- Auburn is playing its first season in the new \$86 million Auburn Arena
- The win over Mercer was the first regular-season Auburn win, men or women, in the new facility
- Auburn is making its first appearance at the Junkanoo Jam and only its second appearance in the Caribbean as it played
  in the Paradise Jam in the U.S. Virgin Islands in 2006
- The other three teams in the Lucaya Division are Sacred Heart, Seton Hall and Boston College
- Auburn has a 21-9 record under Head Coach Nell Fortner when playing in regular-season tournaments
- This will be the first meeting ever between Auburn and Seton Hall
- Auburn is 19-10 all-time against current Big East teams following Monday's loss at South Florida
- Auburn head coach Nell Fortner has a 3-4 record against Seton Hall's Anne Donovan with all seven meetings coming
  while they were coaching in the WNBA
- Fortner and Donovan are also both former U.S. Olympic head coaches
- Playing in the Bahamas will be the closest Auburn freshman Jassany Williams will come to playing at home this season
- Auburn holds a 1-1 all-time record against teams from Rutgers, with both games against Rutgers
- Auburn is 7-2 all-time when playing on Nov. 27; Nell Fortner is 1-2
- The Tigers are 102-26 all-time in the month of November, 31-13 under Fortner
- Auburn is coming off a difficult start to the season, playing two ranked teams in its first three games for the first time in school history
- Auburn is 79-2 under Fortner when scoring 70 or more points
- Fortner has guided the Tigers to a 72-31 record when playing non-conference games, 29-6 when playing at home
- Alli Smalley needs just six 3-pointers to tie the school record of 184 held by Tiffany Krantz
- Auburn was picked sixth in the SEC Preseason Media and Coaches' polls, Tennessee was picked to win the league
- Alli Smalley was picked the the Coaches' Preseason All-SEC First Team and to the media's Second Team
- Nell Fortner is beginning her seventh season at Auburn, marking her longest tenure at any job
- The Tigers welcome five newcomers: Peyton Davis, Camille Glymph, Courtney Strain, Tyrese Tanner, Jassany Williams
- Carla McGhee returns to Auburn for her second stint as an assistant coach
- Auburn will be a first- and second-round host of the 2011 NCAA Tournament in the new Auburn Arena

#### **NEXT UP FOR THE TIGERS**

Auburn will return to Auburn for a two-game pre-finals homestand, beginning with a 6 p.m., Thursday game against in-state rival South Alabama.

#### **AUBURN'S POST-GAME PROCEDURE**

The Auburn locker room is closed. Coach Nell Fortner and selected Tiger players will be brought to the interview room after the 10-minute "cooling off" period.

#### **QUICK HITS**

Auburn is in its 40th season of women's basketball and sports an all-time record of 781-348... AU has made 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, two WNIT appearances and three Final Fours in the program's history... Head Coach Nell Fortner is in her seventh season at Auburn with a 134-87 career record and a 117-76 record on the Plains... The Tigers are coming off a 15-16 season in 2009-10.

#### THE JUNKANOO JAM

Auburn is competing in the Junkanoo Jam this week in Freeport, Bahamas. The Tigers are one of eight teams playing in the two divisions of the tournament. In Lucaya Division are Auburn, Boston College, Sacred Heart and Seton Hall. In the Freeport Division are Alabama, Arizona State, Florida State and Providence.

#### JUNKANOO JAM HISTORY

The Junkanoo Jam has been played since 2003. The tournament namesake, Junkanoo, is a Bahamanian parade and festival that occurs every Dec. 26 and Jan. 1. Junkanoo inthe Bahamas is similar to Mardi Gras in New Orleans.

Previous Junkanoo Jam tournament champions (with their respective division) are: Penn State (Freeport, 2003), Minnesota (Lucaya, 2003), Duke (Freeport, 2004), Iowa (Lucaya, 2004), Rutgers (Freeport, 2005), Texas (Lucaya, 2005), Maryland (Freeport, 2006), Baylor (Lucaya, 2006), Georgia (Freeport, 2007), North Carolina State (2007, Lucaya), North Carolina (Freeport, 2008), Florida (Lucaya, 2008), Xavier (Freeport, 2009), Virginia (Reef, 2009) and Michigan State (Lucaya, 2009).

#### **AUBURN-SETON HALL SERIES**

This will be the first meeting between Auburn and Seton Hall.

