- Najat Ouardad currently ranks 11th in the country in assists with 6.8 per game and 31st in steals with 3.0 per game
- Auburn def. #23 Arkansas, 50-47, in the SEC opener its first win over a ranked opponent in two years
- Hasina Muhammad (16.5 ppg) & Frankie Sullivan (16.9 ppg) are the highest scoring M&W combo in the SEC
- Muhammad is the only player in the SEC this season to score in double figures in every game and has scored in double figures in 22 straight games - a streak that is eighth in the nation
- The Tigers have forced more opponent turnovers (434) than field goals allowed (421)
- Five Tigers (Peyton Davis, Hasina Muhammad, Blanche Alverson, Tra'cee Tanner and Najat Ouardad) have doubledoubles this season: the first time for 5 different Tigers to do so since the 2006-07 season
- Muhammad and Ouardad each have SEC highs of nine steals in games this season
- Auburn leads the all-time series with LSU, 29-17, and leads, 13-7, when playing in Auburn
- LSU won the last meeting, 57-41, on Feb. 19, 2012 in Baton Rouge
- Auburn won the last meeting in Auburn Arena, 65-53, on Jan. 16, 2011
- The Tigers are 194-173 all-time in the Southeastern Conference
- Auburn is coming off a 61-51 loss at Alabama last Thursday; LSU is coming off a 73-60 loss at #4 Kentucky
- This is the 2nd meeting between Terri Williams-Flournoy and LSU's Nikki Caldwell with Caldwell winning the 1st meeting
- Auburn is 7-2 all-time when playing on Jan. 31 and 191-109 when playing in the month of January
- Auburn is 53-24 all-time when playing teams from Louisiana
- · Auburn has forced more than 20 turnovers in 15 of 20 games this season, more than 25 in six
- The Tigers average 22.0 points off turnovers per game
- Hasing Muhammad and Tyrese Tanner have been named SEC Player of the Week this season
- Auburn great Vickie Orr has been named of the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2013
- Senior Julie King graduated from Auburn on Dec. 8
- Auburn won its 800th game last season, becoming the 14th NCAA program to do so
- One of Auburn's newcomers is senior Julie King, a four-year letterwinner on the Auburn soccer team
- For the third time ever, Auburn's roster features a set of sisters in Tyrese and Tra'cee Tanner

- Senior Blanche Alverson was named Auburn's Miss Homecoming Nov. 3

- Auburn was picked to finish 10th in the SEC by both the media and league's coaches

#### **AUBURN'S POST-GAME PROCEDURE**

The Auburn locker room is closed. Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy and selected Tiger players will be brought to the interview room after the 10-minute "cooling off" period.

#### **QUICK HITS**

Auburn is in its 42nd season of women's basketball and sports an all-time record of 824-385... AU has made 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, three WNIT appearances and three Final Fours in the program's history... Head Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is in her first season at Auburn... She has a 156-111 record as a head coach... The Tigers are coming off a 13-17 season in 2012.

#### **800 AND COUNTING**

Auburn picked up its 800th program victory last season, becoming the 14th team in NCAA history to reach the 800-win plateau.

#### WINNING 150

Auburn head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy picked up the 150th win of her head coaching career on Dec. 12 as she led the Tigers to a 69-59 win at George Washington. The win was also significant as it was in Washington, D.C., where she spent her first eight years as a head coach at Georgetown.

Williams-Flournoy also hit a coaching milestone last on Dec. 9 against Hofstra as the win was the 400th of her career as either an assistant or head coach. Following the win she had 251 wins as an assistant and 149 as a head coach.

#### **DEADLY DUO**

Frankie Sullivan of the Auburn men's basketball team currently leads the team and is third in the SEC with 16.9 points per game while Hasina Muhammad leads the women's team and ranks fourth in the SEC with 16.5 points per game. Together, the pair is the highest scoring men's and women's combination in the SEC this season with 33.4 points per game.

#### **ALL-AROUND STAR**

Senior Blanche Alverson has been a super-star both on and off the court in her Auburn career. Off the court, she carries a 3.6 GPA as a biomedical sciences major, she was named Auburn's 2012 Miss Homecoming and she started her own community service program, Ballin' 4 Books.

