- Hasina Muhammad (16.7 ppg) & Frankie Sullivan (17.4 ppg) are the highest scoring M&W combo in the SEC
- Muhammad is the only player in the SEC this season to score in double figures in every game and has scored in double figures in 21 straight games - a streak that is tied for seventh in the nation
- The Tigers have forced more opponent turnovers (416) than field goals allowed (402)
- Five Tigers (Peyton Davis, Hasina Muhammad, Blanche Alverson, Tra'cee Tanner and Najat Ouardad) have doubledoubles this season; the first time for 5 different Tigers to do so since the 2006-07 season
- Muhammad and Quardad each have SEC highs of nine steals in games this season
- Auburn leads the all-time series with Alabama, 42-34, but trails, 14-19, when playing in Tuscaloosa
- Auburn won the last meeting, 81-40, on Feb. 23, 2012 in Auburn
- The Tigers also won the last meeting in Tuscaloosa, 65-55, on Jan. 5, 2012
- Junior Tyrese Tanner scored 20 or more points in both games against Alabama last year
- The Tigers are 194-172 all-time in the Southeastern Conference
- Auburn is coming off a 97-53 loss at #5 Kentucky on Sunday; Alabama is coming off a 96-69 loss at #9 Tennessee
- This is the first meeting between Terri Williams-Flournov and Alabama's Wendell Hudson
- Auburn is 6-4 all-time when playing on Jan. 24 and 191-108 when playing in the month of January
- Auburn is 222-56 all-time when playing teams from Alabama; Coach Flo is 5-0 against Alabama teams
- Auburn has forced more than 20 turnovers in 15 of 19 games this season, more than 25 in six
- The Tigers average 22.6 points off turnovers per game
- Hasing Muhammad and Tyrese Tanner have been named SEC Player of the Week this season
- Auburn great Vickie Orr has been named of the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2013
- Senior Julie King graduated from Auburn on Dec. 8

ON THE TUBE

This will be Auburn's fifth televised game this season as it airs live on CSS and ESPN3.com. Auburn is 1-3 in televised games this season. Matt Stewart will call the action with former Auburn head coach Joe Ciampi adding analysis. Ciampi coached at Auburn from 1979-2004, compiling a 568-203 record guiding Auburn to 16 NCAA Tournament appearances, including three Final Four appearances.

His teams won SEC titles in 1981, 1987, 1988 and 1989 and four SEC Tournament titles in 1981, 1987, 1990 and 1997.

NEXT UP FOR THE TIGERS

Auburn will take Sunday off, returning to action on Thursday, Jan. 31 with a 6 p.m., home game against LSU.

AUBURN'S POST-GAME PROCEDURE

The Auburn locker room is closed. Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy and selected Tiger players will be brought to the interview room after the 10-minute "cooling off" period.

QUICK HITS

Auburn is in its 42nd season of women's basketball and sports an all-time record of 824-384... AU has made 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, three WNIT appearances and three Final Fours in the program's history... Head Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is in her first season at Auburn... She has a 156-110 record as a head coach... The Tigers are coming off a 13-17 season in 2012.

800 AND COUNTING

Auburn picked up its 800th program victory last season, becoming the 14th team in NCAA history to reach the 800-win plateau.

WINNING 150

Auburn head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy picked up the 150th win of her head coaching career on Dec. 12 as she led the Tigers to a 69-59 win at George Washington. The win was also significant as it was in Washington, D.C., where she spent her first eight years as a head coach at Georgetown.

Williams-Flournoy also hit a coaching milestone last on Dec. 9 against Hofstra as the win was the 400th of her career as either an assistant or head coach. Following the win she had 251 wins as an assistant and 149 as a head coach.

DEADLY DUO

Frankie Sullivan of the Auburn men's basketball team currently leads the team and is second in the SEC with 17.4 points per game while Hasina Muhammad leads the women's team and ranks fourth in the SEC with 16.7 points per game. Together, the pair is the highest scoring men's and women's combination in the SEC this season with 34.1 points per game.

ALL-AROUND STAR

Senior Blanche Alverson has been a super-star both on and off the court in her Auburn career. Off the court, she carries a 3.6 GPA as a biomedical sciences major, she was named Auburn's 2012 Miss Homecoming and she started her own community service program, Ballin' 4 Books.

On the court, she joined select company on Jan. 20 at Kentucky as she pulled down her 500th career rebound against the Wildcats. By reaching that plateau, she became just the fourth Auburn player ever to tally 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 100 assists, 100 steals and 50 blocks. Entering Thursday's game at Alabama, she now has 1,046 points, 502 rebounds, 149 assists, 105 steals and 62 blocks. The only other players to accomplish the feat are DeWanna Bonner (2005-09), Brenda Hill (1982-85) and Lori Monroe (1979-83).