#### **SCOUTING AUBURN**

Auburn is off to a rough 1-4 start to the season, dropping four straight games to No. 16 Florida State (61-67), No. 6 Duke (62-75), at South Florida (49-67) and vs. Sacred Heart (53-65). Playing two of the first three games of the season against ranked teams, it marked Auburn's most difficult start to a season in program history.

Auburn's defense has stepped up with 9.0 steals and 3.0 blocks per game, but the Tigers are struggling shooting the ball with a .354 field goal percentage.

Senior Jordan Greenleaf is leading the team this season with 11.2 points and 8.8 rebounds per game. A pair of sophomores are also stepping up big as Blanche Alverson is third in scoring with 9.2 points while point guard Morgan Toles is averaging 8.0 points and 4.2 assists per game. Alli Smalley is second in scoring with 10.0 points per game.

- Alli Smalley needs 49 more points to tie C.C. Hayden for 15th all-time in career scoring at Auburn
- Jordan Greenleaf needs 3 more blocked shots to tie Becky Jackson for eighth all-time at Auburn in career blocks
- Jordan Greenleaf needs 19 more rebounds to tie Mae Ola Bolton for 14th all-time at Auburn in career rebounds and 29 more to tie
  Tasha Hamilton for 13th all-time

#### **SCOUTING SETON HALL**

Seton Hall is 3-3 so far under first-year head coach Anne Donovan, notching wins over Temple (72-59), Massachusetts (61-58) and Army (50-40). The Pirates had losses against Florida Gulf Coast (64-57) and SEC-member LSU (58-40) before falling to Boston College (85-46) in the first round of the Junkanoo Jam.

Seton Hall has struggled from the field, shooting 32.0 percent and 24.7 percent from 3-point range.

Three Pirates are averaging double figures, led by Jasmine Crew with 11.8. Ka-Deidre Simmons (11.0 ppg) and Kandice Green (10.2) round out the trio. Green also leads the team in rebounding with 8.8 per game.

#### LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN

The Auburn women's basketball team struggled from the field, shooting 31.3 percent as the Tigers fell to Sacred Heart, 65-53, in the first game of the 2010 Junkanoo Jam in Freeport, Bahamas.

Senior Alli Smalley led the Tigers in scoring with 12 points while freshman Tyrese Tanner came off the bench for 10 points and three steals. Jordan Greenleaf pulled down a team-high seven rebounds.

For the game, Auburn forced 27 Pioneer turnovers, gathering nine steals, but the Tigers lost the rebounding battle, 42-34. Sacred Heart shot 51.1 percent for the game and 47.1 percent of its free throws.

#### LAST TIME OUT FOR SETON HALL

Boston College used a 15-1 run to open the game, setting the tone for what would be an 85-46 win over Seton Hall in the opening round of the Junkanoo Jam.

Junior Jasmine Crew and freshman Ka-Deidre Simmons led Seton Hall with nine points each. Crew also pulled down a teamhiah seven rebounds.

The Pirates shot 25.0 percent in the game, 11.1 percent from 3-point range and 66.7 percent from the line. Boston College also out-rebounded Seton Hall, 43-39.

#### FORTNER VS. DONOVAN

Nell Fortner and Anne Donovan have never met as collegiate coaches, but the pair did have seven meetings against each other as WNBA coaches with Donovan holding the 4-3 advantage.

Fortner coached the Indiana Fever form 2001-03 while Donovan coached the Charlotte Sting (2001-02) and Seattle storm (2003).

Fortner and Donovan last met on June 28, 2003 with Fortner's Fever pulling out the 79-70 win over Donovan's Storm.

#### **FORTNER-DONOVAN CONNECTION**

Nell Fortner and Anne Donovan have a professional connection in their experience with the WNBA's Indiana Fever. Fortner was offered the head coach position with the expansion Fever in 2000, but could not take the position right away because of her obligation to the U.S. National Team.

In her place, the Fever hired Donovan on an interim basis to coach the team during its inaugural season. She guided Indiana to a 9-23 record in its first season.

#### AN OLYMPIC RING TO IT

Saturday's game marks the first time for this season for Auburn head coach Nell Fortner, head coach of the 2000 U.S. National Olympic Team, to face another Olympic coach. Seton Hall head coach Anne Donovan was the U.S. Olympic head coach at the 2008 Beijing Olympics and was an assistant in 2004.

