AUBURN - UCLA SERIES

This will be the second meeting all-time between Auburn and UCLA with the Tigers holding a 1-0 series advantage. The only other meeting was a 76-52 win over the Bruins on Dec. 15, 1987 in Los Angeles, Calif.

AGAINST THE PAC-12 CONFERENCE

Auburn is 13-3 all-time against current members of the Pacific-12 Conference. The last meeting with a Pac-12 team was a 75-69 win at Arizona State on Dec. 2, 2007.

WILLIAMS-FOURNOY VS. CLOSE

This will be the first meeting between Auburn's Terri Williams-Flournoy and UCLA's Cori Close. Williams-Flournoy is in her second year at Auburn and has a 27-18 record on The Plains and a 170-122 career record. Close is in her third season at UCLA and holds a 44-29 record.

AGAINST THE GOLDEN STATE

Auburn is 11-5 all-time versus schools from the state of California.

LAST TIME OUT FOR UCLA

UCLA earned its first road win of the season with a 56-55 win at San Diego State at Viejas Arena on Sunday afternoon. Senior Thea Lemberger broke a 45-45 tie with a three-pointer at the 7:53 mark of the second half and the Bruins led for the remainder of the game.

San Diego State had one last attempt to tie the game with a pair of free throws with :05 to go, trailing 56-54. Ahjalee Harvey made the first, but missed the second and Nirra Fields secured the rebound for UCLA.

UCLA was led by Fields' 18 points, four rebounds and four steals. Lemberger added 11 points and a season-high eight assists. Senior Atoney Nyngifa added 13 points, three steals and eight rebounds.

LAST TIME VS. UCLA

Sharon Stewart scored a game-high 19 points, leading Auburn to a 76-52 win over UCLA in Los Angeles on Dec. 15, 1987. The Tigers led 43-28 at half and cruised to the 24-point win. Mae Ola Bolton followed with 14 points, 10 assists and seven rebounds while her sister Ruthie Bolton scored 12 points. Vickie Orr also finished in double figures with 10 points.

SCOUTING UCLA

UCLA returns eight letterwinners and two starters from last season's team that went 26-8 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament, but has been ravaged by injuries and a tough schedule so far this season. Playing four top-20 teams in the first nine games of the season, wins have been hard to come by for the Bruins.

UCLA's losses have come to Nebraska, North Carolina, James Madison, North Carolina State and Notre Dame. Wins have come against Pepperdine, then-No. 10 Oklahoma, Grand Canyon and San Diego State with the one against SDSU the lone win away from home.

Atoney Nyngifa leads the Bruins with 17.7 points and 8.3 rebounds per game while Thea Lemberger and Nirra Fields average 15.6 points per game each. Lemberger and Fields also account for 28 of UCLA's 35 3-pointers on the season.

AUBURN - MINNESOTA SERIES

This will be the second meeting all-time between Auburn and Minnesota with Auburn holding a 1-0 series advantage. The only other meeting was a 101-46 win on Nov. 29, 1986 at the Minnesota Dial Classic in Minneapolis, Minn.

AGAINST THE BIG TEN CONFERENCE

Auburn is 18-11 all-time against current members of the Big Ten Conference. The Tigers' last meeting versus a Big Ten team was a 62-54 loss to Purdue on Dec. 18, 2011.

WILLIAMS-FOURNOY VS. BORTON

This will be the first meeting between Auburn's Terri Williams-Flournoy and Minnesota's Pam Borton. Williams-Flournoy is in her second year at Auburn and has a 27-18 record on The Plains and a 170-122 career record. Borton is in her 12th season at Minnesota and holds a 223-141 record. She has a 292-187 career mark.

AGAINST THE NORTH STAR STATE

Auburn is 1-0 all-time versus schools from the state of Minnesota. Terri Williams-Flournoy has never coached against an Minnesota team.

LAST TIME OUT FOR MINNESOTA

The University of Minnesota women's basketball team used a strong second half to come back and defeat visiting North Dakota, 46-44, Dec. 8 at Williams Arena. Amanda Zahui paced the Golden Gophers with 25 points, 12 rebounds and four blocks to notch her fifth double-double of the season.