AUBURN-ALABAMA SERIES

This will be the 77th meeting between Auburn and Alabama with Auburn leading the series 42-34. The Tigers have won 15 of the last 18 meetings. While Auburn leads the series overall, it trails, 14-19, when playing in Tuscaloosa.

SCOUTING ALABAMA

The Alabama Crimson Tide is 11-7 (1-4 SEC) on the season after a 69-96 loss at No. 9 Tennessee Sunday night.

Sophomore Daisha Simmons, who is averaging 12.4 points per game, leads the Tide. She is also the team leader in assists (76) and steals (48) on the season. Redshirt sophomore Kaneisha Horn is averaging 8.8 points per game while leading Alabama in rebounds with 5.5 per game.

In conference play, Simmons and Horn are averaging 14.0 and 13.2 points per game, respectively. The Tide's lone SEC victory comes from an 83-75 win over Ole Miss on Jan. 13.

Alabama averages 71.1 points per game while holding their opponents to 69.7 points per game. Much like Auburn, UA has relied on its defense this season, forcing 24.4 opponent turnovers per game while tallying 12.4 steals per game.

SCOUTING AUBURN

The Auburn women's basketball team, under direction of firstyear head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, returns seven letterwinners and four starters from last season's team that went 13-17 (5-11 SEC). Williams-Flournoy comes to Auburn after eight seasons as head coach at Georgetown where she put together a 143-104 record that included four postseason appearances and three straight trips to the NCAA Tournament, including a Sweet 16 appearance in

Auburn is 13-6 and averaging a 21.5-point margin of victory in the 13 wins. Three Tigers are averaging double figures, led by Hasina Muhammad with 16.7 per game, including six 20-point games, and 5.6 rebounds. Tyrese Tanner is at 12.8 points and 4.1 rebounds per game while Blanche Alverson comes in with 12.1 points and 5.6 boards per game.

Center Peyton Davis leads the team in the post, averaging 6.5 points and 5.5 rebounds per game. Najat Ouardad is tops in the SEC and 10th in the country in assists with 6.9 per game while scoring 5.2 points per game.

LAST TIME VS. ALABAMA (Feb. 23, 2012)

Making it the second-highest margin of victory ever over Alabama, the Tigers sealed an 81-40 victory over the Crimson Tide on Feb. 3, 2012 in Auburn. The 41-point win is Auburn's largest margin win over Alabama since a 45-point win (89-44) on Feb. 18, 1989.

The Tigers took an early lead and extended it to 47-23 at halftime. The Tigers out-scored the Tide 34-17 in the second half to pull away for the comfortable win.

Blanche Alverson tied her career-high with five 3-pointers and Camille Glymph added three, giving each player 53 on the season and tying them for the 7th all-time at Auburn in single-season 3-pointers with Tamela McCorvey (2006-07).

Tyrese Tanner led the Tigers for the seventh time of the season with a career-high 23 points. Najat Ouardad earned a career-high 10 points while Parrisha Simmons tallied a career-high five steals. Despite Alabama's 29 turnovers on the night, Jessica Merritt led the Tide with 15 points and six rebounds while Aneesah Daniels added six points and nine rebounds.

LAST TIME VS. ALABAMA IN TUSCALOOSA (Jan. 5, 2012)

Auburn's 65-55 win over the Tide on Jan. 5 in Tuscaloosa, Ala., marked the first conference victory for the Tigers on the 2012 SEC senson

Tyrese Tanner led the Tigers with 20 points on the game and was one of the three Tigers to finish in double figures. Blanche Alverson tallied 11 points while Hasina Muhammad scored 12 points with five rebounds.

The Tide took a quick 11-3 lead with seven points from Shafontaye Myers. Despite a 21-point comeback to tie the game at 24-24, Alabama's Erin Hogue got a rebound and put-back on the Tide's last possession to give them a 26-24 halftime lead.

The score remained close until the Tigers took at 46-39 lead with 9:53 left, extending the lead to as many as 12 points to take the 65-55 victory.

WILLIAMS-FLOURNOY VS. HUDSON

This will be the first meeting between Auburn's Terri Williams-Flournoy and Alabama's Wendell Hudson.

Williams-Flournoy is in her first year at Auburn and has a 13-6 record this season for a 156-110 career record. Hudson is in his fifth season at Alabama and has a 66-76 record with the Crimson Tide. He is 305-203 on his career

LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN

Kentucky pounced early and Auburn was never able to recover Jan. 20 as the Tigers dropped a 97-53 decision to the fifth-ranked Wildcats at Memorial Coliseum in Lexinaton. Kv.

Hasina Muhammad led Auburn with 13 points while Peyton Davis added 11 with five rebounds. Cabriana Capers came off the bench for eight points and a team-high six rebounds.

The first half would be the difference maker in the game, as Auburn couldn't overcome an early Kentucky run and shot just 6-of-22 (.273) from the floor.