#### **VS. THE BIG EAST CONFERENCE**

Auburn is 19-10 all-time against current members of the Big East Conference. Auburn's last meeting with a Big East team came on Monday with the Tigers dropping a 67-49 decision at South Florida.

#### ON THIS DATE...

Auburn is 7-2 all-time when playing on Nov. 27 and 1-2 under head coach Nell Fortner. The Tigers' last game on Nov. 27 was an 82-67 loss at Florida State last season.

#### **IN NOVEMBER**

Auburn is 102-26 all-time in the month of November, including a 31-13 mark under Nell Fortner (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that season).

#### IN THE CARIBBEAN

While Auburn has never played in the Bahamas, this marks the team's second trip to the Carribbean. The Tigers played in the Paradise Jam in the U.S. Virgin Islands in 2006. Auburn went 1-2 at the tournament with a win over Western Michigan and losses to Xavier and Marquette.

#### TOURNAMENT TIME WITH FORTNER

Auburn has a 21-9 record under head coach Nell Fortner when playing in regular-season tournaments. Since becoming the Tigers' head coach, she has led the team to eight regular-season tournament titles.

#### PLAYING CLOSE TO HOME

Despite playing in a foreign country, this weekend's games in the Bahamas will be the closest freshman Jassany Williams (Davie, Fla.) will play to her home this season.

Freeport, Bahamas is right around 110 miles from Williams' home in Davie, Fla., a suburb of Miami.

#### **AGAINST THE GARDEN STATE**

Auburn has a 1-1 all-time record against teams from the state of New Jersey with both meetings coming against Rutgers. Auburn and Rutgers last played during the 2009 NCAA Tournament with Auburn taking an 80-52 loss.

#### **TOUGH START**

Auburn is coming off its most difficult start to a season in the program's history. After opening against Mercer, Auburn played 16th-ranked Florida State and sixth-ranked Duke, giving the Tigers two ranked opponents in the first three games for the frist time in school history.

#### **89 AND COUNTING**

Auburn junior guard Alli Smalley earned her first collegiate start on Dec. 29, 2007 at Saint Joseph's, the 14th game of her collegiate career, and has not left. Since then, Smalley has started in 89 consecutive games.

#### **DEFENSE MAKES OFFENSE**

In Auburn's first three games of the season, the Tigers used their defense to spark their offense. Auburn has forced 65 turnovers (21.7 per game) this season on 35 steals (11.7 per game), turning them into 24.3 points per game.

#### **DOUBLE DOWN**

Senior Jordan Greenleaf pulled down 12 rebounds with 16 points in the season-opener against Florida State, earning her first double-double of the season and fourth of her career.

She came back with another at South Florida, scoring 13 points with 10 rebounds.

#### **DISHING IT OUT**

By playing in her 30th career game against Mercer, Auburn sophomore became eligible for the career assist rankings. With 149 on her career, she ranks sixth all-time at Auburn with 4.4 per game.

#### I'M FIRST!

While it was Mercer's Sharnea Boykin who scored the first field goal in Auburn Arena, sophomore Blanche Alverson came down on the very next posession to pick up Auburn's first field goal and the first 3-pointer in the facility.

#### **EVERYONE PLAYS**

All 12 active Tigers played at least one minute in each of the first three games of the season.

#### **OUTSIDE THE LEAGUE**

Nell Fortner has guided the Tigers to a 72-31 ledger in non-conference play. When playing at home, Fortner's teams have posted a 30-6 mark. The only six non-conference losses at home came from Xavier on Dec. 2, 2005 (58-60), No. 2 Duke on Dec. 31, 2004 (61-80), No. 20 George Washington on Jan. 3, 2008 (66-68), No. 15 Texas A&M on Nov. 22, 2009 (59-79), No. 16 Florida State on Nov. 15, 2010 (61-67) and No. 6 Duke on Nov. 18, 2010 (62-75).

#### **OFFENSE WINS GAMES**

Auburn is 79-2 when scoring 70 or more points in the Nell Fortner era. The only times Auburn has lost when scoring at least 70 points was on Jan. 20, 2005 vs. No. 7 Tennessee, 71-81 and Feb. 19, 2009 at No. 18 Vanderbilt, 73-70. When scoring less than 70 points, Auburn is 38-75 during the Fortner era.

#### **HOME COOKIN'**

Since a 77-70 loss to Virginia on Jan. 5, 1992, the Auburn Tigers have compiled a 126-9 record against non-conference opponents when playing at home.