Minnesota trailed 31-18 at halftime, but utilized a 20-6 run in the second half to get back in the game. The teams traded baskets until a Shayne Mullaney basket with three seconds remaining gave the Gophers the win.

LAST TIME VS. MINNESOTA

Auburn improved to 2-0 on the season after sweeping its two games at the season-opening Minnesota Dial Classic in 1987. After defeating Clemson in the opener, the Tigers took down the host Gophers, 101-46. Mae Ola Bolton led Auburn with 22 points while Diann McNeil and Vickie Orr pulled down 10 rebounds each.

SCOUTING MINNESOTA

Minnesota returns four starters and seven letterwinners from last season's team that went 18-14 and advanced to the WNIT. The Gophers have continued that run into the 2013-14 season and are 9-2 heading into the Subway Classic.

The Gophers are the top 3-point shooting team in the NCAA at 45.1 percent on the season. Rachel Banham leads that charge as she has 30 treys on the season, hitting them at a 58.8 percent clip. Banham averages 22.2 points and 2.5 assists per game. Amanda Zahui averages a double-double with 13.5 points and 11.2 rebounds per game.

Minnesota's two losses have come on the road, at Creighton and at Hawaii. The Gophers are 6-0 at home this season, including a 63-62 win over Tennessee-Chattanooga, a team Auburn struggled with on the road.

NEXT UP FOR THE TIGERS

Auburn will break for the holidays, returning to action on Sunday, Jan. 5 at Mississippi State in the team's SEC opener.

QUICK HITS

Auburn completed its 43rd season of women's basketball and sports an all-time record of 838-396... AU has made 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, four WNIT appearances and three Final Fours in the program's history... Head Coach Terri Williams-Fournoy is in her second season at Auburn... She has a 170-122 record as a head coach... AU advanced to the 2013 WNIT Quarterfinals... The Tigers are coming off a 19-15 season in 2012-13.

800 AND COUNTING

Auburn picked up its 800th program victory in 2011, becoming the 14th team in NCAA history to reach the 800-win plateau.

TURNAROUND TIGERS

Winning 19 games last year, Auburn had its most wins in a season since winning 30 in the 2008-09 season. The 19 wins were also a 6-win improvement over the previous season.

HASINA MUHAMMAD EARNS ALL-SEC HONORS

Auburn junior Hasina Muhammad was named to the Preseason All-SEC Second Team by the league's coaches. Muhammad averaged 14.0 points and 5.1 rebounds per game last season.

1,000-POINT CLUB

With her 19 points at Alabama A&M, senior Tyrese Tanner became the 28th Auburn player ever to score 1,000 career points. She currently ranks 25th all-time at Auburn with 1,116 points.

SCOUTING AUBURN

The Auburn women's basketball team, under direction of second-year head coach Terri Williams-Fournoy, returns five letterwinners and three starters from last season's team that went 19-15 (5-11 SEC) and advanced to the quarterfinals of the WNIT. AU brings in eight newcomers for the 2013-14 season.

Four Tigers are averaging double figures, led by Tyrese Tanner with 16.2 per game and Hasina Muhammad with 15.0. Freshman Brandy Montgomery averages 12.0 per game while Tra'Cee Tanner averages 10.5. Tyrese Tanner pulls down a team-high 7.3 boards per game.

The Auburn defense is averaging forcing 19.8 turnovers per game and 10.0 steals per game.

LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN

The Auburn women's basketball team held Presbyterian to 27 points on Dec. 18, picking up the 64-27 win in the final game of a four-game homestand. Senior Tyrese Tanner led the Tigers with 18 points and seven rebounds.

Auburn utilized its defense to pick up the win as the 27 points by Presbyterian was the fewest by an Auburn opponent since the Tigers downed New Orleans 76-27 on Dec. 9, 2004. The Tigers forced the Blue Hose into 23 turnovers, scoring 29 points off turnovers. Presbyterian was limited to 20.0 percent shooting from the field and 10.0 percent from 3-point range.

Freshman Brandy Montgomery joined Tyrese Tanner in double digits, notching 11 points. Montgomery has scored in double figures in nine out of 10 games this season. Tra'Cee Tanner scored nine points with a team-high eight rebounds.

Auburn opened the game with an 11-0 run, holding Presbyterian scoreless for the first 5:06, and without a field goal the first 8:32. The Tigers would go on to lead 27-15 at the break.

