### Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- This is Auburn's second meeting with St. John's; Auburn won 69-55 in 2013 at home
- Auburn has met Indiana State just once; a 92-54 win in 1981 on the road
- Auburn and SMU have never met in women's basketball
- An Auburn win over St. John's would snap a five-game road losing streak
- Auburn's last road win came on Feb. 13, 2014, at Vanderbilt
- Auburn has won 11 straight home games dating back to end of last season, matching the longest streak at Auburn Arena
- Auburn is 16-4 all-time against current members of the Big East
- Auburn has a 16-10 record against current members of the American Athletic Conference
- The Tigers are 6-0 all-time against the Missouri Valley Conference
- Auburn is 9-1 all-time in games played in the state of New York
- This is the second time Auburn has played in one of the five boroughs of New York City (last: at Fordham, 1989)
- The Tigers are 13-3 all-time on December 20
- Auburn is 9-3 all-time on December 21
- Auburn is 215-48 all-time in the month of December; Coach Flo is 14-1 in December at Auburn
- Auburn is 22-1 under Coach Flo in non-conference home games
- The Tigers are 31-5 all-time at Auburn Arena in non-conference games
- Auburn is 4-0 this season when forcing 25 or more turnovers (29 vs. Troy; 27 vs. Marquette/Samford, 25 vs. Grambling)
- The Tigers have recorded 15 or more steals four times this year, going 4-0 in those games
- Auburn is second in the SEC in assists (17.3/game) and steals (13.4/game)
- Senior Kiani Parker is 3rd in the SEC in assists (4.4/game); freshman Neydja Petithomme is 15th (3.1/game)
- Senior Hasina Muhammad leads the SEC in blocked shots (1.7/game) and is 12th in steals (2.1/game)
- Muhammad scored a season-high 14 points in win over Savannah State (12/17) to lead Auburn for 1st time in 2014-15
- Junior Tra'Cee Tanner has held or shared the Auburn lead in scoring in 8 of 9 games this year
- Tanner leads the SEC in field goal percentage (.628) and is 9th in scoring (14.4 ppg)
- Sophomore Katie Frerking has led Auburn in rebounding in 6 of 9 games
- Freshman Jazmine Jones scored a career-high 12 points on 5-of-5 shooting in win over Samford (12/14)

**LOOKING AHEAD**

Auburn will have four days off next week for Christmas before returning to practice on Dec. 26. The Tigers will return to action Monday-Tuesday, Dec. 29-30, at the FIU Fun & Sun Classic in Miami. Auburn will face host FIU at 5 p.m. CT on Dec. 29 then either Hampton or Bowling Green at 2:30 p.m. CT on Dec. 30.

**QUICK HITS**

Auburn is off to a 7-2 start for the third time in four years ... Auburn won its 850th all-time game with its win over Troy on Nov. 14, becoming the 19th team in NCAA history with 850 victories ... Auburn is in its 44th season of women's basketball and sports an all-time record of 865-410... Auburn has made 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, five WNIT appearances and three Final Fours in the program's history... Head Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is 45-32 in her third season at Auburn... She has a 188-136 record as a head coach... Auburn advanced to the 2013 WNIT Quarterfinals and the 2014 WNIT Third Round... The Tigers are coming off back-to-back 19-15 seasons.

**AUBURN VS. RANKED OPPONENTS**

Auburn is 94-171 all-time against opponents ranked in the top 25. The Tigers' last win over a ranked opponent was a 68-62 victory at No. 16 Vanderbilt on Feb. 13, 2014. St. John's will be Auburn's first top-25 opponent this season.

**AGAINST THE BIG EAST**

Auburn is 16-4 all-time against schools that are current members of the Big East Conference. St. John's will be the second Big East opponent for Auburn this year; the Tigers defeated Marquette on Dec. 2. Auburn's Big East opponents include: Creighton (2-0), DePaul (8-1), Marquette (1-1), Providence (2-0), St. John's (1-0), Seton Hall (1-0) and Xavier (1-2).

**AGAINST THE MISSOURI VALLEY**

The Tigers are 6-0 all-time against schools that currently reside in the Missouri Valley Conference. Auburn has faced six schools once each, winning all six games: Drake, Illinois State, Indiana State, Loyola, Missouri State and Southern Illinois.

**AGAINST THE AMERICAN**

Auburn has a 16-10 record against schools currently in the American Athletic Conference. The Tigers' American opponents include: Central Florida (1-0), Connecticut (1-4), Houston (2-0), Memphis (1-0), South Florida (1-1), Temple (5-4) and Tulane (5-1).

