Scouting the Commodores

No. 25/24 Vanderbilt will look to win its second-straight game on Thursday, when they play host to Auburn. In their two SEC games, the Commodores have been led by Tiffany Clarke. The junior forward is averaging 16.0 points and 8.5 rebounds through the two league contests and has scored at least 13 points in eight of the last nine SEC games. She recorded her 10th career double-double in the Commodores' last outing against Ole Miss, scoring 19 points and grabbing 10 rebounds. Overall, Vanderbilt has been led by a pair of sophomore guards - Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister. Foggie leads the team with 16.7 ppg, while Lister adds 12.7 ppg and 5.7 assists per contest. Redshirt sophomore Stephanie Holzer is the other major contributor. The center is posting 11.6 points and 7.0 rebounds per contest.

Scouting the Tigers

Auburn comes to West End with a record of 9-7, 1-2 in SEC play under Head Coach Nell Fortner. The Tigers are led by Hasina Muhammad and Tyrese Tanner, who are posting 10.8 and 10.3 points per game, respectively. Parrisha Simmons is the top rebounder at 5.8 per contests, while Morgan Jennings runs the point and is dishing out 3.7 assists per game. Auburn's lone SEC win came in their only road game, a 65-55 win at Alabama sandwiched between home losses to Tennessee (73-52) and Georgia (70-45). In the most recent outing versus Georgia, Muhammad led the way with 15 points, while Blanche Alverson contributed 13 points. The Tigers were outscored in the paint by the Lady Bulldogs, 44-14.

Vanderbilt vs. Auburn - The Series

This will be the 41st meeting in the series between Vanderbilt and Auburn, with the Commodores holding a 24-16 edge in the series. The first meeting was the final game of Vanderbilt's inaugural season, with the Tigers taking an 88-69 win in Starkeville, Miss. The teams have met every year since 1983. Vanderbilt has taken the last 17 straight contests in the series, including all 14 meetings since Melanie Balcomb took over the program. Last year, the Commodores took a 67-59 win at Memorial Gym. Vandy was led by 22 points from Hannah Tuomi and 16 from Jence Rhoads, with the top returner from the contest being Stephanie Holzer (nine points, eight rebounds). Blanche Alverson led the Tigers with 12 points.

Last Time Out

The No. 24/21 Vanderbilt women's basketball team secured a 68-52 win over Ole Miss in its SEC home opener, improving to 13-2 on the season, 1-1 in league action. The Rebels fell to 10-6, 0-3 in the conference. Junior Tiffany Clarke led the way for Vanderbilt, recording her tenth-career double-double. The forward recorded 19 points and 10 rebounds and has scored at least 13 points in eight of the last nine SEC contests. Also in double-figures for the Commodores were Jasmine Lister (15 points) and Christina Foggie (11 points). Lister added six assists. Elan Brown chipped in seven points and eight rebounds. Ole Miss was led by a double-double effort from Nikki Byrd. The Rebel forward scored 15 points while adding 13 rebounds, including seven offensive boards that helped Ole Miss outscore Vandy, 17-11, in second-chance points. Valencia McFarland added 10 points, five rebounds and four assists. Early on, it looked like the script from South Carolina may be repeating itself. The Commodores committed 14 turnovers in the first half and had a scoreless drought of 6:45 that saw a 17-8 lead turn into a 17-19 deficit. Vanderbilt ended that run when freshman Kady Schrann stole it from McFarland and Clarke converted at the other end to tie the game at 19-19. The Commodores would not trail again. Foul trouble contributed to Ole Miss' inability to keep pace. Byrd picked up her fourth foul with 12:56 left and went to the bench. She sat for 1:49 and Vanderbilt went on a 7-0 run to open up a 43-33 lead. Byrd re-entered the game at the 11:07 mark and never fouled-out, but the Rebels were never able to get back within 10 points. Vanderbilt has now won 17 of the last 21 meetings with Ole Miss, including eight of 12 under Melanie Balcomb.

On-Deck

Vanderbilt makes its annual trip to Knoxville, Tenn., to face rival Tennessee for the first of two meetings this season on Sunday, January 15. Tipoff at Thompson-Boling Arena is set for 1:00 p.m. CT and the game can be seen on the SEC Network and ESPN3.

Scouting the Lady Vols

No. 6/7 Tennessee stands at 12-3 overall, 3-0 in SEC play. They travel to No. 9/8 Kentucky on Thursday before hosting the Commodores. Pat Summit's squad will be facing a top 25 opponent for the ninth time this season when Vanderbilt visits on Sunday. The duo of Shekinn Stricklen and Glory Johnson leads the way for the Lady Vols. Stricklen is posting 15.5 points and 6.7 rebounds per contest, while Johnson is averaging 14.3 points and 9.8 boards per game. Johnson is the reigning SEC Player of the Week after becoming just the fourth player in UT history with 1,000 career points and 1,000 career rebounds.

Vanderbilt vs. Tennessee - The Series

Sunday's game will be the 65th meeting between Tennessee and Vanderbilt, with UT holding a 57-7 edge in the series. Tennessee is the most common opponent in program history for Vanderbilt. The first meeting came in the 1979-80 season, a 77-53 UT win in Nashville. The first Vanderbilt win came in 1984-85, an 84-77 win at Memorial Gym. The teams have met at least twice during each season since 1993-94. The most recent Vanderbilt win came in 2008-09, when the Dores won 74-58 at Memorial. Tennessee won both meetings last year (68-56

in Knoxville; 65-57 in Nashville). Vanderbilt has not won in 26 tries in Knoxville.

Facing The Best Of The Best

In the current SEC scheduling format, each SEC team plays 16 games, facing five teams twice in during the season. Vanderbilt always faces rival Tennessee twice and this season drew South Carolina, LSU, Georgia and Auburn as other repeat opponents. Of the five repeat opponents, three are ranked (Tennessee, South Carolina, Georgia) with one receiving votes (South Carolina). They have combined for a record of 9-3 in SEC play this season.