On the court, she joined select company on Jan. 20 at Kentucky as she pulled down her 500th career rebound against the Wildcats. By reaching that plateau, she became just the fourth Auburn player ever to tally 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 100 assists, 100 steals and 50 blocks. Entering Thursday's game vs. LSU, she now has 1,052 points, 510 rebounds, 150 assists, 105 steals and 62 blocks. The only other players to accomplish the feat are DeWanna Bonner (2005-09), Brenda Hill (1982-85) and Lori Monroe (1979-83).

#### **AUBURN-LSU SERIES**

This will be the 47th meeting between Auburn and LSU with AU leading, 29-17. Auburn has a 13-7 advantage when playing in Auburn.

LSU comes to Auburn at 12-8 (3-4 SEC). The Lady Tigers are coached by Nikki Caldwell and feature a lineup of four double-figure scorers, led by junior Theresa Plaisance who leads the league in scoring with 18.3 points per game (17.7 in conference play) and also adds 8.0 rebounds per game. Shooting guards Adrienne Webb and Danielle Ballard add 13.6 and 13.1 ppg, respectively, while Bianca Lutley rounds out the group at 10.6 ppg.

It's been a roller coaster season for LSU with both unexpected losses and quality wins. The Lady Tigers fell to Hampton on the road in just their second game of the season, but bounced back two games later to defeat then-No.12/14 West Virginia. In conference play, LSU is undefeated at 3-0 at home, but 0-4 on the road.

Auburn and LSU have two common non-conference opponents in North Carolina State and Tulane. LSU defeated the Wolfpack, 81-73, but fell to Tulane, 66-64, in overtime, while Auburn was defeated by North Carolina State, 85-71, but beat Tulane, 70-65.

#### **SCOUTING AUBURN**

The Auburn women's basketball team, under direction of firstyear head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, returns seven letterwinners and four starters from last season's team that went 13-17 (5-11 SEC). Williams-Flournoy comes to Auburn after eight seasons as head coach at Georgetown where she put together a 143-104 record that included four postseason appearances and three straight trips to the NCAA Tournament, including a Sweet 16 appearance in

Auburn is 13-7 and averaging a 21.5-point margin of victory in the 13 wins. Three Tigers are averaging double figures, led by Hasina Muhammad with 16.5 per game, including six 20-point games, and 5.6 rebounds. Tyrese Tanner is at 12.5 points and 4.0 rebounds per game while Blanche Alverson comes in with 11.8 points and 5.7 boards per game.

Center Peyton Davis leads the team in the post, averaging 6.8 points and a team-high 5.8 rebounds per game. Najat Ouardad is tops in the SEC and 11th in the country in assists with 6.8 per game while scoring 5.1 points per game.

#### LAST TIME VS. LSU (Feb. 19, 2012)

An LSU run midway through the second half proved to be the deciding factor as the Auburn women's basketball team fell to the Lady Tigers, 57-41, Feb. 19, 2012, at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center in Baton Rouge, La.

Auburn struggled from the field in the game, shooting just 30.9 percent and 16.7 percent from 3-point range. The Tigers were kept in check by LSU's long zone defense.

Freshman Hasina Muhammad led Auburn, coming off the bench for 12 points, four rebounds and a pair of steals. Senior Chantel Hilliard also came off the bench and added nine points and three steals.

LaSondra Barrett notched a double-double for LSU with 13 points and 10 rebounds. Jeanne Kenney also finished in double figures with 11 points. LSU shot 54.1 percent from the field, including 50.0 percent (5-of-10) from 3-point range.

Najat Ouardad scored her seventh point of the game to start the second half, cutting the LSU lead to five. The Tigers were down six, 37-31, with 12:50 to play when LSU went on its second run. Auburn was held scoreless for a little over six minutes as LSU went on a 9-0 run, extending the lead to 15 with 6:27 left to play.

Auburn would never recover from the run, getting no closer than 13. as LSU held on for the 57-41 win.