**SCOUTING AUBURN**

Auburn enters the weekend 7-2 after opening the season with three straight home wins over Troy, Grambling State and Florida Gulf Coast, dropping their first two road games of the year at Virginia and Winthrop, then bouncing back with home wins over Marquette, Southeastern Louisiana, Samford and Savannah State.

Junior Tra'Cee Tanner has been the Tigers' top offensive threat thus far, averaging 14.4 points and shooting an SEC-best 62.8% in the first eight games. She had a double-double in the opener vs. Troy with 16 points and 10 rebounds, then followed that up with a career-high 31 points on 14-of-18 shooting vs. Grambling State. She then scored 19 points in a win over FGCU and has led Auburn in scoring in seven of nine games. Sophomore Brandy Montgomery is averaging 11.7 points per game, including a career-high 24 at Virginia, and sophomore Khady Dieng has contributed 7.6 points per game so far.

Pressure defense remains a staple of Coach Flo's system. After averaging 20.0 forced turnovers per game during her first two seasons, the Tigers have forced an average of 22.2 turnovers in the first eight games of this season while racking up 13.4 steals/game.

**SCOUTING ST. JOHN'S**

St. John's is 9-0 and ranked 25th in the USA Today Coaches' Poll. The Red Storm already have one win over an SEC foe this season (Florida), along with victories over Marist, Xavier and USF, among others.

The Red Storm average 63.1 points per game but are holding their opponents below 50 points per game this season and to a 34% field goal percentage. St. John's out-rebounds opponents by more than 10 per game, averaging 43.7 boards of their own.

Danaejah Grant averages 19.4 points per game and shoots 47% from the field, and Amber Thompson is the team's leading

rebounder with 12.6 boards per game.

St. John's was picked to finish second in the Big East this season after finishing 23-11 last season and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

**SCOUTING INDIANA STATE**

Indiana State is 8-1 on the year, including a 5-0 mark away from home. The Sycamores have road wins at Butler, South Alabama, Indiana, IUPUI and Saint Louis so far this year. The Sycamores' lone loss came at home to Stetson.

ISU shoots 41.1% from the field and is outscoring opponents by nearly eight points per game. Much like Auburn, the Sycamores rely on forcing opponent turnovers (22.4/game) and play multiple lineups; seven players average more than 20 minutes/game.

Racheal Mahan is the team's leading scorer (13.1 ppg) and rebounder (6.7), and Natasha Zurek averages 2.2 assists and 2.4 steals per game.

Indiana State was picked fifth in the Missouri Valley Conference preseason poll; the Sycamores won the conference regular-season title last year, going 20-12 overall and advancing to the WNIT.

**SCOUTING SMU**

Southern Methodist is 4-5 entering the weekend, including an 0-2 mark away from home. The Mustangs, however, played fifth-ranked Texas A&M to the wire in their last outing, falling by just eight points (70-62). The Mustangs' other losses came to Northern Colorado, TCU, USC and Arizona State.

SMU controls the boards in most games, averaging 9.2 rebounds more than their opponents, but is only averaging 59.9 points per game. The Mustangs have also been turnover-prone, turning it over 22.3 times per game.

Alicia Froling averages 11.1 points and 8.0 rebounds per game, while Destynne Hives-McCray has turned in 10.9 and 8.4 per night. Hives-McCray shoots 52.1% from the field.

SMU returns just four letterwinners from its 2013-14 team that went 18-14 and advanced to the second round of the WNIT.

**LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN**

Auburn's women's basketball team got 38 points from its bench and held off a late Savannah State rally to pick up a 62-56 victory Wednesday night at Auburn Arena, the Tigers' 11th-straight home win.

The Tigers (7-2), who led by as much as 17 with less than seven minutes to play, saw that lead evaporate as Savannah State (4-4) began converting Auburn turnovers into points. A 14-1 SSU run cut the lead to as few as two points with 2:12 to play, but Auburn made five of six free throws down the stretch to preserve the victory and the home winning streak.

With their 11th straight home victory - final four games of last season, plus seven straight to open this year - the Tigers have matched the Auburn Arena record for consecutive home wins.

Auburn won 11 straight over the final two games of 2011-12 and the first nine home contests in 2012-13.

Hasina Muhammad led Auburn in scoring for the first time this season, netting a season-best 14 points on 6-of-9 shooting. The senior also tied for the team lead with six rebounds while picking up four assists, two blocks and a steal. Muhammad has had at least one block in eight of nine games this season.