Tiffany Clarke Shows Up For The SEC

Junior Tiffany Clarke leads Vanderbilt in scoring and rebounding through it's two SEC games, averaging 16.0 points and 8.5 boards. The forward scored a game-high 19 points against Ole Miss and has now scored at least 13 points in eight of the last nine SEC contests, including last year's SEC Tournament when she earned All-Tournament honors.

Battle Of The Guards Goes To Lister

The Ole Miss game featured the SEC's top two players in assists per contest entering the game, Vanderbilt's Jasmine Lister and the Rebels' Valencia McFarland. Both players were averaging 5.6 assists entering the contest. Both the final score and the assist battle went to Vanderbilt. In the 68-52 Commodore win, Lister dished out six assists to McFarland's four. In addition, Lister committed just three turnovers next to her six assists, while McFarland turned it over seven times next to four helpers.

SEC Starters

Vanderbilt lost its SEC opener for the second consecutive season on Thursday, January 5, at South Carolina. The Commodores fell at Ole Miss a season ago, 72-67. The Commodores are now 6-4 in SEC openers under Melanie Balcomb. Every season Vanderbilt has lost its league opener under Balcomb, it has come on the road. Vandy rebounded to win its home opener against Ole Miss on Sunday. The Commodores have won their home SEC opener every season since 2003-04.

Home Cooking


Vanderbilt currently stands 11-0 at Memorial Gym this season, including a 10-0 mark during the non-conference portion of the schedule. It marks the second consecutive season Vanderbilt has gone undefeated at home during non-conference pay. The Commodores went 7-0 during that portion of the schedule last year, the first undefeated run through non-SEC play since 2006-07. After winning its first 12 games at home last season, Vanderbilt lost the final three home games to Tennessee, Kentucky and Florida.

200 SEC Wins

Vanderbilt became the fourth program in Southeastern Conference history to reach 200 conference wins when it defeated Mississippi State on February 17, 2011. The Commodores joined Tennessee, LSU and Georgia as 200-win programs in the league. Vanderbilt is currently 202-145 all-time in SEC play.

Night Of Highs

The final non-conference game saw several career highs be set or equalled for Vanderbilt. Christina Foggie matched her career high with 27 points. The sophomore guard shot 9-13 from the field and 5-8 from three to match her output versus High Point on Dec. 4. In addition, freshman Kady Schrann scored 20 points, the first 20-point outing of her young career, while adding career highs in assists (six) and blocks (three).

Holzer Finds Her Game

Through out her career, redshirt Stephanie Holzer has had a big impact whenever she has been on the floor, earning SEC Sixth Woman of the Year honors as a freshman. The problem has been staying out of foul trouble. She committed four fouls in the loss at NC State, however was able to stay on the floor for a then-career-high 30 minutes. Holzer's impact helped Vanderbilt fight back from 14-points down to pull with in three with just 44 seconds remaining. She finished the contest with 15 points and eight rebounds. The Vanderbilt comeback effort began when she knocked down a pair of free throws following a flagrant foul by the Wolfpack's Kody Burke with 6:19 remaining, starting a 12-3 VU run. Holzer followed that up by recording her sixth career double-double versus Florida State (17 points, 13 rebounds), while setting a career-mark for minutes played with 31. The center again committed four fouls against the Seminoles. She ran into foul trouble again versus Western Carolina, scoring nine points in 16 minutes while committing four fouls, and in the SEC opener against South Carolina scoring 10 points and grabbing five rebounds, but only play 19 minutes while committing four fouls.

Holzer On The Floor

Stephanie Holzer's impact on the game continues to be significant, when she is on the floor. After earning SEC Sixth Woman of the Year honors in a rookie season that saw her foul out five times and collect at least three fouls in 17 contests, Holzer continues to struggle with foul trouble. The center is third on the team in scoring at 11.6 points per game, while adding 7.0 rebounds per contest, but she has also committed 44 fouls in 15 games and fouled out of the Oklahoma contest. If her stats were projected out over 40 minutes, she would be averaging 23.8 points and 14.4 rebounds per game, but also 6.0 fouls per contest.

Smith Returns

Junior guard Gabby Smith returned to action against South Carolina for the first time since the Western Illinois game on November 14. Smith suffered a concussion during pre-season practice and missed the exhibition game and the season-opener before scoring nine points against the Leathernecks. Her post-concussion symptoms then recurred and Smith missed the next 11 games before returning against the Gamecocks. She hit Vanderbilt's only three-pointer of the game against USC, playing 26 minutes.

Foggie Just Keeps Rolling

Sophomore guard Christina Foggie leads Vanderbilt in scoring, averaging 17.1 points per contest. She had scored at least 20 points in each of the five games before scoring 13 in Vanderbilt's loss at NC State. The five straight 20-point games marked the first time since the 1990-91 season a Commodore put together a streak of at least five contests with 20-plus points. Wendy Scholtens, who is Vanderbilt's second all-time leading scorer (2,604 points), had nine-straight 20-point performances during her senior campaign. Foggie became just the second Vanderbilt player in program history to score 20 points in at least five-straight contests, but it is the eighth such streak, with the other seven belonging to Scholtens:

A Perfect 10

Every Vanderbilt squad to win their first 10 games has gone on to advance to at least the Sweet 16 of that year's NCAA Tournament. The Commodores are currently 13-2, 1-1 in SEC play.

Top Three From Field & Three

As of the NCAA's most recent national statistics update on Friday, January 6, the Commodores were in the top five in the nation in both field goal percentage and three-point field goal percentage. The Commodores' 43.0% from three-point range leads the nation. Vanderbilt is fifth from the field with a mark of 48.4%. As a team, the Commodores also rank in the top 15 nationally in scoring (14th at 77.5 ppg), assists (11th at 17.9 apg) and assist-turnover ratio (12th at 1.11).

Injuries Hit Dores

In addition to Gabby Smith missing 12 games, Vanderbilt lost freshman guard Maggie Morrison for the season prior to the NC State game. The team's reserve point guard, Morrison suffered a torn ACL from a contact injury during practice. Morrison was eighth in the SEC in assists per game (3.8) and sixth in assist-turnover ratio (1.6) at the time of the injury. Without Morrison, Vanderbilt has nine scholarship players available.