The Tigers took a 30-point deficit into the locker room at halftime, as the Wildcats led 51-21. After trailing just 7-6 in the opening minutes, Auburn allowed an 10-0 run in less than two minutes, as Kentucky jumped out to an 11-point lead at 17-6 with 13:15 remaining in the half. The Tigers never came within eight of the Wildcats, and Kentucky ran off to a 30-point lead at the half.

Auburn managed to get some offense going coming out of the locker room, but it would be too little too late. The Wildcats continued to hit on all cylinders, as all five of Kentucky's starters finished in double figures. A'dia Mathies led with 24 points, while Jennifer O'Neill added 17, DeNesha Stallworth tallied 16 Samarie Walker scored 15 and Bria Goss added 10.

LAST TIME OUT FOR ALABAMA

Alabama dropped a 96-69 decision to No. 9 Tennessee on Sunday at Thompson-Boling Arena. Daisha Simmons led the Crimson Tide with 19 points on the game while Kaneisha Horn tallied 14 points and ten rebounds.

Aside from three ties, the Tide remained in front until the 10:20 mark when the Lady Vols went ahead 20-18 and pulled away for a 49-35 halftime lead. Tennessee continued its momentum in the second half with a 15-5 run to go ahead by 24 with 15:31 to play. Tennessee would lead by no fewer than 20 points the rest of the way, pulling away for the 96-69 win.

Alabama shot 34.6 percent (27-78) from the floor while Tennessee hit 54.3 percent (38-70) of its attempts. The Lady Vols out-rebounded the Tide, 50-38, and collected nine blocks.

ALL EVEN

The Jan. 10 win over Ole Miss was Auburn's 13th of the season, tying last season's win total. The Tigers finished the 2011-12 season with a 13-17 record.

ON THIS DATE...

Auburn is 6-4 when playing on Jan. 24. The Tigers' last game on Jan. 24 came in 2010 with a 68-50 loss at Kentucky. The last win was a 57-46 win over Mississippi State in 1999.

IN JANUARY

Auburn is 191-108 all-time in the month of January (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that season). Head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is 2-4 at Auburn in January.

AGAINST THE STATE

Auburn is 222-56 all-time versus schools from the state of Alabama. Of the 56 loses, 34 have come to Alabama.

Terri Williams-Flournoy is 5-0 in her career against Alabama teams, with two of those wins coming over Jacksonville State while she was at Georgetown.

20 AND 10

Auburn's defense has continued to be a bright spot as the team enters SEC play. The Tigers have forced 20 or more turnovers in 10 of the last 12 games while also tallying 10 or more steals in 11 of the last 12.

ALABAMA CONNECTION

Auburn assistant coach Ty Evans should be pretty familiar with Alabama, after all, he sat on the Crimson Tide bench for four years as an assistant coach and one as associate head coach. He helped coach Alabama to an 18-15 record and a WNIT Sweet 16 appearance in 2011.

FORMER TEAMMATES

Auburn senior Najat Ouardad will see a pair of her former teammates Thursday when the Tigers take on Alabama. The Crimson Tide's Meghan Perkins and Jessica Merritt both played alongside Ouardad for two seasons at Pensacole State College.

The trio led Pensacola State to a third-place finish at the 2011 NJCAA National Basketball Championship, compiling a 36-1 record along the way. PSC finished second in the Panhandle Conference during their freshman year and was the only team to beat eventual national champion Gulf Coast Community College.

ALL ALONE

Sophomore Hasina Muhammad has scored in double figures in all 19 games this season and is the only player in the SEC to score in double figures in every game. Going back to last season, Muhammad has scored in double figures in 21 straight games.

The streak is also tied for the seventh-longest active streak in the nation. Here are the top eight:

20-20 VISION

Against Ole Miss, Auburn's Hasina Muhammad scored 22 points while Blanche Alverson added 23. It marked the third time this season for two Tigers to score 20 points in a game.

Muhammad (24) and Tyrese Tanner (20) both scored in the 20s at Missouri while Muhammad and Alverson each scored 21 at Tulane.

Prior to that game, two Auburn players had scored 20 or more points in the same game just once in the previous 116 games. Since, it has happened three times in 13 games.

CAREER VS. ALABAMA

Seven current Tigers have played against Alabama at least once in their career. Junior Tyrese Tanner has the best career line against the Crimson Tide, averaging 15.3 points and 4.0 rebounds

per game in four meetings. She scored 23 points against Alabama in the last meeting and 20 points the last time the teams played in Tuscaloosa. Senior Blanche Alverson averages 10.2 points per game, including 12 career 3-pointers. Sophomore Hasina Muhammad averages 10.0 points per game vs. Alabama, including 12 points in Tuscaloosa last year.

IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

In the Jan. 18 NCAA statistical rankings, Auburn is ranked in the top 100 in 10 categories and the top 35 in six. Top 35 rankings for Auburn are: FG Percentage (20th, .446), Assists Per Game (15th, 17.1), Blocks Per Game (27th, 5.1), Steals Per Game (16th, 12.6), Assist-Turnover Ratio (31st, 1.03) and Turnover Margin (25th, 5.32).

Individually, Najat Ouardad is 10th in assists (6.9) and 29th in steals (3.11). Blanche Alverson is 28th in the nation in 3-point percentage at 41.3 percent.

DOUBLE DOWN

Five different Tigers have pulled down double-doubles this season. Peyton Davis had the first with 13 points and 12 rebounds against Hofstra. Hasina Muhammad followed up with 21 points and 10 rebounds against George Washington.

Blanche Alverson picked up her first of the season, second of her career, with 11 points and 10 rebounds against UTC. Freshman Tra'cee Tanner tallied one with 21 points and 12 rebounds against Jacksonville. She was the first freshman since DeWanna Bonner on March 2, 2006 to notch a double-double.

Najat Ovardad has the most recent with 14 points and 11 assists against Samford.

With five Tigers pulling down double-doubles, it marks the first time since the 2006-07 season for Auburn to have five different players do so.

GETTING AWAY WITH THEFT

Hasina Muhammad and Najat Ouardad have both tallied nine steals in a game this season. Muhammad stole nine at George Washington while Ouardad got hers against Samford.

The mark ties for fourth all-time at Auburn in single-game steals and is the most in the SEC this season. The nine steals are also tied for 10th in the nation in single-game steals.

When Muhammad reached the mark, it was the most steals in a game for an Auburn player in 20 years.

GOING TO THE BOARD

Junior Peyton Davis pulled down a career-high 17 rebounds against Arkansas on Jan. 3. The 17 boards are the most for an Auburn player since KeKe Carrier pulled down 19 against Valparaiso on Dec. 28, 2010. Davis' 17 rebounds are also tied for 27th all-time at Auburn in single-game rebounds.

"It is a great honor for Blanche and puts her in pretty select company at Auburn. Being proficient in all those areas is what makes her a great player and a great asset to the team. That's a great accomplishment, and just goes to show that she's put in the work to do those things for us."

On Alabama..

"Alabama is going to come after us and they are going to press us. They are a very athletic team from top to bottom. They have a really good point guard that's going to push it in transition and we have got to be able to stop the ball. They are going to pick us up full court, half court. It's just another team, defensively, that we have to prepare for offensively as well as not turning the ball over. There are a lot of things we need to really clean up."

On Alabama's impact players...

"The two biggest impact players that I see are Daisha Simmons at the point guard position now and Kaneisha Horn in the post. Simmons sat out last year and Horn is returning after some injuries. They also have a few freshmen as well, that are playing. Ty Evans, having been there, has helped us out a little bit, since he brought all of them there. Those two are probably the biggest addition that is making them really good and different at this point."

On the Auburn-Alabama rivalry...

SEC Women's Basketball Notes

- The SEC has posted impressive non-conference records in the last decade. The SEC compiled a 134-41 (.766) non-conference record in the 2011-12 season.
- Since the 1990 season, the SEC has compiled a 3047-935 (.765) record against other conferences. The league has recorded 150+ wins during eight seasons.
- \bullet SEC teams have earned appearances in 25 of 31 NCAA Final Fours, an accomplishment unmatched by any other league.
- Overall, SEC squads have filled 34 of the 124 Final Four berths, including having two Final Four teams in 1988 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1989 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1995 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1996 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1998 (Arkansas, Tennessee), 2004 (LSU, Tennessee), 2005 (LSU, Tennessee), 2007 (LSU, Tennessee) and 2008 (LSU, Tennessee).
- SEC teams have made 18 appearances in a nation-high 16 NCAA Championship games, winning eight NCAA Championships (Tennessee: 1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).
- The league also had the distinction of providing both national finalists twice in its history in 1996 (Tennessee 83, Georgia 65) and in 1989 (Tennessee 76, Auburn 60).
 - SEC teams have won 347 NCAA Tournament games against 180 losses (.658) for an average of 11.2 NCAA wins per year.
- In addition, all 14 current members have appeared in the NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC has paced the pack in NCAA tournament bids 22 times in its 31-year history.
- The SEC was the first league to ever have eight teams invited to the NCAA
 Tournament, doing so in 1999, 2002 and 2012.
- The SEC was also the first league to ever have seven teams invited to the NCAA Tournament and earned this honor a leading seven times (1986, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2004).
- The SEC is one of a handful of leagues to have won three national tournament titles with eight NCAA, two WNIT and three NWIT. Along with the eight NCAA championships won by Tennessee, Arkansas (1999) and Auburn (2003) captured the current Women's NIT titles. But the first-ever SEC national title belongs to Georgia, winners of the 1981 NWIT which predates the current NCAA tournament. LSU (1985) and Kentucky (1990) also won NWIT titles. Both Arkansas (1987) and South Carolina (1979) won the WNIT as members of their previous conferences.
- In 2003, Auburn won the WNIT title with wins over South Alabama, Florida State, Richmond, Creighton and Baylor. In 1999, the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks defeated Wisconsin 76-64 to claim the SEC's first WNIT championship.
- In 1981, Georgia defeated Pittsburg, California and Arizona State (in OT) to capture the NWIT Championship, the firstever national championship of any kind for the SEC in women's basketball.