**LAST TIME OUT FOR ST. JOHN'S**

The Red Storm shot a season-best 54.5 percent from the floor and saw eight different players score on Sunday afternoon, as St. John's improved to 9-0 with a 66-42 win at home over NJIT.

Aliyyah Handford scored a game-high 17 points on 8-of-11 shooting in a contest that saw no St. John's starter play more than 28 minutes. Danaejah Grant was the second of three Red Storm players in double figures with 14, while Jade Walker finished the game with 11 points.

Amber Thompson paced the Red Storm with seven rebounds in just 19 minutes of action. Sunday marked the first time this season that the senior forward, who ranked in the top-five nationally in rebounding coming into the game, recorded fewer than 10 boards in any contest this season.

The Red Storm received 20 points from its bench against the Highlanders, a season-high. Kyra Dunn led the St. John's reserves with seven points, while Imani Littleton added six and Tonoia Wade chipped in five. Selina Archer also added two points for St. John's.

**LAST TIME OUT FOR INDIANA STATE**

Indiana State won its ninth-straight road game and sixth-straight game overall as it defeated Saint Louis, 68-58, in Chaifetz Arena on Sunday afternoon. With the win, Indiana State improves to 8-1 on the season.

The Sycamores were paced by a career-high 16 points by senior guard Stephanie Wittman who went 7-for-9 from the floor and picked up a career-high five steals on the afternoon. A total of three Sycamores scored in double-figures in the win, with senior Racheal Mahan's 15 points and senior guard Chelsea Small adding 14 points.

Senior forward Jasmine Grier came off the bench to score all nine of her points in the second half while sophomore forward Rhagen Smith added six points.

**LAST TIME OUT FOR SMU**

Freshman twins Alicia and Keely Froling both recorded double-doubles, but the SMU women's basketball could not overcome

Alicia Froling scored 13 points and grabbed 15 boards, while her twin sister, Keely, contributed 12 points and 13 rebounds.

Both rebound totals were career-highs. Junior forward Destyne Hives-McCray led SMU with 15 points.

Texas A&M (10-0) climbed out to an early 14-5 lead in the first seven minutes of play, thanks to 10 quick points from junior guard Jordan Jones.

SMU (4-5) then clamped down defensively and fought their way back into the game. The Aggies shot just 32.4 percent and committed eight turnovers in the opening half. Guard Courtney Walker, who entered the game averaging a team-best 16.8 points per game, scored just three points on one-of-eight shooting in the half. Walker finished the game with nine points, shooting 25 percent from the field.

**ON DECEMBER 20**

This will be the 17th game for Auburn on Dec. 20. The Tigers are 13-3 all-time on this date with the last contest being a 2009 win over South Alabama in Mobile.

**ON DECEMBER 21**

Sunday will mark the 13th game for Auburn on Dec. 21. The Tigers are 9-3 on the date, including a 66-60 win over UCLA last season in a tournament in Minneapolis.

**HOME SWEET HOME**

Auburn has won 11 straight games at Auburn Arena, including the final two regular season games and two WNIT games in the 2013-14 season and the first six games of 2014-15. Dating back to a win over Alabama on Feb. 17, 2013, Auburn has won 23 of its last 29 home games, including a 17-1 mark against non-conference opponents.

The Tigers have matched the longest home win streak since Auburn Arena opened in 2010. Auburn previously won 11 straight over the last two games of 2011-12 and the first nine games of 2012-13.

Under Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, Auburn has a record of 22-1 in non-conference home games.

Auburn is 49-22 (.690) in its fifth season at Auburn Arena.

**IN AND OUT**

With Auburn's high-intensity defensive pressure, the Tigers must rotate multiple players to keep fresh legs on the floor at all time. As a result, 10 different players are averaging at least 10 minutes played per game, and no player is averaging 30 minutes or more.

Brandy Montgomery has played the most minutes, averaging 27.9, followed by Tra'Cee Tanner (24.3), Katie Frerking (23.7) and Khady Dieng (22.9).

**BIG NIGHT FOR TRA'CEE**

Junior Tra'Cee Tanner had a career-high 31 points in a 92-42 win over Grambling State on Nov. 17. It was the first time an Auburn player scored 30 or more points since Blanche Alverson had 32 against Mississippi State on March 3, 2013.

Tanner's performance was the 35th time in Auburn history that a player scored 30 or more points in a single game.