Back-To-Back POTWs

Christina Foggie was named SEC Co-Player of the Week on December 5 for her performance in games Nov. 28-Dec. 4. Foggie scored 20 points in three contests on the week, averaging 24.7 points while shooting 52.6% from the field and 50.0% from three-point range. The week included a career-high 26 points in a win over High Point. It marked the second-straight conference Player of the Week award for a Vanderbilt player, as classmate and fellow guard Jasmine Lister took home the award the previous week. Foggie shared the award with Kentucky's A'dia Mathies. It also marks the first time the same school had back-to-back players of the week since Jan. 31 & Feb. 7, 2010, when Kentucky's Victoria Dunlap won consecutive awards.

Lister Gets Attention

Sophomore guard Jasmine Lister earned SEC Player of the Week honors for her play Nov. 21-27. The Corona, Calif., native averaged 13.3 points, 4.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists over three games on the week, all Commodore victories. She shot 55.5% from the field (15-27), while shooting an identical percentage from three-point range (5-9). She opened the week with a nine-point, six-assist performance against Sam Houston State, before scoring seven points and grabbing five rebounds in the win over Lipscomb. Lister saved her best for the final game of the week, scoring a career-high 24 points versus No. 12/14 Oklahoma in the championship game of the Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament. She added six assists in the 78-66 win over the Sooners and took home tournament MVP honors. A Vanderbilt player last won SEC Player of the Week on Feb. 7, 2011, when Stephanie Holzer earned the nod.

Commodores Return To Top 25

Vanderbilt returned to the Top 25 on November 28, fresh off its win over No. 12/14 Oklahoma. The re-appearance marked the first time Vanderbilt had been ranked since the fourth week of 2010-11. It snapped the longest drought without appearing in the top 25 (17 weeks) since a 30 week absence during the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 seasons. The Commodores are currently ranked 25th in the AP poll and 24th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll.

Commodores Versus The Top 25

Vanderbilt's game versus No. 12/14 Oklahoma was its first against a ranked opponent this year, giving it a 1-0 mark against ranked foes. The schedule features three opponents currently ranked in the Associated Press Top 25. The Commodores went 2-6 against ranked opponents in 2010-11.

It's The Frontcourt's Turn

After guard play dominated Vanderbilt's first three contests of the season, the frontcourt got a chance to play a greater role in the win over Sam Houston State. Forwards Tiffany Clarke and Clair Watkins, along with center Stephanie Holzer, combined for 45 of the Commodores' 79 points. Another way to look at it is that 27% (three of Vandy's 11 players) of the roster contributed 57% of the points in the contest.

28 x 2 = History

For the second-straight time against USC Upstate, the Commodores dished out 28 assists. The last time Vanderbilt had back-to-back games with more than 25 assists was 2006-05. The 'Dores dished out 25 assists versus Dartmouth on Nov. 18, 2006, before recording 27 helpers against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Nov. 20. Vanderbilt had not even had consecutive games with 20-plus assists since 2009-10, when they recorded 25 against Tennessee State on December 20, before dishing 20 assists in the next game against East Tennessee State on December 28. It also marked the highest two-game assist total for Vanderbilt in over a decade. The 56 assists in two games were the most since the 2000-01 season, when the 'Dores handed out 68 helpers in games versus UNC-Asheville (33 assists on Dec. 17, 2000) and Portland State (Dec. 23, 2000).

400 And Counting

Vanderbilt's win over Sam Houston State on November 22 marked the 400th in program history at Memorial Gymnasium. The only home the Commodores have known as a program, they have posted an all-time record of 407-92 at Memorial, good for a winning percentage of .816.

A Dish Best Served Often

In the 95-51 win over Western Illinois on November 14, Vanderbilt had one of its best games distributing the basketball under Head Coach Melanie Balcomb. The 'Dores dished out 28 assists, their highest total since March 2006 when they served up 32 against Alabama (the highest total under Balcomb). It also marked the first time Vanderbilt had at least 25 assists in a game since December 20, 2009, when it had 26 against Tennessee State. They then matched that total in the win over USC Upstate on November 16. Leading the way was sophomore guard Jasmine Lister, who dished out seven assists in each of the first three games this season. Lister is 19th in the nation in assists per game at 5.7 per contest.

Assists Don't Come Without Field Goals

On the receiving end of those 28 assists, which game on just 37 field goals, Vanderbilt also had one of its best shooting performances of late. The Commodores shot 62.7% (37-59) from the field, their best mark since shooting 64.1% (25-39) on Feb. 8, 2009 at Kentucky. Vanderbilt is currently ranked fifth in the nation in field goal percentage at 48.5%

70 Is The Magic Number

After going 19-3 when holding its opponent under 70 points and 14-1 when scoring at least 70 points last season, 70 has continued to be the magic number for Vanderbilt this season. Vanderbilt has held its opponent to under 70 points in all but one contest this season, going 11-1 in those games. In addition, the Commodores are 11-0 when scoring 70 points. The games in which they did not reach 70 were the loss at NC State, the win over Florida State, the loss at South Carolina and the win over Ole Miss.

Strong Out The Gate

The Commodores jumped out to a 55-17 halftime lead in their contest versus Western Illinois on November 14. That marked the highest first half output for Vanderbilt since leading Belmont, 56-27, at the half on Nov. 23, 2007. In addition, the half-time margin of 38 points marked the largest since January 5, 2004, when the Commodores took a 52-6 lead into the break against Savannah State.

The Still Young 'Dores

After fielding one of the youngest teams in the SEC a season ago, Vanderbilt again features one of the most youthful teams in the league. The Commodores have just one senior (Jordan Coleman) and three juniors (Elan Brown, Tiffany Clarke, Gabby Smith) on their 11-player roster. Only Alabama and Georgia join Vanderbilt in having one senior. By the measure of juniors and seniors combined, Vanderbilt returns fewer than any team in the league with four. Ole Miss has five juniors and seniors, while every other team in the conference returns at least six. While the Commodores may be young, they are certainly talented, as four returners earned SEC All-Freshman honors during their respective rookie campaigns (Brown, Clarke, Jasmine Lister and Stephanie Holzer).