SISTER-SISTER

Auburn's Tanner sisters made a good combination on Dec. 22 in the Tigers' win over Jacksonville. Tyrese and Tra'cee Tanner combined to score 37 points with 15 rebounds and four steals. It was the best combined effort for the sisters this season.

For the season, Tyrese and Tra'cee are combining for 20.2 points and 8.0 rebounds per game.

1,000-POINT CLUB

With her second 3-pointer against Ole Miss, Auburn senior Blanche Alverson became the 27th Tiger all-time to score 1,000 career points. She currently ranks 25th all-time at Auburn in career scoring with 1,046 points.

THE GRADUATE

Senior guard Julie King took a big step Dec. 8 as she earned her degree in Interdisciplinary Studies from Auburn. The fifth-year player spent her first four years at Auburn on the soccer team and is currently using her final year of eligibility with the women's basketball team.

FORCING 25

Since 1987, Auburn has forced 25 or more turnovers in a game 99 times, including six times this season. In those 99 games, the Tigers have a 96-3 record.

CLIMBING THE RANKINGS

Blanche Alverson is climbing her way up the Auburn scoring and rebounding lists. She is currently 25th all-time at Auburn in scoring with 1,046 points. She is also 23rd all-time on The Plains in career rebounding with 502.

TURN IT OVER

A pillar of Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy's style of play is a high-pressure defense that extends most of the floor. The Tigers have foreced 20 or more turnovers in 15 of their 19 games this season. Auburn has forced 25 or more in six games with a season -high 28 against Hofstra. In all, Auburn has scored 429 points off turnovers in its 19 games, averaging 22.6 points off turnovers per

Auburn has tallied 10 or more steals in 14 games this season, including a season-high 22 against Samford. The 22 steals were the most in a game in more than four years for the Tigers.

JET POWERED

Najat Ouardad is making her own waves this season. The 5-1 senior tallied 11 assists vs. Samford, but topped the feat against Ole Miss with 14 assists. Her 14 assits are the most in the SEC this season and are tied for second in the nation this year. They are the most for an Auburn player since 1988 and are tied for fifth all-time at AU in single-game steals. The 11 assists are tied for 19th all-tiem at Auburn.

She also now has 212 career assists, a mark that ranks 10th among active SEC players and ties for 21st all-time at Auburn.

IT'S RAINING 3s

Blanche Alverson is climbing her way up the Auburn career 3-point list. She is currently tied for second with 184. Alverson is 35 3-pointers behind Auburn record holder, and former teammate, Alli Smalley (219).

OFF THE BENCH

Auburn has had great bench support this season with at least one player coming off the bench to score in double figures in 11 of the 19 games. The Tigers' bench so far has scored 335 points on the season, averaging 17.6 per game.

O-BOARDS

Auburn has missed 656 shots this season with 280 (42.7 percent) resulting in offensive rebounds. That has led to 304 second-chance points on the season, averaging 16.0 per game.

KEEPING SCORE

Against Ole Miss, Auburn forced 20 turnovers while the Rebels made just 19 field goals. It marked the 12th time this season that an Auburn opponent has committed more turnovers than made field goals.

On the season, Auburn opponents have hit 402 field goals compared to 416 turnovers. The Tigers have committed just 315 turnovers for $\alpha+101$ margin on the season.

HOME SWEET HOME

Auburn has made itself at home this season, winning nine of its 10 games at Auburn Arena. The Tigers had a 16-13 record in Auburn Arena entering the season, but have improved to 25-14 since.

QUEEN BLANCHE

Senior Blanche Alverson, no stranger to awards on the court, added another piece of hardware to her collection on Nov. 3 as she was named Auburn's Miss Homecoming. After a week of campaigning, she found out the result of the vote at halftime of Auburn's Homecoming Football Game against New Mexico State. She is the first Tiger student-athlete to earn the honor.