#### **BUILDING WITH EXPERIENCE**

Auburn enters the 2010-11 season with a mix of youth and experience. Nine of the 14 players on the roster are either freshmen or sophomores, but among the nine returning players, Auburn brings back 250 games of experience as a starter.

#### **SMALLEY NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC**

Auburn senior Alli Smalley was named to the Preseason All-SEC team by both the coaches and the media. The Coaches selected Smalley to the Preseason All-SEC First Team while the media voted her to the Second Team.

Smalley averaged 15.7 points per game last season, chipping in 4.4 rebounds and 2.3 assists per outing.

# AUBURN PICKED SIXTH IN SEC PRESEASON MEDIA AND COACHES POLLS

Coming off a 15-16 season, the Auburn women's basketball team was picked sixth in the preseason SEC media and coaches polls. Tennessee was the preseason favorite in both polls.

#### **MAKING IT HOME**

Nell Fortner enters her seventh season as Auburn's head coach, marking her longest tenure at any position in her career. The longest Fortner had stayed at a job prior to Auburn came from 1990-95 while she was an assistant coach at Louisiana Tech under legendary head coach Leon Barmore.

#### FIRST GAME IN AUBURN ARENA

Auburn won its inaugural game in the new \$86 million Auburn Arena. The Tigers defeated Mercer, 79-61, for the first regular-season Auburn win, men or women, in the new facility.

The Tigers move across the street this season from its former home, Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum - the team's home since 1974. Auburn played its first game in BEMC on Jan. 11, 1974, defeating in-state rival Alabama. 69-31.

#### **TIGERS SIGN HASINA MUHAMMAD FOR 2011-12**

The Auburn women's basketball signed 6-1 guard/forward Hasina Muhammad (Ridgeway HS, Memphis, Tenn.) to a National Letter of Intent. head coach Nell Fortner announced on Nov. 10.

Muhammad is ranked as the No. 66 overall player in the country by ESPN's HoopGurlz. She is also ranked as the 17th-best guard in the country and No. 2 prospect in Tennessee by HoopGurlz.

Muhammad was also ranked by two other recruiting services. She is the No. 50 overall prospect according to the All-Star Girls Report and No. 47 in the Girls Basketball Report.

#### WNBA CHAMPION... AGAIN

After winning a WNBA title in 2009 with the Phoenix Mercury, former Tiger Le'Coe Willingham put herself in select company when she turned around and won it again in 2010, this time with the Seattle Storm.

Willingham, a native of Augusta, Ga., averaged 5.5 points and 4.1 rebounds per game as she helped the Storm to a league-best 28-6 record.

The Storm swept Los Angeles in the first round of the playoffs, setting up a meeting of Willingham and her former team, the Mercury, in the conference finals. She defeated her old team, and former Tiger DeWanna Bonner, in a sweep for a trip to the WNBA finals.

Seattle made it a perfect run through the playoffs, sweeping the Atlanta Dream in three games for the title.

#### **TIGERS ON THE TUBE**

As part of the SEC's television agreement with ESPN, the Auburn women's basketball team will be televised six times this season on Fox Sports Net, CSS, the SEC Network and ESPN2. The SEC Tournament will be televised on Fox Sports Net, ESPNU and ESPN2. In all, the SEC will be televised in more than 70 games this season.

Auburn will be televised three times at home at the new Auburn Arena and three times on the road. The first will be the SEC-opener on Jan. 2 at Alabama on CSS, followed by a Jan. 16 home meeting with LSU on CSS. The Tigers will appear on CSS again a week later, on Jan. 23, as Tennessee comes to town.

Auburn will then make an ESPN2 appearance on Feb. 13 at Arkansas before traveling to South Carolina for a Feb. 20 game on the Fox Sports

Net

The Tigers will close out the regular season with a Feb. 27 home game against Kentucky on the SEC Network.

# AUBURN TO HOST 2011 NCAA TOURNAMENT FIRST AND SECOND ROUNDS

The new Auburn Arena will close out its first season of operation, March 19-22, as a host site for the first and second rounds of the 2011 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament. Auburn's bid to host the opening rounds was selected by the NCAA and announced on Oct. 29, 2009.

The 2011 event will mark the first time for Auburn to host the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament under its current bid format. The Tigers hosted NCAA Tournament games on nine occasions between 1983 and 1993, posting an 11-0 record over that time. Auburn last hosted on March 21, 1993 when the Tigers downed Louisville, 66-61.