Preseason Honors From Coaches

Stephanie Holzer and Tiffany Clarke each picked-up preseason honors from the SEC's head coaches. They selected Holzer to the Preseason All-SEC First team, while placing Clarke on the second team. The coaches also picked Vanderbilt to finish sixth in the conference this season. Holzer was joined on the first team by C'eira Ricketts (Arkansas), Jasmine James (Georgia), A'dia Mathies (Kentucky), LaSondra Barrett (LSU), Glory Johnson (Tennessee), Meighan Simmons (Tennessee) and Preseason Player of the Year Shekinna Stricklen (Tennessee). In addition to Clarke, the second team included Ericka Russell of Alabama, Arkansas' Sarah Watkins, Georgia's Jasmine Hassell, Adrienne Webb of LSU, Valencia McFarland from Ole Miss and South Carolina's La'Keisha Sutton and leasia Walker.

Preseason Honors From Media

Stephanie Holzer was named Preseason Second Team All-SEC by regional and select national media, it was announced by the league on October 25. Holzer, who was honorable mention and SEC Sixth Woman of the year as a redshirt freshman in 2010-11, returns after averaging 11.1 points and 6.0 rebounds per game. She was joined on the second team by C'eira Ricketts and Sarah Watkins of Arkansas, Valencia McFarland of Ole Miss, and Tennessee's Meighan Simmons. The media also slotted the Commodores fifth in the SEC, behind Tennessee, Georgia, Kentucky and LSU.

Vanderbilt Basketball Is Equal Opportunity

The Vanderbilt women's and men's basketball teams have made their respective NCAA Tournament fields each of the last two seasons, something only accomplished by 15 NCAA Division I institutions. 2010-11 was the ninth time both teams made the NCAA Tournament, but just the second time both teams went in consecutive years (2007, 2008). Both teams made the tournament in 1989, 1991, 1993, 1997, 2004, 2007, 2008 and 2010.

The 20 Standard

Vanderbilt reached the 20-win mark for the 12th consecutive season versus Mississippi State in the SEC Tournament Quarterfinals. It was the 25th time in school history the team reached 20 wins, and the 19th time in the last 20 years.

The Tournament Standard

The 2010-11 season saw Vanderbilt make the NCAA Tournament for the 24th time and 12th in a row. The Commodores have posted a 37-24 mark in the tournament and won at least one game in each tournament during 11 of the 12 appearances. Vanderbilt has made 14 appearances in the Sweet 16, including six in the last 11 seasons. The Commodores have one Final Four appearance (1993).

Best for Last

Junior forward Tiffany Clarke played her best basketball at the end of last season, earning SEC All-Tournament honors. She posted 20.5 points and 13.0 rebounds in Vanderbilt's two games at the tournament. She was the only player named to the All-Tournament squad not from

Kentucky or Tennessee. She matched her season high with 23 points against Mississippi State before grabbing a career-high 17 rebounds against Kentucky. Clarke moved into the starting lineup on January 30 and averaged 13.3 points and 9.0 rebounds through the remainder of the season, including four double-doubles and three 20-point performances. On Feb. 20 against Kentucky, she became the first Commodore with 20 points and 10 rebounds in a game since 2005.

In The Spotlight

The Commodores will be featured on broadcast television ten times during the regular season in 2011-12, including two games on national television and two games on the nationally syndicated SEC Network. The highlights come on Feb. 20, when the Commodores will travel to Kentucky in a game featured on ESPN2. Melanie Balcomb

Head Coach

Vanderbilt's women's basketball program has been a model of consistency under 10th-year Head Coach Melanie Balcomb. In nine seasons at the helm, Balcomb has guided the Commodores to nine NCAA Tournaments, nine 20-win seasons, eight top 25 finishes, three SEC Tournament Championships and four Sweet 16 appearances.

Since her hiring in 2002, Balcomb has elevated an already tradition-rich program and guided it to new heights. Just last season, Balcomb became the third coach in school history to reach 200 career wins, while also becoming the fastest to reach the milestone. Balcomb accomplished the feat in 275 games, five games sooner than Jim Foster.

With a 215-84 record at Vanderbilt, Balcomb's winning percentage of 71.9% is greater than any coach in school history. In her nine seasons at the helm, Balcomb has averaged 23.8 wins per season, won 83.0 percent of games played at Memorial Gym, posted an 8-1 record in the NCAA first round, developed eight WNBA Draft picks, and most importantly, graduated 100% of her players.

An 18-year head coaching veteran, Balcomb is a renowned offensive strategist. In her nine seasons at Vanderbilt that reputation has only been enhanced. Each season under Balcomb, Vanderbilt has ranked in the top 20 in field-goal percentage and has an average national ranking of 8th (47.5%). The offensive success also extends beyond the arc where the Commodores have an average national rank of 14th (38.1%) in three-point field goal percentage.

The Commodores have finished in the top five nationally in field-goal percentage four times and in the top five in three-point field-goal percentage three times under Balcomb. Her teams have also finished in the top five in assists per game, free-throw percentage and scoring offense.

Balcomb's teams have found success throughout every season on West End, but specifically seem to click down the home stretch. In nine seasons, Balcomb's teams have won 73.6% (56-20) of its final nine regular season games.

Balcomb's success as a head coach is not limited to Vanderbilt. Before arriving at Vanderbilt, Balcomb had successful coaching tenures at Ashland (Ohio) and Xavier. In total, she has coached 500-plus games, winning 67% of the time and averaging 22 wins per season.

Last season featured many obstacles that Balcomb successfully maneuvered through to reach another NCAA Tournament and finish third in the SEC. Injuries took an unfortunate toll on the team throughout the year with at least one of Vanderbilt's five leading scorers unavailable for 14 out of the team's 32 games. Injuries coupled with matching Georgia for the fewest upperclassmen in the SEC challenged Balcomb to use different personnel groupings regularly.