The Tigers upped their intensity with a 13-0 run in the beginning of the second half. Auburn forced three consecutive 10-second backcourt violations during a stretch midway through the half. The Tigers put away the game with an 18-3 run to end the second half.

COACH FLO TOURNAMENT TIME

coach in regular season tournaments. That tally includes a pair of tournament championships in 2011 at Georgetown, winning the Lady Rebel Roundup and the Blue Sky Classic.

Coach Flo is 3-3 in regular-season tournaments as Auburn's head coach.

WHEN PLAYING IN MINNESOTA

Auburn is 2-0 all-time when playing in the state of Minnesota with both wins coming at the 1986 Minnesota Dial Classic. The Tigers downed Clemson 91-50 on Nov. 28, 1986 and beat host Minnesota 101-46 the next day.

ON THIS DATE (Dec. 21). . .

Auburn is 8-3 all-time when playing on Dec. 21. The last game on the date was a 69-61 loss to Marist in 2011. Auburn's last win on Dec. 21 was a 67-63 win at Chicago State in 2010.

ON THIS DATE (Dec. 22). . .

Auburn is 4-0 all-time when playing on Dec. 22. The last game on the date was a 85-49 win over Jacksonville in 2012.

IN DECEMBER

Auburn is 210-47 all-time in the month of December (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that season). Terri Williams-Flournoy is a perfect 10-0 in December as Auburn's head coach.

HOME SWEET HOME

Auburn is a perfect 6-0 when playing at home this season and are 21-4 at Auburn Arena in the Coach Flo Era. Overall, the Tigers are 37-17 in their home facility.

SHUTDOWN DEFENSE

In the first 10 games of the season, Auburn held its opponent to 20 or fewer points in a half three times. The Tiger defense flexed against Presbyterian as Auburn held the Blue Hose to season-lows of 15 points in the first half and 12 in the second half. Presbyterian scored 27 points in the game, the fewest allowed by Auburn since a 76-27 win over New Orleans on Dec. 9, 2004.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

Auburn's 92-point output against Florida A&M was the highest scoring game for the Tigers this season and the second-most points scored in the Coach Flo Era. AU used a 30-0 run midway through the second half to pull away and build its lead. The Tigers led by as many as 42 points in the game, their largest lead in any game this season.

HISTORIC MISS

With less than two minutes left in the game vs. St. John's, freshman Brandy Montgomery picked up a steal at mid-court and flipped it up to junior Hasina Muhammad. On the break, Muhammad decided to do what no Auburn women's basketball player has done before - attempt a slam dunk. She missed. The ball came off the back of the rim, but Muhammad put an exclamation point on the

Tigers' big win over the Red Storm.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

In the win over Tulane, Auburn had five players finish the game in double figures, marking the first time for the Tigers to do that since last season's home game vs. Tennessee on Jan. 17, 2013. Tyrese Tanner led the way with 17 points, followed by Brandy Montgomery with 11. Tra'Cee Tanner, Hasina Muhammad and Katie Frerking added 10 points each.

EXCLUSIVE CLUB

Senior Tyrese Tanner has flourished under Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, becoming a force on both ends of the court the last two years. Her all-around game is close to putting her in exclusive company in the Auburn record books.

She is close to reaching a rare feat as she is on pace to becoming just the fifth Auburn player ever with 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 100 assists, 100 steals and 50 blocks. Entering the Subway Classic, she has 1,116 points, 436 rebounds, 134 assists, 143 steals and 95 blocks -- just 64 rebounds from the mark. The only other players to accomplish the feat are DeWanna Bonner (2005-09), Brenda Hill (1982-85), Lori Monroe (1979-83) and Blanche Alverson (2009-13).

TOP FROSH

Freshman Brandy Montgomery has established herself in the Auburn starting lineup and has been a consistent presence for the Tigers. The native of Port St. Lucie, Fla., has scored in double figures in nine of the 10 games she has played in with a season-high of 17 points against Ball State. She is currently third on the team with 12.0 points per game and also ranks third among freshmen in the SEC.

FIRST TO 20

Junior Hasina Muhammad became the first Auburn player this season to score 20 or more points when she torched St. John's for a career-high 28 on Dec. 6. She was 11-of-19 from the field and 6-of-7 from the free throw line in the win.