#### LAST TIME VS. LSU IN AUBURN (Jan. 16, 2011)

Jordan Greenleaf scored a team-high 12 points with nine rebounds as the Auburn women's basketball team notched a 65-53 win over LSU, Jan. 16, 2011, at Auburn Arena.

Greenleaf led a group of three Auburn players to score in double digits, followed by sophomore Morgan Toles and senior Alli Smalley scoring 11 and 10, respectively. Auburn led LSU by as many as 22 points with just under three minutes remaining.

The Tigers used their defense to pressure the Bayou Bengals, tallying 10 steals and five blocked shots while forcing 20 LSU turnovers. Auburn turned the turnovers into 11 points on the other end of the floor.

Auburn led by as many as 22 points in the second half, prompting Nell Fortner to pull her starters with a 60-40 lead and 3:37 left in the game. The lineup of freshmen Peyton Davis, Camille Glymph, Courtney Strain and Jassany Williams, along with sophomore Pascale West, closed out the game for the Tigers. All 13 Tigers saw action in the game with 10 scoring points.

Auburn shot 45.0 percent from the field and 25.0 percent from 3-point range, knocking down 2-of-8 attempts. The Tigers held LSU to just 36.5 percent shooting on the day, including a 23.1 percent mark from beyond the arc.

#### WILLIAMS-FLOURNOY VS. CALDWELL

This will be the second meeting between Auburn's Terri Williams-Flournoy and LSU's Nikki Caldwell with Caldwell holding the 1-0 advantage. The previous meeting came last season, with Williams-Flournoy at Georgetown. LSU defeated the Hoyas, 51-40.

Williams-Flournoy is in her first year at Auburn and has a 13-7 record this season for a 156-111 career record. Caldwell is in her second season at LSU and has a 35-19 record with the Tigers. She is 107-45 on her career.

#### LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN

The Auburn women's basketball team struggled to find its shot Jan. 23 as it fell to Alabama, 61-51, at Foster Auditorium in Tuscaloosa.

Hasina Muhammad led Auburn with 13 points while Peyton Davis earned her second career double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds. Najat Ouardad finished with nine rebounds and four assists.

The 3-point line would be the story of the game as the Tigers once again had trouble defending from beyond the arc. Alabama went 9-of-27 from 3-point range, including seven treys from the Crimson Tide's leading scorer, Shafontaye Myers, who finished with 23 points.

Auburn led the majority of the first half before Alabama went on a 20-6 run to take a 30-20 lead into the locker room. The Tigers couldn't recover from there and never regained the lead in the second half, only coming as close as 32-31 on a jumper from Muhammad with 13:09 to play.

The Crimson Tide led on the boards and in the turnover battle as Auburn was out-rebounded, 51-48, and committed 20 turnovers to Alabama's 18. Alabama also had 13 assists, while the Tigers finished with just five.

#### LAST TIME OUT FOR LSU

Fourth-ranked Kentucky made all the plays down the stretch and converted its free throws in the final two minutes as the Wildcats handed the LSU women's basketball team its fifth-straight road loss by a score of 73-60 on Jan. 27 in Memorial Coliseum in Lexington.

The Lady Tigers were out-scored 27-6 on bench points and couldn't make a crucial shot or get stop in the final minutes after cutting the deficit to two possessions with 1:57 to play.

LSU's Theresa Plaisance led all scorers with a game-high 19 points, marking her 19th-consecutive double-figure scoring game. Adrienne Webb fired in 18 points, while Danielle Ballard matched a career-high with 10 rebounds.

The Lady Tigers did a good job weathering Kentucky's press early and trailing only 31-26 at the break. After struggling with a 39.4 percent effort from the floor in the first 20 minutes, Kentucky started making its shots. The Wildcats connected for a blistering 50 percent in the second stanza.

The Lady Tigers were within striking distance at 64-60 with 1:57 left in the game, but were unable to get a stop after that. Walker crashed the boards for a tip-in and was later called for a technical foul, but Webb missed both free shots. The Lady Tigers trailed 67-60 in the final minute and Kentucky sealed the game at the free throw line.