Despite the challenges, Balcomb again reached 20 wins, finishing 20-12 and 10-6 in the SEC. Individually, Balcomb helped Jence Rhoads earn honorable mention All-America honors from the Associated Press in addition to first team All-SEC recognition. Rhoads was also a WBCA Region 3 All-American. Freshman center Stephanie Holzer was named honorable mention All-SEC, SEC Sixth Woman of the Year and to the SEC All-Freshmen team. Freshman point guard Jasmine Lister was also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team.

Balcomb started at Vanderbilt in 2002 and wasted no time in implementing her own style of winning. Working to transition veteran players into a new system while building new team chemistry, Balcomb's first year saw the Commodores win six of their last seven regular season games, earn an NCAA Tournament berth, and lead the nation in field goal percentage (51.3) against the fourth toughest schedule in the country. She was named a finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year award.

In 2003-04, Balcomb led the Commodores to their fourth Southeastern Conference Tournament title. She masterfully balanced strong upper-class leadership with exciting freshmen talent, winning 10 consecutive games and advancing to the program's 11th Sweet 16 appearance. One year later, her team made its second consecutive trip to the NCAA Sweet 16. The Commodores posted the most wins (10) in the program's history in Southeastern Conference play finishing with a 10-4 record.

The Commodores were ranked seventh in the final AP poll of the 2006-07 season, and earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament after winning another SEC Tournament title. That Vanderbilt squad was the nation's best three-point shooting team, and ranked among the top 10 in points scored. The team's 28-6 mark was the best record for a VU squad in 14 years.

The 2008 season was also one of Balcomb's most impressive coaching jobs. Despite graduating three All-SEC seniors, she led the Commodores to a 25-9 record and the school's 13th appearance in the NCAA sweet 16, all with two freshmen and no seniors in the starting lineup.

In 2009, Vanderbilt won its sixth SEC Tournament title, the third for Balcomb in the last six years. The team also advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the 14th time in school history -- Balcomb's fourth trip with the Commodores. Vanderbilt finished

the year ranked No. 8 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll after narrowly missing an upset of No. 1 seed Maryland in the Raleigh Regional Semifinal.

National accolades came flooding in for Vanderbilt, including senior Jennifer Risper being named the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) National Defensive Player of the Year. Risper and classmate Christina Wirth, who herself was named an All-American and the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, were both selected in the 2009 WNBA Draft

In 2010 Balcomb was faced with one of her most challenging tasks. Faced with replacing National Defensive Player of the Year Jennifer Risper and All-American Christina Wirth, Balcomb guided an undersized team back to the NCAA Tournament, where they narrowly missed advancing to their third consecutive sweet 16.

Despite having to overcome numerous injuries throughout out the season and a size disadvantage in almost every game, Vanderbilt finished the season 23-11 overall. Individually, Balcomb helped junior point guard Jence Rhoads earn first team All-SEC honors, while senior shooting guard Merideth Marsh earned second team All-SEC accolades. Elan Brown and Tiffany Clarke were also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team.

In nine seasons at Vanderbilt, Balcomb has won 12 games in the NCAA Tournament, which ranks 13th among active coaches for most wins in the NCAA Tournament during that time. She holds a winning percentage of 67.1 against SEC opponents. In all, Balcomb owns series advantages over 10 of the 11 schools in the SEC.

Before arriving at Vanderbilt, the Cranbury, N.J., native spent seven seasons at Xavier University. Beginning in 1995, her up-tempo style wreaked havoc on the Atlantic 10 while building the Musketeers into a national contender. In 1998, Xavier recorded its second post-season appearance in school history with a selection to the Women's National Invitational Tournament. Each of the next three seasons, Xavier competed in the NCAA Tournament, capped in 2001 by a victory over perennial power Tennessee and a run to the Elite Eight.

En route to earning three invitations to the NCAA Tournament and compiling a 136-78 record during her tenure, Balcomb's offensive schemes helped push Xavier onto the national stage. Musketeer field-goal percentages ranked among the top three in the nation during three different seasons while the 1999 squad led the country in 3-point accuracy at 40.1 percent. Her 2000-01 squad averaged 79.4 points per game, the highest total in program history. Individual records were rewritten as well. Of the 15 Musketeers who have scored at least 1,000 points in a career, six of them played on Balcomb-coached teams.

Before her accomplishments at Xavier, Balcomb took her first head coaching position at Ashland University. Prosperity was immediate as Balcomb's first unit matched the best record in school history at 18-9 while registering its first winning season in the Great Lakes Valley Conference with an 11-7 mark.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Balcomb served three years as an assistant at Providence College (1990-93), during which the Friars went 62-30, made two NCAA Tournament appearances and once (1990-91) led the nation in scoring while they amassed a 26-6 record. In 1989-90, Balcomb was an assistant at Ohio University and she began her coaching career with a four-year stint (1985-89) on the staff at Niagara University.

In all, Balcomb has coached 19 players who have received All-SEC accolades. Nine of her players have been drafted by the WNBA, including VU's Chantelle Anderson, Ashley McElhiney, Jenni Benningfield, Ashley Earley, Carla Thomas, Dee Davis and Christina Wirth. Her Xavier teams won two league tournament titles (2000 and 2001) and one regular-season championship in the Atlantic 10 Conference (2001).

Xavier's successes during the Balcomb era helped push for construction of the Cintas Center, a state of the art facility which became home to Xavier basketball at the start of the 2000-01 season and - ironically - was dedicated with a victory over Vanderbilt. That season the program posted a school record for attendance with a total of 40,098 fans, who thrilled in the Musketeers' style of play and their results. Commodore followers have enjoyed the entertainment as well.

Her basketball education began at an early age among some of the most well respected coaches in the game. Balcomb's father, Alan, was a varsity boy's coach for 30 years at South Brunswick (N.J.) High School, and then served as an assistant for four years at Princeton University under Pete Carril, the master of the half-court game.

