5 points, 4.0 rebounds and 3.5 steals per game in the two games. Included in those was a season-high 20 points vs. Marist and six steals against CCSU, a mark that ranks in a tie for ninth all-time at Auburn.

#### THE GRADUATE

Auburn senior Chantel Hilliard got a step up on the next phase of her life on Dec. 12 as she graduated from Auburn with a degree in political science.

#### **GOING TO THE BENCH**

Auburn's bench has stepped up this season, scoring 538 points in the 23 games, averaging 23.4 points per game. In two games alone, the Auburn bench has out-scored the opponent (35-34 vs. USC-Upstate and 48-47 against Troy). Overall, Auburn's bench has accounted for 39.5 percent of the team's offense this season.

#### **DEPTH PROVIDES BOOST**

Auburn has banked off its depth so far in the 2011-12 season, utilizing nine different starters in eight different starting lineups. Five different players (Blanche Alverson, Camille Glymph, Chantel Hilliard, Hasina Muhammad and Tyrese Tanner) have led the Tigers in scoring this season.

#### **CHAIRWOMAN OF THE BOARD**

Senior Parrisha Simmons has dominated the boards this season, pulling down a team-high 5.5 rebounds per game, Included in that total are 16 rebounds she tallied against Purdue. It was the most rebounds in a single game for an Auburn player since Jordan Greenleaf pulled down 16 against Mississippi State on Jan. 3, 2010.

#### **MOVING ON UP**

Junior Blanche Alverson hit five 3-pointers against Purdue, moving her past former Tiger Carolyn Jones (1988-91) into sixth place all-time at Auburn in career 3-pointers.

She currently has 132 on her career as she moves toward Kristen Mulliaan's (1992-96) 149.

#### **OFFENSE WINS GAMES**

Auburn is 89-2 when scoring 70 or more points in the Nell Fortner era. The only times Auburn has lost when scoring at least 70 points was on Jan. 20, 2005 vs. No. 7 Tennessee, 71-81 and Feb. 19, 2009 at No. 18 Vanderbilt, 73-70. When scoring less than 70 points, Auburn is 54-99 during the Fortner era.

#### **DEFENSE MAKES OFFENSE**

In Auburn's 23 games of the season, the Tigers have used their defense to spark their offense. Auburn has forced 428 turnovers (18.6 per game) this season on 218 steals (9.5 per game), turning them into 18.1 points per game (416 total points).

Auburn has scored 20 or more points off turnovers in nine games this season.

#### **TURNOVER MACHINE**

Auburn's defense has wreaked havoc on opponents this season, causing an average of 18.6 turnovers per game. Against Central Connecticut State, Auburn forced 37 CCSU turnovers, the most since Auburn forced 37 against Alabama A&M on Nov. 14, 2008.

The CCSU game was the fifth this season where Auburn forced 20 or more turnovers. The Tigers now have forced 20 or more turnovers in seven games.

#### TIGERS PICKED NINTH IN PRESEASON POLL

Auburn was predicted to finish ninth in the SEC in a voting of a select panel of both SEC and national media members. Tennessee was picked to win the league with all 22 first-place votes.

The Lady Vols were followed by Georgia (228), Kentucky (212), LSU (189), Vanderbilt (172) and Florida (151) rounding out the top half of the league. Arkansas (142), South Carolina (107), Auburn (94), Alabama (55), Mississippi State (54) and Ole Miss (48) round out the bottom half.

#### STARTING EXPERIENCE

Auburn has seven players on its roster that had started at least one game prior to the 2011-12 season. That group of seven also combined for 123 career starts, led by Blanche Alverson with 45. Senior Parrisha Simmons has started 41 while her classmates, Chantel Hilliard and Morgan Jennings, have started 12 each.

#### **NEW FACES**

The Tigers welcome two new faces to the roster this season in Hasina Muhammad and Najat Ouardad. Muhammad is a true freshman from Memphis, Tenn., playing at Ridgeway High School. Ouardad, a native of Orleans, France, comes to Auburn from Pensacola State College.

#### **MAKING IT HOME**

Nell Fortner enters her eighth season as Auburn's head coach, marking her longest tenure at any position in her career. The longest Fortner had stayed at a job prior to Auburn came from 1990-95 while she was an assistant coach at Louisiana Tech under legendary head coach Leon Barmore.

#### **AUBURN SIGNS FOUR FOR 2012-13**

Auburn head coach Nell Fortner has signed four players for the 2012-13 season during the Early Signing Period. They are Cabriana Capers, a 6-1 forward from Bolingbrook, III., Chadarryl Clay, a 5-7 guard from Chattanooga, Tenn., Nicole Tanner, a 6-3 forward from Hoover, Ala., and Nariah Taylor, a 6-5 post from Indianapolis, Ind.

Capers is rated a three-star prospect by ESPN's Hoopgulrz and is rated as the No. 35 post prospect in the country. Clay is rated as the No. 77 overall player in the country and 12th-best guard in the country according to ESPN's Hoopgurlz.

Tanner, the younger sister of Auburn sophomore Tyrese Tanner, is rated as one of the top five prospects in the state of Alabama and a top-100 post in the country. Taylor is ranked as the No. 14 post player in the country by ESPN's HoopGurlz. She is also ranked as the No. 88 overall player in the nation by Blue Star Basketball and 97th by the All-Star Girls Report.

2011-12 Auburn Home-Opener

AUBURN - The Auburn women's basketball team coasted past Belmont 80-53 on Nov. 15 in its home-opener at Auburn Arena, putting the 800th victory in program history in the books. Sophomore Camille Glymph came off the bench, hitting five of Auburn's 10 3-pointers to lead the Tigers with 18 points in the win.