#### **ALL EVEN**

The Jan. 10 win over Ole Miss was Auburn's 13th of the season, tying last season's win total. The Tigers finished the 2011-12 season with a 13-17 record.

#### ON THIS DATE...

Auburn is 7-2 when playing on Jan. 31. The Tigers' last game on Jan. 31 came in 2010 with a 67-53 win at Georgia.

#### **IN JANUARY**

Auburn is 191-109 all-time in the month of January (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that season). Head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is 2-5 at Auburn in January.

#### **AGAINST THE PELICAN STATE**

Auburn holds a 53-24 record against teams from the state of Louisiana. Records against Louisiana teams: Grambling State (1-0), Louisiana-Lafayette (1-0), Louisiana-Monroe (0-1), Louisiana State (29-17), Louisiana Tech (2-5), New Orleans (9-0), Nicholls State (1-0), Northwestern State (2-0), Southeastern Louisiana (1-0), Southern (4-0) and Tulane (3-1).

#### 20 AND 10

Auburn's defense has continued to be a bright spot as the team enters SEC play. The Tigers have forced 20 or more turnovers in 10 of the last 13 games while also tallying 10 or more steals in 11 of the last 13.

#### LSU CONNECTION

Auburn fans will see a familiar face on the LSU bench as former Auburn women's basketball player Ruth Ketcham makes an appearance at Auburn Arena. Ketcham, who played at Auburn during the 2007-08 season before finishing her career at Samford, is currently a graduate assistant with LSU.

#### **ALL ALONE**

Sophomore Hasina Muhammad has scored in double figures in all 20 games this season and is the only player in the SEC to score in double figures in every game. Going back to last season, Muhammad has scored in double figures in 22 straight games.

The streak is also the eighth-longest active streak in the nation. Here are the too eight:

#### **20-20 VISION**

Against Ole Miss, Auburn's Hasina Muhammad scored 22 points while Blanche Alverson added 23. It marked the third time this season for two Tigers to score 20 points in a game.

Muhammad (24) and Tyrese Tanner (20) both scored in the 20s at Missouri while Muhammad and Alverson each scored 21 at Tulane.

Prior to that game, two Auburn players had scored 20 or more points in the same game just once in the previous 116 games. Since, it has happened three times in 14 games.

#### **CAREER VS. LSU**

Seven current Tigers have played against LSU at least once in their career. Sophomore Hasina Muhammad has the best stat line against the Bayou Bengals, scoring 12 points with four rebounds and two steals at LSU last season. Senior Najat Ouardad scored seven points with two steals last year. Blanche Alverson averages 5.8 points and 4.8 rebounds per game against LSU in five meetings while Tyrese Tanner has 4.7 points and 3.0 rebounds per game in three meetings.

#### IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

In the Jan. 28 NCAA statistical rankings, Auburn is ranked in the top 100 in 10 categories and the top 35 in six. Top 35 rankings for Auburn are: FG Percentage (24th, .439), Assists Per Game (17th, 16.5), Blocks Per Game (26th, 5.1), Steals Per Game (19th, 12.3), Assist-Turnover Ratio (42nd, 0.99) and Turnover Margin (27th, 4.95).

Individually, Najat Ouardad is 11th in assists (6.8) and 31st in steals (3.0).

#### **DOUBLE DOWN**

Five different Tigers have pulled down six double-doubles this season. Peyton Davis had the first with 13 points and 12 rebounds against Hofstra. Hasina Muhammad followed up with 21 points and 10 rebounds against George Washington.

Blanche Alverson picked up her first of the season, second of her career, with 11 points and 10 rebounds against UTC. Freshman Tra'cee Tanner tallied one with 21 points and 12 rebounds against Jacksonville. She was the first freshman since DeWanna Bonner on March 2, 2006 to notch a double-double.

Najat Ouardad tallied one with 14 points and 11 assists against Samford. Davis has the most recent with 12 points and 11 boards at Alabama.

With five Tigers pulling down double-doubles, it marks the first time since the 2006-07 season for Auburn to have five different players do so.

#### **GETTING AWAY WITH THEFT**

Hasina Muhammad and Najat Ouardad have both tallied nine steals in a game this season. Muhammad stole nine at George Washington while Ouardad got hers against Samford.