While Hasina Muhammad was the first Tiger to score 20 points in a game this season, she was not alone as a 20-point scorer in the game. Senior Tyrese Tanner also scored 20 points against St. John's, marking the first time since March 24, 2013 for a pair of Tigers to score 20 points in the same game. Coincidentally, it was Tanner and Muhammad that night as well.

STANDOUT CLASS

The Tigers' freshmen class has made a big impact already this season as the class has led the team in scoring in five of 11 games. Against Jacksonville State, the freshmen accounted for 25 of the Tigers' 66 points and 38 of Auburn's 74 points at Temple. The freshmen scored 18 of AU's 52 points at Tennessee-Chattanooga, 19 of 68 points vs. Ball State and 23 of 62 points vs. Tulane.

DOUBLE DOWN

Senior Peyton Davis became the first Tiger this season to notch a

double-double, doing so with 15 points and 11 rebounds against Georgia Southern. She picked up another at Alabama A&M with a career-high 17 points and 12 rebounds. Tyrese Tanner also tallied a double-double with 19 points and 10 rebounds.

It marked the first time since March 6, 2009 vs. Ole Miss in the SEC Tournament for a pair of Tigers to get a double-double in the same game. DeWanna Bonner (32 points/13 rebounds) and Whitney Boddie (15 points/10 assists) were the last to do it for the Tigers.

Tanner has since added her second double-double of the season, scoring 17 points with 13 rebounds vs. Tulane.

BACKCOURT

Auburn's defense made team history in the season-opener as the Tigers forced a 10-second backcourt violation on Georgia Southern at the 10:24 mark of the second half. This is the first year for the 10-second backcourt rule in women's college basketball.

Auburn forced two 10-second violations against Florida A&M, one in the first half (6:35) and another in the second half (11:30).

The Tigers picked up four 10-second violations against Presbyterian. Auburn forced one at the 19:32 mark of the first half and again on three-straight possessions (14:02, 13:35, 13:19) in the second half.

SCORING WITH DEFENSE

Auburn has forced 218 turnovers in its first 11 games, averaging 19.8 per game. The Tigers have also scored 239 points off those turnovers, averaging 21.7 points off turnovers per game. Against Ball State, the Tigers scored 39 points off turnovers - the most in a game in the Coach Flo Era.

KEEPING SCORE

Against Presbyterian on Dec. 18, Auburn forced 23 turnovers while the Blue Hose made just eight field goals. It marked the seventh time this season and the 25th time in the Coach Flo Era that an Auburn opponent has committed more turnovers than made field goals.

CLUB PRESS

Auburn's high-pressure, full-court defense under coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, referred to by the players as "Club Press," ranked as one of the best ever at Auburn last year. Auburn's 402 steals set a new school record for a single season while the 701 turnovers forced went down as second all-time on The Plains.

Auburn has forced 25 or more turnovers in a game 106 times since 1987, including 13 times in the Coach Flo Era (three times this season). The Tigers have also tallied 15 or more steals in a game on 99 occasions since 1987, doing so 12 times under Coach Flo.

FRESH START

With her start against Georgia Southern in the season-opener, Katie Frerking became the fifth freshman in the last 10 years at Auburn to start in their first game as a Tiger. Others that have started their first game as a true freshman are Sherell Hobbs

(2005), DeWanna Bonner (2005), Morgan Jennings (2008) and Hasina Muhammad (2011).

TANDEM FROSH

With Katie Frerking and Brandy Montgomery in the starting lineup against Jacksonville State, it was the first time for Auburn to start two freshmen since Tyrese Tanner and Courtney Strain started against Seton Hall in the Bahamas on Nov. 27, 2010, an 85-51 win.

FIRST OUTING

Freshman Brandy Montgomery made her first collegiate appearance and start against Jacksonville State, logging 15 points along the way. Montgomery's 15 points were the most for an Auburn player in their collegiate debut since DeWanna Bonner (19 points) and KeKe Carrier (21 points) against Texas-Pan American on Nov. 18, 2005.