For Balcomb, however, a complete education goes far beyond the hardwood. Every eligible, four-year player during Balcomb's coaching tenure has earned her degree. In May of 2011, Balcomb's team earned a Public Recognition Award for finishing among the nation's top 10 percent in multi-year Academic Progress Rates (APR). Six of seven squads at Xavier earned team grade point averages that ranked in the Top 25. In 2004-05, 40 percent of the Commodore basketball team was named to the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll. Vanderbilt led the SEC with eight players being named to the honor roll in 2003-04.

Two Commodores have been named SEC Scholar Athletes of the Year under Balcomb. Hillary Hager received the honor in 2004 and Christina Wirth won it in 2009. With was also named a 2009 Lowe's Senior CLASS All-American, while receiving WBCA and NCAA post-graduate scholarships. Hager recently returned to Vanderbilt and received her doctorate in 2010.

Balcomb also stresses the importance of community service to her teams. VU logged more than 95 hours of community service last season, including numerous opportunities to visit with young patients at the Vanderbilt Children's Hospital. After the devastating Nashville flood in 2010, Balcomb and her coaching staff volunteered in helping to clean up flood-damaged areas. Balcomb herself has been active in outreach to the surrounding area, participating in numerous fundraising events for local and national organizations, including Coaches vs. Cancer, the Race for the Cure, Mercy Ministries, Vanderbilt Children's Hospital and the Girl Scouts of America. She joined colleagues to represent the SEC in the 2008 4Kay Golf Classic to benefit the Kay Yow Cancer Fund.

An avid golfer, Balcomb finds time to make it to beach on her rare weeks off, and also enjoys reading.

NASHVILLE - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team used an impressive shooting night to score an 86-55 victory over Alabama A&M in its season opener. The Commodores improved to 1-0 on the season, while the Bulldogs fell to 0-1. Guards Jasmine Lister and Christina Foggie led the way for Vanderbilt with 22 and 18 points, respectively. Lister added seven assists, while committing no turnovers. She was also 4-of-6 from 3-point land. Three other Commodores were in double-figures. Tiffany Clarke picked up 11 points, while grabbing seven rebounds. Freshman Maggie Morrison had an impressive collegiate debut with 10 points, five assists and four rebounds. Junior Elan Brown narrowly missed a doubledouble with 10 points and nine rebounds. Alabama A&M was led by 25 points and eight rebounds from Whiquitta Tobar. Shundray Davis added 13 points and nine rebounds. Outside of their two guards, the Bulldogs did not get much scoring output, as no one else on the squad recorded more than five points. Morrison's play was especially important to Vanderbilt Head Coach Melanie Balcomb, as her team was without iunior guard Gabby Smith (concussion, day-to-day) and saw freshman guard Kady Schrann roll an ankle late in the first half. The Commodores shot 48.5% from the field, including 45.0% from three. Size and depth both proved to be a factor, as Vanderbilt outscored Alabama A&M in the paint, 38-28, as well as off the bench, 23-9. Vanderbilt nearly doubled-up on the Bulldogs in the first half, taking a 45-23 lead into the break. Three-point shooting helped open up the lead, as the Commodores were 7-10 from beyond the arc. Lister was an impressive 6-7 from the field, as well as 3-3 from 3-point range in the frame.

NASHVILLE -The Vanderbilt women's basketball team used a blistering first-half shooting performance to defeat Western Illinois, 95-51, in action on Monday, November 14, at Memorial Gym. The Commodores improved to 2-0, while the Leathernecks fell to 1-1. Vanderbilt's guards did what they do best, share the basketball. As a team, the Commodores dished out 28 assists, which is the most since distributing 32 helpers against Alabama in March 2006. Jasmine Lister alone had seven assists, matching her career-high set in the seasonopener against Alabama A&M. Lister led the way in scoring, as well, with 15 points. Tiffany Clarke had 13 points and seven rebounds, while Stephanie Holzer added 14 points and six rebounds. Clair Watkins joined the trio in double-figures with 10 points, while grabbing four rebounds. Elan Brown led the Commodores in rebounding for the second-straight time, grabbing nine boards. Vanderbilt almost had six players in double-figures for the first time since January 2009, as Christina Foggie, Maggie Morrison and Gabby Smith all had nine points apiece. Gabby Smith added five assists in her first action this season (concussion). As a team, the Commodores finished at 62.7% (37-59) from the field and 47.1% from threepoint range. It marks the highest total field goal percentage for a Commodore team since February 8, 2009, when Vandy shot 64.1% (25-39). Western Illinois was led by 12 points from Sadie Webb, while Lindsay Carroll added 10 off the bench. Michele Salvatori was impressive underneath, grabbing 10 rebounds, seven on the offensive glass. The Commodores used an incredibly balanced approach in the first half to open a 55-17 lead. Clarke had 12 points while hitting all six attempts from the field. Lister and Holzer each added eight points. Morrison and Smith had seven while Foggie added six.

NASHVILLE -The Vanderbilt women's basketball team improved to a perfect 3-0 with an 88-42 win over USC Upstate on Wednesday, November 16, at Memorial Gym. For the second-straight game, the Commodores dished out 28 assists, led by nine from freshman Maggie Morrison, who added eight points. Junior guard Jasmine Lister added 10 points and seven helpers. On the receiving end were freshman Kady Schrann, who scored a game-high 15 points, and Stephanie Holzer, who scored 14 points while grabbing 13 rebounds. Holzer is the first Commodore this season to register a double-double. USC Upstate (0-3) was led by 13 points from Hannah Ohl. She added three assists and three rebounds. Tee'Ara Copney joined her in double-figures with 10 points. Also in double-figures for Vanderbilt were Tiffany Clarke, who notched 11 points and grabbed six boards, and redshirt freshman Clair Waitkins, who scored 10 points and added three blocks. It marks the second time in three games the Commodores have had five players reach at least 10 points. In addition to distributing the basketball and hitting open baskets (Vanderbilt shot 52.1% from the field), the Commodores hit the glass, grabbing 51 rebounds. Vandy pulled down 19 offensive boards, while USC Upstate grabbed just 23 total rebounds. It marked the first 50-plus rebound performance for Vanderbilt since pulling down 52 missed shots versus Mississippi State on February 17, 2011. Vanderbilt had another impressive opening half, as they led 42-16 at the break. The Commodores were keyed in the frame by a 21-0 run over nearly eight minutes that turned a 14-11 VU lead into a 35-14 VU lead.