The mark ties for fourth all-time at Auburn in single-game steals and is the most in the SEC this season. The nine steals are also tied for 10th in the nation in single-game steals.

When Muhammad reached the mark, it was the most steals in a game for an Auburn player in 20 years.

#### **GOING TO THE BOARD**

Junior Peyton Davis pulled down a career-high 17 rebounds against Arkansas on Jan. 3. The 17 boards are the most for an Auburn player since KeKe Carrier pulled down 19 against Valparaiso on Dec. 28, 2010. Davis' 17 rebounds are also tied for 27th all-time at Auburn in single-game rebounds.

#### SISTER-SISTER

Auburn's Tanner sisters made a good combination on Dec. 22 in the Tigers' win over Jacksonville. Tyrese and Tra'cee Tanner combined to score 37 points with 15 rebounds and four steals. It was the best combined effort for the sisters this season.

For the season, Tyrese and Tra'cee are combining for 19.8 points and 7.8 rebounds per game.

#### 1,000-POINT CLUB

With her second 3-pointer against Ole Miss, Auburn senior Blanche Alverson became the 27th Tiger all-time to score 1,000 career points. She currently ranks 25th all-time at Auburn in career scoring with 1,052 points.

#### THE GRADUATE

Senior guard Julie King took a big step Dec. 8 as she earned her degree in Interdisciplinary Studies from Auburn. The fifth-year player spent her first four years at Auburn on the soccer team and is currently using her final year of eligibility with the women's basketball team.

#### **Quoting Coach Flo**

On LSU...

"LSU plays four guards, and at any time, one of those guards can start the break. They don't really have to get a rebound, throw it out to the point guard, and let's run the offense.

All four guards can bring the ball down the floor. Theresa Plaisance, she will step out to the 3-point line and they can run a five-out. They can do four guards and one post; the post, which is her [Plaisance], she usually is at the high post. She's not really on the block all the time."

On facing a good matchup zone...

"It's definitely very confusing for your point guard right away. They look at it as someone picking them up as soon as they come down the floor, and you are ready to call a man play. When you look ahead, there are four people standing in a zone set. It becomes very challenging for your point guard, but your kids have got to understand that it is a 2-3 match-up. You have got to make hard cuts so that you can see, 'Okay, are they really in man?' If they are in man, you are going to make that hard cut, and they are going to go with you. If you make that hard cut and they only slide you off a little bit or send you off to the next defender, then you have to realize at that point it's a 2-3 match-up."

On LSU head coach Nikki Caldwell..

"I see a little bit of Pat Summit as far as they play hard. They play extremely hard. I think she is mixing her own feel a little bit with her 2-3 match-up defense that she plays."

- Overall, SEC squads have filled 34 of the 124 Final Four berths, including having two Final Four teams in 1988 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1989 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1995 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1996 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1998 (Arkansas, Tennessee), 2004 (LSU, Tennessee), 2005 (LSU, Tennessee), 2007 (LSU, Tennessee) and 2008 (LSU, Tennessee).
- SEC teams have made 18 appearances in a nation-high 16 NCAA Championship games, winning eight NCAA Championships (Tennessee: 1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).
- The league also had the distinction of providing both national finalists twice in its history in 1996 (Tennessee 83, Georgia 65) and in 1989 (Tennessee 76, Auburn 60).
  - SEC teams have won 347 NCAA Tournament games against 180 losses (.658) for an average of 11.2 NCAA wins per year.
- In addition, all 14 current members have appeared in the NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC has paced the pack in NCAA tournament bids 22 times in its 31-year history.
- The SEC was the first league to ever have eight teams invited to the NCAA
   Tournament, doing so in 1999, 2002 and 2012.
- The SEC was also the first league to ever have seven teams invited to the NCAA Tournament and earned this honor a leading seven times (1986, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2004).
- The SEC is one of a handful of leagues to have won three national tournament titles with eight NCAA, two WNIT and three NWIT. Along with the eight NCAA championships won by Tennessee, Arkansas (1999) and Auburn (2003) captured the current Women's NIT titles. But the first-ever SEC national title belongs to Georgia, winners of the 1981 NWIT which predates the current NCAA tournament. LSU (1985) and Kentucky (1990) also won NWIT titles. Both Arkansas (1987) and South Carolina (1979) won the WNIT as members of their previous conferences.
- In 2003, Auburn won the WNIT title with wins over South Alabama, Florida State, Richmond, Creighton and Baylor. In 1999, the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks defeated Wisconsin 76-64 to claim the SEC's first WNIT championship.
- In 1981, Georgia defeated Pittsburg, California and Arizona State (in OT) to capture the NWIT Championship, the firstever national championship of any kind for the SEC in women's basketball.