FIRST TIMERS

With eight newcomers on the roster, several Tigers are seeing their first action in an Auburn uniform. In the season-opener against Georgia Southern, freshman Katie Frerking and junior college transfer Kiani Parker recorded their first career start. Freshmen Meagan Tucker and Khady Dieng, and junior college transfer Melinda Brimfield also logged their first minutes as a Tiger.

Freshmen Keonna Farmer, Brandy Montgomery and Allina Starr saw their first action against Jacksonville State with Montgomery also getting the start in the win.

TANNER NAMED TO SOUTH POINT THANKSGIVING SHOOTOUT ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Senior Tyrese Tanner was named to the South Point Thanksgiving Shootout All-Tournament team after leading the Tigers to a 1-1 record at the tournament. She averaged 12.5 points, 5.0 rebounds and 2.0 steals per game. She scored 14 in the win over Ball State and totaled 11 points in the loss to Iowa State.

TOP SCORER

Back for her senior season, Tyrese Tanner has led the Tigers in scoring in each of the last two seasons. Her 10.6 points per game as a sophomore led the team and she was back again last year with a team-high 14.2 points per game. She is one of just eight players ever at Auburn to lead the team in scoring in back-to-back years and the first since DeWanna Bonner.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

The Tigers will play a challenging schedule this season, playing eight non-conference games against teams that advanced to the postseason a year ago. Tennessee-Chattanooga, Iowa State, St. John's and UCLA played in the NCAA Tournament last year while Ball State, Tulane and Minnesota played in the WNIT. Additionally, Presbyterian played in last year's WBI.

The strength of schedule showed up in this year's preseason top-25 polls with 13 of Auburn's opponents either ranked or receiving votes.

SISTER ACT

For just the third time ever, Auburn's roster features a sister combination as Tyrese and Tra'cee Tanner step on the court. Tyrese is a senior on the squad this year while Tra'cee is a sophomore.

Other sister combinations to play together at Auburn include Sherell (2004-09) and Reneisha (2006-10) Hobbs, and Ruthie (1985-89) and Mae Ola (1984-88) Bolton.

THE GRADUATE

Senior center Peyton Davis took a big step Aug. 3, 2013 as she earned her degree in exercise science from Auburn. Davis is currently working toward her master's degree.

NEW FACES

Auburn's roster has been overtaken by newcomers this year as eight of the 13 players on the team are in their first year. The newcomer class includes six freshmen and two junior college transfers. Making up the freshman class are Khady Dieng (Dakar, Senegal), Keonna Farmer (Birmingham, Ala.), Katie Frerking (Johns Creek, Ga.), Brandy Montgomery (Port St. Lucie, Fla.), Allina Starr (Minneapolis, Minn.) and Meagan Tucker (Covington, Ga.). The junior college transfers are Melinda Brimfield (Norway, S.C.) and Kiani Parker (Fort Walton Beach, Fla.).

ON THE TUBE

Auburn will appear on TV six times during the 2013-14 regular season. The Tigers will host South Carolina on Jan. 12 in a game that will air on SportSouth. Auburn's will follow that up on Jan. 19 against Kentucky with the team's lone SEC TV appearance of the season. The Tigers' Jan. 26 game at Florida will air live on ESPN. Auburn will play three-straight games in February on TV, starting with a game on CSS on Feb. 13 at Vanderbilt. Auburn will come home for a Feb. 16 meeting with Missouri on SportSouth before traveling to Tennessee for a Feb. 20 game on CSS.

FINAL FOUR RECOGNITION

Auburn made its first of three-straight Final Four appearances a little more than 25 years ago in April of 1988. Members of those three Final Four teams (1988, 1989 and 1990) will be welcomed back to The Plains during the Tigers' Feb. 16 game against Missouri for a 25-year reunion.

Coached by Joe Ciampi, those teams included the likes of Chantel Tremiere, Mae Ola Bolton, Carolyn Jones, Ruthie Bolton, C.C. Hayden, Lauretta Freeman, Linda Godby, Vickie Orr and other Auburn greats.

TIGERS PICKED 8TH IN PRESEASON POLLS

Auburn was picked to finish eighth in both the SEC Preseason Media and Coaches polls. Tennessee was tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the SEC in both polls.

POSTSEASON REGULAR

The Auburn women's basketball team has been to the postseason 22 times in the program's history, 18 NCAA Tournaments and

four WNITs. Of those, the Tigers advanced to three Final Fours and won the WNIT in 2003.

