Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- This is the sixth all-time meeting between Auburn and Virginia; the Cavaliers have won 4 of the previous 5
- This is Virginia's second visit to Auburn and the first in 23 years
- Virginia won last year's meeting in Charlottesville 66-51, despite six 3-pointers from Auburn's Brandy Montgomery
- This is the third meeting between Terri Williams-Flournoy and Virginia's Joanne Boyle; Boyle is 2-0
- Both teams enter this game unbeaten for the second straight season
- Auburn has scored 80+ points in back-to-back games for the first time since the 2013 WNIT (80 vs. UAB; 84 vs. WKU)
- Brandy Montgomery has 20+ points in five of her last seven games going back to last season, including both games this year
- With three 3-pointers vs. SE Louisiana, Montgomery moved into 8th all-time at Auburn with 94 career 3s
- Junior Katie Frerking has made her last 12 free throws and 26 of her last 28 dating back to last season
- Against UAB in the season-opener, Brandy Montgomery (24) and Janiah McKay (20) gave Auburn two players with 20 or more points for the first time since the 2013 WNIT (Hasina Muhammad and Tyrese Tanner)
- Janiah McKay's 20 points vs. UAB were the most for an Auburn freshman in their collegiate debut since Hasina Muhammad scored 20 vs. Maine on Nov. 9, 2012.
- Auburn made 10 3-pointers in the opener vs. UAB, tying for the most in the Coach Flo era (made 10 vs. Maine on Nov. 9, 2012; Auburn's first game under Williams-Flournoy)
- Auburn is 37-8 all-time in season-openers and 25-3 when opening the season at home
- The Tigers have won 25 straight home season openers with the last loss coming in 1977
- Auburn is in its 45th season of women's basketball and has 864 program wins
- The Tigers won four of their final five games of the 2014-15 season, including a first-round SEC Tournament win
- The Tigers are 4-1 all-time on Nov. 19 with wins over Southern, Georgia Southern, and Alabama A&M (2)
- Auburn is 122-34 all-time in the month of November; Coach Flo is 14-7 in November at Auburn
- The Tigers will play four non-conference opponents that advanced to the 2015 NCAA Tournament
- Junior Brandy Montgomery is Auburn's leading returning scorer at 12.3 points/game in 2014-15
- For the fourth time ever (and fourth-straight year), Auburn's roster features a set of sisters in sophomore twins Jazmine and Jessica Jones
- Auburn returns four starters and eight overall letter-winners from 2014 and welcomes four newcomers, three of which are freshmen

LAST TIME OUT

» Auburn used a 25-0 run in the first half to build a big early lead, then held off a late rally for an 80-68 win at Southeastern Louisiana on Monday night in the Tigers' first road test of the season.

» The Tigers led by as many as 25 points early in the third quarter, but the Lady Lions got hot from outside and cut the lead to as few as six points in the fourth before Auburn got two big plays from freshman Janiah McKay down the stretch to hold off the rally.

» Brandy Montgomery led the Tigers with 22 points and also contributed five rebounds and three steals. Montgomery hit three 3-pointers - all in the first quarter - and had 15 at halftime. Tra'CEE Tanner had 16 points and three steals, while McKay poured in 15 points off the bench. Katie Frerking finished with 13 points and game-highs in assists and rebounds (six apiece).

» Auburn is in its 45th season of women's basketball and sports an all-time record of 864-426 ... » Auburn trailed by just five at halftime, but Virginia went on a 10-0 run early in the second half and never looked back. UVA led by as much as 21 before a few late Auburn baskets cut the deficit to 15.

» The Tigers shot 32.3 percent for the game while Virginia hit at a 50% FG rate, including a 65% clip in the second half.

» Auburn is 43-20 all-time against the schools that currently make up the Atlantic Coast Conference. SCOUTING VIRGINIA

» Virginia is 2-0 after a road win at Middle Tennessee and a home victory over Norfolk State during the opening weekend. The Cavaliers are receiving votes in the USA Today Coaches' Poll.

» The Cavaliers finished 17-14 overall in 2014-15, 7-9 in ACC play (9th), and advanced to the first round of the WNIT.

» Through two games, Faith Randolph and Lauren Moses lead the Wahoos with 12.5 points per game. Randolph is the top rebounder, averaging 6.0 per game.

» Montgomery, Tanner, Katie Frerking, Khady Dieng and Jessica Jones played in every game last year for Auburn.

» Pressure defense remains a staple of Coach Flo's strategy as the Tigers have forced an average of 19.6 turnovers per game in her three seasons.

STELLAR DEBUT

» Freshman Janiah McKay made the most of her collegiate debut on Nov. 13 vs. UAB, scoring 20 points and dishing out 7 assists off the bench. It was the best performance by an Auburn freshman in their collegiate debut since Hasina Muhammad scored 20 points vs. Maine on Nov. 9, 2012, which was also Coach Flo's debut.