#### **FORCING 25**

Since 1987, Auburn has forced 25 or more turnovers in a game 99 times, including six times this season. In those 99 games, the Tigers have a 96-3 record.

#### **CLIMBING THE RANKINGS**

Blanche Alverson is climbing her way up the Auburn scoring and rebounding lists. She is currently 25th all-time at Auburn in scoring with 1,052 points. She is also 23rd all-time on The Plains in career rebounding with 510.

#### **TURN IT OVER**

A pillar of Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy's style of play is a high-pressure defense that extends most of the floor. The Tigers have foreced 20 or more turnovers in 15 of their 20 games this season. Auburn has forced 25 or more in six games with a season -high 28 against Hofstra. In all, Auburn has scored 440 points off turnovers in its 20 games, averaging 22.0 points off turnovers per game.

Auburn has tallied 10 or more steals in 14 games this season, including a season-high 22 against Samford. The 22 steals were the most in a game in more than four years for the Tigers.

#### **JET POWERED**

Najat Ouardad is making her own waves this season. The 5-1 senior tallied 11 assists vs. Samford, but topped the feat against Ole Miss with 14 assists. Her 14 assits are the most in the SEC this season and are tied for second in the nation this year. They are the most for an Auburn player since 1988 and are tied for fifth all-time at AU in single-game steals. The 11 assists are tied for 19th all-time at Auburn.

She also now has 216 career assists, a mark that ranks 10th among active SEC players and 19th all-time at Auburn.

#### IT'S RAINING 3s

Blanche Alverson is climbing her way up the Auburn career 3-point list. She is currently tied for second with 184. Alverson is 35 3-pointers behind Auburn record holder, and former teammate, Alli Smalley (219).

#### **OFF THE BENCH**

Auburn has had great bench support this season with at least one player coming off the bench to score in double figures in 11 of the 20 games. The Tigers' bench so far has scored 346 points on the season, averaging 17.3 per game.

#### O-BOARDS

Auburn has missed 699 shots this season with 297 (42.5 percent) resulting in offensive rebounds. That has led to 313 second-chance points on the season, averaging 15.7 per game.

#### **KEEPING SCORE**

Against Ole Miss, Auburn forced 20 turnovers while the Rebels made just 19 field goals. It marked the 12th time this season that an Auburn opponent has committed more turnovers than made

field goals.

On the season, Auburn opponents have hit 421 field goals compared to 434 turnovers. The Tigers have committed just 335 turnovers for a  $\pm$  99 margin on the season.

#### **HOME SWEET HOME**

Auburn has made itself at home this season, winning nine of its 10 games at Auburn Arena. The Tigers had a 16-13 record in Auburn Arena entering the season, but have improved to 25-14 since

#### **QUEEN BLANCHE**

Senior Blanche Alverson, no stranger to awards on the court, added another piece of hardware to her collection on Nov. 3 as she was named Auburn's Miss Homecoming. After a week of campaigning, she found out the result of the vote at halftime of Auburn's Homecoming Football Game against New Mexico State. She is the first Tiger student-athlete to earn the honor.

#### **COMEBACK KIDS**

At Tulane on Nov. 28, Auburn came from 16 points down at halftime to pull off the 70-65 win. It is the biggest comeback for the Tigers since coming back from 18 points down at Vanderbilt on Feb. 19, 2009, closing the gap to just a point in the final minute of the game only to lose 73-70. It was the first time for the Tigers to come back from a double-digit deficit since overcoming a 10-point deficit at Liberty on Dec. 7, 2008 to take away a 64-53 win

#### MUHAMMAD NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After averaging 18.5 points, 8.0 rebounds, 7.0 steals and 2.5 blocks per game in Auburn's games against GW and Temple, sophomore guard Hasina Muhammad was named the SEC Player of the Week for the first time in her career on Dec. 17.