NASHVILLE - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team moved to 4-0 with a 79-56 victory over Sam Houston State in action on Tuesday, November 22, at Memorial Gymnasium. The Bearkats fell to 2-1. The frontcourt led the Commodores, including a double-double from junior forward Tiffany Clarke (19 points, 10 rebounds). Redshirt sophomore center Stephanie Holzer added 13 points and five rebounds, while redshirt freshman forward Clair Watkins notched 12 points and six rebounds, both career highs. Gabby Smith missed her fourth game of the season with a concussion. Lipscomb was led by nine points from Anna Bowers. Sasha Robinson led the Lady Bisons on the boards with nine rebounds, while Morgan Faulkner dished out three assists. Vanderbilt's defense was outstanding right out of the gate, holding Lipsomb without a point until the 11:46 mark when O'Neisha Smith connected on a free throw. The first Lipscomb field goal came three seconds later when Smith rebounded her own missed free throw and scored. The Commodores athleticism was just too much for Lipscomb to overcome. Vanderbilt scored 31 points off turnovers, outscored the Lady Bisons in the paint, 44-14, and off the bench, 28-13 Vanderbilt led at the half, 37-11. The 11 points marked the lowest total for an opponent at the half since it held Alabama A&M to eight in the opening stanza on November 22, 2005.



NASHVILLE - The Vanderbilt women's basketball team put an undefeated record in its annual Thanksgiving Tournament on the line against No. 12/14 Oklahoma on Saturday, November 26, and came away with a 78-66 victory over the Sooners. The Commodores used strong guard play to move to 6-0 on the season, led by a 24-point, six-assist effort from Jasmine Lister, who earned tournament MVP honors. It was a career-high in points for the sophomore. Christina Foggie, who joined Lister on the All-Tournament Team, poured in 21 points. She added five rebounds and three assists. The Sooners, who dropped to 3-1, were led by All-Tournament selection Aaryn Ellenberg, who scored 22 points. Morgan Hook, also an All-Tournament team member, scored 16 for OU, while grabbing six rebounds. Joanna McFarland had a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds. It was a backand-forth affair over the first few minutes before Foggie connected for a pair of threes to put the Commodores up for good. NASHVILLE - For the third straight game, Christina Foggie cracked the 20-point mark, helping No. 25/22 Vanderbilt women's basketball to a 77-56 win over Denver on Friday, December 2, at Memorial Gym. Foggie, coming off a 21-point performance against then-No. 12 Oklahoma and a career-high 25 points at Austin Peay, poured in 23 points in the win. The sophomore guard shot 61.5% from the field (8-13) and hit 6-9 from three-point range. Vanderbilt also got a season-high from junior guard Elan Brown, who scored 13 points while grabbing nine rebounds. Freshman Kady Schrann was in double-figures with 10 points, as was sophomore guard Jasmine Lister, who dished out four assists. Denver was led by 12 points from Kaetlyn Murdoch, who added five rebounds. Morgan Shell joined her in double-digits with 10 points. Emiko Smith dished out seven assists, while Maiya Michel pulled down a team-high six rebounds. Vanderbilt tried to capitalize on the size advantage it had over the Pioneers and did so to the tune of 30 points in the paint, to Denver's 16. The Commodores also did plenty of scoring off their defense, recording 33 points off 23 Pioneer turnovers. Foggie's hot hand helped the Commodores lead 49-21 at the half, as the junior guard was 5-7 from three. After the Pioneers scored the first basket of the game, Vanderbilt responded with a 10-0 run and never looked back. In addition to Foggie's 18 at the break, Clarke, Brown and Watkins all had seven points in the opening frame. The first half lead reached its largest point right as the horn sounded. Clarke pulled down a rebound with nine seconds remaining and the Commodores went right down the floor with Holzer making a layup on a pass from Lister as time expired.



NASHVILLE - No. 25/22 Vanderbilt's sophomore guards have been getting it done all season for the Commodores. On Sunday, December 4, Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister did it to the tune of career highs as Vanderbilt downed High Point, 70-54, to move to 9-0 on the season. The Panthers fell to 4-3. Foggie eclipsed the 20-point mark for the fourth-consecutive game, scoring a career-high 26 points on 9-11 shooting. She hit three-of-four attempts from the three-point line, was 5-7 from the foul line and contributed three steals. Her backcourt mate, Lister, dished out a career-high nine assists, while adding 10 points of her own. Tiffany Clarke just missed a double-double, as well, with 14 points and nine rebounds. High Point was led by a doubledouble effort from Cheyenne Parker, who scored 19 points and added 13 rebounds. Shamia Brown added 13 points, while Tayler Tremblay and Laura Whitt each contributed 11 points. Erin Reynolds, who was coming off a 36-point performance in a win over Pittsburgh, was held scoreless. The Commodores never trailed and led by 17 at the half, but the Panthers tried to claw back in it. They opened the second half with a 9-2 run to pull with in seven, 34-27. The Commodores then answered with a 13-4 run to open up a 59-40 lead with 6:40 left and were able to cruise from there. As has been the case with many opponents, Vanderbilt's combination of size and athleticism was too much for High Point. The Commodores outscored High Point, 40-26, in the paint, while outscoring them off the bench, 16-0. Foggie becomes the first Vanderbilt player to score 20-plus points in four consecutive games since Christina Wirth accomplished the feat in the final four contests of her career at the end of the 2008-09 season. Wirth scored 20 against Auburn in the 2009 SEC Championship game before scoring 23 and 24 in first and second round games of the NCAA Tournament versus Western Carolina and Kansas State, respectively. She concluded her career with 28 points in a Sweet 16 loss to Maryland.