Recently, Auburn has been the postseason in five of the last seven seasons with two NCAA Tournament appearances (2008 & 2009) and three WNIT appearances (2007, 2011 & 2013).

(Episcopal HS), and Asia Robeson, a 6-4 forward from Kalamazoo, Mich. (Kalamazoo Central HS), will join the Tigers for the 2014-15 season. The class is ranked 25th in the nation by ESPN and the Collegiate Girls Basketball Report.

Quoting Coach Flo

On Presbyterian game . . .

"Defensively, especially in the second half, I thought we came out and played a lot tougher. One of our goals was to limit them to 10 3-point attempts because they have been shooting them a lot. The more of those you give up, the more opportunities you give them to make it. That was one of our goals we did not achieve and something we have to continue to work on."

On UCLA . . .

"UCLA has had some injuries, but even with those, their starting five is really good. They have some really good guards that can shoot the ball, some that can put it on the floor. They have a great inside presence as well. They have a very good point guard that can run the team, they are just a very good NCAA-caliber team."

On Minnesota . . .

"Minnesota is another NCAA-caliber team. These are two very tough teams that will help prepare us for the SEC season. Minnesota is tough at home, that is going to be a tough game. Both of these games will show if our defense is moving in the right direction. Offensively, we really want to get our offense from our defense. Both of these teams, I feel like we can pressure them, but at the end of the day we have to rebound and be able to get back in position because they will push the ball in transition."

On preparing for the SEC . . .

"Both of these games set the tone right away for what we have to prepare for next. We have played some easy games, we have had some tough games, but these last two games here before we start SEC play really gives our young kids a picture of what is coming next."

- The SEC has posted impressive non-conference records in the last decade. The SEC compiled a 166-52 (.765) non-conference record last season.
- Since the 1990 season, the SEC has compiled a 3295-983 (.770) record against other conferences. The league has recorded 150+ wins during nine seasons & has never recorded a non-conference winning percentage below .723.
- SEC teams have earned appearances in 25 of 32 NCAA Final Fours, an accomplishment unmatched by any other league.
- Overall, SEC squads have filled 34 of the 128 Final Four berths, including having two Final Four teams in 1988 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1989 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1995 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1996 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1998 (Arkansas, Tennessee), 2004 (LSU, Tennessee), 2005 (LSU, Tennessee), 2007 (LSU, Tennessee) and 2008 (LSU, Tennessee).
- SEC teams have made 18 appearances in a nation-high 16 NCAA Championship games, winning eight NCAA Championships (Tennessee: 1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).
- The league also had the distinction of providing both national finalists twice in its history in 1996 (Tennessee 83, Georgia 65) and in 1989 (Tennessee 76, Auburn 60).
- SEC teams have won 361 NCAA Tournament games against 187 losses (.659) for an average of 11.3 NCAA wins per year.
- In addition, all 14 current members have appeared in the NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC has paced the pack in NCAA tournament bids 22 times in its 32-year history.
- The SEC was the first league to ever have eight teams invited to the NCAA Tournament, doing so in 1999, 2002 and 2012.
- The SEC was also the first league to ever have seven teams invited to the NCAA Tournament and earned this honor a leading nine times (1986, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2004, 2007 & 2013).
- The SEC is one of a handful of leagues to have won three national tournament titles with eight NCAA, two WNIT and three NWIT. Along with the eight NCAA championships won by Tennessee, Arkansas (1999) and Auburn (2003) captured the current Women's NIT titles. But the first-ever SEC national title belongs to Georgia, winners of the 1981 NWIT which predates the current NCAA tournament. LSU (1985) and Kentucky (1990) also won NWIT titles. Both Arkansas (1987) and South Carolina (1979) won the WNIT as members of their previous conferences.
- In 2003, Auburn won the WNIT title with wins over South Alabama, Florida State, Richmond, Creighton and Baylor. In 1999, the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks defeated Wisconsin 76-64 to claim the SEC's first WNIT championship.
- In 1981, Georgia defeated Pittsburg, California and Arizona State (in OT) to capture the NWIT Championship, the first-ever national championship of any kind for the SEC in women's basketball.