COMEBACK KIDS

At Tulane on Nov. 28, Auburn came from 16 points down at halftime to pull off the 70-65 win. It is the biggest comeback for the Tigers since coming back from 18 points down at Vanderbilt on Feb. 19, 2009, closing the gap to just a point in the final minute of the game only to lose 73-70. It was the first time for the Tigers to come back from a double-digit deficit since overcoming a 10-point deficit at Liberty on Dec. 7, 2008 to take away a 64-53 win

MUHAMMAD NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After averaging 18.5 points, 8.0 rebounds, 7.0 steals and 2.5 blocks per game in Auburn's games against GW and Temple, sophomore guard Hasina Muhammad was named the SEC Player of the Week for the first time in her career on Dec. 17.

At GW, Muhammad tied her career high with 21 points, including 14 in the second half, leading Auburn to a 69-59 win over the Colonials. She earned her first career double-double with a career-high 10 rebounds and nearly had a triple-double as she tallied nine steals. Her nine steals are the most for a player in the SEC this season and rank fourth all-time at Auburn in single-game steals.

She came right back against Temple on Sunday with 16 points, six rebounds, six assists, five steals and three blocks. Her six assists were a new career high while her three blocked shots tied her career high.

TYRESE TANNER NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Auburn junior Tyrese Tanner was named the SEC's Player of the Week on Nov. 12, the first player to earn the honor this season. She averaged 20.5 points, including a career-high 26 points, at the Sheraton Raleigh Wolfpack Invitational, Nov. 9-10.

Her 26 points were the most scored in the SEC to that point in the season. She is the first Tiger to earn the SEC's weekly honor since Blanche Alverson did on Jan. 13. 2011.

JACKSON NAMED SEC GREAT

Former Auburn great Becky Jackson was announced Jan. 10 as a member of the SEC 2013 Class of Women's Legends. The class will be recognized during the 2013 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament in Duluth, Ga. Jackson, a native of Franklin, La., played basketball at Auburn from 1980-84.

A four-time All-SEC performer, Becky Jackson finished her career as Auburn's all-time leading scorer and rebounder with 2,068 points and 1,118 rebounds. The Kodak All-American scored 38 points in a game, matching the second-highest mark in school history. She was named an AlAW All-State performer as a freshman and was also named to the Alabama State All-Tournament Team. In 1981 and 1983, Jackson was named to the American Women's Sports Foundation All-American team and was named MVP of the SEC Tournament in 1981.

Her career totals are still among the best all-time at Auburn as she ranks second in career scoring, behind DeWanna Bonner, ranks ninth in career blocks and still holds the Auburn career rebounding record.

Jackson will also be recognized in Auburn on Feb. 17 at halftime of the Tigers' game against Alabama. Her jersey will be retired that afternoon with her joining the ranks of Ruthie Bolton, Carolyn Jones and Vickie Orr.

ORR NAMED TO ALABAMA SPORTS HALL OF FAME

Auburn great Vickie Orr is one of eight individuals that make up the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2013. The banquet will be held May 18, 2013 in Birmingham.

One of Auburn's greatest women's basketball players, Orr was

a Kodak All-American three consecutive years in 1987, 1988 and 1989. The 1988 SEC Player of Year, Orr is second all-time at Auburn scoring with 2,035 points and is one of only two Tiger players to score more than 2,000 points and have 1,000 rebounds.

Orr helped led the Tigers to two straight NCAA Championship games and was the MVP of the NCAA Mid-East Regional and All-Final Four team in 1989. Internationally, Orr was a member of the 1990 U.S.A. Team that won a Gold Medal in the World Championships and a member of the 1990 Goodwill team that won the Gold Medal. She was also a member of the 1992 U.S. Olympic Team that won a Bronze Medal. She went on to play professionally in Italy from 1990-92.

FIRST TIMERS

The season-opening game saw some firsts for Auburn players. Junior Peyton Davis earned the first start of her career while senior Julie King and freshmen Cabriana Capers, Chadarryl Clay, Cedricka Sweeting and Tra'cee Tanner made their first collegiate basketball appearance.

KICKING UP SOMETHING NEW

One of Auburn's five newcomers is former soccer player Julie King. A native of St. Louis, King started for four years for the Tigers' soccer team, helping the team to the NCAA Tournament in each season. As a co-captain last year, she led Auburn to an SEC Tournament Championship and was named SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Year.

King was an All-State basketball selection while playing prep ball at Nerinx Hall in St. Louis, Mo.

SISTER ACT

For just the third time ever, Auburn's roster featured a sister combination as Tyrese and Tra'cee Tanner step on the court. Tyrese is a junior on the squad this year while Tra'cee is a freshman.

Other sister combinations to play together at Auburn include Sherell (2004-09) and Reneisha (2006-10) Hobbs, and Ruthie (1985-89) and Mae Ola (1984-88) Bolton.

TANNER NAMED TO OMNI CLASSIC TEAM

Auburn junior Tyrese Tanner was named to the Omni Hotels Classic All-Tournament Team on Nov. 24 for her play in the two games. For the tournament, she averaged 14.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 1.5 blocks per game. She scored 17 with three steals against San Diego State and returned for 11 points, three blocks and two steals against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.