At GW, Muhammad tied her career high with 21 points, including 14 in the second half, leading Auburn to a 69-59 win over the Colonials. She earned her first career double-double with a career-high 10 rebounds and nearly had a triple-double as she tallied nine steals. Her nine steals are the most for a player in the SEC this season and rank fourth all-time at Auburn in single-game steals

She came right back against Temple on Sunday with 16 points, six rebounds, six assists, five steals and three blocks. Her six assists were a new career high while her three blocked shots tied her career high.

#### TYRESE TANNER NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Auburn junior Tyrese Tanner was named the SEC's Player of the Week on Nov. 12, the first player to earn the honor this season. She averaged 20.5 points, including a career-high 26 points, at the Sheraton Raleigh Wolfpack Invitational, Nov. 9-10.

Her 26 points were the most scored in the SEC to that point in the season. She is the first Tiger to earn the SEC's weekly honor since Blanche Alverson did on Jan. 13, 2011.

#### **JACKSON NAMED SEC GREAT**

Former Auburn great Becky Jackson was announced Jan. 10 as a member of the SEC 2013 Class of Women's Legends. The class will be recognized during the 2013 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament in Duluth, Ga. Jackson, a native of Franklin, La., played basketball at Auburn from 1980-84.

A four-time All-SEC performer, Becky Jackson finished her career as Auburn's all-time leading scorer and rebounder with 2,068 points and 1,118 rebounds. The Kodak All-American scored 38 points in a game, matching the second-highest mark in school history. She was named an AlAW All-State performer as a freshman and was also named to the Alabama State All-Tournament Team. In 1981 and 1983, Jackson was named to the American Women's Sports Foundation All-American team and was named MVP of the SEC Tournament in 1981.

Her career totals are still among the best all-time at Auburn as she ranks second in career scoring, behind DeWanna Bonner, ranks ninth in career blocks and still holds the Auburn career rebounding record.

Jackson will also be recognized in Auburn on Feb. 17 at halftime of the Tigers' game against Alabama. Her jersey will be retired that afternoon with her joining the ranks of Ruthie Bolton, Carolyn Jones and Vickie Orr.

#### **ORR NAMED TO ALABAMA SPORTS HALL OF FAME**

Auburn great Vickie Orr is one of eight individuals that make up the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2013. The banquet will be held May 18, 2013 in Birmingham.

One of Auburn's greatest women's basketball players, Orr was a Kodak All-American three consecutive years in 1987, 1988 and 1989. The 1988 SEC Player of Year, Orr is second all-time at Auburn scoring with 2,035 points and is one of only two Tiger players to score more than 2,000 points and have 1,000 rebounds.

Orr helped led the Tigers to two straight NCAA Championship games and was the MVP of the NCAA Mid-East Regional and All-Final Four team in 1989. Internationally, Orr was a member of the 1990 U.S.A. Team that won a Gold Medal in the World Championships and a member of the 1990 Goodwill team that won the Gold Medal. She was also a member of the 1992 U.S. Olympic Team that won a Bronze Medal. She went on to play professionally in Italy from 1990-92.

#### FIRST TIMERS

The season-opening game saw some firsts for Auburn players. Junior Peyton Davis earned the first start of her career while senior Julie King and freshmen Cabriana Capers, Chadarryl Clay, Cedricka Sweeting and Tra'cee Tanner made their first collegiate basketball appearance.

#### KICKING UP SOMETHING NEW

One of Auburn's five newcomers is former soccer player Julie King. A native of St. Louis, King started for four years for the Tigers' soccer team, helping the team to the NCAA Tournament in each season. As a co-captain last year, she led Auburn to an SEC Tournament Championship and was named SEC Co-Defensive

Player of the Year.