**BRANDY FROM DOWNTOWN**

Sophomore Brandy Montgomery scored a career-high 24 points against Virginia on Nov. 23, including six 3-pointers. It marked the most 3-pointers in a game by an Auburn player since Ruth Ketcham had six vs. Colgate on Dec. 5, 2007.

Montgomery needs just 18 more made 3-pointers to move into the all-time Auburn top 10.

**CLUB PRESS**

Auburn's high-pressure, full-court defense under coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, referred to by the players as "Club Press," has ranked as one of the best ever at Auburn over the last two seasons. In 2012-13, Auburn's 402 steals set a new school record for a single season while the 701 turnovers forced went down as second all-time on The Plains.

In 2013-14, the Tigers forced 659 opponent turnovers while recording 354 steals, remaining a major force on defense in the Southeastern Conference.

Auburn has forced 25 or more turnovers in a game 114 times since 1987 and has done so four times this season. Auburn forced 29 turnovers in the season-opener vs. Troy, 25 in the win over Grambling and 27 in wins over Marquette and Samford. The Tigers have also tallied 15 or more steals in a game on 105 occasions since 1987, doing so five times last season and four times already in 2014-15.

The Tigers used the defense to fuel their offense, averaging 19.3 points per game off turnovers last year. Auburn scored 29 points off turnovers in the season-opener vs. Troy, 34 against Grambling, 28 vs. Marquette and 27 vs. Samford.

### BACK-TO-BACK 19-WIN SEASONS

Auburn has posted back-to-back seasons with a 19-15 record, which tie for the most wins in a season since the Tigers' SEC Championship season of 2009. The Tigers advanced to the WNIT quarterfinals in 2013 and the WNIT third round in 2014.

### LOCKDOWN DEFENDER

Hasina Muhammad returns for her senior season as one of the top defensive players in the Southeastern Conference. A selection to the SEC All-Defensive Team in 2014, Muhammad ranked second in the SEC in steals (2.4/game) and fourth in the league in blocks (2.1/game). She also ranked in the top 50 nationally in both categories in 2014.

### TOUGH SCHEDULE

The Tigers will play a challenging schedule this season, playing as many as seven non-conference games against teams that advanced to the postseason a year ago. Florida Gulf Coast, Winthrop, St. John's and Hampton all played in the NCAA Tournament last year, while SMU, Marquette and Bowling Green advanced to the WNIT.

Auburn's first five SEC opponents - South Carolina, Florida, Kentucky, Georgia, and Tennessee - all advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season. Texas A&M, LSU and Vanderbilt all made the Big Dance, while Mississippi State and Missouri joined Auburn in the WNIT.

### SISTER ACT

For just the fourth time ever, Auburn's roster features a sister combination as twin freshmen Jazmine and Jessica Jones will be in uniform for the Tigers. It gives Auburn a pair of sisters on the roster for the third-straight year as Tyrese and Tra'Cee Tanner played together the last two seasons.

Other sister combinations to play together at Auburn include Tyrese (2010-14) and Tra'Cee Tanner (2012-present); Sherell (2004-09) and Reneisha (2006-10) Hobbs, and Ruthie (1985-89) and Mae Ola (1984-88) Bolton.

### NEW FACES

AUBURN, Ala. - Junior Tra'Cee Tanner had her fourth career double-double, and the Auburn women's basketball team used a huge run around halftime to earn a season-opening 71-54 win over Troy on Friday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (1-0) kept up their trademark defensive pressure throughout the game, forcing 29 turnovers while amassing 22 steals on the night, falling just two swipes shy of a school record.

Tanner led the way both shooting and on the boards, scoring 16 points and pulling down 10 rebounds to earn her first double-double since posting 14 points and 10 boards at Tennessee last season.

Auburn controlled the boards on the night, out-rebounding Troy 51-41. The Tigers also had 21 assists to Troy's 10 and shot 43.5 percent while holding the Trojans to a 26.6-percent night.

Four Auburn players hit double-figures on the night. Along with Tanner's 16, sophomore Khady Dieng contributed 13 points while sophomore Katie Frerking and senior Hasina Muhammad had 10 apiece.

Frerking narrowly missed a double-double of her own, pulling down a career-high nine rebounds. She also had a career-best five steals along with two assists and a block.

Auburn led for more than 37 minutes on the night, but the big run came just before and just after halftime. The Tigers outscored the Trojans 16-0 over the final 2:24 of the first half and the first 1:32 of the second stanza, opening up an 18-point lead. Troy would get no closer than 14 points the rest of the way.