TANNER AND MUHAMMAD EARN WOLFPACK HONORS

Auburn's Tyrese Tanner and Hasina Muhammad were selected to the Sheraton Raleigh Wolfpack Invitational All-Tournament Team to start the season. Tanner averaged 20.5 points, including a career-high 26 against North Carolina State. She also tallied 8.5 rebounds and 2.0 steals per game. Muhammad averaged 16.0 points per game, tying her then-career high with 20 points in the season-opener against Maine.

TIGERS DOWN UNDER

Auburn unofficially started its season in August as the Tigers traveled to Australia for a 10-day, four-game tour. Auburn opened with an 86-54 loss to the WNBL's Logan Thunder, but rebounded for an 81-71 win over the Cairns Dolphins. The Tigers continued on to Sydney where it tallied a 67-58 over the WNBL's Sydney Flames. The Tigers rounded out the trip with an 84-46 trouncing of the Sutherland Sharks.

Over the four-game tour, Hasina Muhammad was the top Tiger with 23.3 points per game. Blanche Alverson averaged 17.5 points while freshman Chadarryl Clay tallied 10.5. Fellow freshman Tra'cee Tanner scored 9.0 per game, followed by Peyton Davis with 6.5, Cabriana Capers with 2.8 and Pascale West with 2.0.

BALLIN' FOR BOOKS

Senior Blanche Alverson, always active in the community, started her own community service initiative last season called Ballin' For Books. The program encouraged Auburn fans to donate books during Auburn home games late in the season.

More than 1,100 books were collected as part of the program

and were donated to the Loachapoka Library, Pine Hills Literacy Project, Boys and Girls Club, and Atlanta inner-city schools.

STARTING EXPERIENCE

Auburn returned five players that combined for 127 career starts at Auburn entering the season. Previous starters werre Blanche Alverson, Hasina Muhammad, Najat Ouardad, Courtney Strain and Tyrese Tanner. If you include newcomer and former Auburn soccer player Julie King (and her 88 career soccer starts), that number goes up to 215.

TIGERS PICKED 10TH IN PRESEASON POLLS

Auburn was picked to finish 10th in both the SEC Preseason Media and Coaches polls. Kentucky was tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the SEC in both polls.

NEW FACES

The Tigers welcome five new faces for the 2012-13 season, including one senior and four freshmen. The senior is Julie King (Nerinx Hall / St. Louis, Mo.), who joins the team after four years

on the Auburn soccer team. The four freshmen are: Cabriana Capers (Bolingbrook / Bolingbrook, Ill.), Chadarryl Clay (Girls Preparatory School / Chattanooga, Tenn.), Cedricka Sweeting (South Broward (Fla.), Nassau, Bahamas), and Tra'cee Tanner (Hoover / Birmingham, Ala.).

AUBURN SIGNS SIX FOR 2013-14

The Auburn women's basketball team signed six players to National Letters of Intent during the early signing period for the class of 2013. Keonna Famer, a 6-1 wing from Birmingham, Ala., Katie Frerking, a 6-1 guard from Johns Creek, Ga., Brandy Montgomery, a 5-10 guard from Port St. Lucie, Fla., Shae Nelson, a 6-1 post from Cordova, Tenn., Allina Starr, a 5-10 point guard from Minneapolis, Minn., and Meagan Tucker, a 5-8 guard from Covington, Ga., will join the Tigers for the 2013-14 season, head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy announced Nov. 16.

NEW ORLEANS, La. - Blanche Alverson and Hasina Muhammad scored 21 points each, leading the Auburn women's basketball team in a comeback 70-65 win at Tulane Wednesday night. The Tigers were down by 16 at halftime, but rallied back to hand the Green Wave their first loss of the season.

Auburn took a quick 7-2 lead to start the game, but Tulane rallied to score 13 straight points to take a lead it would not give up for most of the game. The Green Wave kept on rolling through the period to take a 16-point, 39-23 lead at halftime.

For everything that Auburn did wrong in the first half, the Tigers did right in the second. After shooting 30 percent in the opening period, Auburn came back to shoot 50 percent in the second to finish the game at 40.9 percent.

Auburn also limited Tulane to 23.1 percent shooting in the second half after surrendering 55.6 percent in the first. The Tigers also forced just three Green Wave turnovers in the first half, but came back to force 10 in the second, scoring 17 points off turnovers.

Alverson, Muhammad and Tra'Cee Tanner led the charge in the second half, hitting timely shots and clutch free throws. Alverson scored 11 of her 21 in the second half while Muhammad scored 16 of hers. Tra'Cee Tanner came off the bench to score a career-high 14 points with six rebounds.

AUBURN - The Auburn women's basketball team picked up a win after an 11-day layoff, as it defeated Hofstra, 68-58, Dec. 9 in Auburn.