Auburn will be one of 16 first- and second-round sites in 2011. The complete list of host sites includes Albuquerque, N.M. (University of New Mexico, The Pit/Bob King Court); Auburn, Ala. (Auburn University, Auburn Arena); Charlottesville, Va. (University of Virginia, John Paul Jones Arena); Cincinnati, Ohio (Xavier University, Cintas Center); College Park. Md. (University of Maryland, Comcast Center): Columbus. Ohio (Ohio State University, St. John Arena); Durham, N.C. (Duke University, Cameron Indoor Stadium); Knoxville, Tenn. (University of Tennessee, Thompson-Boling Arena); Salt Lake City, Utah (University of Utah, John M. Huntsman Center); Spokane, Wash. (Gonzaga University, McCarthey Athletic Center); Shreveport, La. (Louisiana Tech University, CenturyTel Center); Stanford, Calif. (Stanford University, Maples Pavilion); Storrs, Conn. (University of Connecticut, Harry A. Gampel Pavilion): University Park, Penn. (Pennsylvania State University, Bryce Jordan Center); Waco, Texas (Baylor University, Ferrell Center); and Wichita, Kan. (Wichita State University, INTRUST Bank Arena).

The 16 advancing teams will continue play at four regional sites: Dayton, Ohio (University of Dayton Arena), Spokane, Wash. (Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena), Dallas, Texas (American Airlines Center) and Philadelphia, Pa. (Liacouras Center). The 2011 NCAA Women's Final Four will be held at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Ind. on April 3 and 5.

#### **SEC Women's Basketball Notes**

- The SEC has posted impressive non-conference records in the last decade.
  The SEC compiled a 121-45 (.729) non-conference record during the 2009-10 season.
- Since the 1990 season, the SEC has compiled a 2,774-844 (.767) record against other conferences. The league has recorded 150 + wins during eight seasons and has never recorded a non-conference winning percentage below .723.
- SEC teams have earned appearances in 25 of 29 NCAA Final Fours, an accomplishment unmatched by any other league.
- Overall, SEC squads have filled 34 of the 116 Final Four berths, including having two Final Four teams in 1988 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1989 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1995 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1996 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1998 (Arkansas, Tennessee), 2004 (LSU, Tennessee), 2005 (LSU, Tennessee), 2007 (LSU, Tennessee) and 2008 (LSU, Tennessee).
- SEC teams have made 18 appearances in a nation-high 16 NCAA Championship games, winning eight NCAA Championships (Tennessee: 1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).
- The league also had the distinction of providing both national finalists twice in its history in 1996 (Tennessee 83, Georgia 65) and in 1989 (Tennessee 76, Auburn 60).
  - SEC teams have won 329 NCAA Tournament games against 168 losses (.662) for an average of 11.4 NCAA wins per year.
- $\bullet$  In addition, all 12 current members have appeared in the NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC has paced the pack in NCAA tournament bids 21 times in its 29-year history.
- The SEC was the first league to ever have eight teams invited to the NCAA
  Tournament, doing so in 1999 and 2002.
- The SEC was also the first league to ever have seven teams invited to the NCAA Tournament and earned this honor a leading seven times (1986, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2004).
- The SEC is one of a handful of leagues to have won three national tournament titles with eight NCAA, two WNIT and three NWIT. Along with the eight NCAA championships won by Tennessee, Arkansas (1999) and Auburn (2003) captured the current Women's NIT titles. But the first-ever SEC national title belongs to Georgia, winners of the 1981 NWIT which predates the current NCAA tournament. LSU (1985) and Kentucky (1990) each won NWIT titles. Both Arkansas (1987) and South Carolina (1979) won the WNIT as members of their previous conferences.
- In 2003, Auburn won the WNIT title with wins over South Alabama, Florida State, Richmond, Creighton and Baylor. In 1999, the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks defeated Wisconsin 76-64 to claim the SEC's first WNIT championship.
- In 1981, Georgia defeated Pittsburg, California and Arizona State (in OT) to capture the NWIT Championship, the first-ever national championship of any kind for the SEC in women's basketball.

As a team, the Tigers were 25-of-66 from the field for 37.9 percent. Auburn shot 7-of-13 from the stripe and 4-of-10 from 3-point land. Florida State out-rebounded Auburn, 47-29.