RALEIGH, N.C. (AP) -- Kody Burke's career-high 21 points led North Carolina State to a 66-59 upset win over No. 20 Vanderbilt on Sunday. Bonae Holston added 15 points and seven rebounds for N.C. State (7-3). Stephanie Holzer led Vanderbilt (10-1) with 15 points and eight rebounds. Vanderbilt jumped out to a 10-5 lead, with guard Christina Foggie scoring five of those points, but after that, a physical N.C. State team imposed its will. "They set the tone from the start of the game," Vanderbilt Coach Melanie Balcomb said. "They were more aggressive, more physical. They took us off our cuts. They outrebounded us. They went to the foul line more than us. In every category, they did more than us." The Commodores came into the game leading the NCAA in 3-point shooting. N.C. State Coach Kellie Harper said controlling that was the key to her team's victory. Vanderbilt hit only six of 18 3-pointers. "We wanted to take that away from them," Harper said. "Minus a few breakdowns here and there, I thought we did a good job. The players adjusted and did a good job of being aware. We had tremendous focus most of the game." N.C. State scored the final five points of the first half and took a 34-22 lead into intermission. Burke had 17 points in the first half. Vanderbilt adjusted in the second half, getting the ball inside to center Holzer, who scored 13 points after the break. "We talked at halftime about playing together better," Balcomb said. But Vanderbilt still trailed 49-39 with 10:38 left, when Foggie sat down with four fouls. "I had talked to her about not putting herself in positions where the ref could or could not make a call," Balcomb said. "She needed to play; that was a key period. That took us out of our comfort zone. We couldn't afford our guards to get in foul trouble." Foggie returned at the 5 minute mark and hit a pair of 3-pointers, the second making the score 62-59 with 44 seconds remaining. Holston, a 43 percent foulshooter this season, was fouled with 23 seconds left and made both foul shots. Emili Tasler ended the scoring with two more foul shots.

NASHVILLE -- The No. 25/23 Vanderbilt women's basketball team improved to 11-1 with a 64-59 victory over ACC foe Florida State on Thursday, December 22, at Memorial Gym. The Seminoles fell to 6-6. In a game that was won on defensive end and the glass, Vanderbilt center Stephanie Holzer paved the way, scoring 17 points and matching a career-high 13 rebounds to collect her sixth career double-double. Christina Foggie added a game-high 18 points, while Jasmine Lister scored 10 points and dished out six assists. Kady Schrann scored seven points while Elan Brown added seven points and six rebounds. It was the defensive efforts of the Vanderbilt post players that proved pivotal, as Holzer and company held Florida State's Cierra Brayard, who was honorable mention All-America a season ago, to four points. Bravard struggled to even get attempts in the post, as she shot just 1-for-4 from the field. Florida State was led by 16 points off the bench from Chelsea Davis, while Chasity Clayton and Alexa Deluzio each added 15 points. Clatyon recorded a double-double, pulling down a team-high 11 rebounds. Holzer even stepped up to make two huge free throws with 18 seconds remaining, giving Vanderbilt the final margin of 64-59. It gave the Commodores revenge for a 72-66 loss in Tallahassee a season ago. Turnovers proved to be a major factor in the contest. Vanderbilt forced 24 Seminole turnovers, scoring 19 points off those miscues. Florida State scored only 11 points off 17 Commodore turnovers. Both teams struggled to score early on. It took nearly three minutes for Vanderbilt to score the first points of the game, a layup by Holzer at the 17:12 mark. Florida State could not get on the board until 15:06 mark when Chelsea Davis connected for a jumper. The opening period remained low-scoring, with both teams shooting less than 35% from the field (31.4% for Vanderbilt, 34.8% for Florida State). There were also 24 combined turnovers in the period (nine by VU, 15 by FSU). Neither team led by more than five points, with the Commodores taking a five-point lead, 27-22, into the break. Foggie led the way on the scoreboard in the first half, but it was Holzer's nine rebounds in the frame that really set the tone for Vanderbilt. The defensive play of Holzer and Clarke held Bravard, who was averaging 17.5 coming into the contest, scoreless.

Freshman Kady Schrann had career highs in points (20), assists (six) and blocks (three). Vanderbilt also got 12 points and seven rebounds from Tiffany Clarke, while center Stephanie Holzer scored nine points and pulled down five boards. NASHVILLE -- The No. 24/21 Vanderbilt women's basketball team secured a 68-52 win over Ole Miss in its SEC home opener, improving to 13-2 on the season, 1-1 in league action. The Rebels fell to 10-6, 0-3 in the conference. Junior Tiffany Clarke led the way for Vanderbilt, recording her tenth-career double-double. The forward recorded 19 points and 10 rebounds and has scored at least 13 points in eight of the last nine SEC contests. Also in double-figures for the Commodores were Jasmine Lister (15 points) and Christina Foggie (11 points). Lister added six assists. Elan Brown chipped in seven points and eight rebounds. Ole Miss was led by a double-double effort from Nikki Byrd. The Rebel forward scored 15 points while adding 13 rebounds, including seven offensive boards that helped Ole Miss outscore Vandy, 17-11, in second-chance points. Valencia McFarland added 10 points, five rebounds and four assists. Early on, it looked like the script from South Carolina may be repeating itself. The Commodores committed 14 turnovers in the first half and had a scoreless drought of 6:45 that saw a 17-8 lead turn into a 17-19 deficit. Vanderbilt ended that run when freshman Kady Schrann stole it from McFarland and Clarke converted at the other end to tie the game at 19-19. The Commodores would not trail again. Foul trouble contributed to Ole Miss' inability to keep pace. Byrd picked up her fourth foul with 12:56 left and went to the bench. She sat for 1:49 and Vanderbilt went on a 7-0 run to open up a 43-33 lead. Byrd re-entered the game at the 11:07 mark and never fouledout, but the Rebels were never able to get back within 10 points. Vanderbilt has now won 17 of the last 21 meetings with Ole Miss, including eight of 12 under Melanie Balcomb.