AUBURN, Ala. --Junior Brandy Montgomery scored 24 points and freshman Janiah McKay added 20 points with seven assists in her collegiate debut to lead Auburn to an 85-71 win over UAB in Friday's season-opener at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (1-0) won their season opener at home for the 25th straight time behind a second-half surge that saw Auburn shoot 61.1 percent over the final 20 minutes.

Montgomery went 10-of-19 from the floor, hitting four 3-pointers on the night. Freshman McKay added 20 points and a game-high seven assists in an impressive collegiate debut. The Gainesville, Fla., native was also a presence at the free-throw line, going 5-for-7.

Tanner recorded a double-double, the ninth of her career, with 18 points on 8-of-9 shooting and 10 rebounds, and junior Katie Frerking went 4-for-10 from 3-point range for 12 points and added a game-high three steals.

Auburn scored 40 points in the paint, led by Tanner's 16.

Auburn started the game on a 7-0 run before UAB heated up from behind the arc, hitting four opening-period 3-point attempts to tie the score at 18 at the end of the first quarter. The Tigers and Blazers exchanged leads in the second quarter, culminating with UAB's Chelsea Black, who led the team with 22 points, hitting a 3-point shot with 0:02 left on the clock to give UAB a one-point halftime lead at 36-35.

The game took a turn in the Tigers' favor in the third and fourth periods as Auburn found their mark, hitting a sizzling 61.1 percent (22-36) from the floor. A 14-0 run spanning the final minutes of the third quarter and the start of the fourth proved to be the difference as UAB got no closer than seven points for the remainder of the game. Montgomery was the spark that ignited the run, scoring seven points in that span.

Auburn shot 53.1 percent for the game while holding the Blazers to 47.3 percent. Auburn forced UAB into 17 turnovers while committing just nine of their own.

HAMMOND, La. --Auburn used a 25-0 run in the first half to build a big early lead, then held off a late rally for an 80-68 win at Southeastern Louisiana on Monday night in the Tigers' first road test of the season.

The Tigers (2-0) led by as many as 25 points early in the third quarter, but the Lady Lions (0-2) got hot from outside and cut the lead to as few as six points in the fourth before Auburn got two big plays from freshman Janiah McKay down the stretch to hold off the rally.

Brandy Montgomery led the Tigers with 22 points and also contributed five rebounds and three steals. Montgomery hit three 3-pointers - all in the first quarter - and had 15 at halftime. Tra'Cee Tanner had 16 points and three steals, while McKay poured in 15 points off the bench. Katie Frerking finished with 13 points and game-highs in assists and rebounds (six apiece).

Auburn battled foul trouble late in the game as Tanner, Montgomery and McKay all missed significant minutes late in the third and early in the fourth with three fouls each. Meanwhile, SLU's Taylin Anderson could not miss from outside, hitting three 3-pointers and scoring a total of 13 points in the fourth quarter as the Lady Lions made their run, cutting a 15-point Auburn lead at end of three to just six points with 4:44 to play.

But a Montgomery layup and a coast-to-coast drive from McKay put the Tigers' lead back at 10 points with 4:15 to play, and a highlight-reel reverse layup from McKay with 2:15 left put the game out of reach for SLU.

Auburn shot 43.3 percent for the game despite going cold for much of the early part of the fourth quarter. The Tigers were also 17-of-23 at the free-throw line, key down the stretch. SLU shot 37.9 percent but hit nine 3-pointers.

After the teams traded several early 3-pointers and were tied 10-10 at the first media timeout, the Tigers finished the first quarter on a 15-0 run to take a 25-10 lead after one. That run continued more than three minutes into the second quarter, extended to a 25-0 streak to give the Tigers their biggest lead at 35-10 with just under seven minutes left in the half.

- » Over 96% of Auburn's donors and fans indicate that the frequency of communication, the transparency of communication, and the content of communication from Auburn Athletics meets or exceeds their needs.

WINNING

- » Auburn has finished in the top 10 percent of the NACDA Director's Cup for 10 consecutive years.
- » Auburn has won 13 national titles since 2004, which is third-most in the SEC. National Champion teams include Football, Men's Swimming and Diving, Women's Swimming and Diving, Equestrian, and Women's Outdoor Track and Field.
- » Auburn has won 20 SEC titles in the past 10 years, tied for fourth-most in the conference.
- » Sixteen of Auburn's 21 sports participated in postseason competition in 2014-15, with four programs achieving Top 10 finishes nationally.
- » The Auburn football team has won a National Championship and two Southeastern Conference Championships in the last five years, and played for the national title for the second time in four years in 2013.
- » No school has won more SEC Football Championships in the last 10 years than Auburn.
- » The Auburn softball team had its best season in school history, advancing to its' first-ever Women's College World Series, where it advanced to the semifinals.
- » Gymnastics advanced to the NCAA Super Six for the first time in 22 years and second time in school history in 2015, finishing sixth while breaking 52 program records.
- » Men's Swimming & Diving team has recorded 23 consecutive top-10 NCAA finish and has won 18 of the last 22 SEC Championships (including 16 consecutive titles from 1997-2012).
- » Women's Golf has won three SEC titles in the last seven years, five in the last 11 years, and seven in the last 16.