Auburn had four players score in double figures, led by Peyton Davis and Tyrese Tanner, each with 13. Hasina Muhammad added 12, and Blanche Alverson tallied 11. It was the fourth time this season that the Tigers had four or more players in double figures. Najat Ouardad tied her career high with eight assists while also scoring eight points.

In addition to leading Auburn in scoring, Davis also earned her first career double-double as she grabbed a career-high 12 rebounds in the effort. It was the first double-double for the Tigers since Blanche Alverson's in last year's season-opener against Mercer.

The Tigers got off to a sluggish start in the opening minutes of the first half, but picked up the intensity to start a 13-0 run with 9:01 remaining. Alverson and Tyrese Tanner combined for 11 of the 13 points during the run. Auburn allowed just five points in the final nine minutes of the half and held Hofstra to just one field goal from Andreana Thomas with 1:42 to play. The Tigers held a 16-point lead at halftime with the score 39-23.

AU led by as many as 20 in the second half, but let the gap close to four late in the game. The Tigers were able to hold off the Pride in the final two minutes for the 68-58 win.

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Auburn junior Hasina Muhammad notched her first career double-double, tying her career high with 21 points along with 10 rebounds and nine steals, leading the Tigers to a 69-59 win at George Washington on Dec. 12. The win was also a special one for Auburn head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy as it was the 150th of her

The win was not an easy one as the Tigers had to fight off several Colonial runs. Auburn took a 13-point lead at halftime and extended it to 16 points early in the second half, but George Washington mounted the first of its comebacks for 16-straight points to tie the game up with 12:58 left in the game.

After the Colonials tied the game up, the Tigers went on a 10-2 run to pull back away at 51-43 with 9:04 to go. Auburn took a nine-point lead with 5:57 to play, but GW mounted another comeback, a 10-2 run of its own, to cut the lead to just one with 4:48 to play.

Auburn responded by scoring the next six points, a 3-point play from Muhammad and a trey from Blanche Alverson, to take a 64-57 lead. The Tigers would let the Colonials no closer than five the rest of the way, pulling away for the 69-59 win.

Alverson followed Muhammad with 14 points while Najat Ouardad added 10 points, nine rebounds and seven assists.

AUBURN - The Auburn women's basketball team utilized a 17-0 run early in the game to scrap its way to a 53-40 win over the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga Dec. 19 at Auburn Arena. UT-Chattanooga entered the game with a pair of wins already this season over SEC teams, downing Tennessee in the season-opener and winning at Alahama.

It proved to be a low-scoring game by both teams, as Auburn and UTC each posted season-lows in scoring. The Lady Mocs' 40 points were also the fewest allowed by the Auburn defense this season.

Hasina Muhammad led the Tigers with 19 points, followed by Blanche Alverson with 11. Alverson tallied her first double-double on the season, adding 10 rebounds in the effort. She is also now 30th all-time in career rebounding at Auburn with 461.

Auburn created a spark in the opening half with a 17-0 run, holding UTC scoreless for more than seven minutes. The Tigers limited the Lady Mocs to a season-low 15 points at halftime, as Auburn took a 28-15 lead into the locker room. UTC shot just 20.7 percent from the floor in the first half, the lowest of any Auburn opponent this season.

Both sides tallied 25 points apiece in the second half and traded field goals, but UTC could not come within seven points the rest of the way. Auburn held on to its lead for the 53-40 victory.

AUBURN - The Auburn women's basketball game picked up its seventh-straight win and 10th of the season with an 85-49 victory over Jacksonville Dec. 22 at Auburn Arena. The seven-game winning streak is the longest for the Tigers since winning the first 20 games of the 2008-09 season.

Tra'cee Tanner led the Tigers in scoring and notched her first double-double with 21 points and 12 rebounds. Tra'cee Tanner shot 83 percent from the floor with a career-high 10 field goals made. She and her sister, Tyrese, combined for their best game of the season with 37 points and 15 rebounds. Tyrese Tanner tied her season high in field goals made, shooting 7-for-15 from the floor, to score 16.

In addition to the Tanner duo, Blanche Alverson and Hasina Muhammad posted double figures for the second-consecutive game, as Alverson finished with 16 and Muhammad with 10.

The Tigers employed a 12-1 run to jump out to an early 14-4 lead over Jacksonville. After a 3-pointer from Maggie Wilson cut Auburn's lead back to seven, the Tigers held the Dolphins without a field goal for more than four minutes of play. Auburn increased its lead to as many as 24 points with 5:04 remaining in the half and took a comfortable 43-22 lead into the locker room.

AU led by as many as 39 in the second half for the 85-49 win.

The Aggies led by as many as 30 points midway through in the second half en route to the 22-point win, going 27-of-56 (.482) from the floor.