King was an All-State basketball selection while playing prep ball at Nerinx Hall in St. Louis, Mo.

#### SISTER ACT

For just the third time ever, Auburn's roster featured a sister combination as Tyrese and Tra'cee Tanner step on the court. Tyrese is a junior on the squad this year while Tra'cee is a freshman.

Other sister combinations to play together at Auburn include Sherell (2004-09) and Reneisha (2006-10) Hobbs, and Ruthie (1985-89) and Mae Ola (1984-88) Bolton.

#### TANNER NAMED TO OMNI CLASSIC TEAM

Auburn junior Tyrese Tanner was named to the Omni Hotels Classic All-Tournament Team on Nov. 24 for her play in the two games. For the tournament, she averaged 14.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 1.5 blocks per game. She scored 17 with three steals against San Diego State and returned for 11 points, three blocks and two steals against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.

#### TANNER AND MUHAMMAD EARN WOLFPACK HONORS

Auburn's Tyrese Tanner and Hasina Muhammad were selected to the Sheraton Raleigh Wolfpack Invitational All-Tournament Team to start the season. Tanner averaged 20.5 points, including a career-high 26 against North Carolina State. She also tallied 8.5 rebounds and 2.0 steals per game. Muhammad averaged 16.0 points per game, tying her then-career high with 20 points in the season-opener against Maine.

#### **TIGERS DOWN UNDER**

Auburn unofficially started its season in August as the Tigers traveled to Australia for a 10-day, four-game tour. Auburn opened with an 86-54 loss to the WNBL's Logan Thunder, but rebounded for an 81-71 win over the Cairns Dolphins. The Tigers continued on to Sydney where it tallied a 67-58 over the WNBL's Sydney Flames. The Tigers rounded out the trip with an 84-46 trouncing of the Sutherland Sharks.

Over the four-game tour, Hasina Muhammad was the top Tiger with 23.3 points per game. Blanche Alverson averaged 17.5 points while freshman Chadarryl Clay tallied 10.5. Fellow freshman Tra'cee Tanner scored 9.0 per game, followed by Peyton Davis with 6.5. Cabriana Capers with 2.8 and Pascale West with 2.0.

#### **BALLIN' FOR BOOKS**

Senior Blanche Alverson, always active in the community, started her own community service initiative last season called Ballin' For Books. The program encouraged Auburn fans to donate books during Auburn home games late in the season.

More than 1,100 books were collected as part of the program and were donated to the Loachapoka Library, Pine Hills Literacy Project, Boys and Girls Club, and Atlanta inner-city schools.

#### **NEW FACES**

The Tigers welcome five new faces for the 2012-13 season, including one senior and four freshmen. The senior is Julie King (Nerinx Hall / St. Louis, Mo.), who joins the team after four years on the Auburn soccer team. The four freshmen are: Cabriana Capers (Bolingbrook / Bolingbrook, III.), Chadarryl Clay (Girls Preparatory School / Chattanooga, Tenn.), Cedricka Sweeting (South Broward

(Fla.), Nassau, Bahamas), and Tra'cee Tanner (Hoover / Birmingham, Ala.).

#### **AUBURN SIGNS SIX FOR 2013-14**

The Auburn women's basketball team signed six players to National Letters of Intent during the early signing period for the class of 2013. Keonna Famer, a 6-1 wing from Birmingham, Ala., Katie Frerking, a 6-1 guard from Johns Creek, Ga., Brandy Montgomery, a 5-10 guard from Port St. Lucie, Fla., Shae Nelson, a 6-1 post from Cordova, Tenn., Allina Starr, a 5-10 point guard from Minneapolis, Minn., and Meagan Tucker, a 5-8 guard from Covington, Ga., will join the Tigers for the 2013-14 season, head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy announced Nov. 16.

#### ON THE TUBE

AUBURN - The Auburn women's basketball team picked up a win after an 11-day layoff, as it defeated Hofstra, 68-58, Dec. 9 in Auburn.

Auburn had four players score in double figures, led by Peyton Davis and Tyrese Tanner, each with 13. Hasina Muhammad added 12, and Blanche Alverson tallied 11.
